Total Solar Eclipse Basics

- On Monday April 8th, 2024 around 3pm people within Butler County will experience a total solar eclipse for 2.5-3 minutes
- The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806
- Large crowds are expected to show up for this once-in-a-lifetime event which may impact traffic, cell phone service, and even wi-fi

Things to Consider

- Review solar eclipse safety information found here: science.nasa.gov/eclipses/future-eclipses/eclipse-2024/safety
- Ohio Law requires that every person, which intends to prepare, serve or sell food from a movable vehicle, portable structure, or watercraft that routinely changes location, obtain a Mobile Food Operation License.
- Please note that if you had a food license for your mobile in 2023, the expiration for your license is February 29th, 2024. If you plan to operate for any events during the April 2024 solar eclipse, you must apply for a Mobile Food Operation License for the 2024-2025 licensing year prior to the event. Current mobile food operation license fee is \$208.00 USD.
- New mobiles must submit a plan review application packet to the Butler County Environmental Health Department at least 30 days prior to the scheduled event to allow our staff time to accommodate your request and schedule your inspection.
