

Residents and visitors will find other beautiful parks throughout the City of Woodhaven. Whether you are looking for a fun place to exercise, picnic, play ball, cool off, walk the family dog, enjoy an outdoor concert, skateboard or ice skate, we are sure you will find a park that suits your needs.

The Mayor and Council remain committed to developing and maintaining a healthy and vibrant park system. This summer, a new road, walkway and parking lot were installed at the south end of Civic Center Park, providing improved and convenient access to many facilities within the 71-acre gem. In the past year, many other improvements have been made to Civic Center Park, including the development of the inclusive playground, and disc golf course and splash pad upgrades.

HOMEOWNERS: When dealing with a contractor, it is in your best interest to have them pull permits and arrange for the proper inspections. The permit fees are the same for contractor or homeowner. We strongly recommend that when you hire someone to do work for you, ask them to provide you a copy of the permit.

Twenty-four (24) hour voice mail is available for after-hour requests to schedule inspections and to leave messages. Inspections are performed on Tuesdays and Thursdays only. Please note that you must call by 2:00 p.m .the business day before the day you want an inspection.



Department of Public Services

Transfer Station

During the winter months of January 1 through March 31, the Transfer Station is only open on Saturdays 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Woodhaven I.D. is required and only open to Woodhaven residents. Materials must come from a resident's property and work must have been performed by the resident and not a contractor. Yard waste, hazardous materials, shingles, motor oil, concrete, bricks, railroad ties are items not accepted.

R.V. Storage

The R.V. Storage winter hours are January 1 through March 31, Monday through Friday 7:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Gate closes at 3:00 p.m. and Saturday 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The storage area offers 30-foot and 40-foot sites. At this time we have a waiting list for both size sites.

Street Sweeping

Street sweeping will suspend during the winter months. Your street is typically cleaned the day after your trash day. This schedule will remain the same and will resume again in the spring.

Leaf Program

Our annual City Leaf Collection Program typically begins at the end of October. However, adjustments may be made depending when leaves begin to fall. City crews will come through your area two times.

The leaf program is intended to help those who cannot collect leaves easily or need assistance. If you or a family member are able to collect your leaves, please do so. Leaves should be placed in yard waste bags or receptacles that are clearly marked Yard Waste. Yard waste stickers are available at City Hall and DPS.

Please rake all leaves to the back of the curb and not onto the pavement, which can cause flooding.

Holiday Lights

Holiday lights are a festive and fun way to decorate, but if they are misused or are not properly maintained, they can pose a fire hazard.

- Make sure to inspect strands each year before using them.
- Check for any gaps in insulation and broken or exposed wires. If any are found, do not use the strand.
- Make sure that your outlets are in good condition. Do not overload your electrical outlets.
- Do not leave the lights on when nobody is home or at night. Timers can be useful in controlling the power to the lights.

Live Christmas Trees

Live Christmas trees can add that special touch to your holiday atmosphere, but if not handled properly, could be a serious fire risk.

- Snow and ice removed from driveways and sidewalks should not be deposited on city streets, as it impedes the safe flow of vehicle traffic.





Your Animal Control and Animal Shelter

The operations at the Animal Shelter are funded by the cities of Woodhaven/Trenton and by donations from generous people like you.

The Animal Shelter and Animal Control provides many services for the residents of Woodhaven and Trenton. Some of our services are pet adoptions, owner surrenders, trapping strays and nuisance animals, volunteering, fundraising and adoption events, educating residents on keeping healthy and happy pets, enforcing all animalrelated laws and complaints.

City Ordinance Reminders

Please remember that ALL dogs and cats within the city of Woodhaven must be licensed with the city by April 30 each year. You will need to take proof of rabies shot to the City Clerk's office to purchase your license.

Dogs must wear their license at all times, even while traveling in and out of state.

Please remember when walking your dog anywhere within the city, even in parks, that the dog must be on a leash at ALL times. Please be aware that the city has a running-at-large ordinance for felines. Cats must be contained at all times and are not allowed to run the neighborhoods.

Adoptions

Please check out our pets at www. petfinder.com, Adopt-A-Pet.com and our Facebook page, Woodhaven-Trenton Animal Shelter.

Individuals can adopt dogs, cats and other small animals (when available) during any posted hours. Adoption fees are \$100. Your new pet will have a health record. For all animals that are unable to be altered at the time of adoption, a \$50 deposit fee will be charged. The adopter will have 30 days to alter the new pet. Once this is completed, the \$50 deposit fee will be refunded. Michigan State Law requires all animals adopted from an animal shelter or rescue group be spayed or neutered.

Donations

The Animal Shelter takes donations of all pet foods, blankets, toys, cleaning supplies and other animal-related items. The Animal Shelter also is in GREAT need of cat litter at ALL times. Wildlife Information

Animal Control asks that you become aware that the city does have a large amount of wildlife and we need your help to keep these animals safe. Things you can do to help keep the wildlife from being a nuisance are: Contain all trash in properly closed containers; keep your outside grills clean of food once you're done cooking; keep grass, weeds and brush trimmed back and neat; check your chimney caps and all vents for loose areas; raise wood piles off the ground at least six (6) inches; keep trees trimmed back from your home and other buildings; make sure there are no gaps under decks that animals can move into. Also, there are wildlife repellant sprays on the market that can help divert the animals from your property. Moth balls also are a good repellant. Animal Control does have a nuisance animal trap available for a rental fee.

NEW ROBOTIC SYSTEM HELPS PATIENTS WITH HIP, KNEE PAIN

The Mako Robotic arm-assisted surgery system makes hip and knee replacements a lot easier for patients. "It's breakthrough technology and we're fortunate to have it," explained Dr. William Athens, Jr. of Precision Orthopedics in Brownstown Township.

Athens and his partner, Dr. James Eberhardt, have done nearly 400 joint replacements this year at Beaumont Taylor.

"There's less complications with the Mako Robot," Athens said. "The patient is discharged the next day instead of three or four days."

In fact, partial knee resurfacing is done outpatient with the new technology instead of the one- or two-day inpatient hospital stays with the traditional methods.

Changing lives

People suffering from knee and hip problems know how difficult simple tasks like walking, standing, running,

bending, lifting and even sleeping, can become.

"When you have boneon-bone arthritis it's like an aching feeling in the joint, making daily living difficult," Athens said. "They (patients) become



sedentary. The pain is

incapacitating. This gets rid of that pain and restores function so they can play tennis and go bowling and hiking. We're restoring their ability to stand, walk, bend their knees, and to do things we take for granted every day."

Mako Robot is more surgically customizable and accurate than any other knee or hip replacement system on the market, which makes it easier for patients to return to their lifestyles after surgery, Athens said.

Robot maps surgery

The process is simple. The patients meet with a doctor in the Brownstown office and a CT scan is taken at the hospital, where a 3D picture is downloaded to the robot. This allows the surgeon to assess the exact way the replacement joint must be inserted to optimize fit and alignment.

"We are still performing the surgical procedure, the robot is assisting the surgeon by making the surgery more precise," Athens said. The information from the CT scan is downloaded to the robot as well as intra-operative anatomic landmarks from the individual patient. The robotic arm is then brought into the operative field to make the bone cuts that are accurate to the half millimeter. It's five times more accurate than traditional instrumentation for joint replacement."

During the surgery, the Mako Robot provides a set of boundaries. This results in fewer surgical errors.

The recovery time with the robotic surgery is easier, because





because Dr. James Eberhardt there's less swelling.

"It allows people to get back to doing some of the things they haven't done in many years, because of the pain," Athens said. "In that regard, it's life-changing. It means there is quicker recovery, a joint that is more stable that can potentially last longer, a joint they can be more active on and that they will have less issues with," Athens said.

Robot's debut

The Mako Robot has been on the market five years, he said, and it came to his office in the Downriver area in January 2018.

"The only other places in Michigan that offer it is DMC (Detroit Medical Center) downtown and Huron Valley DMC," Athens said. The robot is also at St. Joseph in Arbor and Henry Ford West Bloomfield.

He expects Mako Robotic technology to be used for shoulder replacement in the near future.

Between 10 and 20 percent of patients who undergo traditional knee replacements are dissatisfied with the results, Athens said, adding that the Mako Robot "really takes it to the next level to properly align the joint to the patient's anatomy, because everyone is different."

Brownstown's Victory Gym offers more than just a workout

ne of the greatest challenges facing veterans, no matter how long they've been out of military service, is readjusting to civilian life. Something as simple as going shopping, cleaning one's room, or even just having time to sit and think can be incredibly challenging for veterans. Luckily, there's a place for them at Victory Gym in Brownstown.

Founded in 2015 by 18-year Army veteran Mike Emory, the volunteer-anddonation-based gym offers a free membership to former service members and first responders (firefighters, paramedics, and police officers). The



gym was originally founded specifically for former military servicemen and women. But the gym quickly expanded to include first-responders.

"First responders have a lot of the same experiences as veterans," explains Char Haener, the executive director of Victory Gym.

This isn't just an ordinary gym, however. The gym is based on the camaraderie inherent to the military. The atmosphere is casual and oldschool, similar to working out in your neighbor's garage. Not only that, but every Wednesday at 7 p.m., there's a peer-led PTSD counseling session. The difference between regular counseling and peer-led counseling is paramount in Victory Gym's mission.

"We focus on peer-led because other therapy can be offered elsewhere, but peer-led therapy is something unique that you don't come by often," Haener said. "It's brothers and sisters helping each other."

Victory Gym isn't just for service members, either, Civilians are welcome for \$15 per month, and students pay \$10 per month, no contract. However, even this is designed to help veterans, by offering them a chance to interact with civilians in a comfortable environment.

Physical fitness is a hallmark of military and first-response work, so a gym is often an environment in which many veterans feel comfortable. There's even an element of PTSD treatment that encourages working out called "iron therapy".

"It's a place to open up," Haener said. "When the stresses of daily life are creeping up, it's a great way to release it."

One of the most powerful parts of the gym is the Memory Wall. The wall is lined with pictures of previous members who have passed away. Whether those

on the wall have passed away after losing the battle with their PTSD, have been killed in action, or have simply passed

from natural causes, the pictures serve one purpose: "We don't want to add more photos to the wall." Haener said.


The gym's devotion to the whole well-being of the veterans and service members that populate our everyday lives is

clearly palpable. The main drive of Victory Gym is now, and has always been, to serve those who serve us. The respect for the veterans, and for the struggles they face in their everyday lives. is evident.

"There's a misconception that if somebody has PTSD, they're weak, or more susceptible for some reason," Haener said. "The strength that it requires to live with PTSD on a daily basis and still be here, and carry on with your life, it takes immense strength...we want to encourage anybody that feels like they're living with PTSD – you can talk to us. Message our Facebook page... you have a support system waiting for you, and it's here every single day."
