Total Solar Eclipse Basics

- On Monday April 8th, 2024 around 3pm people within Butler County will experience a total solar eclipse for 2.5-3 minutes
- The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806
- Large crowds are expected to show up for this once-in-a-lifetime event which may impact traffic, cell phone service, and even wi-fi

Things to Consider

- Do not allow vehicles to be parked on or near any component of your septic or private water systems (tanks, leach area, well head, etc.) to prevent damage to sewage and water systems.
