Dear Ms. Zimmerman:

We are requesting \$5,000 in assistance towards our cleanup efforts of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway, as well as other waterways within Nassau County. Keep Nassau Beautiful, Inc. (KNB) wishes to use this year's funding to greatly enhance our ongoing and future waterway cleanup efforts.

As you know, rivers, with tributaries that crisscross our interior, bound mainland Nassau County on three sides. Annually, we conduct the St Marys River Celebration (March 21, 2015), a one day volunteer event which focuses on the major waterways of Nassau County.

Last year's event saw 630 volunteers providing 3,150 hours while collecting 35,000 pounds of refuse from the St Marys, Amelia (Intracoastal), and Nassau Rivers. This is a massive undertaking and requires extensive logistical coordination. Site Captains at 21 separate locations are the primary supervisors with two overall geographic managers leading the efforts.

This cleanup is highly resource intensive and requires coordination with numerous community agencies and businesses in order to fully execute a successful event. Your assistance will insure our ability to continually increase participation and secure the necessary equipment to fully support the undertaking.

We look forward to a long and beneficial relationship serving the citizens of Nassau County.

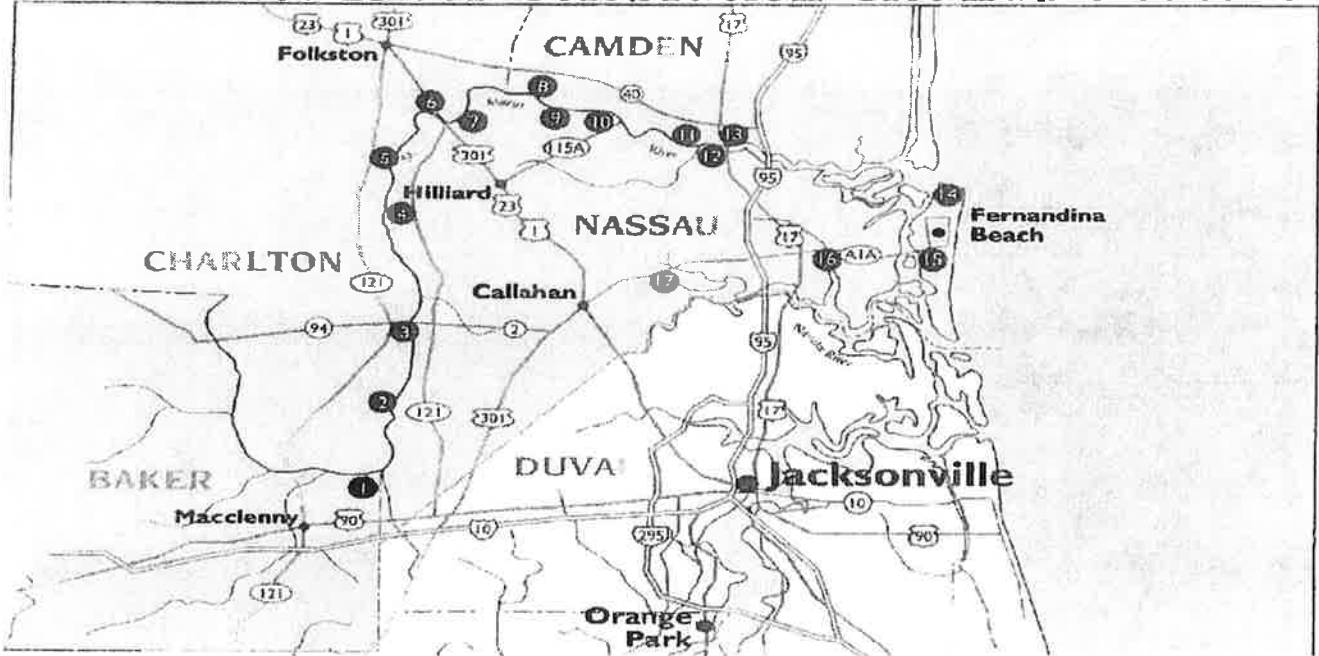

Attached for the Governing Board's consideration is a request for Waterway Cleanup Assistance to fund a clean-up on September 19, 2015 for the 27th Annual Halifax and Indian River Lagoon (HIRL) and 30th Annual Ocean Conservancy International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) hosted locally by Volusia County Environmental Management. Prior to 2012, these events were held separately, on different dates, and organized by different program areas within Volusia County Environmental Management. In 2012, these cleanups were successfully combined to be held on the same day and organized by the same program personnel. In 2014, despite rainy weather, this combination event had a great volunteer turnout with **942 adults and 259 children under 12** in attendance. They cleaned **over 7,100 pounds of trash and recyclables** from **41 coastal sites** on foot, motor boat, scuba, paddleboard and kayak. This includes over 600 pounds of fishing line and debris removed during an underwater scuba event at the Ponce Inlet north jetty.

During this event, participants not only remove and dispose of the trash and recyclables from our waterways, but they record the types of trash found on a data card provided by the Ocean Conservancy. In total during 2014, **89,823 total trash items** were collected and recorded by volunteers. This included approximately **789 yards of fishing line, 9 appliances, 24 tires, 593 balloons and, the most cigareete butts ever removed during a local event, at 48,798 individual filters**. The top ten items collected during the event were:

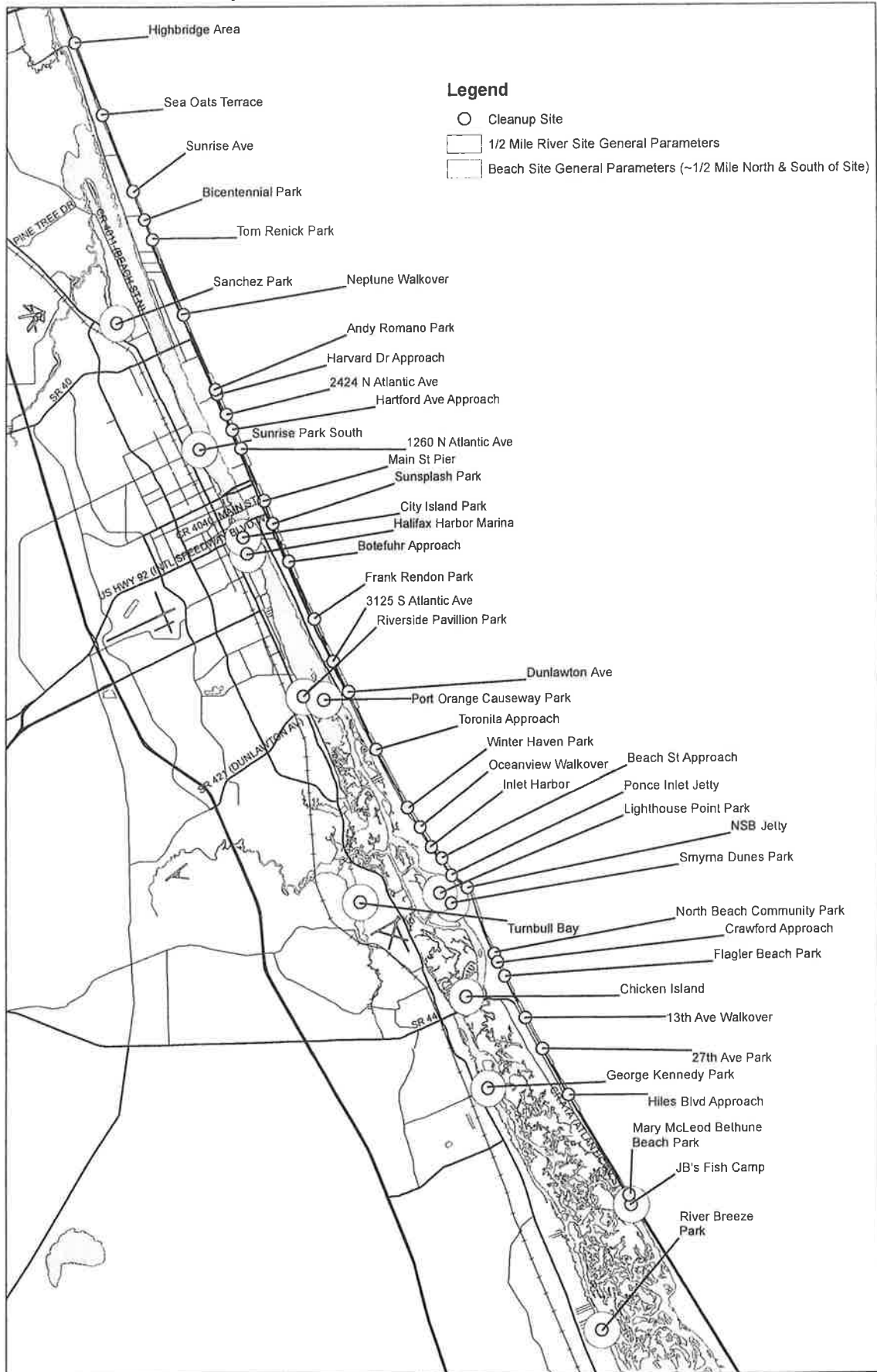

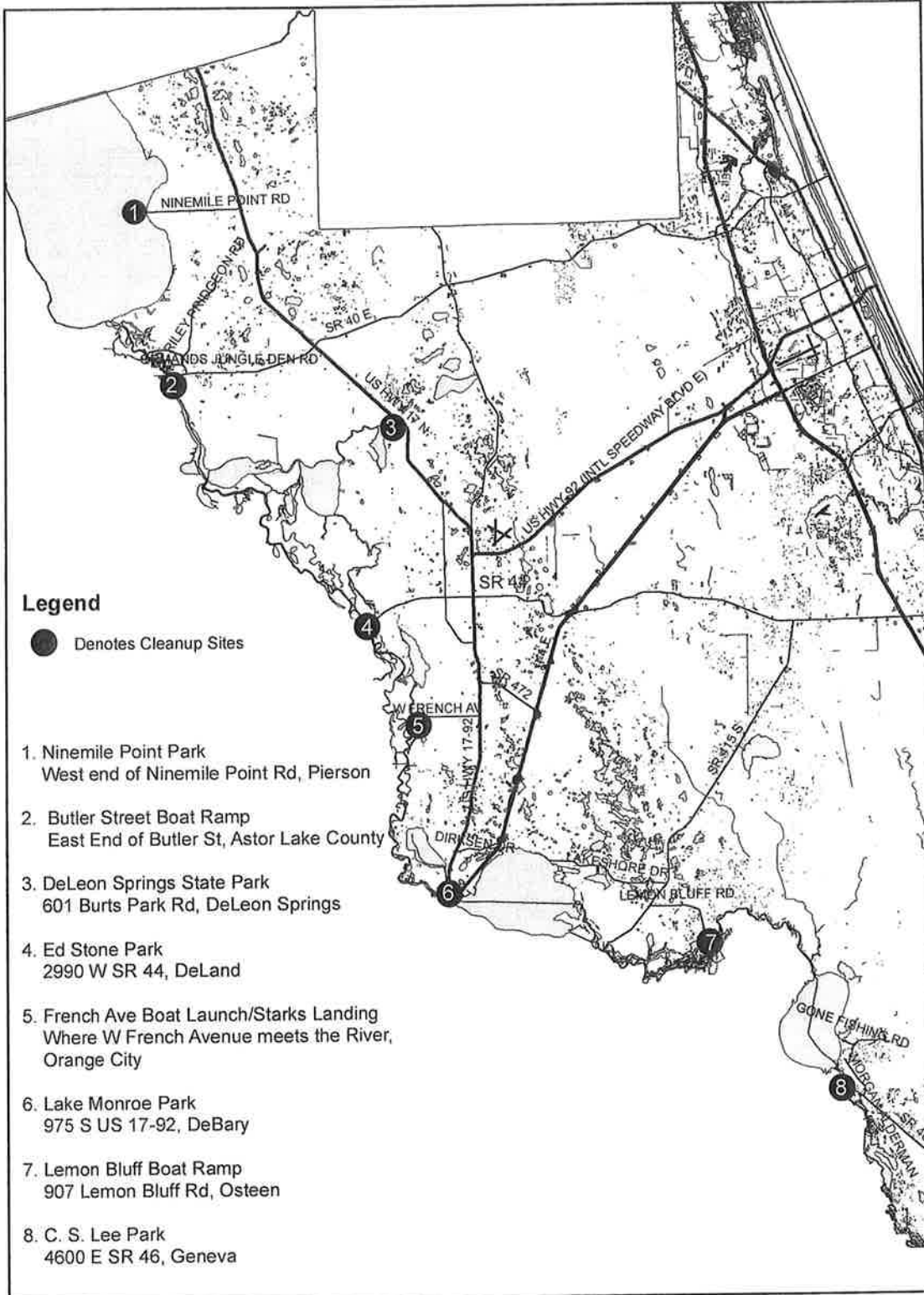
