 - Demographics




Survey Results – Eligibility and Demographics

- Average age: 49 years old
- 67% home owners
- City most connected to:
 - Othello: 52%
 - Ritzville: 40%
 - Lind: 5%
- 65% white, 22% Hispanic
- 44% make less than \$50,000 per year
- 71% had less than a 4-year college degree




48% of respondents rate the quality of life in Adams county as 'excellent' or 'very good'

Resident-Rated Quality of Life




Life Factors Affecting Quality of Life






67% of respondents had volunteered at least once in the past 12 months.

Volunteerism in the Last 12 Months




About 15% of respondents stated that there has been someone in their household who had to move in because they didn't have a pace to live.




Housing and mental health services were identified as the services most in need of improvement.


What public services need the most improvement in Adams Community?




What behaviors that affect your health does your community need more information about?



58% 'strongly agree' or 'agree' they can easily access healthy, affordable food in Adams County.









12% said there was a time in the past 12 months when they did not have any health insurance. 20% stated they had a problem accessing needed health care.

What medical services did you have a problem getting?






What problems did you have accessing health services that you needed?



88% go to a doctor or clinic when they need medical care.


Where do you most often go when you need medical care






68% have visited a doctor in the past year.

Time since last doctor visit for preventative or annual physical.




39% used alternative medicine in the past year.

Likely Source of Help for Mental Health/ Substance Abuse Problems










Frequency of Exercise per Week











19% usually go to work even if they are sick.






Survey Results – Emergency Preparedness

33% would seek information from police/ fire department if a significant emergency occurred.






Survey Results – Emergency Preparedness












Total Veterans & Veterans' Share of the Civilian Population Age 18+









Total Foreign-Born Population and Foreign-Born Share of Citizenship









Share of Total Overall Income Earned by Household Income Level




Total Annual Taxable Retail Sales & Annual Growth Rate




Assessed Value of Taxable Total Property & Annual Growth Rate






Total Number of Employed Persons & Unemployment Rate









Overall Homeowner Vacancy Rate




Overall Rental Vacancy Rate




Total Property Crimes & Property Crimes per 1,000 Residents




Total Violent Crimes & Violent Crimes per 1,000 Residents




Total Drug and Alcohol Arrests, and Arrests per 1,000 Adults and Juveniles




Total Juvenile Drug and Alcohol Arrests, and Arrests per 1,000 Juveniles



Total Adult Drug and Alcohol Arrests, and Arrests per 1,000 Adults




Total Domestic Violence Offenses and Rate per 1,000 Persons

Accepted Victims of Child Abuse and Neglect & Rate per Youth Ages 0-17




