City Update – 3/31/20

President Trump has extended the social distancing guidelines for another thirty (30) days. We strongly urge people to STAY HOME and WORK SAFE. Please only travel for essential business. Going out of doors for exercise and mental health is encouraged, but PLEASE practice social distancing when doing so. Keep at least 6 (six) feet of space between yourself and others.

Governor Abbott, Bureson County Judge Keith Schroeder, Mayor Bradford and the Bureson County Office of Emergency Management strongly encourage the following practices when shopping for food and necessary supplies:

- Limit the number of trips per week whenever possible.
- Do not shop in family groups – send one person inside.
- Maintain the separation distance of 6 feet from other shoppers while making selections, lining up at the registers, and entering and exiting the store.

Please continue to practice the following actions to slow the spread of COVID 19:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 30 seconds. If soap and water are not available use an alcohol-based sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, and throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
