Total Solar Eclipse Basics

- On Monday April 8th, 2024 around 3pm people within Butler County will experience a total solar eclipse for 2.5-3 minutes
- The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806
- Large crowds are expected to show up for this once-in-a-lifetime event which may impact traffic, cell phone service, and even wi-fi

Things to Consider

- Review solar eclipse safety information found here: science.nasa.gov/eclipses/future-eclipses/eclipse-2024/safety
- A temporary retail food establishment or temporary food service operation may operate at an event for not more than five consecutive days. If you plan to sell food at an event for the April 2024 solar eclipse, contact the Butler County Environmental Health Food Program at 513-887-1770 to obtain a temporary food license. Fee is \$55.00 USD per event.
- Applications can be found at https://health.bcoho.gov/forms_and_applications/index.php#outer-194 and must be submitted at least 10 days prior to the event to allow our staff time to accommodate your request and schedule your inspection.
- A temporary license is only valid for a single event, at one location, and for a period not more than five consecutive days.
- When a licensed RFE or FSO leaves their facility and operates at another location, they must obtain a temporary license in the Health District where the operation will be conducted.
