Dear Mr. Crosley:

Please find enclosed a completed Small-Scale Derelict Vessel Removal Program Application submitted on behalf of the Miami-Dade County Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources' Division of Environmental Resources Management (DERM). DERM is applying for funding for the removal and disposal of eleven (11) derelict vessels located in the District's waterways within Miami-Dade County. Six (6) of the vessels were removed in September and October of 2014 while removal of the remaining five (5) is underway. The vessels' locations are within approximately 0.75 to 2 miles of the Intracoastal Waterway and all represent(ed) a hazard to navigation and to the environment.

The contracted cost for the removal and disposal of these vessels totals \$46,505.00. We are requesting that FIND fund approximately 64.5 percent of these costs (i.e. \$30,000.00). The remaining contracted costs will be paid for by Miami-Dade County's Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund and FWC's Florida Boating Improvement Program. Please note that the contracted costs are based on the lowest bids received from pre-qualified vendors via a competitive bidding process. Additionally, all costs related to management and oversight of the project are born by Miami-Dade County and are not included in the \$46,505.00 contracted cost.

In addition to the required Attachments A and B of the application, enclosed are FWC derelict vessel database reports for each of the eleven derelict vessels, photographs of the derelict vessels (when obtainable), an aerial photo map showing the vessels' locations, and a contractor bid sheet and invoice. We respectfully request that this application be considered at the next scheduled meeting of the FIND Commission.

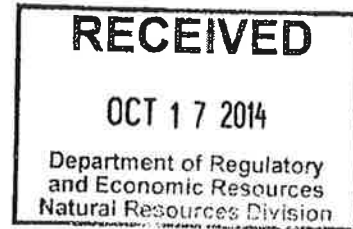

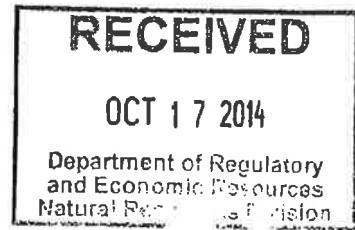

I am happy to inform you that Miami-Dade County is already working on the celebration of Baynanza 2015. We have greatly appreciated the support for our annual Baynanza Biscayne Bay Cleanup Day by the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) in past years, and look forward to working together again with FIND in 2015.

The 33rd annual Biscayne Bay Cleanup Day is scheduled for April 25, 2015, and is expected to draw over 6,000 community participants. These volunteers from all over Miami-Dade County are dedicated to cleaning our shores and nearby islands of debris.

The Florida Inland Navigation District has been an outstanding supporter of Baynanza, and we are looking forward to maintaining our partnership. For this purpose, we are asking for the same contribution from previous years of \$10,000 from FIND. This contribution will assist us with the funding of the Baynanza t-shirts that are provided to all participating volunteers. The cost of the t-shirts is approximately \$26,000 for 7,400 shirts (see attached). Baynanza t-shirts help generate excitement about participation in this event and are an essential element in educating our community about the importance of protecting our waterways and marine environment. Baynanza's History

Baynanza was created in 1982 in an effort by Miami-Dade County to save Biscayne Bay, and to date, it's the largest coastal cleanup in South Florida. This program was created when local community leaders and Miami-Dade County joined forces with other government and private agencies to raise awareness about the dire conditions of one of our most important natural resources, Biscayne Bay. At the time, the Bay was being threatened by the direct impact of pollution from sewage runoff, marine debris, and other contaminants. The main idea for the creation of Baynanza was to get the community involved in the efforts to bring Biscayne Bay back to life, and the name came from a play of words between bonanza and bay. Thirty years later, the Baynanza Biscayne Bay Cleanup Day, has become a staple in the local efforts to clean our coastal areas and community awareness. On this day, thousands of volunteers go out to more than two dozen sites throughout Miami-Dade County to pick up several tons of trash from the shorelines and nearby islands of the Bay. But Baynanza is more than just a 1-day event. This internationally known program is comprised of more than 45 great environmental events organized by several local agencies and sponsors. Overall, Baynanza runs from March to April every year, giving the community an array of educational events to choose from.

Baynanza's Current Success


Miami-Dade County hosted the 32nd anniversary of the Baynanza Biscayne Bay Cleanup Day on Saturday, April 26, 2014. Almost 6,100 community volunteers participated at 23 cleanup sites. At the end of the day, the Baynanza volunteers managed to collect a record amount of more than 45 tons of trash from the shoreline of Biscayne Bay.

Baynanza 2015

The Baynanza 2015 Biscayne Bay Cleanup Day is scheduled to take place on Saturday, April 25th and is expected to draw over 6,000 community participants. These volunteers will help to clean 23 sites and 16 islands in Biscayne Bay (see attached). Collectively, we hope to pick up more than 40 tons of trash from our waterways.
