The District has assisted this program for a couple of years. If approved an agreement will be executed conforming to the District's clean-up policy.

Item 3. Purchase of New Color Scanner.

The District constantly scans its archived records into digital files for long term storage and retrieval. The existing scanner is 11 years old and only scans in black and white. Staff would like to update and upgrade the scanner to color to keep up with change in our records. Staff used the state equipment contract to price various scanners meeting our specifications and the CANON DR 7550C was the least expensive.

Event Highlights!

- This event is produced by the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast with grant money from the Florida Inland Navigation District.
- More than 900 volunteers participated on Saturday, July 23, 2011.
- Volunteers reported to one of 21 registration sites in Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties. We covered approximately 125 miles of waterways.
- We removed a total of 8.5 tons of trash.
- Our participation was up by 10% over 2010 and we collected 10.3% less trash.
- Unusual items:
- Manatee Center Team worked together to remove a large industrial (earth mover type) tire.
- Diver's removed a volley ball net from Peck's Lake Reef

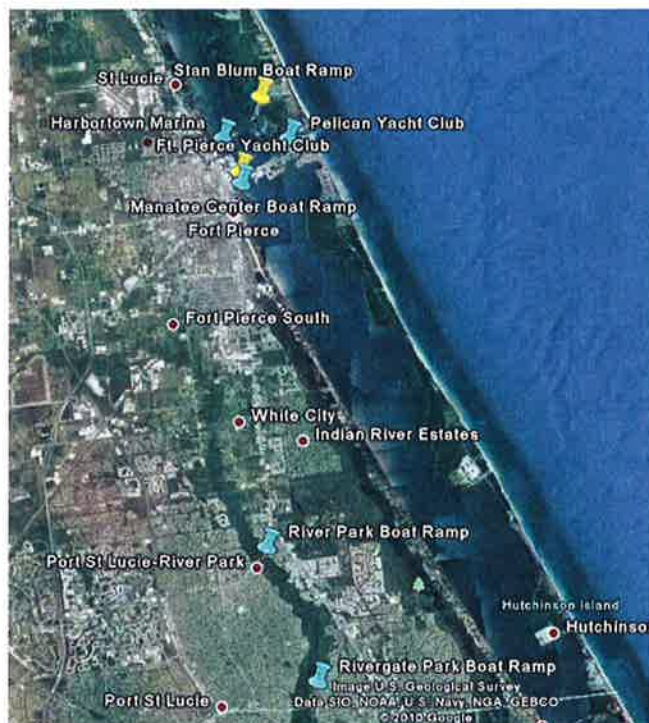

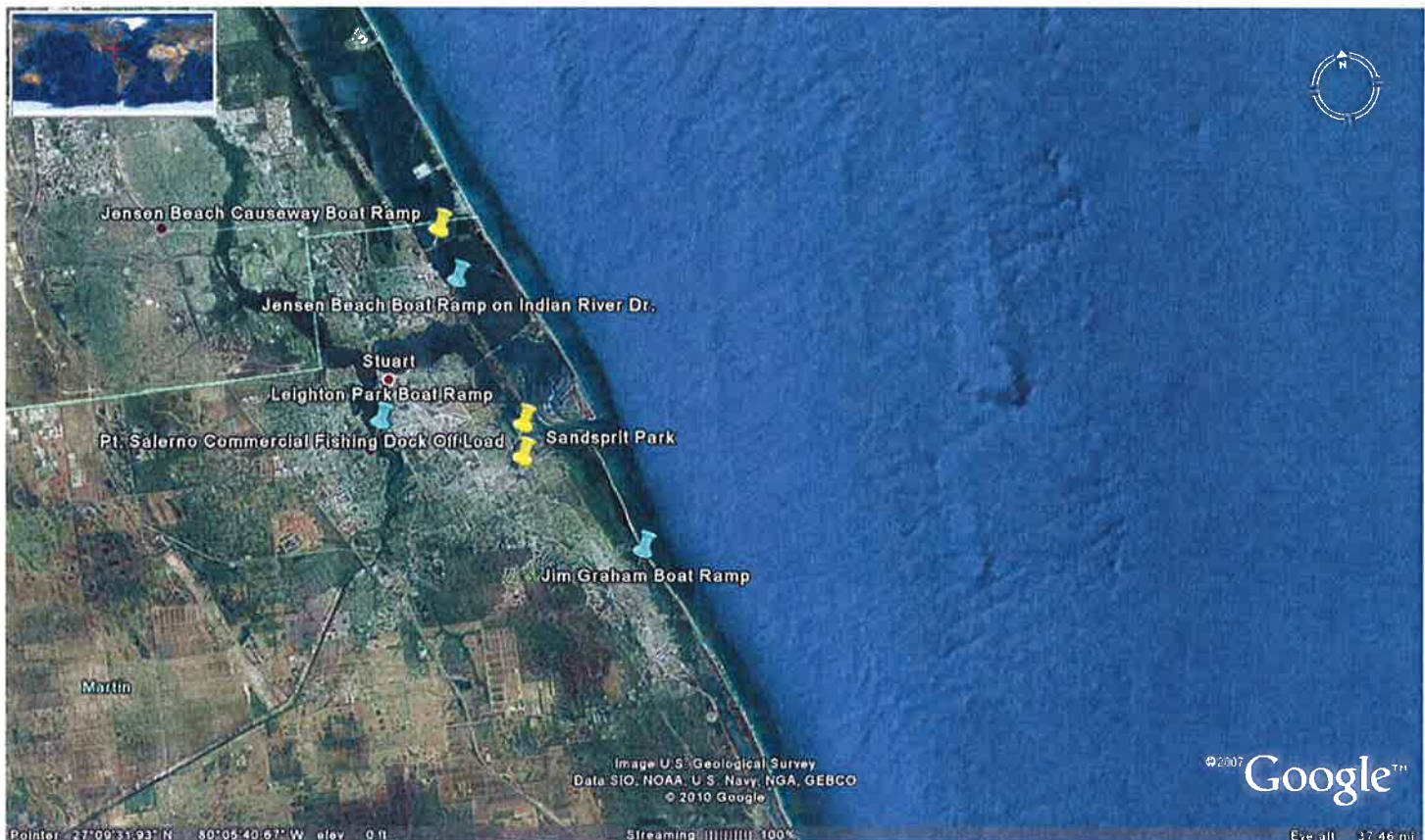

FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT
WATERWAY CLEAN UP PROGRAM POLICY

The following constitutes the policy of the Florida Inland Navigation District regarding the provision of funding for organized clean up programs for the waterways within the District.

1. The District shall fund a maximum of one clean up program per waterway, per year within a county, except for the provisions of items 7 through 9, below
2. The clean up program must be sponsored by a government agency or a not-for-profit corporation.
3. District funding shall be limited to \$5,000.00 per waterway, per county, except for the provisions of items 7 through 9, below.
4. The District shall be recognized in all written, audio or video advertising and promotions as a participating sponsor of the clean up program.
5. The funding provided by the District shall only be allocated to reimburse the applicant for out of pocket expenditures related to specific cleanup program expenses such as trash bags, trash collection, gloves, advertising, T-shirts etc... The funding provided by the District shall not be allocated for parties, food or beverages.
6. The District Board shall make all final decisions concerning the provision of funding for a clean up program.

In addition to the above requirements, a cleanup program implementing all of the following additional incentives will qualify for up to additional \$5,000 in clean up funds.

7. The clean up program budget must provide equal or greater matching funds for all Navigation District funding.
8. The applicant shall tally and report the composition and location of the waterway-related debris, with the goal to show definitive progress in the amount of refuse collected, a reduction in the overall debris in the waterway, or an increase in the number of additional waterway areas included in the clean up.
9. For each additional \$1,000 in Navigation District funding, the applicant shall coordinate a minimum of one waterway collection point or clean up area, or an applicant can conduct an additional waterway cleanup program for the waterway areas.
