MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF CITY COUNCIL
MONDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2022, 6:00 PM

Mayor Robert Money called to order the October 10, 2022, regular meeting of the Board of City Council at 6:00 pm.

Councilman Danny Carpenter led all in the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk, Crissy Cunningham, called for attendance.

Motion to approve the regular meeting minutes from the September 16th, 2022 meeting passed with a motion by Councilwoman Bolar and a second by Councilman Alexander. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Ms. Melanie Jones was present from the Tourism Commission. Jones reported on the success of the summer palooza and thanked everyone for attending. The event is planned for next year as well. Ms. Jones requested use of the park for the upcoming holiday hoopla in December. Motion to approve Tourism's request for the use of the park passed with a motion by Councilman Hurst and a second by Councilwoman Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Motion to approve a resolution designating the city clerk as the business officer and the assistant city clerk as assistant business officer regarding any credit cards issued to the city passed with a motion by Councilman Harmon and a second by Councilwoman Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Motion to accept the recommendation of the Ewing, Flemingsburg, and Fleming County Planning Commission for a zone amendment at 424 E. Water St., Flemingsburg Kentucky from low density residential (R-1), to moderate density residential (R-2) passed with a motion by Councilman Hurst and a second by Councilman Alexander. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Councilman Alexander provided the Greater Fleming Co. Water report. Discussed the towers need painting; KIA funds will help take care of that.

Mr. David Gray was present to report for FCA-TV. He recently covered the tractor parade and did a Perspectives with Chief Bowling about the Freedom Award received by the Flemingsburg Police Department.

Chief Bowling was present to report for the police department. Bowling advised he has requested additional time for the grant to obtain accreditation which would allow two years from now. Bowling

thanked everyone for their support regarding the Freedom Award. At the Chamber Awards dinner, the Police Department received the Community Service Award. Cameras were installed at the police department to show live feed from the schools; dispatch updated their CAD system to radio directly to officers in their cars.

Councilman Harmon asked for an update on the leaking roof situation at the police department. There was discussion that the original contractor has attempted to fix, but he has no solution. Another roofer gave an opinion that the previous contractor would blame the A/C unit and the A/C contractor would blame the roofing contractor. The new contractor suggested a \$6,000 option so the water runs off. Councilman Harmon says the original contractor should pay for the repair. There was discussion that there was no contract for this project. It needs to be fixed. Motion to approve up to \$7,000 for the repair passed with a motion by Councilman Harmon and a second by Councilwoman Graham. Motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

Mr. Joe Dunaway was present to report for the public works department. Dunaway provided a handout concerning clean-up week. Dunaway advised he can report street light outages, but he needs an address. The Lions Club Auction will take place October 24-27th.

The Parks and Recreation committee is waiting on the grant approval before soliciting bids.

Mayor Money advised the Hillsboro and Ward Elementary schools fall festival will be October 22 at the park; Trick-or-Treat will be October 31st from 5-7pm.



There was discussion led by Councilman Hurst of a truck being parked on the corner of Courthouse Circle.
