## Temporary Campgrounds

### Total Solar Eclipse Basics

- On Monday April 8th, 2024 around 3pm people within Butler County will experience a total solar eclipse for 2.5-3 minutes
- The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806
- Large crowds are expected to show up for this once-in-a-lifetime event which may impact traffic, cell phone service, and even wi-fi

### Things to Consider

- A temporary campground is any tract of land used for no more than 7 consecutive days to park five or more recreational vehicles or portable camping units. If you plan to operate a campground for the April 2024 solar eclipse, please contact the Butler County Environmental Health Department to obtain a temporary license.
- Your application must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the event to allow our staff time to accommodate your request and schedule your inspection.
- Fee for temporary campground event is \$150.00 USD (\$1.00 USD for each additional site over 50).

Totality begins: ~3PM  
Partial ends: ~430PM
