REGULAR MEETING AT 7:00 P.M.

1. **Light Agenda** – You may have noticed the light agenda, which is typical for this time of year, as the holidays limit the amount of time in the workplace and year-end projects consume staff time. For me, the enterprise zone also limited my ability to work on other things. The bonus of the light agenda is that you have less to read during the start of the NFL playoffs and may be able to catch part of the NCAA Championship Game.
2. **Ambulance Billing RFP** – The City issued a request for proposals for Ambulance Billing last year. Responses are due back by February 2nd, and we expect a good response due to contacts that have already been received from prospective vendors.
3. **Enterprise Zone** – Thankfully, the Enterprise Zone application is complete and in the hands of DCEO. I don't expect to hear much from them for a while regarding the selection process. In working to develop a plan B, I've found that in previous years the applications weren't given the same level of scrutiny, as many of the zones in place have little realistic hope of creating the number of jobs and amount of investment that are required to obtain zone approval. I have a conference call next week on the potential statutory changes.
4. **State of the City** – I provided something like a "State of the City" update this week to Kiwanis as the program speaker on Wednesday. The presentation was a recap of my 2016 presentation that identified the then recent adoption of goals, mission, and the survey that was out at the time, the 2017 presentation where I discussed the survey results, community and economic development plans, newly adopted incentive programs, and focus on customer service, and that in 2018 I was happy to report your recent reduction of the levy, the use of the incentive programs to complete façade improvements in the Downtown Area, Minor Home Repairs in residential neighborhoods, and a continued effort to use the survey results to guide our service delivery. I talked about some of the expectations for the coming year and how optimistic I am that we're on right path. The presentation appeared to be well received, and several people expressed their appreciation for the efforts that we are making.

5. **Representative Bustos Visit**— Congresswoman Cheri Bustos will be in Kewanee on Saturday, January 6th at the Library to present a Congressional Record to Etta LaFlora and the City of Kewanee on being named a finalist for the 2017 Governor's Hometown Award. She is extremely proud of the work involved in the project and wants to show her appreciation.
6. **Fire Department Hiring– The City is developing a new two-year hiring list in the event that openings become available during that period.** Applications are due at 4:00 PM, Friday, January 26. Written testing is scheduled to be conducted on February 24, with physical testing planned for March 24th. Interviews of qualified candidates who pass both the written and physical tests will then be scheduled. The hiring list is expected to be finalized by the Police and Fire Commission in May.
7. **Tag Days** — Employees of the Kewanee Life Skills Re-Entry Center have proposed a "tag days" type of event to help them raise money for the Polar Bear Plunge in support of Special Olympics. When they determine a date, the item will be placed on the consent agenda for consideration at the next meeting.
8. **Collective Bargaining** — The City will soon begin negotiations with the Fraternal Order of Police on a new collective bargaining agreement. I have reached out to Jay Titus, the FOP field representative, to ensure that our calendars are aligned for bargaining sessions. Jay will be meeting with the union members later this month to discuss their goals for the bargaining sessions and then propose a schedule. I'll keep you informed as the process moves forward.
9. **Raffle** – I was contacted by a resident about an idea to raise money for a project in the community. He indicated that in Amboy, the City sells 50/50 raffle tickets all year and the winner is drawn at an annual event they have, which I suspect is something akin to Hog Days. I think such a program could be useful to fund home improvements through Rebuilding Together or Downtown Improvements like improved streetscaping. I'd like your thoughts on a similar contest, and ideas for the use of the proceeds. Feel free to call, text, email, or drop off your thoughts. I'll compile them all and summarize the information to see whether or not it's something we'd like to pursue.
10. **Amtrak Meeting** – There will be an Amtrak Meeting in Princeton on January 23rd at 11:00 AM. Additional information will be provided when it becomes available.
11. **Code Amendments** – There are proposed amendments to the City's Code of Ordinances that will be given to you on Monday to review. They will be placed on the agenda for the next meeting for discussion and feedback, and then will be brought to your consideration at a later meeting (the date of which depends on the extent of the changes and your feedback).

COUNCIL MEETING 17-24 DECEMBER 26, 2017

The City Council met in Council Chambers at 7:00 PM with the Mayor calling the meeting to order and the following answering to roll call:

Mayor Looney called the regular Council Meeting to order at 7 PM, stating that the Council was reconvening following a work session to discuss street maintenance.

News media present was as follows:

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The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Mayor Looney asked for a moment of silence for our troops still fighting overseas.

Mayor Looney explained that the next items were placed on the consent agenda and were considered to be routine in nature to be passed as a whole with one vote of the Council. Mayor Looney requested that any member of the Council or the audience wishing to have an item removed from the consent agenda for individual consideration to make the request and the item would be removed and considered following the approval of the remaining consent items. The consent agenda included minutes from the December 11, 2017 Council Meeting, payroll for the pay period ending December 23, 2017 in the amount of \$192,240.32, reports from Finance & Administrative Services, Bock, Inc., and the Health Insurance Fund. The consent agenda was approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Faber. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Bills submitted for approval totaling \$423,934.63 were approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Colomer. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Mayor Looney then asked if anyone wished to speak regarding a non-agenda item. There being no such requests Mayor Looney moved on to new business.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution #5088 authorizing the City Manager, Mayor, Attorney, and Clerk to execute the appropriate documents to obtain ownership of the remaining land in the Kentville Industrial Park from the KEDC and amending the budget was approved on a motion made by Council Member Colomer and seconded by Council Member Faber. After some discussion regarding the parcel genealogy and the proposed use of the land by the Department of Corrections, Council Member Koehler expressed some reservations. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays, with Council Member Koehler voting present. The motion passed.

Minutes of the Zoning Board of Appeals from its meeting held on December 20, 2017 were accepted on a motion by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Faber. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3914 granting a request for variance to Calvin and Diane Peart, 1009 N Burr Street to allow an addition on the east side of the current house was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Colomer. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Minutes of the Plan Commission from its meeting held on December 21, 2017 were accepted on a motion made by Council Member Colomer and seconded by Council Member Koehler. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3914 granting a rezoning request to Jon DeBord, 110 E Tenth Street from R-2, One-Family Dwelling to B-3, Business and Wholesale was approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Colomer. Community Development Director Edwards confirmed at the request of Council Member Yaklich that any additional buildings placed on the lot would need a building permit. Mr. DeBord reported that he plans to purchase the parking lot across the street to the south. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5089 authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Michlig Energy for the purchase of automotive fuel for Calendar Year 2018 was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Yaklich. Facilities Manager Newton reported that of the total gallons of fuel approximately 35,000 gallons would be gasoline. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3915 amending Ordinance #3436 to amend the Sexual Harassment Policy of the City of Kewanee as required by Public Act #100-0554 on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Colomer. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

OTHER BUSINESS

Council Member Colomer stated that he was excited to buy the land and the potential benefits to the City with the expansion of the Life Skills Reentry Center. He thanked the KEDC and IDOC for their partnership in the project. He also wished everyone a safe new year.

Council Member Koehler asked about the excess ambulances. Fire Chief Shook reported that the ambulances had not yet been sold. He did report the he had reached out to Neponset and they had not responded to the offer. Chief Shook also noted that the percentage of assist calls to Neponset had declined.

Council Member Yaklich asked Chief Shook how the new ambulances were working out. Chief Shook reported favorably. Council Member Yaklich noted his shared enthusiasm over the IDOC project and land acquisition. He also noted the road race that would be held on Sunday, December 31, 2017 and their need for some assistance. Council Member Yaklich then reminded residents to park off the street following the accumulation of snow.

Council Member Faber echoed the sentiments of Council Members Colomer and Yaklich in regard to the KEDC and IDOC partnership with the City for the land acquisition. He also reminded residents not to throw snow in the street while clearing sidewalks and driveways.

Council Member Koehler thanked the trash route guys for their assistance when he was unable to get his garbage to the curb.

Mayor Looney reported that the heat had been repaired at the train depot. He acknowledged the final meeting of the year and thanked Council and staff for all their efforts through the year.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

City Clerk Edwards announced that the City had some difficulty with the recycling truck that morning, and recycling would be collected the following day. City Hall offices would be closed on Monday, January 1, 2018, in observance of New Year's Day. There would be no change to the regular trash collection schedule. Christmas Trees – void of any decorations, tree stands, or plastic bags would be picked up on December 29 and January 5th.

There being no further business, Council Member Yaklich moved to adjourn the meeting and Council Member Faber seconded the motion. Roll call showed 5 ayes, no nays. The meeting adjourned at 7:38 PM.

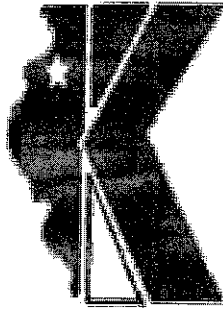

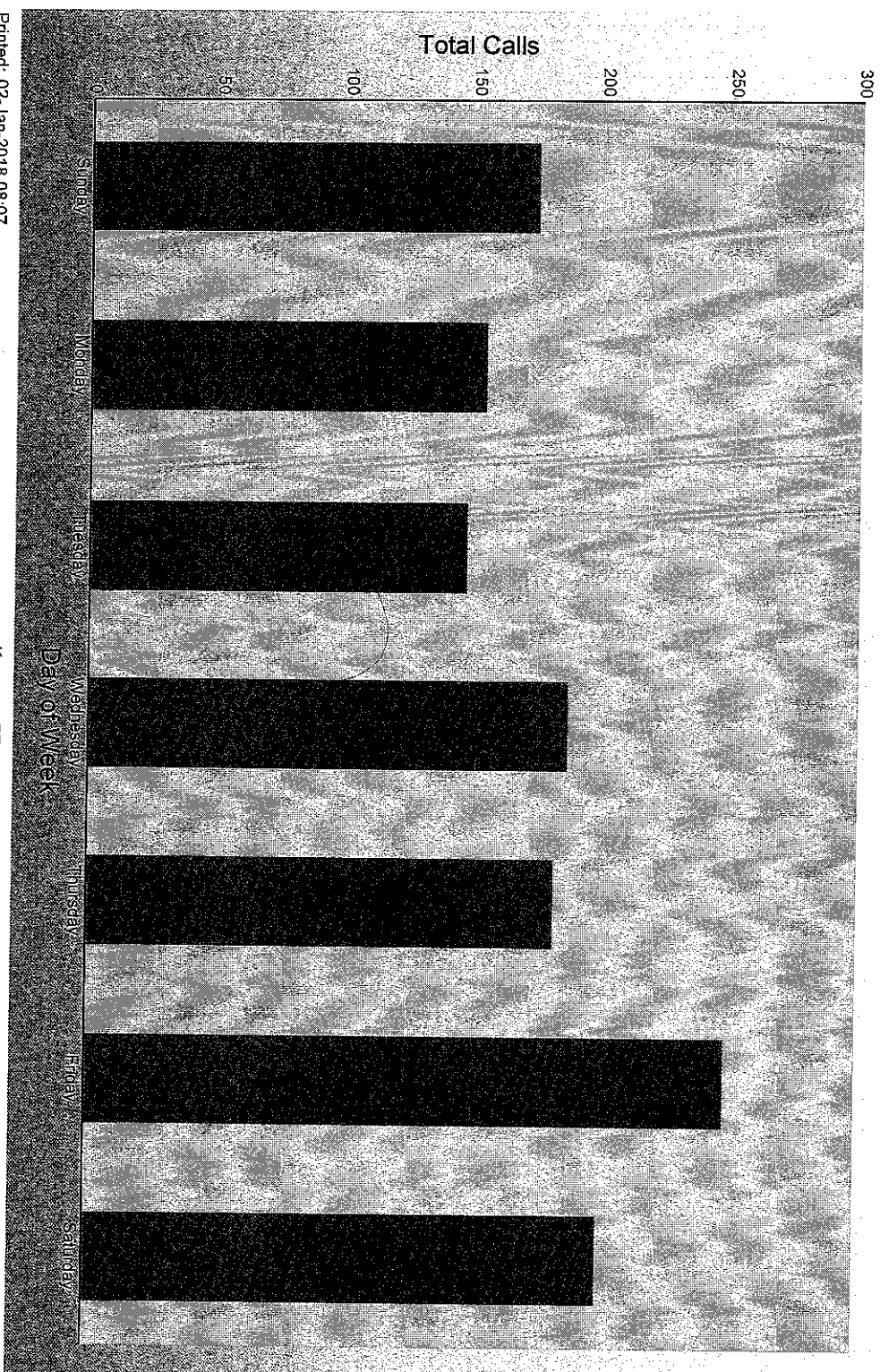

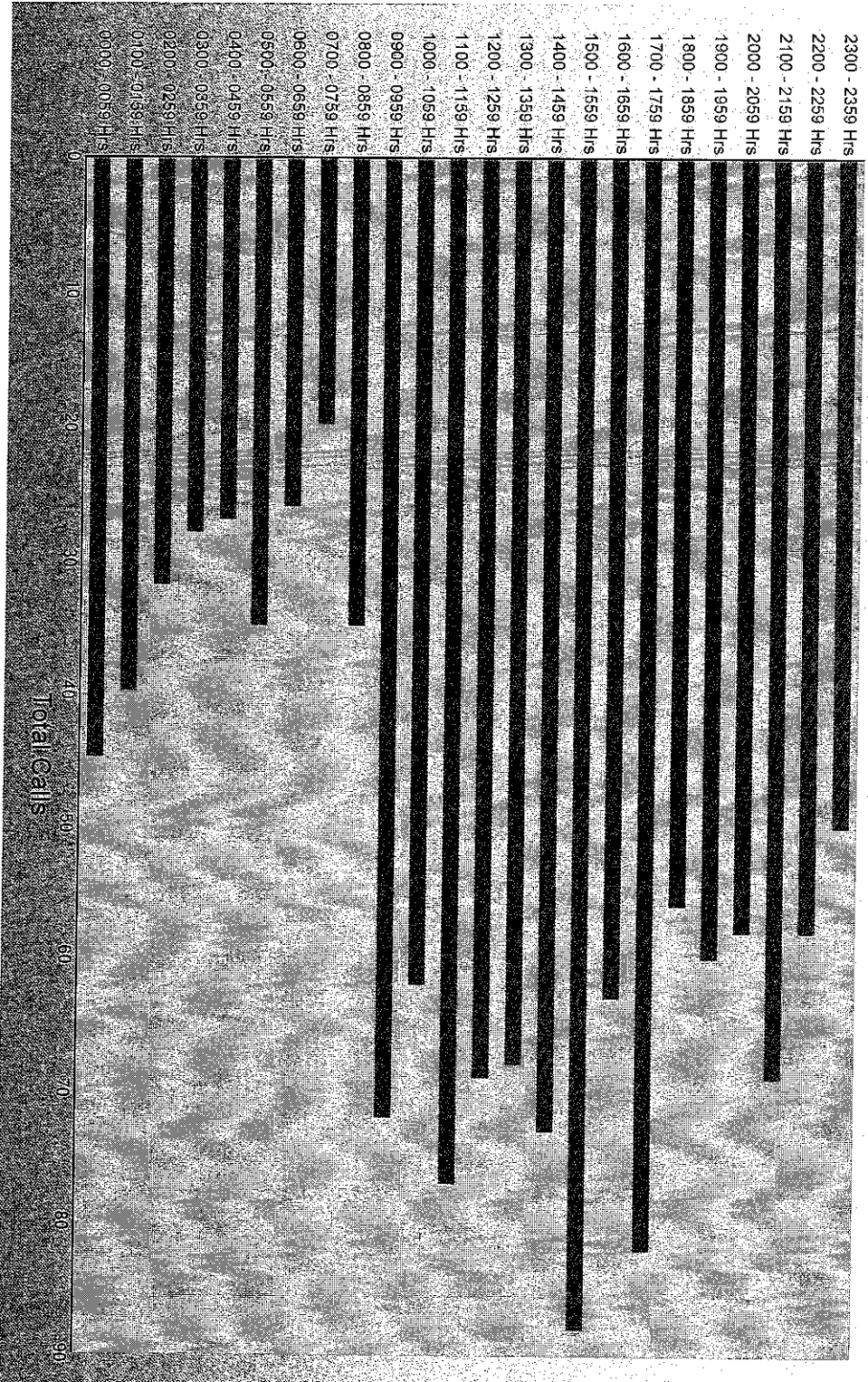
December 2017

Total Calls by Day

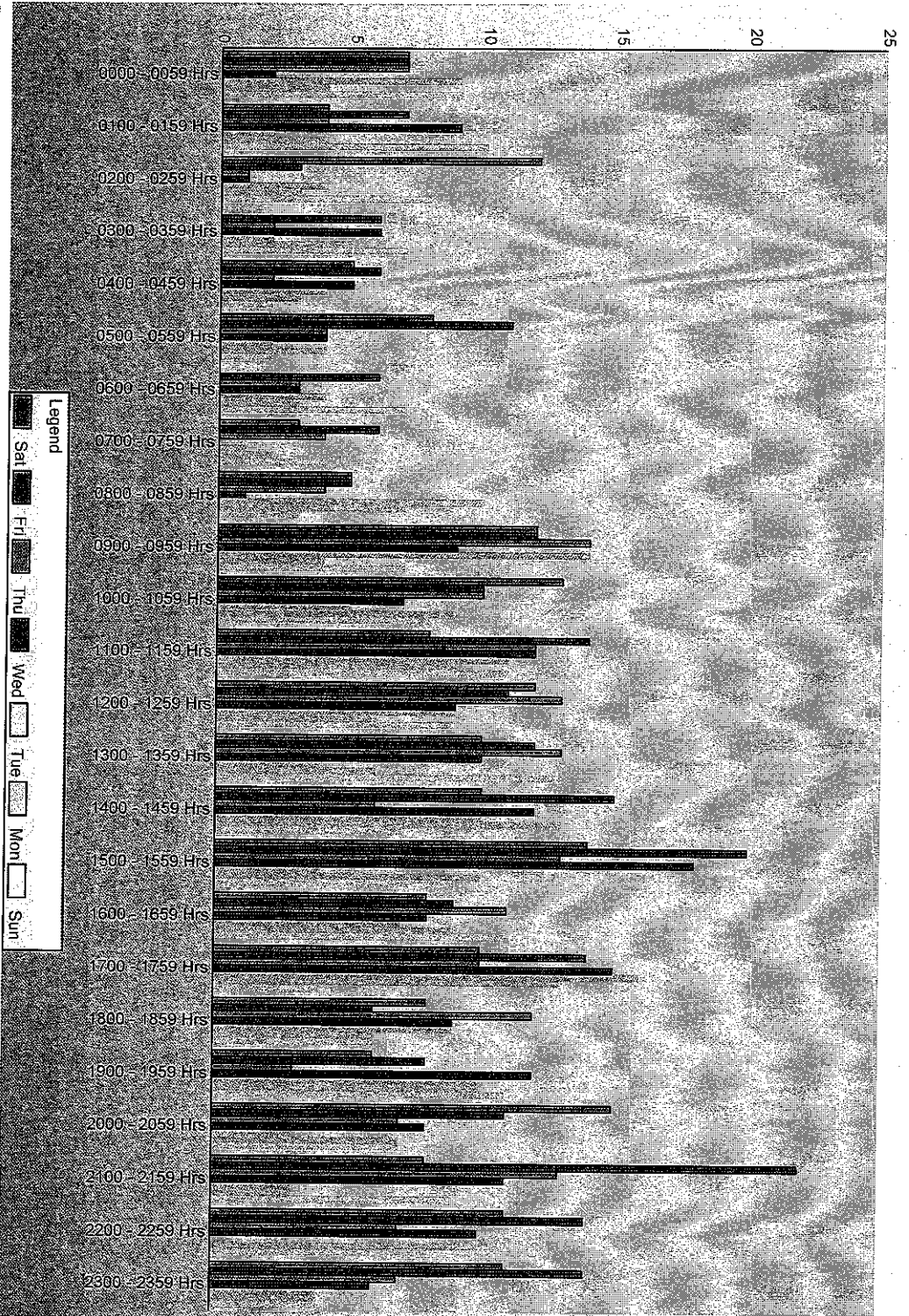


December 2017

Public Works Department Report

The Sanitation Division picked up **539,920** lbs of curbside garbage, **71,100** lbs of curbside recycling and **18,420** lbs of curbside landscape waste in the month of **November 2017**.

The Water Division replaced **3** curbstops and repaired **5** leaking water service lines. The Water Division repaired **2** water main breaks. They delivered **113** red tag notices that resulted in **19** water services being shut-off at the curbstops. Of those delinquent accounts **14** have been paid and service re-instated. Water staff terminated **1** water services that made the list of properties that are up for demolition. The water Division replaced **2** fire hydrants. The water staff replaced **56** mxu/meters and **101** had customer water service or account transfers. The water crew performed **11** leak checks for water account customers. The water division had **8** after hour's customer assist service calls. The water division staff assisted the water loss survey technician 2 days and found 2 leaking service lines and have replaced both of the lines.

The Street Division picked up **57** cubic yards of bulk brush. The Sewer Division replaced a 30' section of mainline sewer on W. First St., replaced 2 sewer laterals on W. 1st Street. The Street/Sewer handled **6** after hour's customer assist service calls. Both the Street and Sanitation Divisions have been re-establishing the right of ways and replacing sidewalks after sewer repairs and tree removals. The Street Division re-instated the road surface on Madison after Ratliffs had installed the second conflict manhole. The Street crew mounted all of the salt boxes in the plow trucks. The Street crew rebuilt the manhole and installed a new storm inlet at 4th and Chestnut.

The Sewer camera crew has been cleaning and televising trouble areas in order to determine if the needed repairs can be done with the cipp technology or conventional spot repair method. (14 more that need viewed)

PURPOSE	Authorizes the construction of a memorial in Veteran's Park to service members of the Vietnam Conflict.	

BACKGROUND	<p>City staff was contacted by the Superintendents of both school districts regarding a proposed memorial to residents of Kewanee who served during the Vietnam Conflict. Both districts had been approached by a veteran who, with a background in civil engineering, has designed a memorial that tastefully commemorates service in each branch of the military. At the request of the districts, the City then met with the memorial's proponent to see if Veteran's Park might serve as a more suitable location.</p> <p>The proposed design of the memorial would provide a sustainable monument, the placement of which would not interfere with activities that occur in the park. All necessary funds have already been raised for the construction of the memorial, which would take less than a month to complete. If approved, the memorial would be completed this spring. An aerial representation, cross section, and examples of the proposed pavers to be used are included in your packets.</p>

ANALYSIS	<p>The veteran who has served as a proponent of the memorial felt like either of the schools would serve as a good location for the piece, because students could walk past the names engraved in the bricks and develop an appreciation for the men and women from Kewanee who served this country during a time of war. While I understand that rationale, there were difficulties in placing the memorial at each of the facilities, and the rationale behind the memorial might not have been fully achieved. Additionally, a Kewanee graduate might not think to look at Wethersfield for a memorial to a loved one, or vice versa. Veteran's Park provides a more natural location for such a memorial than would either of the high school properties.</p>

RESOLUTION NO. 5090

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A MEMORIAL IN VETERAN'S PARK TO SERVICE MEMBERS OF THE VIETNAM CONFLICT, AND DECLARING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE IMMEDIATELY.

WHEREAS, Veteran's Park is a suitable location for memorials to our service members who provide service to our country both during times of peace and war; and

WHEREAS, The City has been asked for permission to construct a memorial to the service members of the Vietnam Conflict in Veteran's Park at no cost to the City; and

WHEREAS, the placement of the monument will not interfere with activities that occur or are expected to occur in Veteran's Park; and

WHEREAS, The Kewanee City Council encourages all citizens to embrace and fully support the life, service, and full measure of devotion given by the millions of brave men and women that have forgone their personal convenience to serve their Country and to protect the greater good of the people of the United States of America.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE KEWANEE CITY COUNCIL, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 The City Council hereby finds that the construction of a Vietnam Conflict Memorial in Veteran's Park would be an enhancement to the park.

Section 2 City staff is hereby directed to ensure the use of adequate construction methods and materials to ensure the sustainability and appearance of such monument.

Section 3 City staff is directed to inform the public and the press about the time, date, and location of the dedication ceremony, when the details are finalized.

Section 4 This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

All Vietnam Veterans are referred to each other as **BROTHERS AND SISTERS FOREVER.**

- WHAT** A memorial for all those veterans who served in Vietnam, from Kewanee, for thanks and support of your service.
- WHY** A brick and marble memorial for placement in a public place where people will respect, to help in the healing for those who served.
- WHERE** A place of choice is waiting for approval, to be announced when approved.
- WHO** Veterans names only will be placed on a brick. We need your help by providing names there will be no charges asked.

The monument is from fellow Vietnam veterans, Brothers and Sisters, who had the fortune to know them, with a Thank you for your service, or a welcome home, which was never received upon our return home. It's only been 10, 12 years that people would thank you for your service. Now it is the time to let go of our bad feelings and sign the list and have your name placed on a single brick.

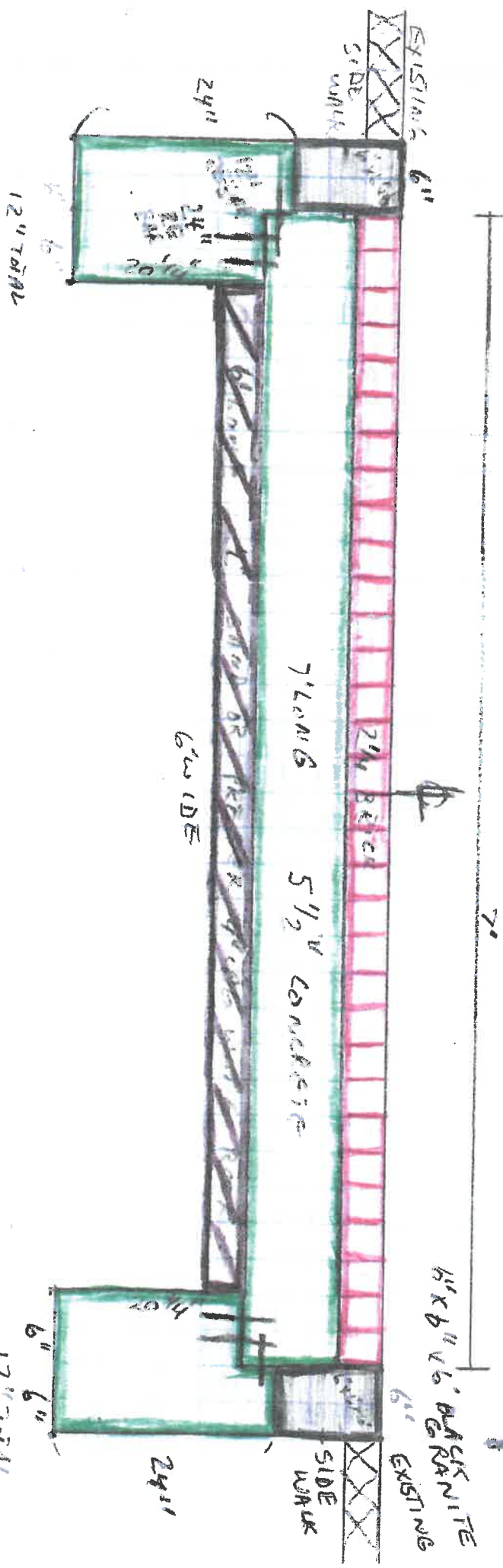
