MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF CITY COUNCIL

Mayor Robert Money called to order the August 8th, 2022, regular meeting of the Board of City Council at 6:00 pm.

Councilman Ricky Hurst led all in the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk, Crissy Cunningham, called for attendance.

Motion to approve the regular meeting minutes from the July 11, 2022, meeting and the special meeting minutes from the July 27, 2022, meeting passed with a motion by Councilman Van Alexander and a second by Councilwoman Angie Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Ms. Crystal Ruark was present for the Flemingsburg Fleming County Chamber of Commerce. Ruark thanked everyone for support of the golf scramble and use of the annex for the day camp. Many events will take place in August including the 1st day of school, Explore Fleming Co. meeting, Smokin BBQ Fest, and an evening CPR class. September events include a workforce development conference, a first responders' parade and dinner, small business awards dinner, Supper on the Bridge and the Vietnam Traveling memorial wall.

A motion to amend the Tourism Interlocal Agreement passed with a motion by Councilwoman Amy Bolar and a second by Councilman Ricky Hurst. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Mr. Rob Conn reported on Code Enforcement. Conn reported it is a busy time for violations. Homelessness continues to be an issue. The missing person case is also ongoing. A reward is now being offered as well.

Mr. Dave Gray was present for FCA-TV. He advised programming is going well. The presentation from the UK students will air soon and then fall programming.

Chief Bowling reported that Fleming County dispatch is working on obtaining a grant to update the CAD system. It will improve communication. The school received a safety grant to update their security; the video will feed directly to dispatch and the police department. Officer Smith will be returning October 1. Brian Cooper returned from summer break on August 1.

Public Works Director, Joe Dunaway has had crews helping install the solar lights. Five bids were received for the Dorothy Street project. The bid was awarded to Thompson Bros. for \$165,150. Dunaway plans to meet with Mr. Joey Harmon on his apartment project to discuss

utilities; it may not need engineering services to move forward. Workers are here for the Taco Bell project. Mr. Dunaway also shared some cost increases and his recommendation to raise the water and gas tap fees. Motion to move forward to amend the ordinance concerning said fees passed with a motion by Councilman Van Alexander and a second by Councilman Ricky Hurst. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Mayor Money advised council to let him know if they want to attend the KLC Conference September 20-23.


There being no further city business, the meeting was properly adjourned at 6:46 pm.
