REGULAR MEETING AT 7:00 P.M.

- 1. **East Street** The FAU project on East Street is underway. The project will take approximately 45 working days to complete, so with good weather it could be done in midto late July. There was a slight delay this week due to the need for materials that were not on hand. While waiting for the arrival of the parts needed for the project, the pavers were able to complete a portion of the 2019 General Street Maintenance Program.
- 2. **Viaduct** Staff met with the engineer last week and the engineering firm is now working directly with the railroad on the permitting process. Staff has also contacted Burlington Northern regarding the mowing of their rights of Way in advance of significant community events that are scheduled for the summer.
- 3. **Demolition Grant**—The city was awarded \$37,000 for demolitions under the Abandoned Properties Program. This will allow us to provide a similar impact to the community as we have had in recent years. Community Development will participate in a Web-training event for the grant on June 27th.
- 4. **Police Vehicles**—The Dodge Charger has been delivered to the department for officers to test drive. The condition of the vehicle was documented by both the company and the department, and officers were encouraged to use caution when driving it as we will be responsible for any damage. Chief Ainley will be checking with officers to get their feedback on the car and whether or not it's something to consider adding to the fleet.
- 5. **Fire Fighter Applications Applications are being accepted through June 25th.** The packet is available at City Hall at the customer service counter and on the City's website. We also have put the word out on our Facebook page. Testing is scheduled to begin June 29th.
- 6. **Waste Water Treatment Plant**—Staff provided a television interview with WQAD regarding the plant and the need for sludge hauling. Chamlin is preparing documents for short-term and long-term hauling with a variety of options, and staff will be meeting with the engineer and potential haulers next Thursday to discuss options and opportunities.
- 7. **Capital Bill Funding**—Unofficial word is that the Capital Bill contained funding for each Representative and Senator to be able to disburse to worthy projects. Letters are being

- drafted to our elected representatives to request project funding if it becomes available.
- 8. **Mowing**—Staff has made minor adjustments to the process in order to get work orders into the hands of contractors faster, but remains cognizant of the budgetary impact that faster turnaround times can have overall and will monitor the situation.
- 9. **Variances** Variances have been applied for at 1200 W Division St & 803 Page Street. ZBA will meet on June 19th to hear those case, which will then be brought to you for your consideration.
- 10. **Mobile Home Parks**—Staff met with the new owner of the mobile home parks earlier this week, driving through the park formally known as Southwind to point out violations and opportunities for enhanced compliance. Staff is optimistic that the cooperative approach will result in a higher degree of compliance than experienced in the past.
- 11. **Newsletter**—Staff has begun working on the next newsletter, which we expect to have out at the end of next month. If you have any questions or topics that you'd like to have answered, please let me know.

COUNCIL MEETING 19-10 MAY 28, 2019

The City Council met in Council Chambers at 7:00 PM with the Mayor calling the meeting to order and the following answering to roll call:

Michael Yaklich Council Member

Council Member Chris Colomer was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Mayor Moore asked for a moment of silence for our troops still fighting overseas.

Mayor Moore explained that the next items were placed on the consent agenda and were considered to be routine in nature to be passed as a whole with one vote of the Council. Mayor Moore requested that any member of the Council or the audience wishing to have an item removed from the consent agenda for individual consideration to make the request and the item would be removed and considered following the approval of the remaining consent items. The consent agenda included minutes from the May 13, 2019 Council Meeting, payroll for the pay periods ending May 11 & 15, 2019 in the amount of \$217,492.41, reports from Community Development and the Police Department, request from Kewanee Area Church Fellowship to host a bake sale on August 3, 2019, a Tag Day on September 21, 2019, and the 41st annual CROP Walk on Sunday, October 6, 2019, all in support of local food pantries, and a request from Cerno's for the use of the parking lot at 213 W. Second St. on June 16, 2019 from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm for the Hog City BBQ Challenge. The consent agenda items were approved on a motion made by Council Member Komnick and seconded by Council Member Faber. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Bills submitted for approval totaling \$740,005.59 were approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Yaklich. There were no questions or discussion regarding the bills. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Mayor Moore then asked if anyone wished to speak regarding a non-agenda item. Kathy Pugh spoke on behalf of the Shell Station asking the council to reconsider a combination liquor license that would allow selling liquor both on and off premises. She explained that Shell wished to build an addition and allow drinking in the gaming room only. She stated that they had not had any

problems in any of their other locations with the same services. Mayor Moore requested drawings of the proposed addition, locations of other Shell stations with gaming rooms, and the history from these locations for the council to review.

Carl Tanzillo spoke on behalf of the residents of Advel Court requesting that the City take over Advel Court and maintain the street. He produced a 1949 document that showed that the street was private and not a City street. Council Member Faber asked about the discussion in the past at previous council meetings. It was explained that the residents of Advel Court were given information regarding bringing the street up to standards before it could be turned over to the City. Council Member Faber stated that his street was sub-standard as well and asked how many private streets there were in the City. City Manager Bradley responded that there were 8 or 9 others. City Attorney Raver pointed out that the width of the street was a problem also and may affect property owners land. City Manager Bradley explained that a petition would need to be signed by all property owners and that the street upgrades could possibly be done by a special tax assessment before turning the street over to the City. Council Member Yaklich stated that he thought cost estimates should be given to all of the property owners. Mayor Moore agreed that the City should not take on the full burden. He advised the residents to form a committee and to bring forward what they can do to bring the street up to standards.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Moore opened a public hearing on the Appropriations Ordinance for the municipal fiscal year from May 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020 at 7:24 PM. City Manager Bradley explained the appropriation ordinance was a statutory requirement. The City would continue to use the previously passed budget and the procurement policy to guide spending. Mayor Moore asked if anyone from the Council or audience had any comments. There being no other comments, the public hearing was closed at 7:25 PM.

NEW BUSINESS

Don Bixby from Chamlin & Associates gave a report on capital improvements needed at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) for future EPA compliance. He explained that there was an urgent problem with sludge disposal at the plant. We have about a month to a month and a half left before the lagoon is full. At this time, the only apparent solution is to secure the services of a contract hauler to remove the sludge. IEPA regulations have tightened to the point that little farm land is available to spread the sludge on as we have done in the past. Long term options include planning annually to use contract haulers or install our own sludge press and landfill the sludge. Discussion followed regarding the design and ways that the \$1,000,000 press project could be paid for. Possible solutions to the chlorides issue were discussed as well, along with a new phosphorus limit to be imposed by the state.

Ordinance #3963 fixing appropriations for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2019 and ending April 30, 2020 was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Komnick. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

The minutes of the Zoning Board of Appeals were accepted on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Faber. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3964 granting a variance to Dean Olson at 629 W Prospect St was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Komnick. Community Development Director Edwards noted that the full Zoning Board of Appeals were in attendance at the meeting and voted unanimously. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5163 establishing premiums for eligible participants in the City of Kewanee self-insured health care program was approved on a motion made by Council Member Komnick and seconded by Council Member Faber. It was noted that the premiums were calculated to match estimated expenses in the FY19-20 budget by the former City Clerk working with our insurance consultants. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5164 authorizing an agreement to provide janitorial services for Kewanee City Hall and the Amtrak Depot with Peart Properties of Kewanee, IL was approved on a motion made by Council Member Faber and seconded by Council Member Yaklich. It was noted that only 2 bids were received with an approximate \$5,000 difference between the bids. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Ordinance #3965 amending Chapters 95 and 113 of the Kewanee City Code increasing the minimum age for the sale, purchase, and use of tobacco products, electronic cigarettes and alternative nicotine products from 18 to 21 years old was approved on a motion made by Council Member Komnick and seconded by Council Member Yaklich. Council Member Faber stated that he personally had a problem with 18 year olds being able to vote and/or serve in the military but not smoke. City Manager Bradley explained that the State of Illinois had passed a new law that takes effect July 1, 2019 regarding the increase in the minimum age. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

Resolution #5165 authorizing the use of the public alley and parking area in the 200 block of West Second Street by Hype, Inc d/b/a Cerno's Bar & Grill in conjunction with Hog Days was approved on a motion made by Council Member Yaklich and seconded by Council Member Faber. Police Chief Ainley noted that there had been no serious problems in the last several years with Cerno's request. Roll call showed 4 ayes, no nays. The motion passed.

OTHER BUSINESS

Council Member Yaklich asked if citizens could clean plugged storm water inlets near their homes. Operations Manager Johnson explained that citizens could do this themselves if they were able to do so safely and away from traffic. He noted that they could also call City Hall and report the plugged inlet and city staff would be sent out. Council Member Yaklich also asked about the status of the audit. City Manager Bradley reported that the engagement letter has been

signed but fieldwork has not been scheduled yet.

Council Member Faber asked how the new weed mowing contract was working out. Community Development Director Edwards reported that the quality has been excellent, reporting timely and that there have been no issues. Council Member Faber stated that he would have liked to have seen the yard mowed at a house close to the Cemetery where the owner had recently passed away before the recent Memorial Day service.

Council Member Komnick reported that he had received a lot of good feedback regarding the City-wide Clean-up Day. He also commented on the good turnout at the Memorial Day service.

Mayor Moore also commented on the Memorial Day service. He stated that the Kewanee Band and Choir did an excellent job. He asked City Manager Bradley to give an update on the viaduct. City Manager Bradley reported that he had nothing new to report. Mayor Moore stated that the City-wide Clean-up was a success. He invited anyone who wanted to improve the process to come volunteer and help at the next clean-up day. The mayor also asked if the time frame for ordinance violations, such as tall weeds, could be shortened.

HENRY COUNTY TRAFFICKING ENFORCEMENT GROUP INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

These Articles of Interagency Agreement are entered into by the undersigned public agencies, hereinafter referred to as Member and collectively as Member Agencies on the date indicated by the action of the respective governing boards.

For and in consideration of the terms herein set forth and the mutual covenants and obligations of the Parties hereto, it is agreed by and among the undersigned Parties the following:

Parties to this agreement are:

Colona Police Department Geneseo Police Department Kewanee Police Department Henry County Sheriff's Department

WHEREAS, Henry County Sheriff's Department, Kewanee Police Department, Colona Police Department, Geneseo Police Department, are each a law enforcement agency in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the agencies hereto have a public duty and obligation to enforce the laws and protect the citizens from illegal activities; and

WHEREAS, the jurisdiction and authority of each Member is limited and such limitations are detrimental in combating crime within the geographical boundaries of the Member; and

WHEREAS, the Members recognize that criminal activities can more effectively be combated by the pooling of resources and working collaboratively to provide a more effective means of law enforcement protection; and

WHEREAS, the Members have the authority to enter into this Interagency Agreement pursuant to Article 7, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1, et seq.).

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- **1. GROUP.** The Member Agencies shall operate a multi-jurisdictional group known as the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group within the County of Henry in the State of Illinois. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group shall operate in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois and with the policies established by the group member's officer department policies.
- **2. MEMBER AGENCY.** A Member Agency is defined as an agency which designates an officer(s) to work actively with the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. The Member agency head must sign the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Interagency Agreement.
- 3. PURPOSE. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group shall conduct covert and overt investigations concerning individuals and groups engaged in criminal activities in the geographical areas serviced by member agencies, with specific emphasis on all levels of drug trafficking and human trafficking for sexual and labor exploitation. Investigations will include the development of intelligence data regarding criminal activity in the service area. The intelligence data will be assimilated and maintained with dissemination of this intelligence data to the appropriate federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group will also participate in training and education of area law enforcement agencies concerning new and safe investigative techniques as well as ongoing criminal activities in the area. Also, the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group will be available to community groups so as to inform and educate the community regarding criminal activities being conducted in the service area and make the community aware of safety concerns when necessary.
- **4. INDEMNIFICATION.** In the event a civil proceeding is commenced against a group officer who has been assigned as member of the group, and the proceeding alleges acts or omissions occurring within the scope of group activities, the officers agency shall provide representation and indemnification to the group officer to the extent authorized and as limited by the State Employee Indemnification Act (5 ILCS 350). In the event that a group officer is injured. That member's agency and the group officers insurance is responsible for the coverage of the treatment. All officers from agencies other than the Henry County Sheriff's Department employee, will be officially deputized by the sitting Sherriff prior to preforming duties outside of their respective agency jurisdiction.
- **5. HENRY COUNTY TRAFFICKING ENFORCEMENT GROUP ADVISORY BOARD.** The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board (Board) is comprised of all Member Agency heads or their designee and shall be the governing body of the group.
 - This Board may designate a prosecutor from the area serviced to also be on the Board.
 - This Board shall designate officer positions. These positions are Chair, Vice-Chair,

Treasurer, and Secretary. Each officer's appointment will begin at the first meeting on/after July 1st for one year. The Chair shall conduct meetings of the Board. If the Chair is absent, succession shall be first Vice-Chair, followed by Treasurer, and finally Secretary. The Treasurer shall maintain accurate financial records in accordance with the ICJIA requirements and generally accepted accounting procedures.

- A quorum will be required to call a vote. A quorum is designated as more than half of the total number of Board members. Each Board member will have one vote. Only members present during a call for vote may vote.
- The Board may award monies or other things of value for such law enforcement purposes as deemed appropriate by the Board by a majority vote. The amount and method of payment will be stated in the motion voted upon.
- This Board may enter into agreements with a nonparticipating agency for the intention of fulfilling the purpose of the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. Any such agreement would be an attachment to this agreement.

6. MEMBER AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES. Each Member Agency will provide an officer for 4-8hrs a week. A Member Agency may elect to assign additional officers and hours as funding and staffing allow. Their respective group officers are to be provided with necessary commodities, equipment, services, and training, including officer safety related items, not provided by the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. Each Member Agency will determine how staffing hours are provided to the Group. The Member Agency may elect to have only officers that are on their normal work shift participate. It will be the Member Agency's responsibility to keep track of the time earned and reimburse its officer(s) how they see/deem appropriate. The Agency head will assist with this responsibility.

7. GROUP OFFICER. Each Member Agency providing an officer to the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group will assure their officer:

- Received appropriate law enforcement certification:
- Is a full time officer or a part-time officer with specialized training/experience in interdiction;
- Completed the Member Agency's probationary training period;
- Is not subject to any pending disciplinary action;
- Will adhere to all laws of the United States of America, State of Illinois;
- Will comply with the their departments policies and procedures;

8. SALE OF FORFEITED PROPERTY. No persons, either sworn or civilian, who are either employed or assigned to the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group, may purchase property - physical or real, forfeited to the Group as a result of an investigation conducted by the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. Also, no employee of

any Member Agency may purchase such forfeited property. Additionally, no immediate relatives - mother, father, son, daughter, brother, sister, may purchase such property. This pertains to participation in Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group auctions, as well as any other type of sale transaction conducted by any governmental agency, which involves the sale of forfeited property which would result in the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group receiving all or part of the sales proceeds.

9. Distribution of Funds and/or Property. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board shall have the power and authority to distribute Group assets and or forfeiture funds which are not required for the operation of the Group.

Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group funds considered for distribution may include cash forfeited to Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group agencies, cash forfeited to other law enforcement agencies and allocated to the Group. Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group agencies share of proceeds from the sale of forfeited property and other property or assets owned by the Group.

No distribution shall be made by the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board contrary to any term, condition, or applicable statute governing the original receipt of said funds or assets by the Group. Any agency receiving funds or assets distributed by Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group, shall agree to any original or additional term, condition or applicable statute which governs the further use of said funds or assets by the receiving agency.

Distributions shall be at such a time and in such total amount as determined by the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board. The Group Advisory Board may authorize distribution of funds at the last Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board meeting of the calendar year. Distributions shall be made in amounts to be determined by the member agency's participation in a case. If an agency not a member of the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group assists a group member agency. The Advisory Board may elect to include that agency in the distribution of funds.

Only those Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group agencies considered to be Group members for distribution purposes shall be eligible for distribution. An agency shall be deemed to be a member agency eligible for distribution beginning when the agency:

A. Signs the interagency agreement

All of the above are subject to the final approval of the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board.

10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This agreement shall commence July 1, 2019 and shall remain in effect for one year or until such time as it is renewed, altered, modified, or terminated by a two thirds majority vote. In the event that this agreement is terminated, the termination vote must be made in writing at least 30 days prior to the specified termination date.

RESOLUTION NO. 5169

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE HENRY COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, GENESEO POLICE DEPARTMENT, COLONA POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE CITY OF KEWANEE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO OPERATE A MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL GROUP KNOWN AS THE HENRY COUNTY TRAFFICKING ENFORCEMENT GROUP WITHIN THE COUNTY OF HENRY IN THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, AND DECLARING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE IMMEDIATELY.

WHEREAS, Henry County Sheriff's Department, Kewanee Police Department, Colona Police Department, Geneseo Police Department, are each a law enforcement agency in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the agencies hereto have a public duty and obligation to enforce the laws and protect the citizens from illegal activities; and

WHEREAS, the jurisdiction and authority of each Member is limited and such limitations are detrimental in combating crime within the geographical boundaries of the Member; and

WHEREAS, the Members recognize that criminal activities can more effectively be combated by the pooling of resources and working collaboratively to provide a more effective means of law enforcement protection; and

WHEREAS, the Members have the authority to enter into this Interagency Agreement pursuant to Article 7, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1, et seq.).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE KEWANEE CITY COUNCIL, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1

- **1. GROUP.** The Member Agencies shall operate a multi-jurisdictional group known as the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group within the County of Henry in the State of Illinois. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group shall operate in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois and with the policies established by the group member's officer department policies.
- **2. MEMBER AGENCY.** A Member Agency is defined as an agency which designates an officer(s) to work actively with the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. The Member agency head must sign the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Interagency Agreement.
- <u>3. PURPOSE.</u> The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group shall conduct covert and overt investigations concerning individuals and groups engaged in criminal activities

in the geographical areas serviced by member agencies, with specific emphasis on all levels of drug trafficking and human trafficking for sexual and labor exploitation. Investigations will include the development of intelligence data regarding criminal activity in the service area. The intelligence data will be assimilated and maintained with dissemination of this intelligence data to the appropriate federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group will also participate in training and education of area law enforcement agencies concerning new and safe investigative techniques as well as ongoing criminal activities in the area. Also, the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group will be available to community groups so as to inform and educate the community regarding criminal activities being conducted in the service area and make the community aware of safety concerns when necessary.

4. INDEMNIFICATION. In the event a civil proceeding is commenced against a group officer who has been assigned as member of the group, and the proceeding alleges acts or omissions occurring within the scope of group activities, the officers agency shall provide representation and indemnification to the group officer to the extent authorized and as limited by the State Employee Indemnification Act (5 ILCS 350). In the event that a group officer is injured. That member's agency and the group officers insurance is responsible for the coverage of the treatment. All officers from agencies other than the Henry County Sheriff's Department employee, will be officially deputized by the sitting Sherriff prior to preforming duties outside of their respective agency jurisdiction.

5. HENRY COUNTY TRAFFICKING ENFORCEMENT GROUP ADVISORY BOARD. The Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group Advisory Board (Board) is comprised of all Member Agency heads or their designee and shall be the governing body of the group.

- This Board may designate a prosecutor from the area serviced to also be on the Board.
- This Board shall designate officer positions. These positions are Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary. Each officer's appointment will begin at the first meeting on/after July 1st for one year. The Chair shall conduct meetings of the Board. If the Chair is absent, succession shall be first Vice-Chair, followed by Treasurer, and finally Secretary. The Treasurer shall maintain accurate financial records in accordance with the ICJIA requirements and generally accepted accounting procedures.
- A quorum will be required to call a vote. A quorum is designated as more than half of the total number of Board members. Each Board member will have one vote. Only members present during a call for vote may vote.
- The Board may award monies or other things of value for such law enforcement purposes as deemed appropriate by the Board by a majority vote. The amount and method of payment will be stated in the motion voted upon.
- This Board may enter into agreements with a nonparticipating agency for the intention of fulfilling the purpose of the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. Any such agreement would be an attachment to this agreement.

6. MEMBER AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES. Each Member Agency will provide an officer for 4-8hrs a week. A Member Agency may elect to assign additional officers and hours as funding and staffing allow. Their respective group officers are to be provided with necessary commodities, equipment, services, and training, including officer safety related items, not provided by the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. Each Member Agency will determine how staffing hours are provided to the Group. The Member Agency may elect to have only officers that are on their normal work shift participate. It will be the Member Agency's responsibility to keep track of the time earned and reimburse its officer(s) how they see/deem appropriate. The Agency head will assist with this responsibility.

<u>7. GROUP OFFICER.</u> Each Member Agency providing an officer to the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group will assure their officer:

- Received appropriate law enforcement certification;
- Is a full time officer or a part-time officer with specialized training/experience in interdiction:
- Completed the Member Agency's probationary training period;
- Is not subject to any pending disciplinary action;
- Will adhere to all laws of the United States of America, State of Illinois;
- Will comply with the their departments policies and procedures;

8. SALE OF FORFEITED PROPERTY. No persons, either sworn or civilian, who are either employed or assigned to the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group, may purchase property - physical or real, forfeited to the Group as a result of an investigation conducted by the Henry County Trafficking Enforcement Group. Also, no employee of any Member Agency may purchase such forfeited property. Additionally, no immediate relatives - mother, father, son, daughter, brother, sister, may purchase such property. Proclamation recognizing June 10, 2019 as the 100th Anniversary of Illinois Being the First State to Ratify the 19th Amendment.

Whereas, Illinois had long been at the forefront of the movement to provide women the right to vote; and

Whereas, in Illinois the first women's suffrage association was established in Earlville in LaSalle County in 1855, just seven years after the first women's rights convention in Seneca Falls, New York which called for suffrage for women; and

Whereas, the first statewide suffrage organization, the Illinois Woman Suffrage Association was established in 1869, becoming the Illinois Equal Suffrage Association in 1891; and

Whereas, in 1891, Illinois enacted a law allowing women the right to vote for elective school offices; and

Whereas, in 1913 Illinois enacted the Presidential Suffrage Bill which gave Illinois women the right to vote in federal and municipal elections, not otherwise restricted to men under the Illinois Constitution; and

Whereas, with the enactment of that law, Illinois became the first state east of the Mississippi River to give women such right to vote for President of the United States, and is credited with being a major positive influence in advancing the women's suffrage movement in the United States; and

Whereas, on June 4, 1919, the proposed 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution was passed by the United States Congress and sent to the States for ratification; and

Whereas, 100 years ago on June 10, 1919, Illinois became the first State to ratify the 19th Amendment (one hour prior to Wisconsin); and

Whereas, Illinois led the way for the necessary three-fourths of the States to ratify the 19th Amendment, which became part of the Constitution on August 26, 1920.

Now therefore, be it further resolved that the City Government of Kewanee IL declares June 10, 2019, a day to celebrate women's rights to vote and recognize the important role Illinois played in achieving that right in the United States.
