

**CITY OF FLEMINGSBURG
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF CITY COUNCIL
MONDAY, MAY 9, 2022, 6:00 PM
CITY ANNEX BUILDING**

Mayor Robert Money called to order the May 9th, 2022, regular meeting of the Board of City Council at 6:09 pm.

Councilman Danny Carpenter led all in the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk, Crissy Cunningham, called for attendance.

Motion to approve the regular meeting minutes from the April 11, 2022, meeting passed with a motion by Councilman Van Alexander and a second by Councilman Ricky Hurst. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Motion to approve second reading of an ordinance of the city of Flemingsburg, Kentucky fixing the compensation of its elected officials (both annual and per diem) for terms commencing January 1, 2023 and set in the year the official is elected pursuant to KRS 83A.070(1) passed with a motion by Councilman Blake Harmon and a second by Councilman Ricky Hurst. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Motion to approve a resolution approving application for and administration of a KOHS grant to be used for community preparedness passed with a motion by Councilman Ricky Hurst and a second by Councilman Van Alexander. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Motion to accept a resolution to acquire/develop/renovate recreation resources by application of 50% project cost Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant passed with a motion by Councilman Blake Harmon and a second by Councilwoman Angie Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Motion to approve a resolution adopting and approving the execution of a Municipal Aid Co-op Program Contract between the City and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Transportation Cabinet, Department of Rural and Municipal Aid for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, as provided in the KRS, and accepting all streets referred to therein as being streets which are a part of the Incorporated City passed with a motion by Councilman Blake Harmon and a second by Councilman Danny Carpenter.

Ms. Kristie Dodge was present from the Buffalo Trace Area Development District. Dodge discussed the Dorothy Street project and which funds to use for said project. ARC funds are not guaranteed, and the application process is very lengthy. ARPA funds are available now. Motion to withdraw the ARC application and proceed with ARPA funds passed with a motion by Councilman Danny Carpenter and a second by Councilman Van Alexander. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Mayor Money advised the CPI for this year was 7% per the Department for Local Government.

Mayor Money reported the Public Hearing for the LWCF Application will be held here at the annex on May 16th.

Money discussed complaints of walkers on Clark Street and the lack of sidewalk. The Kentucky Department of Transportation is requiring the city to take care of this for an estimated cost of \$169,000. State funds can be applied for in August. Motion to proceed with application of state funds passed with a motion by Councilman Ricky Hurst and a second by Councilwoman Angie Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Money entertained a motion for the city to donate funds of \$500 each to the Cruising for Kids event and the upcoming Rod Run event. Motion to donate funds to each event passed with a motion by Councilwoman Amy Bolar and a second by Councilwoman Angie Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Ms. Candy Dales requested on behalf of the Fleming County FRYSC, access to the Old Reservoir to host fishing/aquatics camp this summer July 19-20. Motion to approve request passed with a motion by Councilwoman Amy Bolar and a second by Councilman Ricky Hurst.

Code Enforcement Officer, Mr. Rob Conn provided a written report in the council packets. Conn discussed trainings and abilities of the iWorq software. Conn also discussed the increasing homelessness issues in Flemingsburg.

Mr. David Gray was present to report for FCA-TV. He announced he had covered the Cruising for Kids car show and the Meet the Candidates events.

Chief of Police, Brian Bowling, reported it had been very busy. Narcan training was held. The accreditation process is continuing. The grant used to hire Malleri can be extended to pay her for 3 years instead of 2; only the time, not the money will be extended. The UK Students will begin their project to give suggestions to improve downtown next week. They will be here every Thursday for approximately the next 12 weeks. The radio over the internet program has begun being used and is proven to be a big asset.

Public Works Director, Joe Dunaway, provided a written report in the council packets. Dunaway also shared the Outstanding Wastewater Treatment Plant Award that was presented to the Flemingsburg Wastewater Treatment Plant for Eastern Kentucky. Dunaway advised the contractor will start on the shelter house this week; solar lights have been ordered and him and the mayor have been working on an application for blacktop funding. The Annual Rod Run will be held on June 11th; with a rain date of June 25th.


The Buildings and Grounds committee met but has nothing to report yet.

The Parks and Recreation Committee is working on plans for the city park.


There being no further city business, the meeting was properly adjourned at 6:57 pm.
