RE: Council Meeting of **Monday**, **June 27**, **2022**

REGULAR MEETING AT 7:00 P.M.

- 1. Audit— CLA continues to work on the audit, holding weekly meetings remotely with staff to get answers to any questions and work through the audit process. To date, there are no red flags or issues that threaten to hold up the completion of the work. At this point we would project a September completion of the FY22 Audit.
- 2. **Consumer Confidence Report** The City's consumer Confidence Report is available on the City's website. There were no detected violations of drinking water standards during the reported year and the report certifying the notification process for the report has been completed for submittal to the Environmental Protection Agency. The reports are required to be available by July 1st of each year.
- 3. **EMS Agreements** We are in the early stages of adjusting contracted rates with the Kewanee Community Fire District for EMS Service, similar to the approach that was taken with regard to the Neponset Fire Protection District. The Fire District's rates have not been adjusted in a long time and need to more accurately reflect the costs incurred to provide service outside of our municipal coverage area.
- 4. **Training Grant** As expected, the City received a grant from the American Job Center for training new employees to the Paramedic level. The grant enables us to adequately staff at the level needed to maintain our ALS level of service without incurring unsustainably high training costs.
- 5. **City Hall** We've experienced some issues with the HVAC system and the roof may need to be replaced prior to the installation of the solar panels on the building. We're evaluating our options and looking into the life expectancies versus the actual conditions of the systems in place to develop recommendations for your consideration next month.
- 6. **Striping** We don't yet have answers to the questions that were asked about costs, but we wanted to assure you that the topic is still on our radar.
- 7. **Community Development Hiring** The part-time position in Community Development was offered to Kathleen Weber. We expect her employment to begin with the City in approximately two weeks.

- 8. **Boiler Property** Staff has a meeting next week with representatives from Henry County to discuss options for remediating the property and returning it to a productive use. We'll let you know of any progress that comes of the meeting.
- 9. **Starcom Radio Funding** It was brought to our attention that there may be some confusion over the source of funding for the Starcom Radios. You may recall that the ARPA funds for Covid Relief were being spent primarily on infrastructure improvements for water and sewer as authorized in the act. Funding for the Starcom Radio system was coming entirely from the fund balance in the General Fund.
- 10. **McClure Street** The posting for the Cemetery Laborer position has been made. We expect this to be filled internally and for a few more shifts in personnel to happen before we end up with an opening for an entry level position in Public Works.
- 11. **Fire Department Graduation** Greg Rusk, William Brunson, and Ryleigh Clark will graduate from the Peoria Fire Academy on July 1st. They will be certified in Basic Firefighter Operations, HAZ-MAT Operations, and other certifications that are pre-requisites to more training as they advance their careers. We have received favorable reports from the instructors at the academy about their performance and are excited to have them back on their regular shifts.
- 12. **Fire Department Training** Markus Murphy passed his National EMT-B exam and is now certified to work in our EMS system. He will be joining 4 others this fall to begin his paramedic training funded by the aforementioned grant.
- 13. **Fire Department Training (Part 2)** Yesterday the department participated in a drill along with Kewanee Community Fire Protection District and Mortenson, Inc., the company building the windmills west of Kewanee, on and around route 81. Scenarios involved an unresponsive patient inside an upright windmill and an injured patient inside a tube yet to be set upright. The training was well received and beneficial, as none of our EMT/Paramedics had ever been inside a windmill.
- 14. **EMS Ambulance Inspection** The EMS Coordinator for Genesis and a representative of the Illinois Department of Public Health will inspect and certify our ambulances next weeks as one of the final steps in our transition to the Genesis EMS System.

The June 13th 2022, Council Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. 5 members of the City Council were present in Chambers.

The Consent Agenda included the following items:

Motion made by Councilmember Komnick to approve consent agenda. A Seconded was made by Councilmember Faber. Discussion: None Motion Passed 5-0

Bills were presented in the amount of \$841,045.85

Councilmember Baker moved to approve payment of the bills. Councilmember Colomer seconded the motion. Discussion: The motion was approved 5-0.

- Public Comments: Amber Patch-Troxell stepped up to discuss the recent • accident on McClure and Dwight where a little boy was hit by a truck. Amber personally witnessed the accident and is wanting to get that road safer. She stated that this is not the first incident where a pedestrian was hit. Mayor Moore stated that after that night he reached out to the Chief of Police to see historical information on that intersection and road. After research there are guidelines that need to be followed to get a four way stop on that road. A study will need to be done if the traffic seems warranted. Baker asked on why there are other areas that have more stop signs with less traffic. Amber mentioned she doesn't know what the answer is but hopes we can fix it. There is a sign stating school zone, but it is faded. Colomer asked if we could the radar sign to help stop the speeding. Paula Baker asked about installing a speed bump. Chief Welgat stepped up to explain there have only been 3 accidents since 2001. A suggestion that he has is to talk to your kids on bikes. Teach them that they need to follow the rules of the road. Chief stated he does try to work with local kids. But regarding the speeding, we will install the speed sign and get a study and see what the actual numbers look like. Lacey Jackson stepped up to explain how she got hit. She was walking with her kids when a truck hit her blinded by the light. She states the road needs to be wider. Someone spoke up that there should be sidewalks. However then was stated that you can not ride your bike on the sidewalks. Colomer stated he has been preaching about this for a long time.
- Paula Baker stepped to ask who is responsible for the creek line. How can we make sure that is being mowed? Kevin Newton stated he would look into that.
- Dean Blank was curious about some mailings that he received and how to get some help with home repairs. We gave him a TMHR application.
- New Business:
- A. Consideration of Resolution #5351 authorizing the execution of documents that are necessary and proper for the sale of real estate Councilmember Colomer made the motion, Councilmember Faber seconded. Discussion: None Motion passed 5-0

B. Consideration of Resolution #5352 a resolution authorizing the execution of a purchase agreement and other documents that are necessary and proper in the procurement of Starcom radios and communication systems to be used by the City of Kewanee Councilmember Baker made the motion, Councilmember Faber seconded. Discussion: Moore asked Chief Welgat to explain the new radios. Welgat stated they tried them out with 2 handheld radios and never lost c9onnextion and could be heard crystal clear. Mayor Moore stated that is a huge plus. We need to keep our guys safe so they can keep the community safe. Motion passed 5-0

Mayor's Communications:

MAYOR COMMUNICATIONS 06/13/2022

The city posted a request recently regarding illegal dumping on the former site of the Kewanee Boiler Company. As is typically the case, the post drew fire because, in the opinion of some people, the City should not have sold the property to its present owner, should have held previous owners accountable to environmental remediation, and should have prevented dumping sooner. The City has never owned the Boiler Shop property; therefore, we have never sold it. The City has never been tasked, and in fact, is prohibited from true environmental regulation of private enterprise, and has never received a complaint from the owner that people are illegally dumping on his property.

I am not sure what the scope of work that was laid out when we had the repair done on N. Main St. near the intersection of E. 10th, but in my opinion the job was only half done. I know there is some uncertainty there because we are in the area where the state ends maintenance and we begin. At some point someone has to do the work that will properly fix the problem. One house in particular, had to add an extra support to their porch roof because of the problems caused when heavy vehicles hit the rough area.

The Daniels are still looking for a recommendation on adding a tube to their property so they can fill in the ditch on the south side of their property. I have gone down there and taken a closer look. I am no expert, but it appears to me with the current condition, eventually we aren't going to have no choice but do something. The tile on both sides of the road is beginning to collapse, and the sidewalk is sinking as well. Another concern I received from the Daniels, and I witnessed on another occasion while driving by, is children wanting to play in that ditch. Ms. Daniels appeared before us at a previous council meeting asking for some guidance. I know we are busy, but if we could begin to work with them on this project, we can hopefully take care of the sinking sidewalk, stop the road from further damage, and alleviate an eyesore and an attractive nuisance.

Council Communications:

• **Councilmember Colomer:** Is curious when we were getting the line striped on the specific locations. Colomer asked to get an update in the next memo and get a plan together before they get to bad.

• Councilmember Baker: Nothing

• **Councilmember Faber:** Asked if Chief Welgat to monito the grass being mowed and put into the streets. Welgat stated his officer is working on it and making contact. Faber is curious if we are still doing the free smoke alarms. Welgat stated yes if you called and are the list you will soon get one.

• **Councilmember Komnick:** Asked about getting the cooling centers on the website. Appreciates the discussion about the intersection and something that needs to be looked into.

• **Announcements:** City Hall will be closed to Observe Juneteenth on Monday June 20th. Trash and recycling will remain the same.

• Councilmember Colomer moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilmember Baker seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0 The meeting adjourned at 7:55 PM

As part of the Firefighter Recognition Program, employees of the Kewanee Fire Department are to be recognized for actions above and beyond the call of duty. Today, Monday, June 27th, Firefighter Kyle Bumphrey and Engineer Andrew Welgat will be recognized for actions taken in response to a potentially hazardous fire response.

On Thursday, May 26th, Kewanee Fire Department was dispatched to Cernovich's Auto & Truck Wrecking for a report of a fire. At the time of dispatch notification, 1 of the Fire Department ambulances was already on scene of a different EMS emergency, leaving only 2 firefighters to respond to this fire when response would normally consist of 5 personnel. Mr. Bumphrey and Mr. Welgat responded immediately in Engine 2. Upon arrival, the fire was found to be in a large pile of tires. The flames and smoke from this fire were reaching approximately 40 feet into the air with other combustible materials in the immediate area. With their Captain on the ambulance call and not yet on scene to direct operations, these 2 firefighters immediately deployed a hose line, donned their gear and breathing apparatus, engaged the pump on their Engine and began suppression efforts on the growing fire. Their immediate actions contained the fire to the area of origin and prohibited any spread of fire to the remaining tires. By relying on their extensive training in emergency situations, they were able to mitigate the problem and contain damage to the initial area. It would have been very easy to get caught up in the size of the fire and the fact they were alone until help arrived.

Therefore, the City of Kewanee, along with the Mayor and City Council, City Manager, and Fire Chief, hereby recognize and congratulate Kyle Bumphrey and Andrew Welgat for their actions. The Plan Commission convened on June 16, 2022, in the Council Chambers at Kewanee City Hall, commission members Edleman and Mirocha were absent. For business, there was one case to be heard.

Mulcahy wasn't sure who he spoke with but thought it was me (Keith Edwards). I told Mulcahy that I didn't remember the conversation, but it very well could have been me. We discussed the property and the use, and I told Mulcahy that I would get back in touch once I figure out what should be done, if anything. It should be noted that Mulcahy stated he has had conversations with the neighbors and has had no issues or complaints. The City has not received any complaints concerning the subject property.

After researching Airbnb, I've learned that Airbnb is a company/brand that markets Short-term rentals of single-family dwellings for a period of 29 days or less.

Bradley and I discussed the usage and agreed that Short-term Rental is a use that should be in our Zoning Codes as an allowed Special Use in Residential Zoning.

I called Mulcahy and advised that we felt there should be an amendment to the current allowed Special Uses to allow Short-term rentals. Mulcahy was understanding and stated he would comply with whatever would be required to keep the property in compliance with the City Ordinances. At the May 9, 2022 City Council meeting, the Council and Mayor all agreed that Short-term rentals/Airbnb would be a good option for our visitors. Mulcahy attended this meeting.

Attached to this packet is a copy of the ordinance that was written and passed, with no objections, by the City Council at the May 9, 2022 meeting.

I do not see any items of concern with this Special Use Permit request. At the end of this section are the three criteria that must be satisfied prior to recommending a Special Use Permit granted. Directly below is a set of typical stipulations that might be placed on a Special Use Permit for a Short-term rental:

- Edwards read the background information.
- Mulcahy described how an Airbnb works to the commission members.
- Morrison inquired about the International Reference Code (IRC) and International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) that was mentioned in the stipulations. Morrison stated he was under the impression that the City was still utilizing BOCA. Edwards advised that the International Code Council (ICC) has taken the place of BOCA (Building Officials and Code Administrators International) and the IRC is the Building Code for Residential structures and IPMC is the code that is used to enforce maintenance of buildings and property. Edwards said that the ICC codes are adopted by the city by ordinance.

There were no others present in support of the petition. There were no objectors.

Recommendation:

After discussing the facts and testimony presented, the Plan Commission, by a vote of seven in favor, none opposed, two absent, that the request for a Special Use Permit to use the existing building and property as a Short-Term Rental be granted.
