MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF CITY COUNCIL  
MONDAY, JANUARY 10, 2022, 6:00 PM

Mayor Robert Money called to order the January 10, 2022, regular meeting of the Board of City Council at 6:00 pm.

Councilman Danny Carpenter led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion to approve the minutes from the December 13, 2021, meetings passed with a motion by Mr. Van Alexander and a second by Mr. Ricky Hurst. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Ms. Amy Kennedy, Executive Director for Buffalo Trace Area Development District was present. Ms. Kennedy discussed the grant from 2003 that was used to build the Fisher Building Apartments. At that time, the loan was designed to be forgiven by the city.

Motion to approve a Resolution for CDBG Loan Forgiveness passed with a motion by Ms. Angie Graham and a second by Mr. Danny Carpenter. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Ms. Kennedy also discussed some new information on use of ARPA funds; the limit for the loss revenue calculation has been opened to \$10 million. Reports will still be required per their schedule. Mid-May the 2<sup>nd</sup> halves of payments will begin to be dispersed.

Mayor Money advised no contractors to bid on the renovation for the Princess Theatre, but Nathan Johnson has decided to look at it for a possible bid submission.

There was no new business.

Mr. Joe Dunaway provided his department report. Mr. Rob Conn discussed permits he had issued for storage buildings and fencing. Mr. David Gray advised programming is going well for FCA-TV.

Police Chief, Brian Bowling welcomed everyone to visit the new Police Department. Bowling discussed opioid settlement monies will be paid out over 19 years. Funds could go out as early

as May 2022. Body cameras have been ordered. The PD is also working on accreditation; an Office Administrator has been hired with Grant funds. The grant will cover salary for two years.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee met this evening. They discussed the Princess Theatre and discussed notifying the owners of the Fried Building about tin blowing off the roof.

The Parks & Recreation Committee met this evening. They have not received any quarterly funds from the City. This will be checked on and reported back.

Councilman Carpenter praised the Shop with a Cop program as well as the Holiday Hoopla. He had been given concerns from some about lighting downtown. There was discussion we would contact KU about the lighting.

Councilwoman Bolar reported how much she enjoyed the Police Department Open House.

Councilman Alexander also reported how much he enjoyed the Police Department Open House.

Councilwoman Graham reported she loved the Holiday Hoopla, and it was the best Christmas parade she could remember. She thanked everyone for their help decorating downtown and complimented the new Police Station.

Councilman Hurst agreed with the other comments and compliments.

There being no further city business, the meeting was properly adjourned at 6:37 pm.
