### Event Highlights!

- This event is produced by the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast with grant money from the Florida Inland Navigation District.
- 1,045 volunteers participated in 2013.
- Volunteers reported to one of 23 registration sites in Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties. We covered approximately 125 miles of waterways.
- We removed a total of 7.6 tons of trash.
- Our participation was up by 9% over 2010 and we collected about the same amount of trash.
- Since 2008: 4,550+ volunteers, 1,600+ Boats & 53.2+ Tons of Trash Removed
- Unusual items:

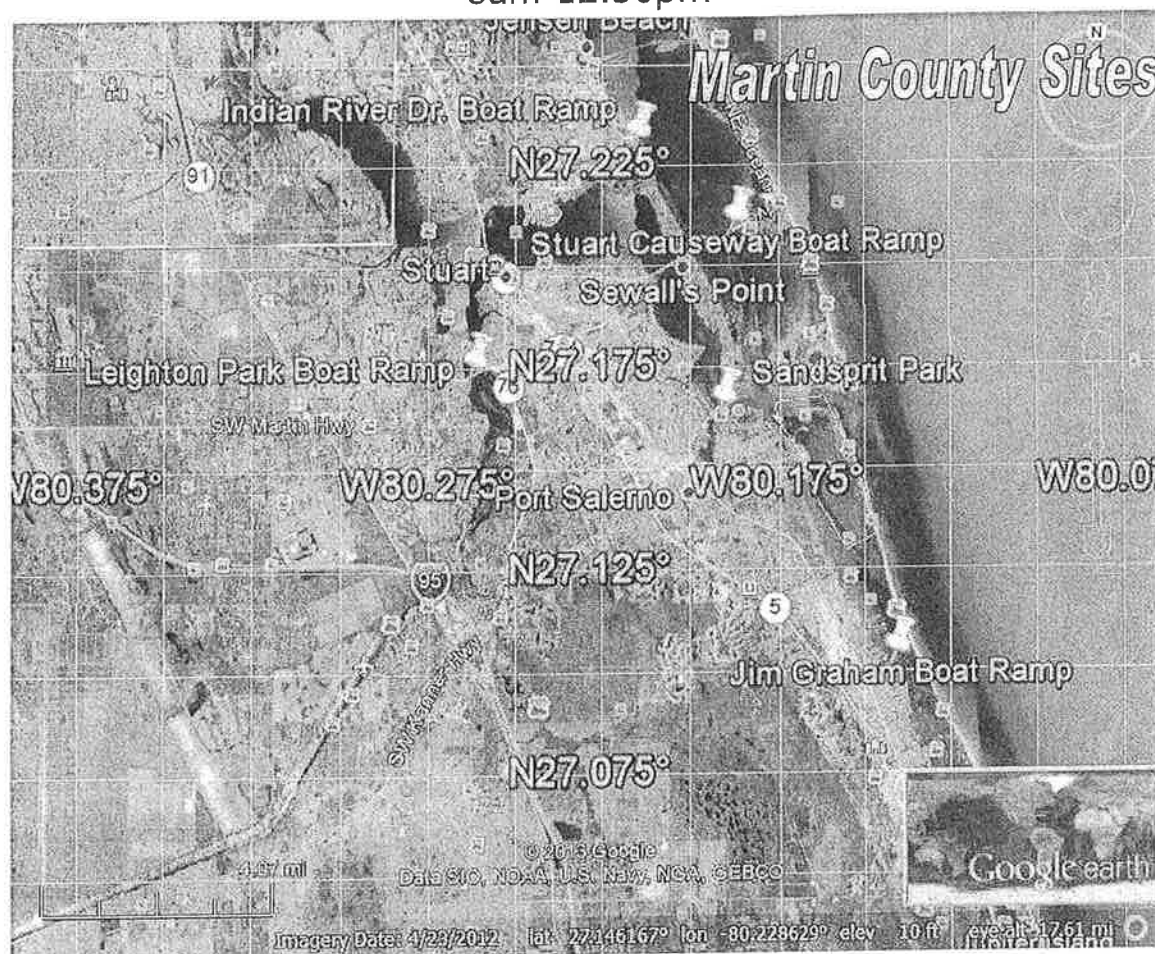

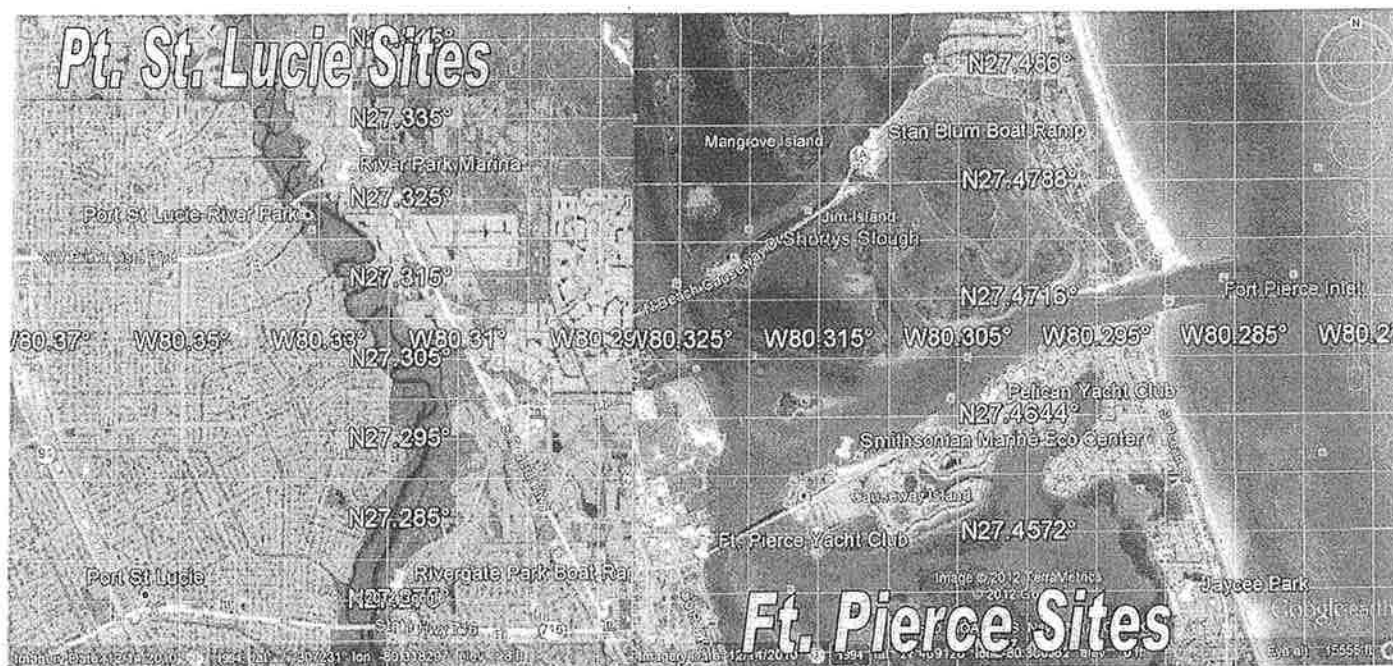

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#### **6th Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup Scores Tons of Trash**

**Stuart, FL – (August 26, 2013)** — The Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast (MIATC) conducted its 6th Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup on Saturday, July 27, 2013. Thanks to sponsorship from the Florida Inland Navigation District, over 1000 volunteers came out to collect trash along the waterways of Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties in the one day event.

After weeks of wet summer weather, the sun shined brightly for the one thousand plus volunteers, who set out from 24 different sites to remove trash from 125 miles of waterways in the region. The cleanup also included an offshore reef dive at Peck Lake, conducted by the Port Salerno Commercial Fishing Dock Authority (PSCFDA) and supported by the Southeast Florida Coral Reef Initiative and Stuart Scuba. "More than 60 divers participated in the reef cleanup," said Butch Olsen, Jr., president of PSCFDA. "Divers found mostly cans, bottles, monofilament and a couple of lead lines. Divers who have participated each year were all saying that they were seeing less trash than in past years."

"We are very pleased with this year's effort," said Charlie Hayek, St. Lucie County Team Coordinator. "This year we have been able to increase our recycling efforts in all three counties thanks to a significant sponsorship from Waste Pro. Volunteers have recorded 7.6 tons of trash to

date and data cards are still trickling in. We incorporated a new site this year at the Jaycee Park Boat Ramp and were pleased to record a turnout of 41 people working that site. Together we all made a BIG difference."

Participants who registered in the event were asked to tally up their findings on a data card. Team Charmer was able to aid in the recovery of 30 baby sea turtles who's nest had been ravaged by a raccoon at Peck Lake Reef Park. Throughout the Treasure Coast volunteer's removed several bicycles, batteries, air conditioner compressors, boat parts, BBQ grills, bottles, cans, thousands of feet of fishing line and thousands of cigarette butts. "From Indian River County to Martin County volunteers reported similar conditions from previous years. The Data Cards to date confirm less trash was collected," said April Price, Event Coordinator for the cleanup. "We counted more volunteers and a similar amount of trash from 2012, so I feel that we are making a difference. I have a personal goal to hold this event and have the volunteers find no trash, so we still have a long way to go."

Volunteers and sponsors were recognized at an Appreciation Bar-B-Que at the Ft. Pierce Yacht Club on Sunday, August 11th. "Everyone was anxious to hear the three county totals and we really want to show appreciation for their hard work", said Price. "This event was a real success and we are already planning next year's cleanup which will take place on July 26th, 2014."

Attached for the Governing Board's consideration is a request for Waterway Cleanup Assistance to fund a clean-up on September 20, 2014 for the 26<sup>th</sup> Annual Halifax and Indian River Lagoon (HIRL) and 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Ocean Conservancy International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) hosted by Volusia County Environmental Management. Prior to 2012, these events were held separately, on different dates, and organized by different programs within Volusia County Environmental Management. In 2012, these cleanups were successfully combined to be held on the same day (September 21<sup>st</sup>) and organized by the same program. In 2013, this combination event had record breaking attendance with **1,775 volunteers** that participated and cleaned **83 miles** on foot, motor boat, scuba, paddleboard and kayak from **46 sign-in locations**.

During this event, participants not only remove and dispose of the trash from our waterways, but they record the types of trash found on a data card provided by the Ocean Conservancy. In total, **111,463 total trash items** were collected and recorded including approximately **739 yards of fishing line**, **13 appliances**, **662 balloons**, and **30 tires**. The top ten items collected during the event were:



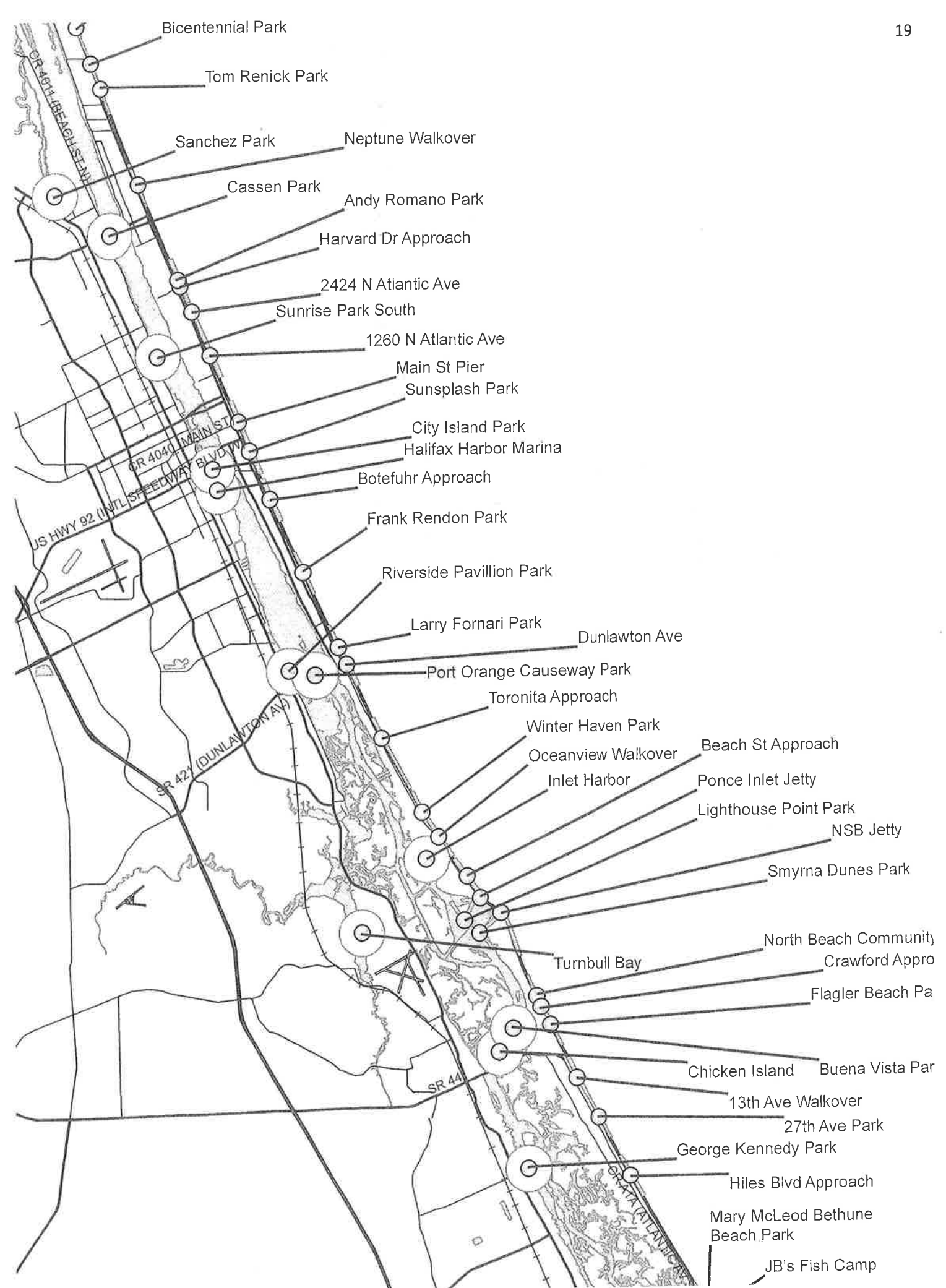

On behalf of the Keep Jacksonville Beautiful Commission and the City of Jacksonville, thank you for allowing us to apply for financial assistance for the organized removal of refuse within the District's waterway in Duval County.

For several years, the Florida Inland Navigation District's generosity has allowed us to purchase needed supplies for our annual International Coastal Cleanup, as part of the Great American Cleanup, promoted by Keep America Beautiful, of which Keep Jacksonville Beautiful is an affiliate.

Because of F.I.N.D.'s consistent, generous support, KJB has been able to remove trash and debris from the Atlantic Ocean, St. Johns River, Intercoastal Waterway and local streams and creeks. In fact, in the past five years, 89,200 pounds of debris were collected by 3,666 volunteers who donated 7,575 hours. That's a savings to the environment and to the city budget—the volunteer value for all of those hours was \$81,165.24, and the cost avoidance amounts to \$59,966!
