

Regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen convened at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, January 10, 2017 in Room 34, the Harry B. Butters Chambers, Norwood Memorial Municipal Building, with the Pledge of Allegiance, and a silent moment of prayer and reflection. Meeting is Recorded.

#### 7:30 P.M. – Chief Anthony J. Greeley, NFD:

Chief Greeley began his monthly review of department activities by wishing all a happy new year. He said December was a typical month for the Fire Department, adding that the Department runs 365 days per year. It never closes. The Chief commended the members of the Fire Department for the work they do, stating he is proud and privileged to lead them. He said there are many specialized positions in the Fire Department. Captain Maurice is the Press Information Officer and does a fantastic job getting information to the press. Ff. Flaherty is the Communications Officer and he keeps the radio system

operating. He will be retiring within the next three years. Dara O'Malley has led the Water Rescue Unit for fifteen years but he will be stepping away from it and he will be replaced by a firefighter in the department who is trained. FFs Hogan and Motta keep the decontamination trailer at the ready. Fire Education Officer Paul Ronco did a fantastic job again in 2016. He visits the schools and delivers the fire safety message to the children. FFs Michael Downy and John Shea are the ALS and BLS coordinators and they keep everything in compliance. Lt. Hayes is the IT support and he does a fantastic job. Dispatch supervisor Collen DiBlasi and dispatchers Lanzoni, Brown and White are competent and consistent and did a great job all year in 2016. The Fire Investigation Unit is comprised of FFs Henry and Cody. Fire Prevention is done by Deputy Maggio and Lt. Butters. Business Manager Kathleen Bane is retiring this week after thirty plus years. The chief said he will truly miss her- she is the heart and soul of what the department does every day and how they do it. He said Ms. Bane is a tremendous asset to him in his success as Chief. The knowledge that she had got him through the first couple of years and even today. Ms. Bane was a keeper of sixty-nine people and she handled each and every person on staff every day. He publicly thanked Ms. Bane and she will be dearly missed. Selectman Bishop said Kathy Bane is the epitome of respectability and was not always treated well. Selectman Plasko spoke about the Chief acknowledging staff and knows he is sincere in his praise and the employees are deserving of it.
