OVERFLOW IS NOT PERMITTED, <u>All trash must be bagged and fit inside of the closed trash cart</u>. 32 gallon trash bags weighing less than 50 pounds may be taken to the Transfer Station with an attached Excess Bags sticker at no extra cost.

<u>Landscape waste collection</u> uses biodegradable, 2-ply paper bags. One \$1.00 Excess Bag sticker must be attached to each landscape waste bag. Landscape is picked up city-wide on Mondays 3/20/23 – 12/4/23.

<u>Excess Bag stickers</u> can be purchased at: Beck Oil (East 2nd & Tenney St), Farm King, JoJo's, CVS, Shell Express, Sullivan Foods, Wal-Mart, Casey's, and City Hall. Stickers are \$1.00 each.

<u>Burn days</u> are in April, May, June, September, October, and November. Burn days are Wednesdays and Saturdays (weather permitting). Check our website at <u>www.cityofkewanee.com</u> or call 852-2611 ext 6, after 8:00 a.m. to confirm if the conditions are right for burning that day.

<u>Transfer Station</u> hours are Monday through Friday 7:00 a.m. -11:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. -3:00 p.m. (closed on scheduled holidays),

<u>Saturday Transfer Station</u> hours will be from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. on the following Saturdays: 4/22/23, 5/13/23, 5/27/23, 6/10/23, 6/24/23, 7/8/23, 7/22/23, 8/12/23, 8/26/23, 9/9/23, 9/23/23
