

Regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen convened at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, September 11, 2018 in Room 34, the Harry B. Butters Chambers, Norwood Memorial Municipal Building, with the Pledge of Allegiance, and a silent moment of prayer and reflection. Meeting is Recorded. Chairman Maloney reflected upon the importance of remembering September 11, 2001 to the Country and all who perished in the attacks on the World Trade Center in New York as well as the Pentagon and Shanksville, Pennsylvania.
