## MEMORANDUM

### REGULAR MEETING AT 7:00 P.M.

1. **Enterprise Zone** – The City finished 8th overall in the scoring, but there's not a direct correlation between scores and awarding of zones. Though the state has 9 zones expiring, they appear to have exceeded the maximum number of zones in previous years, and are attempting to pare it back. The next meeting of the board is September 16th in Chicago. We will continue to lobby for inclusion in the program based on its proven impact on the region.
2. **Beer Garden Fences** – Staff measured the height of existing fences surrounding beer gardens currently operating under a special use permit. Two fences were found to be below 6 ft. in height; those fences are at Illini Tap and Misty's. A portion of the fence at Illini tap stands at 5 feet 2 inches, while a portion of the fence at Misty's stands at 5 foot 9 inches in height.
3. **Façade Program** – The program continues to be popular among property owners in the downtown area. An application was recently submitted by People's National Bank and we have had discussions with a handful of other businesses in the area that are contemplating work improvements to their buildings.
4. **Rebuilding Together** – Rebuilding Together Henry County's work day will be September 16th. The group has selected three homes in Kewanee to complete improvements to this year; utilizing funds raised by the Kewanee Housing Coalition, the US Department of Agriculture, and the City's targeted minor home repair program. Purchasing the materials and having work done by volunteers on the work day allows us to stretch the money further than if we were simply providing improvements through the grant program.
5. **Kewanee Life Skills Re-Entry Center** – The Warden at the KLSREC approached the City regarding the availability of resources from the facility to assist the City in cleanup after the Hog Days Parade, with the removal of trees in the cemetery and City parks, the decoration of the City's trash barrels, their ability to use the city's landscape waste in the production of compost which would be used in a horticulture program, producing fresh vegetables for our local food pantry and flowers for beautification in community projects. Staff is excited about the potential opportunities to work with the facility on projects that are beneficial to the city and the program's participants.

Warden Williams also provided information about a fundraiser the facilities staff are participating in to raise money for Special Olympics. Information about this worthwhile cause was sent to you in an email with a live link.

6. **Animal Issues/Social Media** – Despite claims to the contrary on social media, there is no evidence that cases of animal neglect, abuse, or abandonment are on the rise in Kewanee (based on the number of reported cases during the past 4 years). Nonetheless, we are anticipating a large crowd to be present at the city council meeting to voice their concerns regarding these issues. Neither the City Council nor staff are indifferent to such concerns. The city's penalties are severe enough in consequence to dissuade such occurrences for any case that should be filed at the municipal level. For more severe cases, the opportunity exists to file state charges should the state's attorney feel they are warranted.
7. **Solar Farms** – There are ongoing discussions with a Consortium of solar energy providers regarding potential solar farm installations in Henry County, with specific interest in the Lininger Industrial Park and sites just outside of the city limits.
8. **911 Dispatch** – There is still discussion as to which 911 Public Safety Answering Points will remain open. A meeting is scheduled for August 21<sup>st</sup> to further refine the details. As noted in the previous memo, the recommendation was to maintain existing services at all three PSAPs, with Kewanee and Henry County being designated as the primary answering points and Geneseo being designated as a secondary PSAP, contingent upon the Cities and County agreeing to maintain current levels of staffing for a period of not less than three years. The County has now indicated that they are unwilling to sign such an agreement.
9. **Trees in Berrien Park** – Unfortunately, vandals hacked down the two ornamental trees in Berrien Park that were planted by the Garden Club. The City will provide replacement trees and the club will provide the labor to put trees back in the park and will provide ongoing maintenance in the future.
10. **Hog Days** – With Hog Days coming up, we're trying to put as much of our resources as possible towards sprucing up the high visibility areas of town.
11. **Fall City Wide Cleanup Day** – Staff is starting to plan another city wide cleanup for October 21 from 7 am – 12 noon, pending approval from the hospital for the use of their site.
12. **Back to School** – School starts for both school districts on August 16, so everyone should be on the lookout for kids walking to school. We will be working with both school districts to make sure any infrastructure issues in the area are wrapped up.

## **COUNCIL MEETING 17-14 JULY 24, 2017**

Mayor Looney asked for a moment of silence for former Mayor Bruce Tossell and our troops still fighting overseas.

Mayor Looney explained that the next items were placed on the consent agenda and were considered to be routine in nature to be passed as a whole with one vote of the Council. Mayor Looney requested that any member of the Council or the audience wishing to have an item removed from the consent agenda for individual consideration to make the request and the item would be removed and considered following the approval of the remaining consent items. The consent agenda included minutes from the July 10, 2017 Council Meeting, payroll for the pay period ending July 8, 2017 in the amount of \$208,313.39, and reports from Engineering, Finance & Administration, Public Works, and Bock, Inc. The consent agenda was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Schweitzer. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Bills submitted for approval totaling \$1,215,596.14 were approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Faber. Council Member Koehler asked if the payment for K-9 school was the first for the police K9. Chief Ainley confirmed it was the first class for that dog. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

### **CITIZEN PARTICIPATION**

Mayor Looney asked if anyone wished to speak regarding a non-agenda item. There being no such requests Mayor Looney moved on to new business.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Mark Mikenas, Executive Vice President of the Kewanee Chamber of Commerce gave his semi-annual report to the Council

The minutes from the Plan Commission from its meeting on July 20, 2017 were approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Koehler. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3892 granting a special use permit to Abilities Plus for land located at 427 E Garfield Street for a sheltered care or board and care facility was approved on a motion made by Council Member Schweitzer and seconded by Council Member Faber. Mayor Looney explained that those in favor of the request would be allowed to speak first. Randy Carton, President of the Abilities Plus Board addressed the concerns voiced at the Public Hearing during the Plan Commission meeting. Roberta Cinnamon, a parent of a client of Abilities Plus, expressed her support of Abilities Plus. Mark Elbus expressed his concerns regarding the proposed sheltered care or board and care facility, stating the concern was lower property values. Mayor Looney noted that he had spoken with a resident who previously was a property owner next to one Abilities Plus' facilities. That resident reported that his property value actually increased. Council Member Faber noted that he did not see a loss in approving the request. Council Member Schweitzer stated that she was offended by the lack of understanding expressed by those in opposition to the facility. Council Member Koehler noted that he was against a previously approved home on Hollis Street. That home has been kept in top notch condition, with no complaints received regarding the house. Council Member Yaklich noted that he would be abstaining from the vote, as he was a landlord to Abilities Plus at the time and his wife was the realtor for the sale of the property. Mayor Looney reported that when he was on the Abilities Plus Board he never received any complaints regarding their homes. Roll call showed ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3893 granting a special use permit to Tracy Glasgo, owner of Tracy Jeans, for property located at 125 West South Street #11 for the sale of alcoholic liquor by the serving was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Schweitzer. John Beaman, affiliated with Tracy Jeans, noted that the building in question was the old JC Beaman building in Midland Plaza. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5062 awarding the 2017 annual street maintenance program to Advanced Asphalt Company, Inc. was approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Koehler. City Engineer Nobel noted that the timing of the program would depend on the timing of the approval of Illinois Department of Transportation. No work would be scheduled over Labor Day weekend. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5063 to authorize an agreement with Missman, Inc. for engineering services relating to Phase I Design and Project Development for the 2018 F.A.U, (Federal Aid Urban) East Street Improvement Project (South Street to Second Street) was approved on a motion made by Council Member Schweitzer and seconded by Council Member Yaklich. City Engineer Nobel noted that Missman was one of the standby engineering firms previously selected by the Council. The FAU project was a 2 year process, with this being the beginning of the process. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

The recommendation of the Plan Commission regarding the height for the fence and screening to be installed around the beer garden/outdoor eating area at the Boiler Room 206 North Chestnut Street was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Yaklich. Anthony Segura, owner of the Boiler Room requested that the Council consider one of the two options that he had submitted to the Plan Commission and City Council. He explained that the ordinance states that the screening should be of adequate height, further noting that adequate could be different to everyone. He requested that the ordinance be amended to be more specific. Scott Wiegand noted that Mr. Segura had been a good neighbor. Council Members held a discussion concerning the points addressed by Mr. Segura. Council Member Schweitzer questioned the height of the other beer garden fences. Roll call showed 3 ayes, 2 nays, with Council Member Schweitzer and Mayor Looney casting the dissenting votes. The motion passed.

Resolution #5064 to authorize the use of the public sidewalk and street for beer garden concert events at 202 N. Chestnut Street on August 18 and August 31 was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Schweitzer. Council Member Faber noted that he appreciated the Boiler Room bringing in the concerts, but there was a noise problem that needed to be addressed. Council Member Yaklich stated that he believed there had been an expansion of the special use by building a permanent stage. Mayor Looney noted that there had been three complaints logged regarding the event. He also noted that staff had met with Mr. Segura after the event to discuss details and concerns regarding the event. Roll call showed 4 ayes, 1 nay, with Council Member Yaklich casting the dissenting vote. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3886 amending sections 50.09-(A) and 50.09-(D) Rates and Rules for Solid Waste Pickup and Section 50.10-(E)(3)(A)-1 Solid Waste Transfer Station Standard Rates of Chapter 50 Solid Waste Management, of Title V Public Works; and Sections 92.06, Rates and Charges, and 92.08(B) Placement of Headstones Permit Required, of Chapter 92: Cemeteries of the Kewanee City Code, establishing fees for use of City cemeteries and their services was approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Schweitzer. Mayor Looney noted that the ordinance had been previously tabled allowing staff to collect more data. That data had been supplied. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3894 to amend Section 35.37 Fire Rescue Ambulance Service Fees of the Kewanee City Code was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Schweitzer. City Manager Bradley explained that the one change to the fee schedule was to add an additional level of refusal. At the ALS level of ambulance service, the paramedic can treat a patient for diabetic related emergencies. With the treatment, the patient would no longer need transport to the hospital. This new level of refusal would be charged in those situations. Roll call showed 4 ayes, 1 nay, with Council Member Koehler casting the dissenting vote. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3895 declaring a 1990 Alexis Spartan fire engine as excess was approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Faber. City Manager Bradley reported that with the purchase of the new fire engine, it was beneficial to rotate one of the existing fire engines out of service to save on insurance and maintenance fees. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5058 to authorize the City Manager to execute a right-of-way agreement with Geneseo Communications was tabled on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Schweitzer. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

## **OTHER BUSINESS**

Council Member Schweitzer extended her condolences to the friends and family of Bruce Tossell.

Council Member Koehler thanked the volunteers of the Prairie Chicken Festival.

Council Member Yaklich also extended his condolence to the Tossell family.

Council Member Faber extended his condolences to the Tossell family. He also reported that the Prairie Chicken Festival committee had 37 vendors and had to turn away 10 additional vendors. There will be some adjustments made for the next festival to accommodate all of the vendors.

Mayor Looney thanked the Prairie Chicken Festival volunteers. He also thanked the Council for covering for him at the previous meeting. He thanked city staff for putting together all of the information for the large agenda for the evening. He also thanked the Plan Commission members for the work they do for the City. Finally, he extended his sincere condolence to the Tossell family.

## **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

City Clerk Edwards announced that the Main Street railroad crossing was closed for repairs beginning Monday, July 24 and would last approximately 10 days. Detours around Main off of West Third and West Fifth Streets would be open to route traffic onto North Tremont Street. The Park Street crossing would be closed for repairs and was expected to be reopened on Wednesday, July 26.

There being no further business, Council Member Schweitzer moved to adjourn the meeting and Council Member Faber seconded the motion. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The meeting adjourned at 8:32 PM.

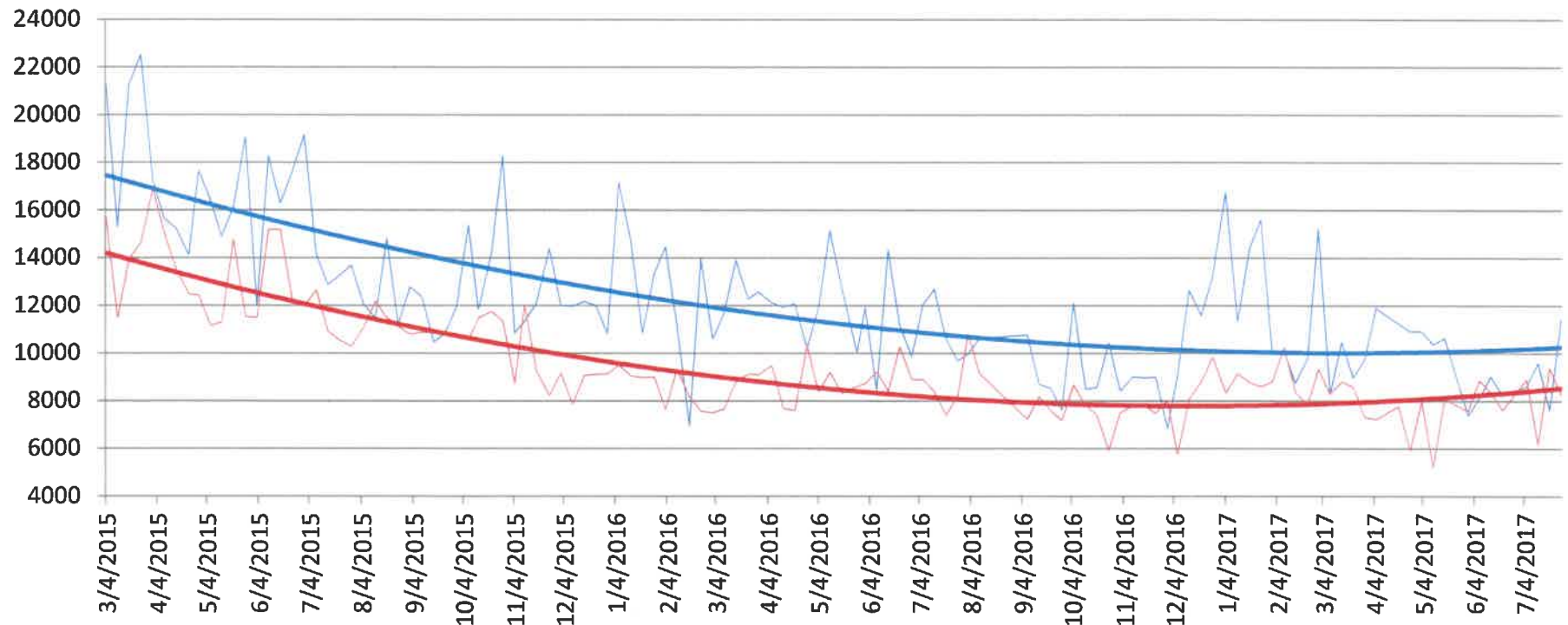

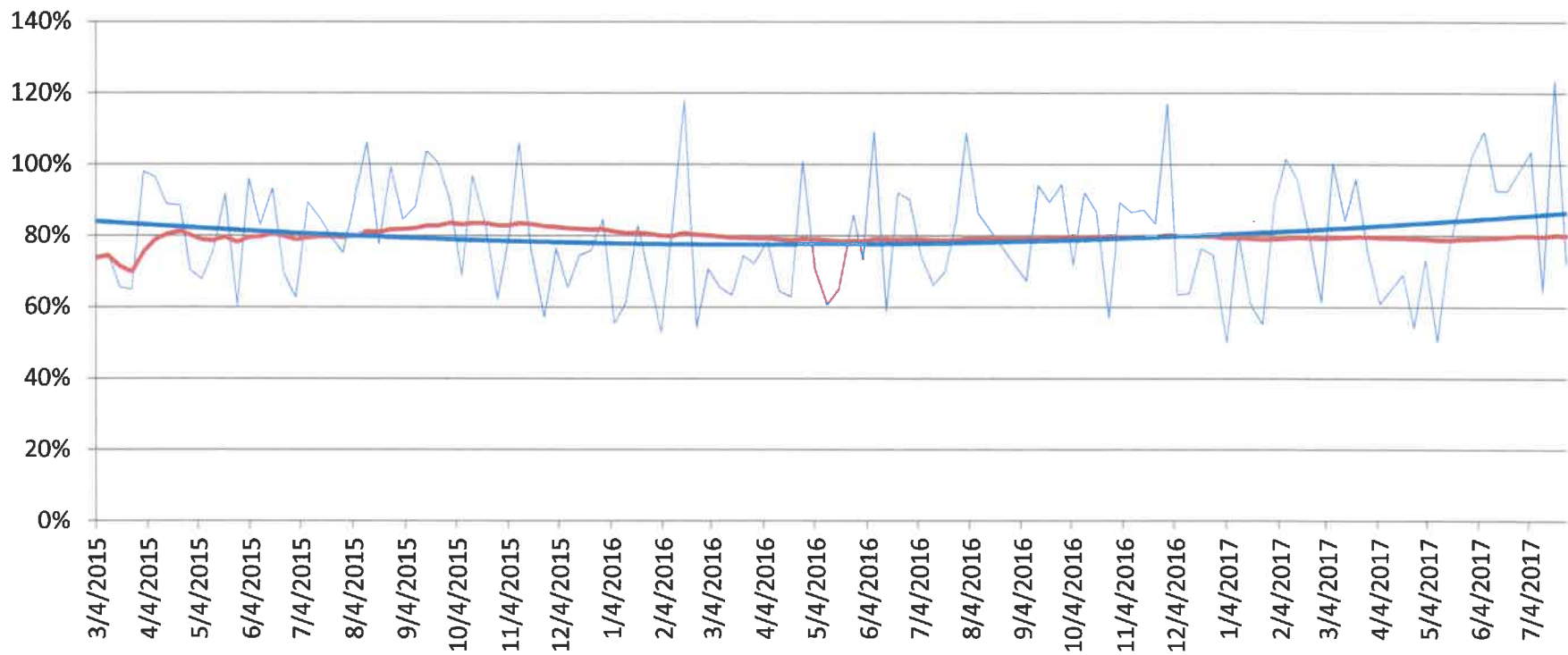

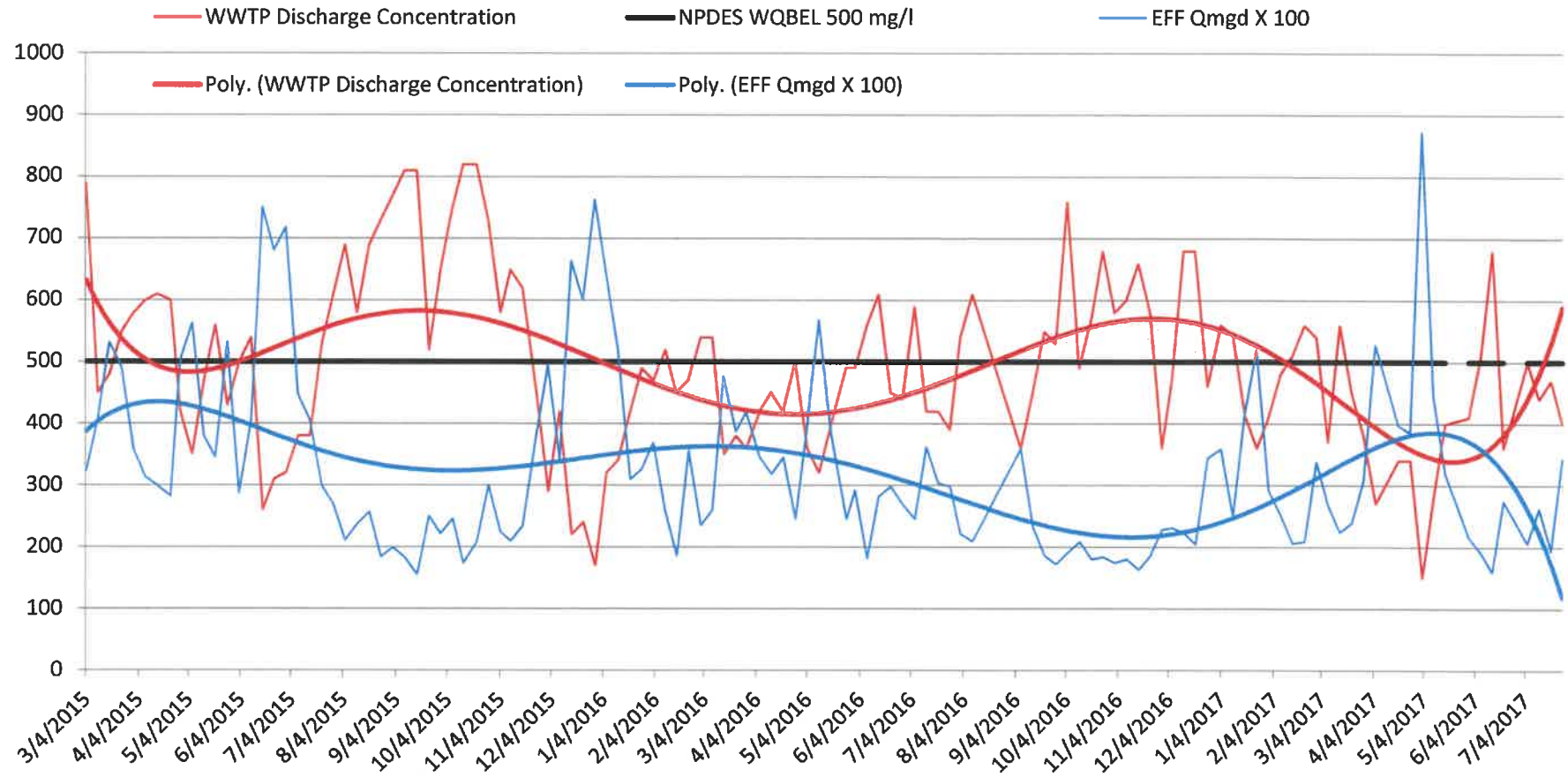
### % CHLORIDES FROM RAW WATER SUPPLY

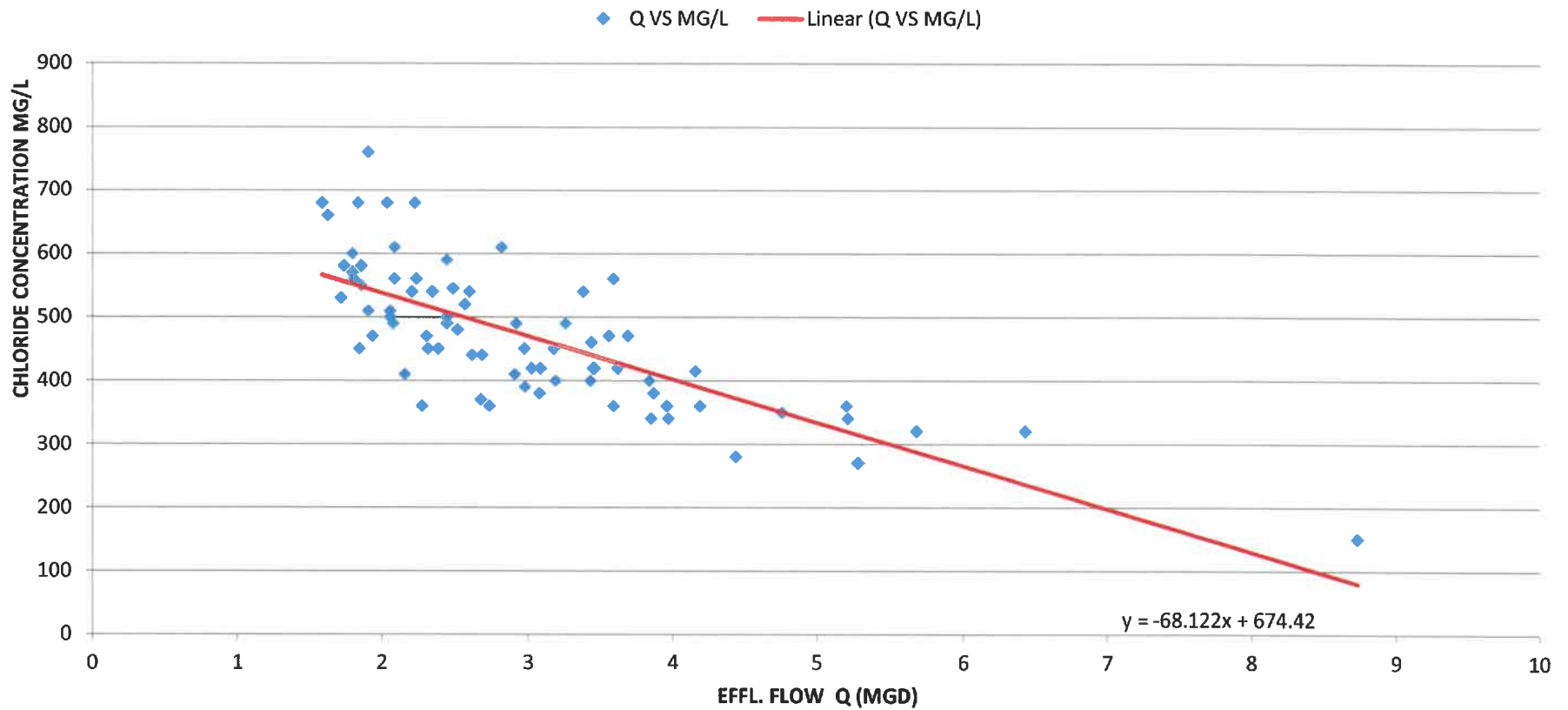

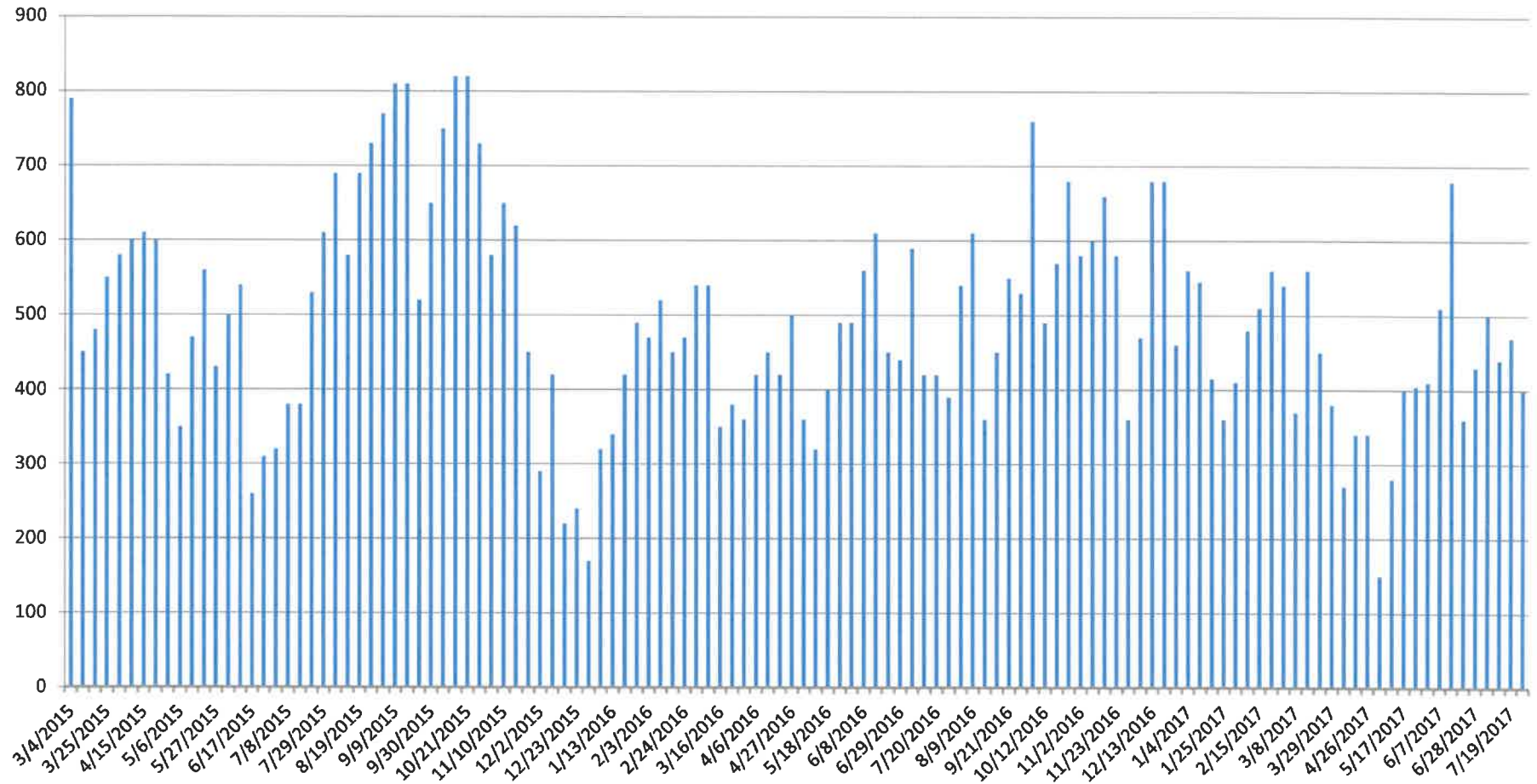
## Q VS MG/L, JAN 2016 - JULY 2017

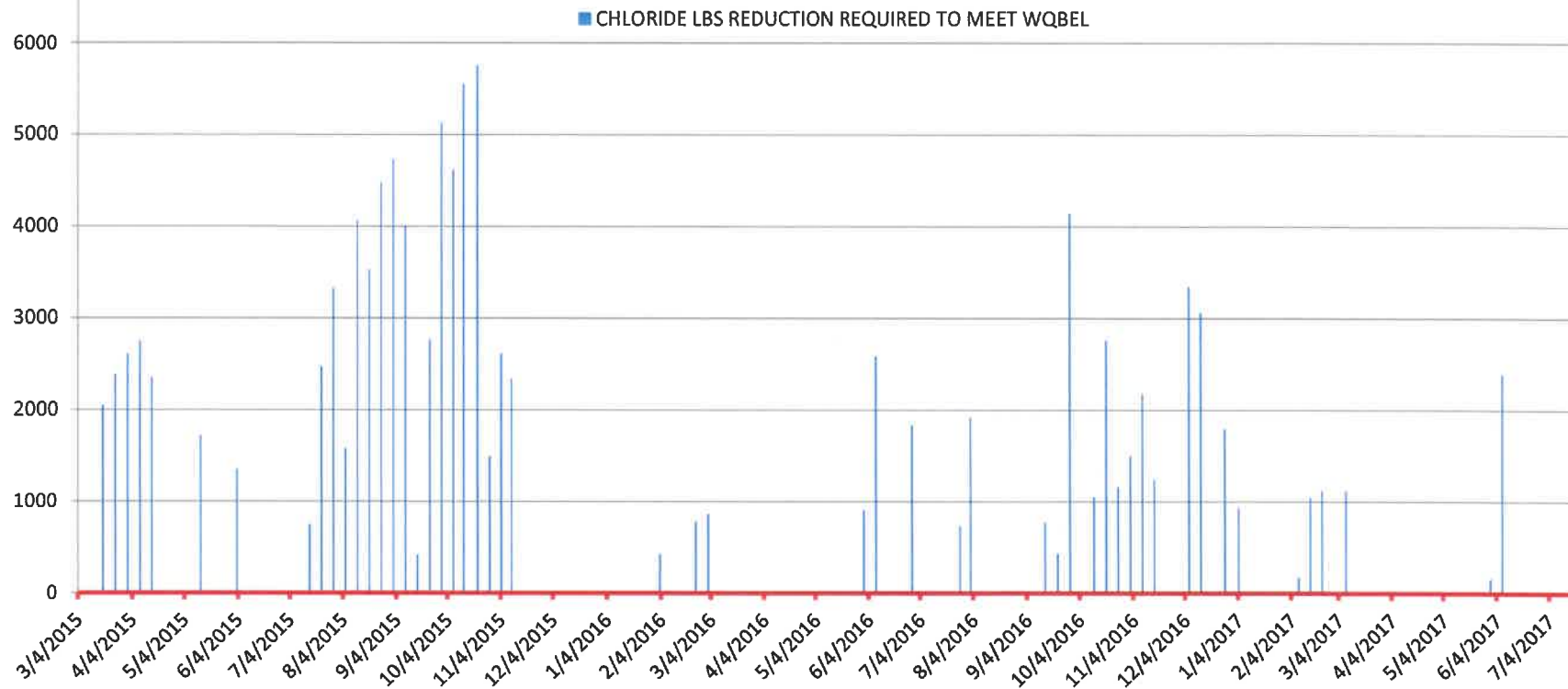
### Chloride Discharge Concentration

### CHLORIDE LBS REDUCTION REQUIRED TO MEET WQBEL

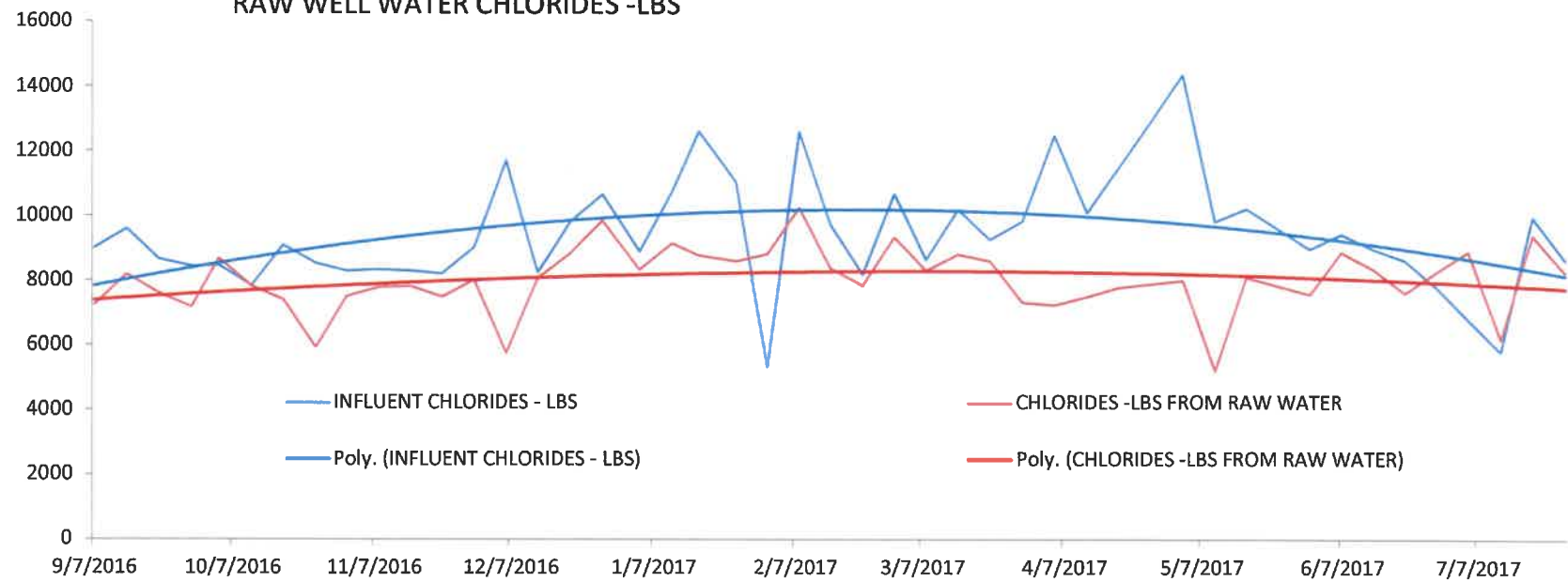

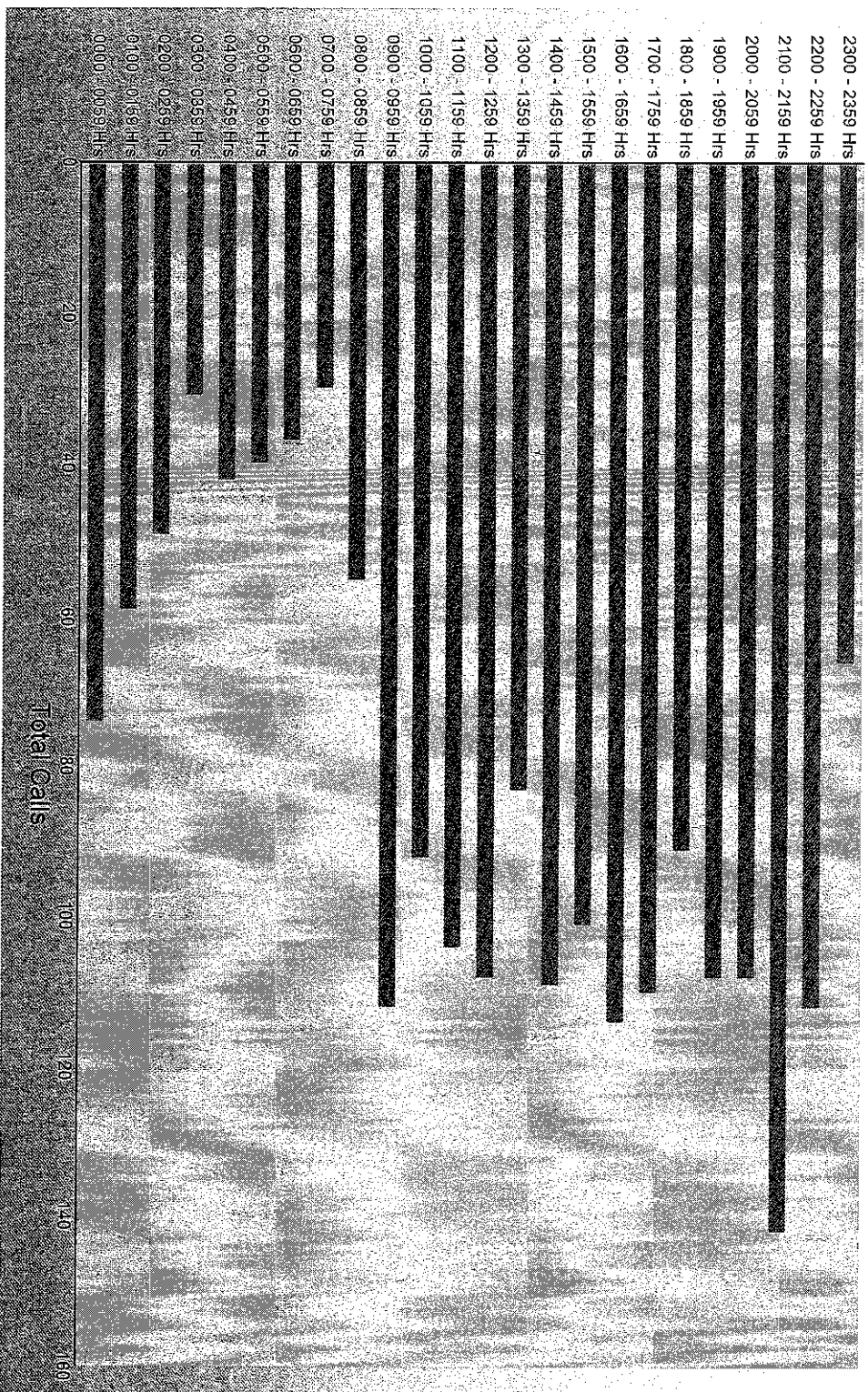

## Total Calls by Day

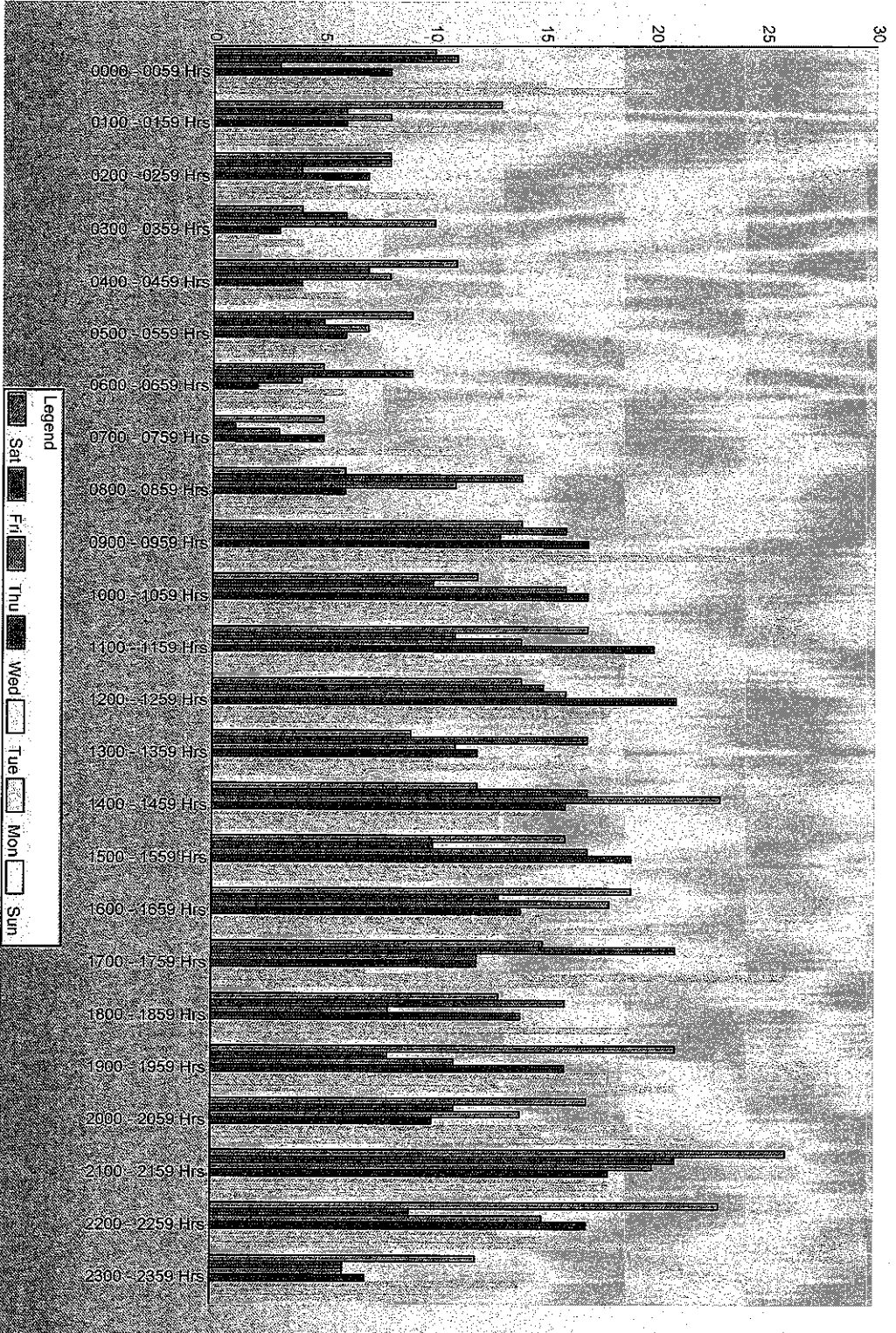


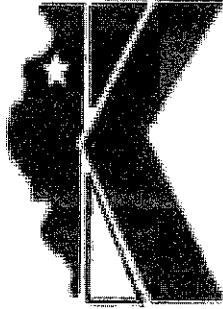

<b>PURPOSE</b>	Authorizes the use of the small business interest payment program by MTM	
<b>BACKGROUND</b>	The City provided a low interest loan to MTM in July 2016 from the Revolving Loan Program. In the application for the loan, MTM provided some rather large numbers regarding potential employment and sales. Since that time, the company has restructured its ownership, narrowed its product line, reduced its overhead, and borrowed additional funds to inject capital into its operations.

<b>ANALYSIS</b>	<p>The loan was taken out last fall with the idea that they would be able to qualify for this program. However, the program was created but not funded until the current budget was approved in May. The bank which made the loan provided two letters, one asking for the City to consider this program for 2 years, and a subsequent version as the behest of MTM requesting that the City commit to a 10-year term. MTM also provided information from a call for financing that the company generated that has projections regarding production with an infusion of capital. That document contains proprietary information and is available for your review at City Hall.</p> <p>Making this small commitment helps to ensure the viability of the previous loan and provides a small boost to a small company that is struggling in its early stages but appears to have established itself. I would love to see the company grow as projected in the call for financing, but the projected use of some of the capital, along with the projected profit levels and exit strategy, make me hesitant at this time to commit to anything beyond one or two years of assistance.</p> <p>The use of loan proceeds and creation of jobs in the past two years both meet the criteria established within the program.</p>

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE USE OF INCENTIVES UNDER THE SMALL BUSINESS INTEREST PAYMENT PROGRAM BY MIDWEST TRAILER MANUFACTURING AND DECLARING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE IMMEDIATELY.

**WHEREAS,** The City Council approved Community and Economic Development Incentives for use in the City of Kewanee in September 2016; and,

**WHEREAS,** Those incentives included the Small Business Interest Payment Program intended to assist existing legal businesses within the City of Kewanee with obtaining financing for certain eligible costs, including operating capital; and,

**WHEREAS,** Midwest Trailer Manufacturing expressed interest in the program in October 2016, at which time the program had not been funded; and,

**WHEREAS,** Midwest Trailer Manufacturing received a low interest loan from the City of Kewanee in July 2016 through the City's Revolving Loan Program; and,

**WHEREAS,** The City Council finds it in the best interest of the community to continue to support Midwest Trailer Manufacturing in its early stages to ensure the viability of the previous loan and to give a small boost to the company in its work to create and retain jobs in the community.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEWANEE IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1**           The City Council of the City of Kewanee accepts the recommendation of staff to authorize the use of the Small Business Interest Payment Program by Midwest Trailer Manufacturing in conjunction with a loan from State Bank of Toulon disbursed October 28, 2016 and maturing on October 28, 2017.

**Section 2**           The City Council finds it is in the best interests of the City of Kewanee and would promote industrial development; protect current levels of employment, and create new job opportunities in the City of Kewanee. Therefore, the City Council authorizes the use of the Small Business Interest Payment Program by Midwest Trailer Manufacturing for a loan not to exceed \$500,000 with a one year maturity, such maturity date occurring on or before December 31, 2018.

**Section 3** The Mayor, City Attorney, City Manager, and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all documents necessary to bind the City and to make said authorization to Midwest Trailer Manufacturing, as approved by the City Attorney.

**Section 4** Said authorization, is expressly conditioned upon Midwest Trailer Manufacturing complying with:

- A. All terms and conditions of said Small Business Interest Payment program and said Midwest Trailer Manufacturing providing the City with adequate written documentation of compliance with said terms and conditions, including, but not limited to, the specific retention and creation of FTE 18 jobs, and sales of no less than \$2 million per year.
- B. Loan funds received shall be used exclusively for the purposes stated in the application filed by Midwest Trailer Manufacturing and as approved by this resolution.

**Section 5** This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

On behalf of Midwest Trailer Manufacturing, LLC (MTM) and Benjamin Endress, I would like to submit an application for the Small Business Interest Payment Program for a loan in which the State Bank of Toulon made to MTM on October 28, 2016 in the amount of \$500,000.00. The loan is a revolving line of credit and was utilized to support working capital needs which included, payroll, employee training, material and inventory purchases.

Details of the loan structure are listed below:

<b>Loan Request:</b>	<b>\$500,000.00 operating line of credit</b>
<b>Purpose:</b>	To support material purchases, labor costs and employee training.
<b>Terms/Repayment:</b>	Interest payable monthly, principal due at maturity.
<b>Pricing:</b>	Floating daily at 100 b.p. over WSJ prime.
<b>Collateral:</b>	Blanket lien on business assets of Midwest Trailer Manufacturing, LLC, cross-collateralized with the business assets of Macon GC, LLC. Limited guarantees by James Hunt, Larry Garner and Russ Spenser, and an unlimited guaranty of Macon GC, LLC, with Benjamin O. Endress having a 70% limited guaranty and Adam Endress having a 30% limited guaranty of Macon GC, LLC's guaranty.

A copy of the promissory note is included with the application packet.

You may recall Benjamin and Adam Endress purchased the vacated BoMag plant in Kewanee at auction on 9/17/15 through a Company they own known as ADBEN INVESTMENTS, LLC. Ownership of the plant has since changed hands and is now owned by ENDO HOLDINGS LLC, which members include Benjamin, Adam, and Philip Endress.

Ben and Adam, along with three partners, James Hunt, Larry Garner and Russ Spencer, formed Midwest Trailer Manufacturing, LLC (MTM) and began building prototype trailers in January, 2016. Membership structure of MTM when the company formed was as follows:

MACON GC LLC	55.0%

Ben Endress owns 70% of MACON GC LLC  
Adam Endress owns 30% of MACON GC LLC

Through their first year of operations, the Company made their goal of selling 76 trailers, but at a great cost, reporting a net loss of \$1,375,874.67 on \$1,790,170.97 in sales. The significant loss was due to several factors, but one in particular. The Company strayed from their original business plan of building just round tub trailers and developing markets for this product. Instead, they tried to develop an Elliptical Tub trailer line and an aluminum trailer line, in addition to the round tub line, as they were chasing demand in the market for these products. They also custom built trailers for customers. As a result, the Company was very inefficient as they were trying to design and engineer new trailers, train welders and assemblers, set up production lines, and deliver trailers on time. They jumped from 11 employees to 40 trying to keep up with production. Labor costs were high, production was slow, and they had a difficult time pricing their trailers.

At the beginning of fiscal year 2017, Ben and Adam Endress began making changes. They brought in their brother Steve Endress, a retired superintendant of schools, to take over as CFO of MTM. Prior to Steve, the Company had no CFO. Macon GC, LLC took over more ownership as they infused more cash into MTM. Larry Garner stepped down as a production manager. James Hunt, President, took over the production management roll. Ownership today is as follows:

MACON GC LLC	91.0%
James Hunt	4.50%
Russ Spenser	3.00%
Larry Garner	1.50%

Ben Endress owns 70% of MACON GC LLC  
Adam Endress owns 30% of MACON GC LLC

The new ownership and manager has reverted back to their original business plan; to build round tub steel trailers, make the production line efficient and sell only round tub steel trailers. Once production is efficient and sales are stable, they will consider venturing into the production and sales of Elliptical trailers and then possibly aluminum trailers.

Since the change in strategy, the Company is down to 20 employees. They have become efficient in building round tub steel trailers, they have stockpiled an inventory of trailers ready for immediate sale, they have priced them appropriately, and they are selling. Through May 31, 2017, the Company has reported a net loss of \$503,844.62 on \$1,592,250.20 of sales. Operations are improving. In the month of May, 2017 the Company reported a net profit of \$60,508.49 on \$465,104.50 in sales.

The issue going forward is reducing the debt of \$3,531,772.52 they amassed in their first year of operation. The State Bank of Toulon made a \$500,000.00 loan to MTM last October to aid the Company with working capital. The ownership of MTM would like to utilize the City's Small Business Interest payment program to subsidize the interest for this loan allowing the Company to utilize the money saved for working capital.

The loan from State Bank of Toulon is for one-year, however, we intend to renew this line of credit from year-to-year. We would ask the City to consider subsidizing the interest on this loan for at least a ten year period.

# Loan Programs

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## ***KEWANEE SMALL BUSINESS INTEREST PAYMENT PROGRAM***

### **PURPOSE**

The program is designed to stimulate economic growth and create jobs that will improve the living conditions of residents in the community. The program provides financial assistance to eligible businesses and development projects while mitigating the amount of risk taken on by the City.

Businesses receiving funds through the program will be required to obtain conventional financing and create or retain a sufficient number of jobs to merit public investment.

### **AUTHORIZATION**

The City of Kewanee is the administrator of this program and where applicable will facilitate implementation of the program through identification of companies that might benefit from the program. Budgetary and participant approval for the program rests with the authority of the City Council, while authorization for program implementation is the responsibility of the City Manager and assigned staff

### **ELIGIBLE AREAS**

Financing under this program is available to all eligible businesses located within the city limits of the City of Kewanee.

### **ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS**

Applicants for the program must be existing legal businesses, located within the City of Kewanee, with a proper local business license (if applicable), insurance, and required permits per local, state and federal requirements, or corporations in good standing looking to locate or relocate in Kewanee. If an applicant is a new start-up business and does not have proper licenses or insurance, then these items can be made a condition of approval. The business can be a tenant leasing space or an owner of

property where the business is located. The existing business must create or retain three (3) or more permanent full time equivalent (FTE) jobs.

### **HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS**

Approved applicants obtain a loan through a commercial lender of their choice. Upon review and approval of semi-annual reports submitted by the applicant to the City, provided that agreed upon benchmarks have been achieved by the applicant, the City provides reimbursement to the applicant for interest expenses incurred as a result of the loan.

### **PROGRAM BENEFITS/ELIGIBLE USES**

Funds under this program are restricted to interest payments on certain eligible costs.

Some common eligible costs are:

- Operating capital (including license and permit fees if applicable)
- Renovation of leased space or owned buildings (including engineering, architectural, and local permits or fees), new construction, or acquisition of existing commercial or industrial space.
- Purchase of manufacturing equipment (with or without installation costs)
- Furniture, fixtures and equipment (FF&E)

The lending institution shall disburse funds and calculate interest thereon incrementally on a reimbursement basis, or through direct payment of vendor/contractor invoices, as eligible costs are verified. The City of Kewanee and program participants shall negotiate benchmarks and goals for employment, sales, and other measurables to ensure that the City's investment of funds is merited.

# Loan Programs

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## **FUNDING LIMITS**

Program funding and availability is at the discretion of the City Council. Funding is limited to \$2,000 per year for each job created within any two consecutive reporting periods, with a maximum funding amount of \$40,000 per year per participant.

<b>ANALYSIS</b>	<p>The City received an application from Bette Dennison for the proposed street sign on June 23, 2017. During a review of the application and discussion with the Honorary Street Sign Advisory Committee, it was discovered that this request was made previously, but had not come to completion, even though the Advisory Committee had recommended placement of the sign.</p> <p>PFC Richards was a Kewanee resident at the time of his death. He served in the Marine Corp in Okinawa. He sustained a gunshot wound to the abdomen and was hospitalized. The infection from the wound combined with the onset of pneumonia took his life less than a month later.</p> <p>The application was received from Bette Dennison, niece of PFC Richards. She is 1 of 9 nieces and nephews that are current residents of Kewanee. She has requested that the block of Madison Avenue bounded by 6<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> Streets be honorary named for PFC Richards. PFC Richards' parents lived at 1102 Madison Avenue at the time of his death. Ms. Dennison has further requested that the unveiling of the signs take place on a Friday in September if possible.</p>

- Section 4** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

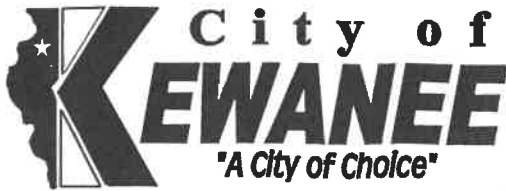

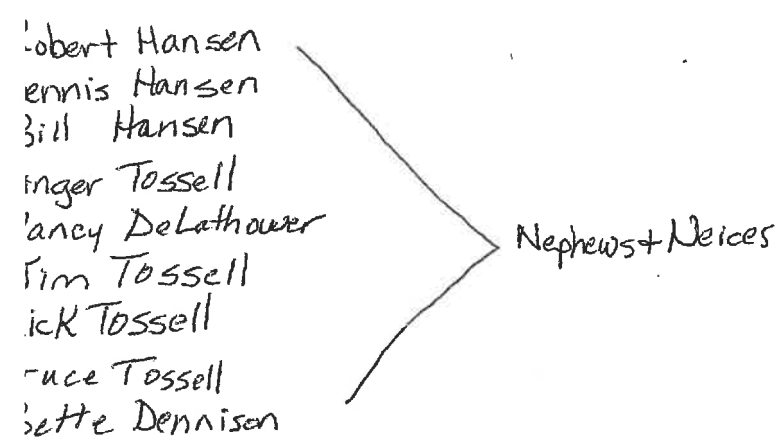

Dear Mrs. Richards:

You have been duly notified by the Commandant of the Marine Corps of the death of your son Walter George RICHARDS, Pfc. USMCR, 498 496, 25 June 1945. The following statement was made by the Medical Officer in Charge:

Walter G. Richards was admitted to this hospital on 19 May 1945 with a serious gunshot wound of the abdomen, sustained on 10 May. His case was complicated by the development of an atypical pneumonia for which intensive penicillin treatment was commenced immediately. The patient's condition improved slightly but the combination of pneumonia and peritonitis, which had been caused by his wound, proved too severe for him to survive. He passed away at 5 A.M. on 25 June 1945.

It was my privilege to come to know your son for about 5 weeks as a patient here. I saw him from one to 3 times each day during that period. Our doctors, nurses, and corpsmen worked faithfully to save his life. He put up a very brave fight and displayed a fortitude worthy of emulation. He was a young man of splendid courage.

I read passages of Scripture to him frequently and offered many prayers with him and in my own room for his recovery. Parents frequently write me asking for any message. I have no direct message from his suffering to you other than this: About 3 days before he left us he said, "I wanted so much to see my father and mother again, but it looks as if I might not get to see them now". Mrs. Richards, he expressed his faith in God through Christ many times. He always said, "Amen", at the conclusion of the prayers with him, and in these prayers I had asked God for his recovery, and that all his sin might be forgiven through Jesus Christ, and that he might have peace of spirit.

On June 25 he was buried in Army, Navy and Marine Cemetery No. 2 on Guam, M.I. with military honors. At the grave I read Psalm 23, Psalm 121, parts of John 14, and I Corinthians 15: 25-50. I offered prayer that God would comfort the hearts of you who would shortly be notified of his going away, and that all of us who live might not forget the price of liberty in our country. The Committal service usually used in the Presbyterian Church was read and benediction in the last two verses of Jude was invoked. The pall bearers composed of six sailors who stood at attention while a squad of U.S. Marines fired three volleys, Taps were sounded.

May Your great loss draw you nearer to Him who gave His only Son that we be freed from bondage of sin.

It is with deep regret that I must inform you of the death of your son on Feb. 1, 1942. Private First Class Richards was drowned in the swimming pool at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico and was buried in the Military Cemetery at Santurce, Puerto Rico. A Military funeral was conducted by Captain Luis Maldonado-Soltero, the Protestant Chaplain of the Post and nearly all the members of his company were able to attend. The men of the 42nd took up a collection and placed three large wreaths and three sprays on his grave.

The loss of your son was felt as a great blow to all the members of his company and they share your grief. He was always known as a hard worker who was willing to work no matter what the job or the hour.

Your son's personal effects and the flag which covered his casket have been turned over to Captain Vincente Mita, Jr., Summary Court Officer of the Puerto Rican General Depot, who will send them to you as soon as possible.

For settlement of his accounts, I must refer you to the General Accounting Office, Washington, D. C., although it will undoubtedly take several weeks for them to make settlement.

# Plan Double Service For Richards Boys; William First Kewanee Casualty

Mr. and Mrs. William W. Richards, 1102 Madison Ave., have received a telegram from the War Department stating that the body of their son, Pfc. William L. Richards, is among the 1,150 remains from the Caribbean and Central America aboard the U. S. Army Transport "Honda Knot" due to arrive at San Francisco about April 1.

According to the Associated Press report, other war dead on the "Honda Knot" from this area are: 1st Lt. Lester R. Ackeborg, 320 E. Ave., Prophetstown; GM3 David G. Larson, Rte. 2, Geneseo.

Mr. and Mrs. Richards had previously received word on March 22 that the body of their son, Pfc. Walter G. Richards, who died on Guam May 10, 1945, was aboard the army transport "Walter W. Schwenk" due in San Francisco March 21.

The family has notified Mayor Brown and Seifert and Smith funeral home that it is their wish to hold a double service for their two veteran sons when the bodies arrive in this city.

Pfc. William L. Richards was born in Kewanee April 6, 1920, was educated in Kewanee schools and was employed with the Walworth company. For a time he had employment with The Star-Courier.

He enlisted with the United States Army at Peoria Dec. 21, 1939, and was stationed at Rock Island arsenal for a year and a half, serving his outfit as second cook. In April of 1941, he left with the 42nd Infantry from Rock Island Arsenal for Puerto Rico, sailing from New York, and had since been stationed there.

Pfc. William L. Richards was Kewanee's first casualty in World War 2, with death coming from drowning on Feb. 1, 1942 at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico.

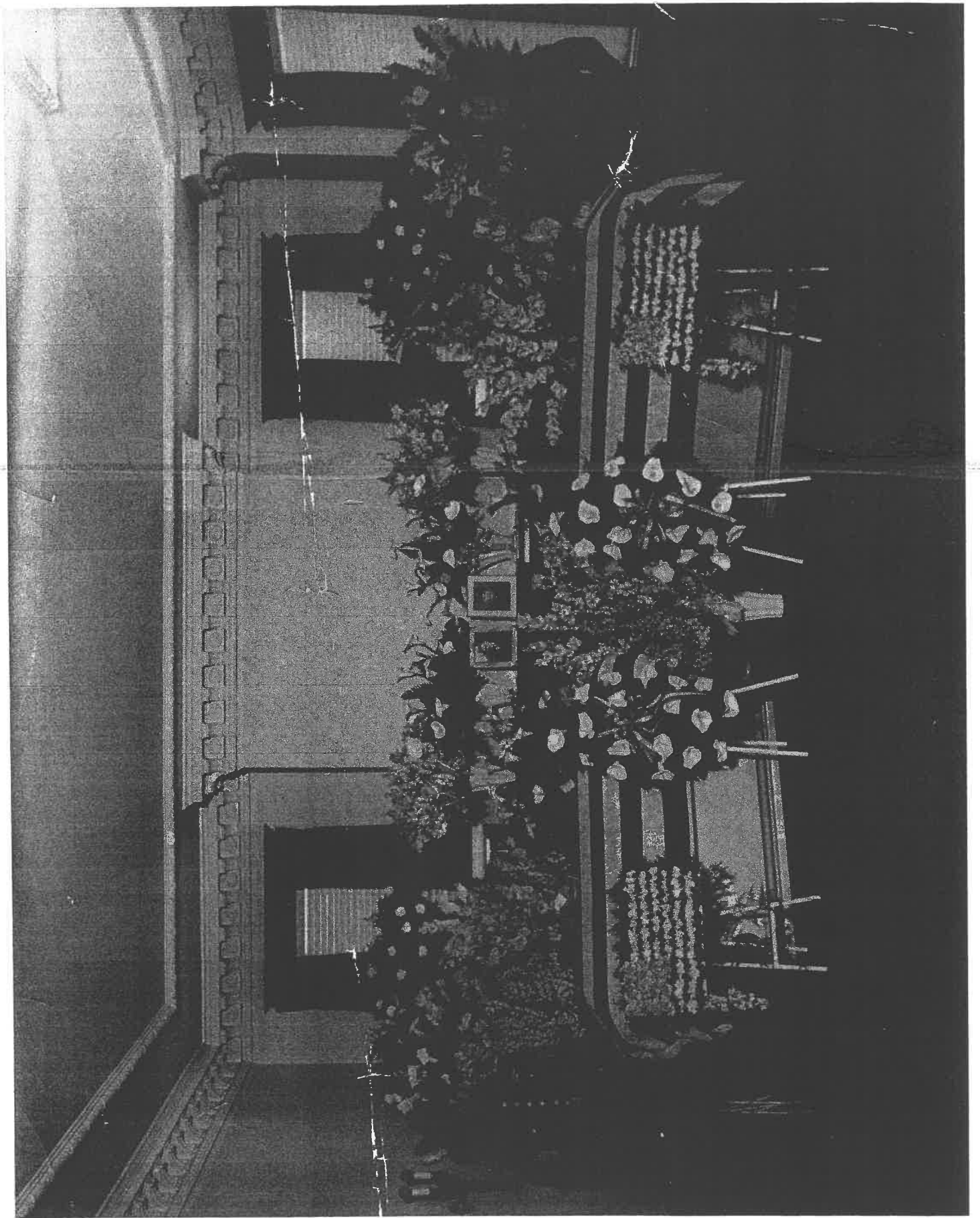

## SECOND GOLD STAR

There are two gold stars in the home of Mr. and Mrs. William W. Richards, 1102 Madison Ave., Kewanee, today. A second son, Pfc. Walter George Richards, Marine, died June 25 at Guam in action at Okinawa islands on May 10. Their first son, Pfc. William Richards, was Kewanee's first casualty in World War II, drowning Feb. 1, 1942 at Puerto Rico. A third son, Coxswain Gene Richards, is on navy duties at Washington, D. C.

A notable record indeed for this Kewanee family which has sacrificed two of its sons in the long struggle on the road to a permanent peace. The brave lad who has just given his life in action at Okinawa has made a definite contribution to victory in the Pacific as this battle was undoubtedly the turning point in that theater of operations.

Pfc. Walter Richards' death brings the total casualties from Kewanee in this war to 62 and the total for Henry county to 96, with eight names added to the honor roll since Memorial Day.

## RECEIVE CABLE

First word of Pfc. Richards' wounds came to his parents in an undated cablegram signed by himself. It stated that he was in a hospital and desired news from home. A letter written June 8 by a marine officer came shortly afterwards to Mr. and Mrs. Richards, informing them that their son had been wounded May 10. It described his injuries and stated that he was admitted to a hospital on May 19 for medical treatment. They then received letters dated June 14 and 18, the first written by a marine officer and the second by a Red Cross worker for Pfc. Richards. The letter from the officer informed Mr. and Mrs. Richards that their son had developed pneumonia and his condition was critical.

The son of William W. and Irene Devenney Richards, Pfc. Richards was born in Kewanee Dec. 16, 1923. He attended Kewanee schools. He was employed by The Star-Courier and D. and V. Bottling Works before taking employment with the Walworth Company. In November of 1942, he entered marine service. He trained at San Diego, Calif., and was not granted a leave to come home before leaving for service in the Pacific area 29 months ago, MEMBER V.F.W.

Pfc. Richards was a member of Kewanee Post, 2675, Veterans of Foreign Wars.

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A PORTION OF AN ALLEY LOCATED ON THE EAST SIDE OF 918 AND 930 HARBOUR STREET, AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT AS PROVIDED HEREIN

WHEREAS, The City Council has received a petition from the abutting property owner, Bradley Osborne, 924 Harbour Street, to vacate a sixty feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 151 and 152 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 918 Harbour Street; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council has previously vacated a portion of Bunn Avenue, and 150 feet of the alley adjacent to 924 Harbour Street leaving a sixty seven feet long part of the a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 158 and 159 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 930 Harbour Street, landlocked; and,

WHEREAS, The entire public alley was platted and dedicated to the public as a part of the Pleasant View Addition Extension; and,

WHEREAS, The alley is unimproved with no public use and no utilities of the City or its franchisees; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council has determined that there is no further public use for sixty feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 151 and 152 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 918 Harbour Street, nor the sixty seven feet long part of the sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 158 and 159 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 930 Harbour Street; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council has determined that said sixty feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 151 and 152 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 918 Harbour Street to be vacated shall be conveyed in its entirety to Bradley Osborne; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council has determined that said sixty seven feet long part of the sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 158 and 159 inclusive of the Pleasant Valley Addition Extension, commonly known as 930 Harbour Street to be vacated shall be conveyed in its entirety to Troy Dennison; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council has determined that the value of the land and the cost to the City to have City staff and the City Attorney prepare and file the appropriate documents in Henry County to convey title of the proposed vacated portion of public alley to Bradley Osborne and Troy Dennison is \$200.

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEWANEE, ILLINOIS, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, AS FOLLOWS.

**SECTION ONE:** The City Council finds that public interest is best served by relief to the public from further burden and responsibility of maintaining the portion of the sixty feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 151 and 152 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 918 Harbour Street and the sixty seven feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 158 and 159 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 930 Harbour Street, described in Section Two hereof, by vacating said portion of public alley.

**SECTION TWO:** That the sixty feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 151 and 152 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 918 Harbour Street, and the sixty seven feet long part of a sixteen feet wide public alley adjacent to the east side of Lots 158 and 159 inclusive of the Pleasant View Addition Extension, commonly known as 930 Harbour Street, is hereby vacated. That portion of public alley being more particularly described as bounded by the following description:  
Beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot One Hundred Fifty-One (151) of Pleasant View Addition Extension, City of Kewanee, Henry County, Illinois; thence North along the West line of a sixteen (16) feet wide alley a distance of Sixty (60) feet to the Northeast corner of Lot One Hundred Fifty-Two (152) of said Pleasant View Addition Extension; thence East Sixteen (16) feet to a point, said point being on the East line of said Sixteen (16) feet wide alley, and said point also being on the East line of Pleasant View Addition Extension to a point; thence South a distance of Sixty (60) feet along the East line of Pleasant View Addition Extension to a point; thence West a distance of Sixteen (16) feet to the point of beginning. Said vacated section of public alley containing 960 square feet, more or less; and beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot One Hundred Fifty-Eight (158) of Pleasant View Addition Extension, City of Kewanee, Henry County, Illinois; thence North along the West line of a sixteen (16) feet wide alley a distance of Sixty-seven (67) feet to the Northeast corner of Lot One Hundred Fifty-nine (159) of said Pleasant View Addition Extension; thence East sixteen (16) feet to a point, said point being on the East line of Pleasant View Addition Extension to a point; thence South a distance of Sixty-seven (67) feet along the East line of Pleasant View Addition Extension to a point; thence West a distance of sixteen (16) feet to the point of beginning. Said vacated section of public alley containing One thousand seventy-two (1,072) square feet, more or less.

**SECTION THREE:** The City Council finds that value of the land being vacated and the administrative cost to the City of Kewanee to lawfully put into effect said vacation is \$200.00.

**SECTION FOUR:** The City Council hereby directs that title to the vacated portion of public alley described in Section Two hereof, shall be, upon payment of

\$100.00 dollars to the City of Kewanee, conveyed to Bradley Osborne, 924 Harbour Street, Kewanee, owner of abutting parcels with permanent index numbers 20-27-407-005, and upon payment of \$100.00 to the City of Kewanee, conveyed to Troy and Natasha Dennison, 930 Harbour Street, Kewanee, owner of abutting parcels with permanent index numbers 20-27-407-001, all in compliance with 65 ILCS 5/11-91-1.

**SECTION FIVE:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 3897

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 155.117(B)(2) OF THE CITY CODE WHICH ESTABLISHES STANDARDS FOR SCREENING AROUND A BEER GARDEN/OUTDOOR EATING AREA, AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE UPON PUBLICATION AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

**WHEREAS,** The City of Kewanee has previously established standards for screening around beer gardens / outdoor eating areas; and

**WHEREAS,** The City Council has found that the current ordinance fails to determine the minimum height for screening around a beer garden / outdoor eating area; and,

**WHEREAS,** The City Council has stated their desire for the minimum height for screening around a beer garden / outdoor eating area to be established at six (6) feet.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEWANEE, ILLINOIS, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1** The City Council hereby amends Chapter 155.117(B)(2) of the City Code by inserting text shown as underline and omitting the text shown as ~~strike-through~~ as follows:

- (2) Screening. The licensee shall provide a wall or fence ~~of~~ with minimum height of six feet or greater as recommended by the Plan Commission and approved by the City Council ~~adequate height~~ to screen the patrons on the premises from the view of the surrounding property. Such fence or wall shall be of a design and structure as recommended by the Plan Commission and approved by the City Council. The perimeter of the fence or wall shall be landscaped by the licensee with suitable plants and shrubbery to preserve, as far as possible, harmony with the appearance of the surrounding property. Said landscaping to be as recommended by the Plan Commission and approved by the City Council.

**Section 2** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

<b>BACKGROUND</b>	Inspections of the property and buildings located at 511 W 5 <sup>th</sup> St (house), 522 E 7 <sup>th</sup> St (house), 315 Elliott St (garage), 521 Cambridge Rd (garage). . have provided enough evidence to execute the Fast-Track (NON-JUDICIAL) Demolition pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1(e). As result of this Non-Judicial Demolition Process, the Director of Community Development has acquired the right to demolish the all buildings located at 511 W 5 <sup>th</sup> St, 522 E 7 <sup>th</sup> St, 315 Elliott St, and 521 Cambridge Rd. . A Request For Proposal was drafted and published with a bid due date of August 8, 2017. **Section 1** The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents to put into effect the Communications Facilities franchise agreement with Geneseo Communications as contained in Attachment A hereto.

## AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into by and between Cambridge Telcom, Inc. and Geneseo Communications, Inc., an Illinois corporation, herein "Cambridge Telcom and Geneseo Communication", and the City of Kewanee, Illinois, an Illinois municipal corporation, herein "the City", and collectively "the Parties".

Whereas, the Parties have tentatively negotiated a contract whereby Company shall provide fiber service connection to the City, under certain terms and conditions, and wish to put said oral agreement in written form that was approved by the Kewanee City Board, at its regular meeting on \_\_\_\_\_.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises as set forth herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, it is agreed by the Parties as follows:

- I. Cambridge Telcom or Geneseo Communications Obligation to Provide Services. Company agrees to provide symmetrical fiber service connection to the City at its offices in the City Hall for contract price, located at 401 E 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Kewanee Illinois.
- II. Cambridge Telcom or Geneseo Communications agrees to increase current service. Company agrees to increase current broadband speed from 50meg to 100meg at no additional charge.
- III. Cambridge Telcom or Geneseo Communications agree to pay a \$200 ROW permit fee for any construction outside this project. Work done outside Fiber to the Home project will require separate set of plans and individual ROW check per project.
- IV. Payment of Infrastructure Maintenance Fee. Cambridge Telcom or Geneseo Communication agrees to pay a onetime municipal telecommunications infrastructure maintenance fee of \$7500, for all fiber installation work performed for the present project, as identified as Stage 1 and Stage 2 in Attachment A, within the City right-of-way. Cambridge Telcom and Geneseo Communication agrees to pay an additional \$7500 in the future for each additional similarly sized phase that Cambridge Telcom and Geneseo Communication chooses to install.
- V. Taxes. At such time as it becomes permissible by federal law or state statute, a tax for services provided through the use of Cambridge Telcom or Geneseo Communication's fiber optic lines in an amount set by federal law or state statute shall immediately go into effect.
- VI. Relocation. Cambridge Telcom or Geneseo Communication agrees to work with the City on any issues relating to current infrastructure to avoid issues for both parties up to and including relocating, at their expense, any infrastructure belonging to them that, due to its location, provides an extraordinary impediment to the repair or replacement of water, sewer, or stormwater lines already in existence prior to the execution of this agreement.

At the time that Company wishes to make a fiber service connection in the future, it shall make application for a permit for said connection with the City. No Permit fee will be charged to Company for the issuance of said permit by the City. Company, however agrees to be in constant contact with City employees, to supply all documents of work area, and to comply with all City ordinances while working in the City right-of-way. Company further agrees to restore all work surfaces as best as possible to prior condition, and to seed all disturbed soil areas.

4. Extending Service to Residential Areas. Company agrees to make its best efforts to extend fiber service to residential neighborhoods within the City, as fiber service is extended within City rights-of-way. Geneseo agrees to survey residential neighborhoods, and to extend fiber service to those neighborhoods where demand would justify the cost of extension.

5. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Parties, their successors, and assigns.

6. Authority to Execute. This Agreement has been executed by Cambridge and Geneseo by its duly authorized representative, with full authority to bind the company. This agreement has been signed by the City, pursuant to a vote of the Kewanee Board, at a lawful meeting of the Board, acting in open session.

**BACKGROUND**

The city of Kewanee currently operates 3 ambulances. All three of these ambulances are nearing or past their expected operational life span.

Our current inventory:

**1king12** is our first out and newest ambulance built on a G4500 chassis type III. This unit has been plagued with issues repeatedly over the past year and has become unreliable at times. We are having issues with the unit going into “limp” mode to protect the engine and transmission resulting in the inability to travel faster than idle speed. It has been to the city mechanic and to D&D motors numerous times in the last month to try to track down and resolve the issue. The issue appears to be electrical or a computer in nature which makes the tracing and diagnosis of the problem more difficult. This ambulance currently has a loan still being paid on it with 2 payments left of \$10,000 each. One this November and then again next year. This unit was out of service for nonscheduled maintenance and repairs 19 times in the last 12 months.

Mileage:97,134

Engine hours: 8013 at a range of 30-50 miles (online research suggested range) per engine hour this equates to **240,390 – 400,650 miles of wear.**

**1king28** a ford 450 chassis type III that was placed into service as the front emergency ambulance in 2001 and now sits in the number two position for emergency calls. This ambulance is moved back to the first position when the front line ambulance is out of service. Since moving to the second position this unit has more than doubled its engine hours. This unit was out of service for nonscheduled maintenance and repairs 11 times in the last 12 months

Mileage:106,179

Engine hours:13,266.9 at a range of 30-50 miles (online research suggested range) per engine hour this equates to **398,007 - 663,345 miles of wear.**

**1king16** a ford 350 sized chassis type III (van chassis) that was originally purchased to be an over the road transfer ambulance for the now defunct ambulance service. It is not designed to carry the weight or be used as our front line

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**ANALYSIS**

Last October Chief Shook put in for an “AFG grant” to help with the purchase of a new ambulance. We knew going in that due to the amount of monies awarded for the purchase of ambulances nationwide that the odds were not in our favor. The award period for this grant began in March and will expire in September of this year with the city not being notified to date of a decision on our application.

Currently in the fire department vehicle acquisition fund there is \$180,124. A new ambulance at this time would run between \$168,750 for a lower end 450 size class III (van chassis) to \$250,000 for a 550 size class I (truck chassis) as was applied for in the department AFG grant. After talking with Rod, Kevin Newton and Vic the city mechanic, I feel we should consider moving towards a heavier duty chassis than the van chassis with all of the rescue gear and weight the ambulance is required to carry. Ideally, we would only be loading an ambulance with 60-70% of its weight capacity to reduce wear and tear. 1king12 is close to its max weight without a driver, EMT and patient on board producing more wear on the unit, shortening its life span, and increasing the number of repairs and upkeep costs.

The front line ambulance (**1king12**) is currently experiencing a communication issue which has resulted in the transmission going into “limp mode”, as mentioned above. The issue has been ongoing since the beginning of July. Most recently, the ambulance has been at D&D for diagnostics for the last week and a half, with the issue being a “**constant hard failure**”. With the breaks in service and the age of the ambulance fleet, I feel it is prudent as a “stop gap” measure to look at least one if not two used ambulances to get us through until such time that a new unit can be purchased.

Byron Fire protection District is selling 2- 2010 Medtec ambulances. Sealed bids are due by August 26, with the vehicles available for delivery in September. I plan to take a day and travel with either the city mechanic and or Kevin Newton/Rod to inspect these ambulances. After review of the vehicles, a determination will be made regarding the worthiness of the vehicle. Should the determination be favorable, I am requesting permission to bid on the ambulance/ambulances in an amount not to exceed \$65,000.
