NM INCIDENT SUMMARY/CURRENT ORDERS:

- 1. A Public Health Emergency was declared by Governor Lujan Grisham for COVID-19 on 3/11/2020, Amended on 3/23/2020**
 - All gatherings over (5) five individuals are prohibited. * Restaurants are limited to take-out and delivery only. * Indoor Shopping malls, retail shops, recreational facilities, theatres shall close. * Lodging shall not operate at more than 50%. FOR DETAILS SEE FULL ORDER.

- 2. A Public Health Order 3/24/2020 Non-Essential Services:**
 - Prohibits Non-Essential health services, defined as services that can be delayed for (3) months without undue risk. * Eliminates Non-Essential medical procedures will slow the use of personal protective gear. For details see full order: <https://nmhealth.org/publication/view/rules/5702/>
 - Prohibition of selling PPE without prior approval. * Prohibits healthcare providers and wholesale medical suppliers from selling or distributing PPE with out prior approval from NMDOH. * For details see full Order: <https://nmhealth.org/publication/view/rules/5703/>

- Work with schools to support food pickup or other needs

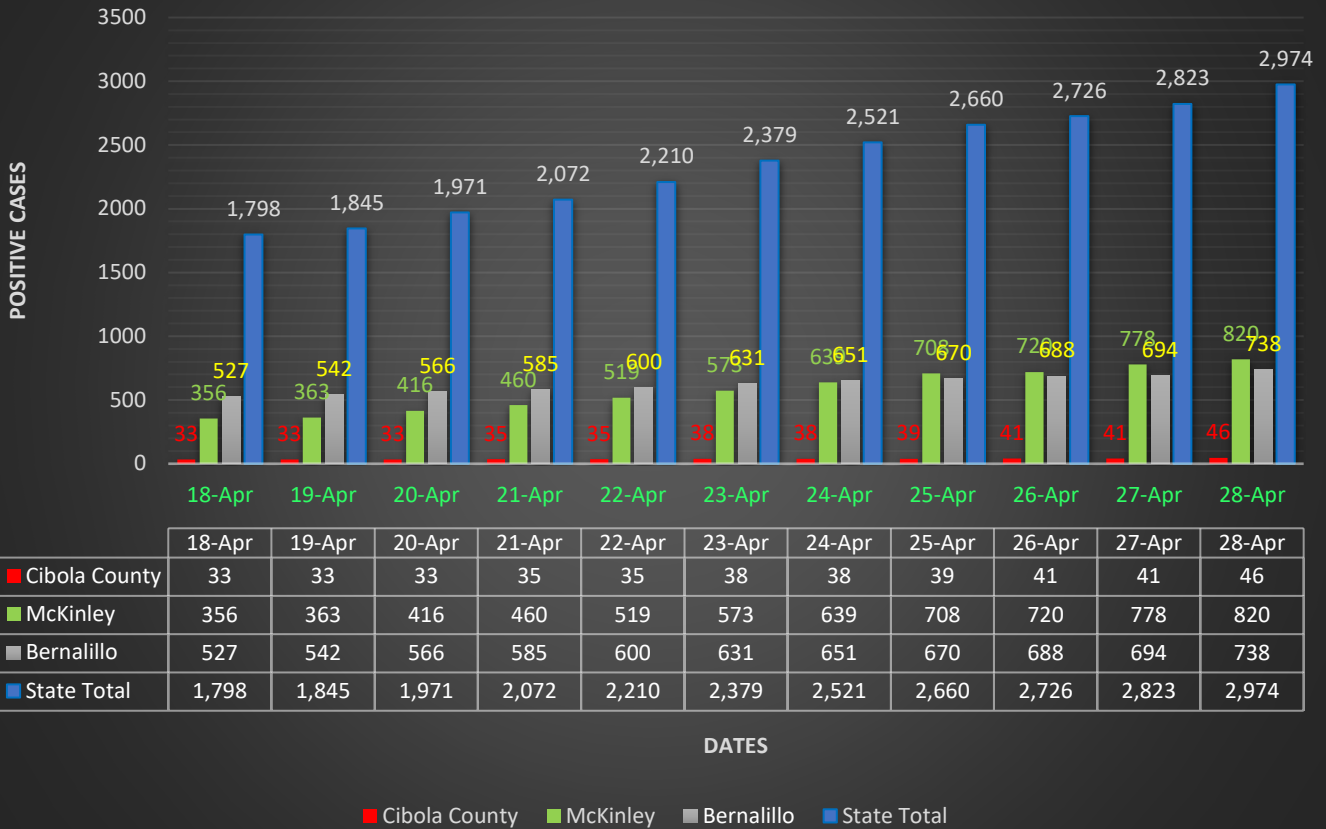

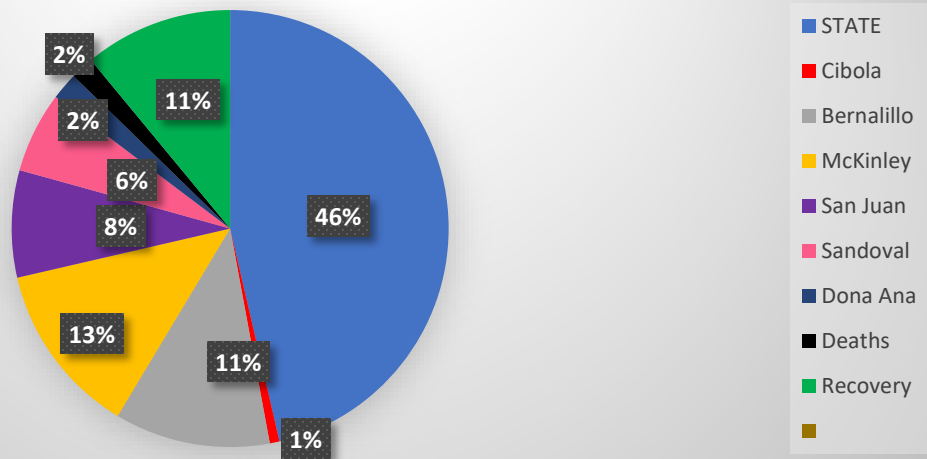


COVID-19 Cibola Comparison

- The number of deaths connected to COVID-19 in New Mexico Increased by 6 and now at total of 110.
- DOH Reports 5 new positive cases in CIBOLA COUNTY bringing the total to 46.

- NM DOH reports 61,745 tests to date. 773 **Total Test in Cibola County**
- Working with local sites for possible alternate housing areas.

OPERATIONAL INFORMATION

Resources Status: CCOEM is working with CGH and the prisons to assist in getting their resource request filled at the local or state level.

EOC Status: Level III Partially Activated. CCOEM is coordinating and communicating with local hospital, City of Grants, Village of Milan, and neighboring jurisdictions/agencies. All County Staff are required to wear face mask while in public.

NMDOH and CDC Current Recommendations:

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Revised Testing Criteria for COVID-19 April 1, 2020

- The New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) is providing revised testing criteria announced by Department of Health Cabinet Secretary Kathy Kunkel during Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham’s news conference Tuesday afternoon (4.1.20).
- Thanks to increased statewide testing capacity, the following people may now be considered for COVID-19 testing:
 - Asymptomatic people who are close contacts or household members of New Mexico residents who have already tested positive for the coronavirus;
 - Asymptomatic residents in nursing homes;
 - Asymptomatic people in congregant settings such as homeless shelters, group homes, detention centers;
 - Symptomatic people displaying the COVID-19 symptoms of cough, fever or shortness of breath.

Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center

reports 1,769 total COVID-19 cases, and 59 total deaths

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. – On Monday, the Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center (HCOC) confirmed a total number to 1,769 positive cases on the Navajo Nation, which includes 839 males, 930 females, and an average age of 47-years old. The total number of deaths is 59, which includes 39 males, 20 females, and an average age of 65-years old.

The Navajo Nation COVID-19 cases by county:

- McKinley County (New Mexico): 431
- Navajo County (Arizona): 426
- Apache County (Arizona): 411
- Coconino County (Arizona): 250
- San Juan County (New Mexico): 178
- San Juan County (Utah): 21
- Socorro County (New Mexico): 21



- Cibola County (New Mexico): 16
- Sandoval County (New Mexico): 15
