## **Approved Meeting Minutes October 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023**

### **Approval of Agenda**

Per Chairman Fiala, we'll proceed with agenda as presented.

### **Approval of Minutes**

Per Chairman Fiala, since we do not have a quorum present, approval of the September 8<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes will be tabled until next month's meeting.

### **Old Business: Fall Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Event Recap**

Jodi Pessell said that everything went well, all of the volunteers showed up and the football team worked out great (again). We had some really huge tires that came in, but we were able to figure out a way to get them handled. She also mentioned that the grounds person at the Expo said that if that ever have tires that we are unable to load into the trailer, that he is around on Monday mornings and he can load them with help from other people around there if needed. Overall, she feels everything went very well and according to our tire counts we collected 1,345 tires (this includes all tires).

Jay VanStee expressed that he observed (and that has been percolating in his mind for a while), we call this the "Household Hazardous Waste Event," but clearly, we are getting some very large tractor tires that aren't household (let's be honest, these are straight up farm tires that farms a business). So, there is an argument to

be made that we are in fact subsidizing businesses by accepting these large tires and frankly they represent a risk of injury as some of these tires weight 200-300lbs. We've been fortunate enough to get the Expo Center help us load them on occasion, although at other times we have had Health Department employees driving the tractor (which he is not comfortable with). The football players again were able to gang up on these tires and load them in the trailers, but he just perceives the risk of one of them flipping over backwards or something, so there is a liability risk there that we need to recognize and consider whether or not we should really be accepting large farm/tractor tires. Clearly, we don't have a quorum present, so he isn't expecting any decisions to be made today, but he just wanted to share his view and ask for some further discussion on it before the next collection.

Chairman Fiala thought the Thornapple Kellogg Football Team was phenomenal and he has spoken with Catherine Getty a little bit about this; she would like to have him, herself and maybe Craig Stolsonburg go in front of the School Board to talk about the football players volunteering. The coaches mentioned they would like to have some sort of public service recognition for them as well. Chairman Fiala also shared that he was a little disappointed with the volumes as he thought in general all the volumes were down (more than he anticipated they would be), but other than that he thought this was another excellent event.

Jodi Pessell stated that Drug & Laboratory always asks if there is a dumpster for cardboard (to get recycled) and she wondered if this is something we need to look into as it would make sense to have at least one (1) present at the event. Chairman Fiala stated asked Don Johnson if we could possibly get a container from Waste Management specifically for cardboard (obviously we would pay for it) since they donated a container for waste at this last event. Don replied that he would have to look into, but he did say that if the cardboard is broken down so that it would fit in his dump trailer, he would be willing to load it up on that and take it to Waste Management's cardboard box.

### **New Business: Recycling Report to Board of Commissioners (BOC)**

Chairman Fiala asked Rachel Frantz to confirm that she puts together a HHW report with the sharps, medicine and all the volumes & everything that we collected at the event; she confirmed she does this report and for this last event, she is just waiting on the oil and electronic numbers. She also wanted to mention that the presentation that was emailed to everyone was not the complete presentation; for some reason it skipped every other page so we are only seeing half of the pages, not the full report.

Rachel Frantz also confirmed that she is working on the Annual Report for the BOC as well. However, the recycling report presentation is really more focused on Materials Management Planning, so she thought she would do the Annual Report separate since that is usually based on the calendar year.

### **Chairman Comments**

Chairman Fiala just wanted to share that a lot of Road Commissions have difficulty with dead deer along the roads and not many of them do as we do at the Solid Waste Oversight Committee & Sherriff's Office and at a recent County Road Commission Meeting, it was presented that there is a company here in Michigan that has a proposal out and they would like to come to Barry County to pick up the deer; they would charge \$60.00 per deer. So, he requested that Rachel Frantz contact the Sherriff's Department to see if she can find out the cost

per year as well as how many deer are picked up per year. Years ago, he said we used to do budget increments of \$10,000.00 for the Sherriff's Department to do that and then when they would use that up, we would just give them another \$10,000.00 more. We haven't received any reports on that in a while and he has no idea how many dead deer are picked up in a year; so, he would like to get an idea first to determine whether or not this is something worth pursuing.

Rachel Frantz shared that as far as Materials Management Planning, the Notice of Intent is really all that we are waiting for and that will come in the form of a Survey Monkey to the BOC. She did ask Michael Brown to let her know as soon as the Board receives that and so far, he has not informed her that they have. It was supposed to be done at the beginning of September and then it was changed to October, so she isn't really sure when it will come out. However, once it does come out, then that starts the clock and that is why she wanted to get this presentation in front of the BOC this month, so that they can be refreshed on what she will be asking them to do. She did get some more information from the last meeting she attended; the BOC will accept or reject the position of County Approval Agency, which would make them responsible for the early planning, the implementation of that Plan as well as appoint the Designated Planning Agency (DPA) and the Materials Management Planning Committee. So, that really falls on them to do as the County; however, she thinks it is very important that we provide them with some guidance so they have an idea of what we are looking for in the Planning Committee Members and she will go over that with them during the presentation.

Rachel Frantz also shared that during an EGLE meeting, it was stated that the DPA could be a group such as the Department of Public Works, so she wondered if our DPA could then possibly be the Solid Waste Oversight Committee. However, she did confirm that currently EGLE has Michael Brown listed as the DPA (as well as herself), but she imagines the BOC will appoint just her as the DPA (and not Michael Brown) as the DPA is the one who writes the Plan and she can't imagine that Michael has time for that.

#### Recycling 101

Curbside and drop-off recycling generally includes:

- **Paper** products such as office paper, phone books, magazines, junk mail, newspaper, paperboard (like cereal boxes)
- **Cardboard** should always be flattened
- **Glass** bottles and jars
- **Metal** cans and aluminum foil
- **Plastic** food and beverage bottles and jars



\*Recyclables should be loose, do not bag!  
Always check with your hauler or drop-off site for their specific rules.

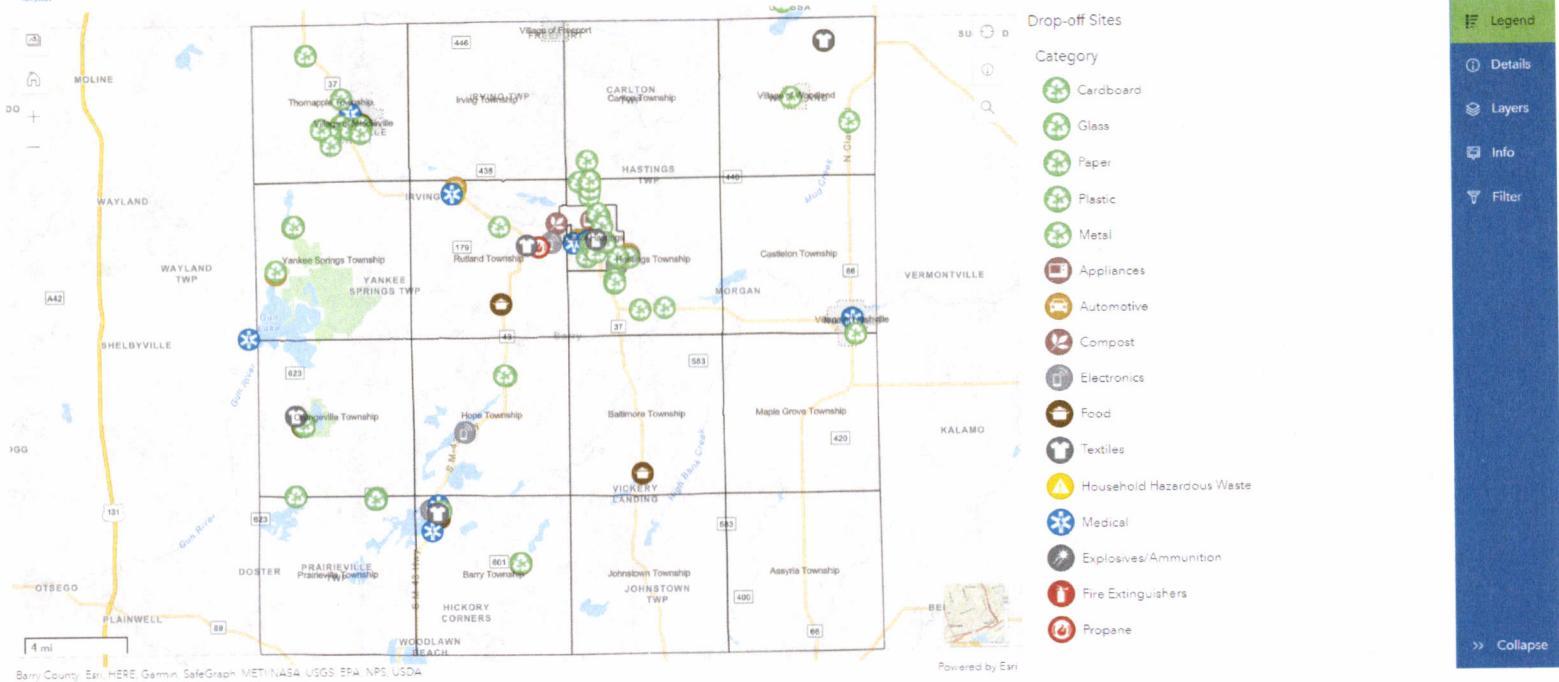
- Generally Accepted (IGA):** Most recycling curbside and drop off facilities that accept plastic accept these types.
- Sometimes Accepted (SA):** These plastics are sometimes accepted curbside and at drop off centers, check with your hauler or drop off center to confirm.
- Usually NOT Accepted (NA):** These types of plastic are especially hard and expensive to recycle and are almost never accepted curbside or at drop off centers. It's best to reduce or eliminate your use of these plastics and reuse what you already have.



# Interactive Recycling Map

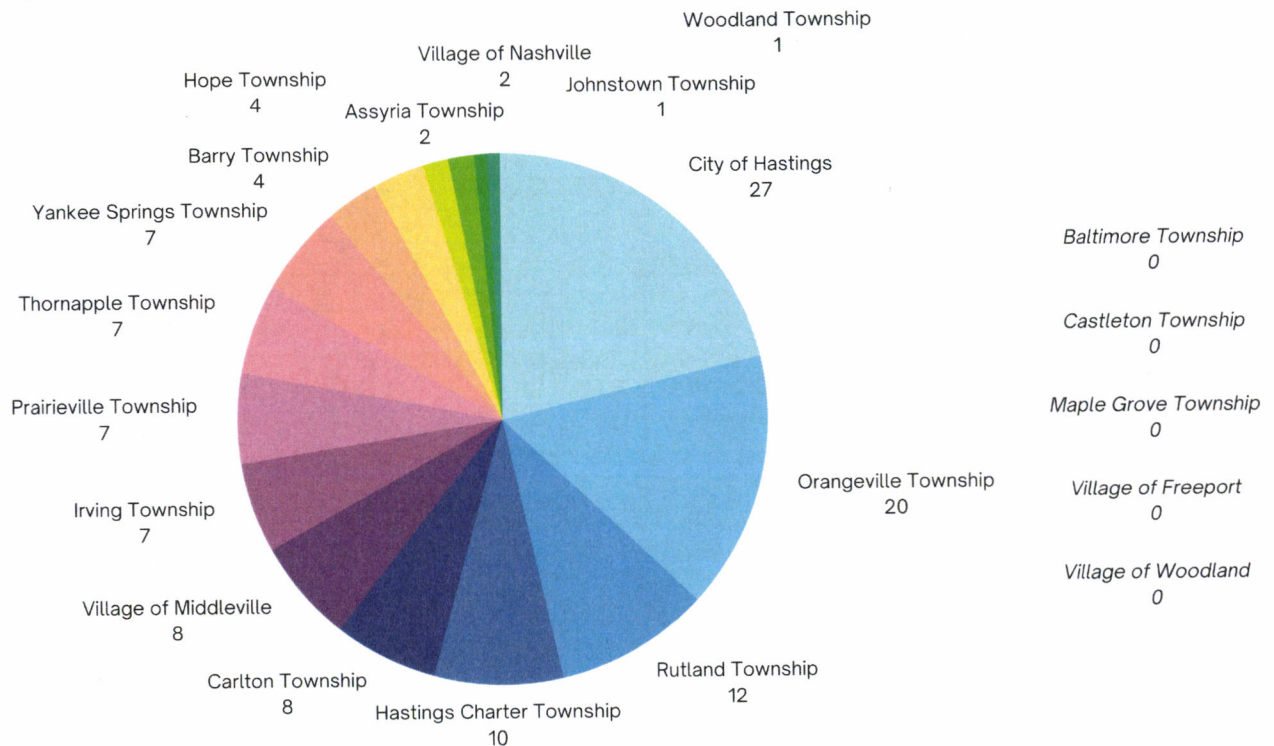

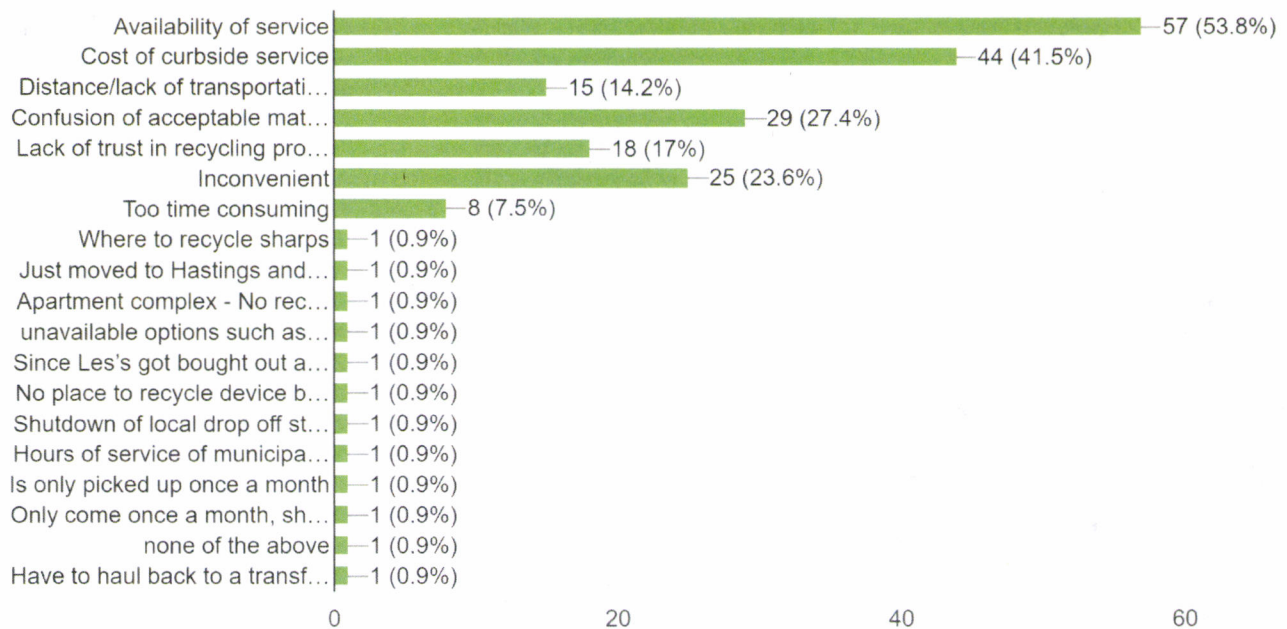
Which township, village or city do you live in?

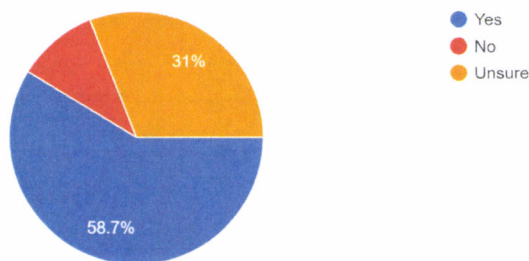
## What barriers exist (if any) that prevent you from recycling? (select all that apply)

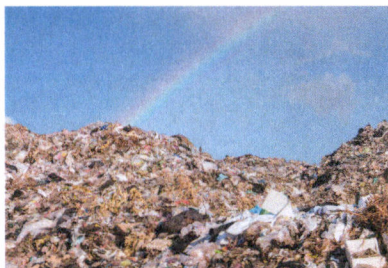

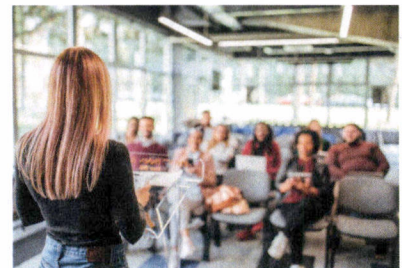
