



NO WIPES IN THE PIPES

In today's unprecedented times for sanitizing, disinfecting, and personal protection, cleaning product wipes used with other personal protection products are disposed of in the wrong manner. Anything that might be deemed, flushable is not necessarily biodegradable and can cause a myriad of problems with your sewer lines, the city sewer system and even at the wastewater treatment plant.

Items such as disinfectant wipes, heavy duty paper towels, toilet scrubbing pads, disposable gloves and masks, disposable diapers, and all feminine products should not be flushed down the toilet. You will be inviting sewer blockages and restrictions if your sewer line has root intrusion or structural issues. These items will get caught in the sewer and build up over time and cause blockages not only in your sewer system but in the city's main sewer lines, pump stations, and even at the treatment plant.

Remember: The sanitary sewer system was designed for the three "Ps". (Pee, poop, and paper) but no, "wipes in the pipe".
