



ANCHORAGE RECYCLES

PAPER

- Paper that tears, paper bags, window envelopes, spiral notebooks, and paper with staples and tape
- Mail, magazines, paperback books, and newspapers and phone books (plastic sleeves removed)
- Shredded paper (bagged in recyclable bag)



PLASTIC (#s 1-5 & 7)

- Plastic household containers (all colors)
- Plastic to-go containers, beverage cups, and egg cartons (not styrofoam)
- Toothpaste tubes with caps
- Medicine bottles
- Laundry detergent bottles
- Coffee/tea pods with contents and lids removed



CARDBOARD

- Flattened boxes
- Milk cartons and egg cartons
- Pizza boxes
- Cereal boxes and food boxes
- Wax-lined cups



METAL & GLASS

- Bottles and jars (with lids)
- Foil pans and wrap
- Aluminum, steel and tin cans
- Aerosol cans



DID YOU KNOW?...

You can leave the lids, caps and labels on.



Remove last serving of food and drink; no rinsing needed!

Materials are preferred loose, but you can use clear or white trash bags or blue recycling bags.
