The 2020 - 2021 vehicle stickers are now available at City Hall during regular hours, or the police department 24 hours a day/7 days a week. Stickers are \$2 each, cash or check. Be sure to bring the license plate number for each vehicle.

## ANNUAL ALARM REGISTRATION

City Ordinance requires all burglar alarms to be registered with the Anchorage Police Department, regardless if the system is monitored by a security service or not.



**Registration forms are due by January 31, 2020.**

There is no charge to register your alarm. However, owners with unregistered alarms can incur civil penalties of up to \$250 a day. Registration forms are included with this newsletter and are available on the City website under City Services/Police Department or at City Hall. Registration forms should be returned to the Police Station or City Hall, or mailed to City of Anchorage, P.O. Box 23266, Anchorage, KY 40223.

**HAZARDOUS TREES**

Trees that are in City rights-of-way and identified as hazardous by the Anchorage Forestry Board have been marked with spray-painted numbers. Trees will be removed by the City in early 2020, weather permitting. Please call City Hall if there are any questions.

**CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL**

Christmas trees may be placed by the curb for pick-up on the first two regular yard waste days in January. Any tree 6-foot tall or less can be handled by the Republic Services driver. Trees larger than six feet should be cut into 4-foot lengths and placed curbside. The bases of large trees are quite heavy; by cutting larger trees into 4-foot sections, the tree can be safely handled by a single person.



**KEEPING CULVERTS CLEAR**

It is the responsibility of the property owner to keep driveway culverts open and free-flowing, and to replace collapsed drainage culverts. Twigs and other debris carried by rains and melting snow into the natural and man-made channels, clog pipes and culverts. Unless you've checked them recently and cleared them, water backups can occur and create flooding problems. When channels are properly cleaned and maintained, the water keeps moving and prevents flooding of Anchorage roads and property.



**WALKING PATH SAFETY**

Many Anchorage residents enjoy getting their exercise, walking their dogs, and walking or biking to school along the walking paths during the winter. Homeowners with walking path easements on their property are also responsible for keeping the paths clear of debris, snow, and ice for the safety of pedestrian traffic. Pedestrians should also use caution, especially during wet or snowy weather. Now is a great time to make a new year's resolution to get out and enjoy the paths throughout the City.
