NM INCIDENT SUMMARY/CURRENT ORDERS:

- 1. A Public Health Emergency was declared by Governor Lujan Grisham for COVID-19 on 3/11/2020, Amended on 3/23/2020**
 - All gatherings over (5) five individuals are prohibited. * Restaurants are limited to take-out and delivery only. * Indoor Shopping malls, retail shops, recreational facilities, theatres shall close. * Lodging shall not operate at more than 50%. FOR DETAILS SEE FULL ORDER.

- 2. A Public Health Order 3/24/2020 Non-Essential Services:**
 - Prohibits Non-Essential health services, defined as services that can be delayed for (3) months without undue risk. * Eliminates Non-Essential medical procedures will slow the use of personal protective gear. For details see full order: <https://nmhealth.org/publication/view/rules/5702/>

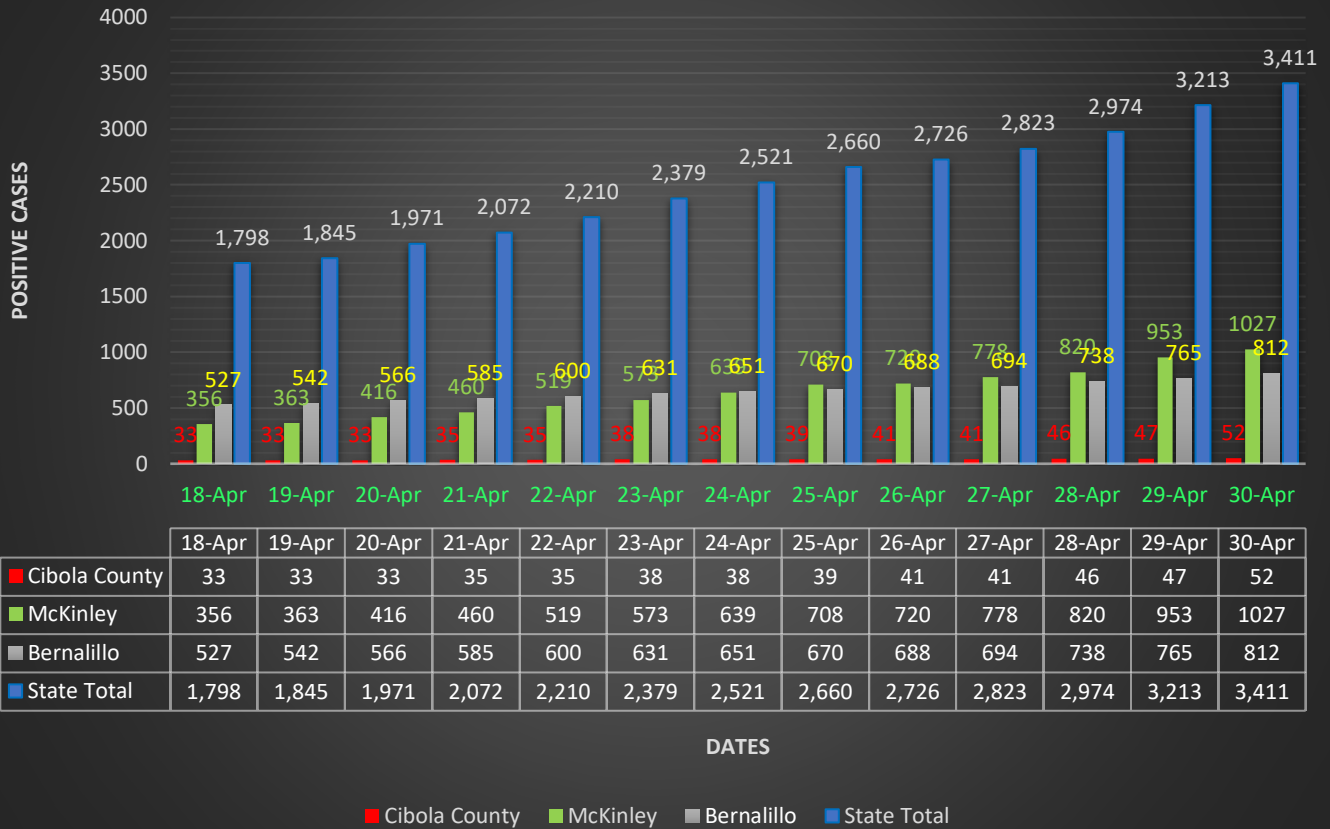

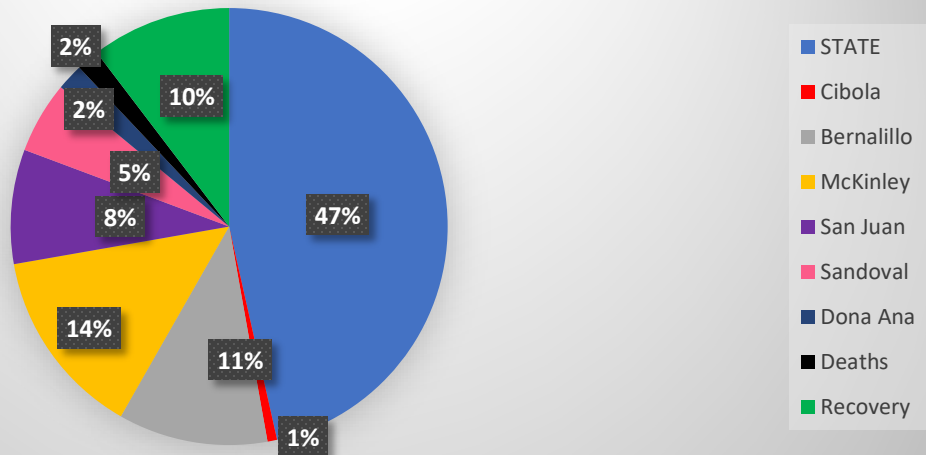


COVID-19 Cibola Comparison

OPERATIONAL INFORMATION

Resources Status: CCOEM is working with CGH and the prisons to assist in getting their resource request filled at the local or state level.

EOC Status: Level III Partially Activated. CCOEM is coordinating and communicating with local hospital, City of Grants, Village of Milan, and neighboring jurisdictions/agencies. All County Staff are required to wear face mask while in public.

NMDOH and CDC Current Recommendations:

Handwashing, cough and sneeze into upper arm or tissue, social distancing, encourage sick staff to stay home (especially those with fever)

Revised Testing Criteria for COVID-19 April 1, 2020

- The New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) is providing revised testing criteria announced by Department of Health Cabinet Secretary Kathy Kunkel during Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham's news conference Tuesday afternoon (4.1.20).
- Thanks to increased statewide testing capacity, the following people may now be considered for COVID-19 testing:
 - Asymptomatic people who are close contacts or household members of New Mexico residents who have already tested positive for the coronavirus;
 - Asymptomatic residents in nursing homes;
 - Asymptomatic people in congregant settings such as homeless shelters, group homes, detention centers;
 - Symptomatic people displaying the COVID-19 symptoms of cough, fever or shortness of breath.

Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center

reports 104 new COVID-19 cases, and two new death

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. – On Wednesday, the Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center (HCOC) confirmed an additional 104 positive cases of COVID-19, bringing the total number to 1,977 positive cases on the Navajo Nation, which includes 920 males, 1,057 females, and an average age of 46-years old. The total number of deaths is 62, which includes 41 males, 21 females, and an average age of 65-years old. A total of 11,404 COVID-19 tests have been administered with 8,239 negative test results.

The Navajo Nation COVID-19 cases by county:

- McKinley County (New Mexico): 504
- Navajo County (Arizona): 468
- Apache County (Arizona): 450
- Coconino County (Arizona): 274
- San Juan County (New Mexico): 202
