

## Free Electronics Collection in Nashville

Come one, come all, and bring your old TVs and laptops! We will be collecting electronic waste for recycling on Saturday, July 15 from 9am to 1pm at the Village of Nashville Transfer Station, 300 E Casgrove St, Nashville.

Items that will be accepted include computers, laptops, laptop batteries, circuit boards, hard drives, servers, USB drives, RAM, memory, computer chips, processor power supply, power cords, cables and wires, printers, scanners, fax machines, keyboards, mice, audio equipment, ink jet, toner cartridges, desk, office, and cell phones, cell phone batteries, AC adapters with wires, GPS units, gaming systems, iPads, tablets, mixed batteries, small household appliances, holiday/Christmas lights, and of course TV screens and monitors! Freon containing devices will NOT be accepted at this time. You can however take freon containing devices directly to Padnos for recycling.

Electronics will be collected at no cost. There is a suggested donation of \$10 for TVs and monitors to offset the cost. This project is funded by a grant from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). This event is open to all Michigan residents!
