BROWARD COUNTY



Within Broward County, The Florida Inland Navigation District (District) is the state sponsor for Federal navigation projects along the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW). Nearly \$24 million has been invested in the Broward portion of the ICW in the past 10 years. These investments and the ICW itself generate significant economic impact throughout the twelve-county region and beyond.

Different modeling techniques were used to estimate the value created by the ICW. To find the share of property value that is attributable solely to the proximity to the ICW, hedonic modeling was used. Hedonic modeling for Broward County showed that proximity to the Intracoastal Waterway adds value to homes within 1500m of the ICW. In total, the ICW makes up about \$14 billion, or 5%, of the \$268 billion in Broward County property values. Annualized, the ICW makes up about \$844 million in actual sales value yearly.
