

State Fiscal Year 2013 Annual Report

Program Development Highlights

Community Re-Entry Program. The ADAS Board is partnering with the Butler County Mental Health Board to co-fund a program for individuals with serious mental illness who are returning to their homes in Butler County from prisons across Ohio. The ADAS Board's funding and participation allowed for development of increased clinical skills in the area of integrated dual disorders assessment and treatment.

Problem Gambling Services. Problem gambling services were developed in the county including training of treatment staff, funding for treatment provision to indigent clients, and funding for awareness campaigns regarding how to obtain help for gambling issues. The board is funding the provision of problem gambling counseling services by Community Behavioral Health and problem gambling community awareness and prevention services by the Alcohol and Chemical Abuse Council.

Addiction Medications. Funds are being made available by the ADAS Board to assist substance abuse treatment clients with no other sources of health insurance coverage to obtain addiction medications that will assist them in their recovery. Opiate dependent persons are a primary focus of this effort.

Opiate Task Force. An Opiate Task Force was created by the Butler County Coalition for Healthy, Safe, and

Drug-Free Communities to mobilize community agency partners and concerned Butler County residents to assess community needs, to raise community awareness, and to develop and implement collaborative strategic plans to address the county's serious opiate abuse problem.

Cincinnati Exchange Project (CEP). The Cincinnati Exchange Project was funded to include Butler County in their efforts to provide a range of health services to intravenous drug users and other opiate addicted persons to reduce the spread of diseases such as HIV and Hepatitis C often transmitted via intravenous drug use, to reduce the incidence of serious infections including endocarditis, to increase the availability of Narcan in order to reduce the number of accidental deaths from opiate overdose, and to refer persons for health and social services including addiction treatment. The project involves a mobile van which is expected to eventually visit a number of locations in the Greater Cincinnati area.

Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to

Treatment (SBIRT). The ADAS Board is partnering with Primary Health Solutions (PHS), a federally qualified health center operating community health centers in Butler County, in the development of screening and brief intervention services for patients engaging in high risk use of alcohol and other drugs. Such services are to become a routine part of their primary care services. With the assistance of the ADAS Board, PHS has secured a grant from Interact For Health to aid in the implementation of these services.

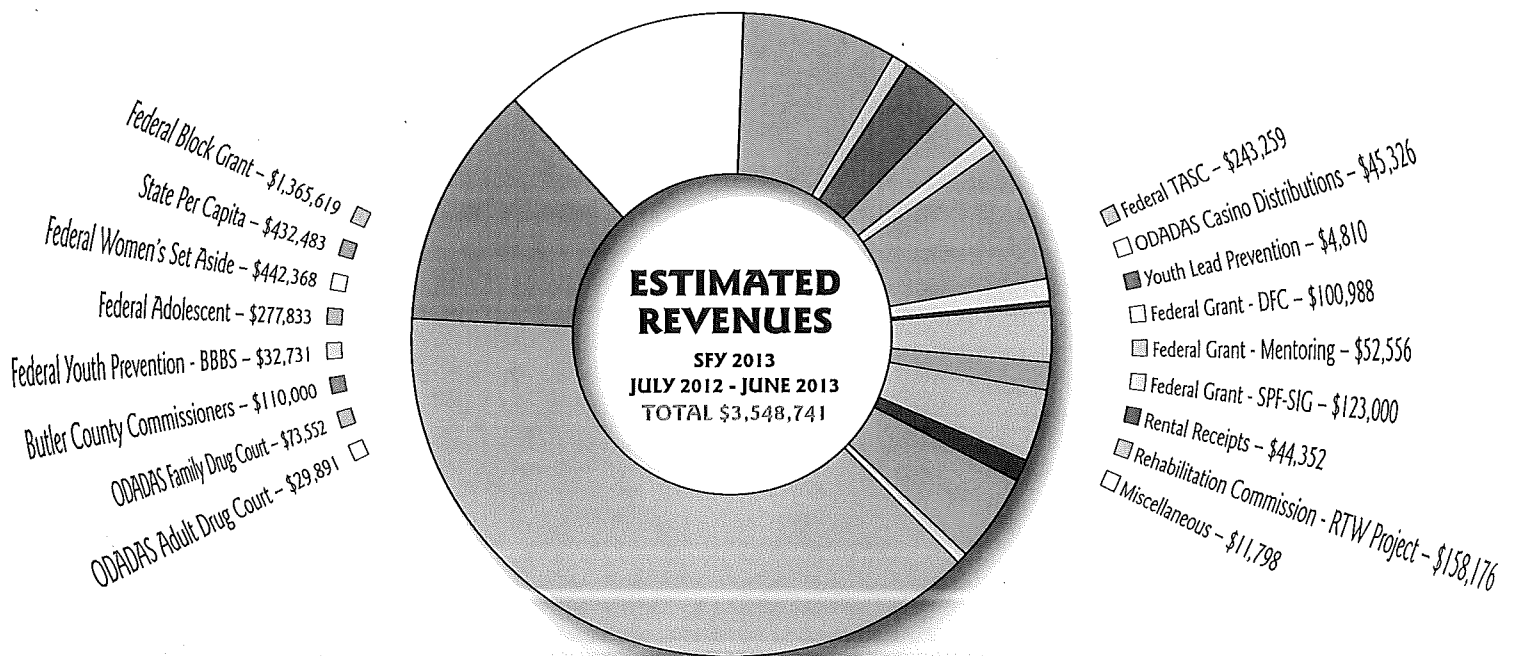

Board Ends Statement

The Butler County ADAS Board, in partnership with the community, will minimize the adverse effects of alcohol, other drugs, and gambling so that people can live healthier, safer and more productive lives.

- 1) The first priority is that those who are dependent on alcohol, other drugs, and gambling will effectively manage their dependencies and live lives minimally impeded by them.
- 2) The second priority is that non-dependent persons will be aware of the possible dangers associated with alcohol, other drugs, and gambling and will make low-risk choices about them.

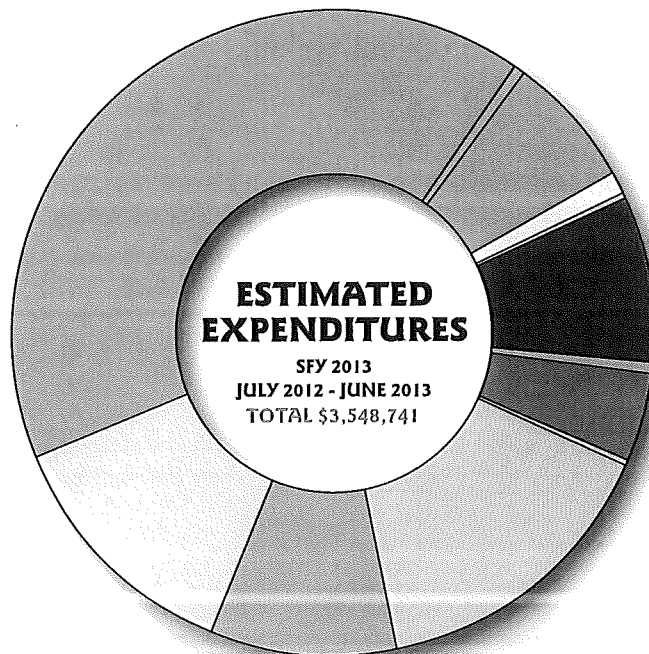

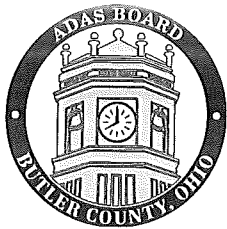
