To submit a written appeal, include all documentation with the request and mail to: City of Anchorage, Attn: Board of Tax Supervisors, P.O. Box 23266, Anchorage, KY 40223.

The deadline to make an appointment or submit your written appeal is Friday, February 11, 2022.

Appointments will be scheduled in the order that calls are received with the first appointment starting at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, February 21, 2022.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK-UP



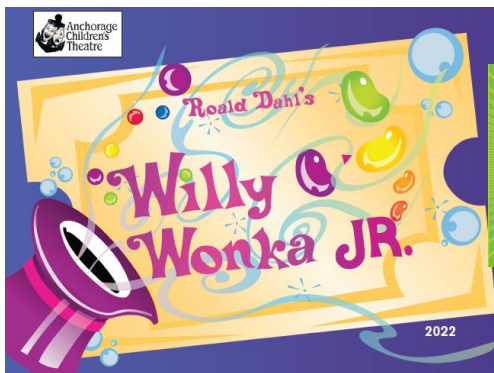
Republic Services will pick up Christmas trees with yard waste. They should not be placed in trash. Please remove all decorations and remember each tree should be cut in half or to a size manageable for one person to load into the Republic Services truck.

WHAT ANCHORAGE RESIDENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT TREE REMOVAL:

- Regulations and necessary forms are online at <http://www.cityofanchorage.org/permits.htm>
- A permit must be filed with City Hall for the removal of any **live or dead** tree(s) measuring 3 or more inches in diameter that have either fallen or need to be removed for other reasons. Please note that significant fines may be incurred if trees are removed without permit(s).
- The permit application must be accompanied by a photo of the tree(s) and a map showing their location(s) on your property (maps may be printed from <https://apps.lojic.org/lojiconline/>). The application may be submitted to City Hall via email or in printed form.
- The trees for which the form is filed may be removed 10 days after the notification is received by City Hall, unless the City Forester requests a field check.
- For an *emergency* removal -- for example, if a tree has fallen on a structure or vehicle or is blocking a road or driveway -- please take a photo before the tree is removed and submit the permit within 48 hours.
- A City ordinance requires that removed trees must be replaced within one year. The replacement requirements are explained in detail on the permit form itself. The City maintains a list of recommended replacement trees on the permits page of the website and printed copies at City Hall.

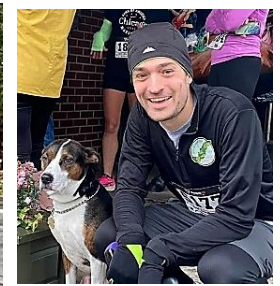

REPUBLIC SERVICES WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

Icy inclines and low hanging tree limbs and wires can prevent drivers from completing back door trash collections. Drivers will not risk running off driveways and damaging lawns if drives are not plowed or adequately salted in bad weather conditions. Unrestrained dogs, and blocked carts and driveways can also prevent collection. Please remind snow plow personnel to keep the path to carts clear of piled snow.

Yard waste and recycling are curbside only. Carts or bags need to be placed at the curb with unobstructed access by Republic Services vehicles. Each household is allowed to place up to 16 bags of yard waste that do not exceed 50 lbs. by the curb for pick up each week.
