1. Approval of Commission Meeting Minutes from June 13, 2023 - Placed on the agenda without a recommendation by Rules & Legislative Committee.

Motion to approve by Mark Thomas. Seconded by Pinson. Approved by voice vote.

2. Approval of Special Called Commission Meeting Minutes from June 29, 2023 - Placed on agenda without a recommendation by Rules & Legislative Committee.

Maddox made a motion to approve the minutes with a correction to add the phrase "people making six figures on the payroll getting substantial raises while other people are struggling" to his comment. Seconded by Epperson. Approved by voice vote.

5. Temporary Public Comment Guidelines - Pursuant to State of Tennessee Public Chapters 213 and 300 effective July 1, 2023, a governing body shall, for each public meeting, reserve a period for public comment on matters that are germane to the items on the agenda for the meeting.

In light of the new law that public comment will be allowed at all government meetings across the state, guidelines must be established. In order to allow the public to speak at tonight's meeting this item was moved up in the agenda order.

Maddox made a motion to allow 3 minutes per speaker, alternating those speaking for and those speaking against the item, with no overall time limit, and no limit to the number of speakers. Seconded by Hooker.

Sanders suggested that each speaker fill out a form before the meeting is called to order requesting to speak. Maddox agreed to include that in his motion. Hooker also agreed.

Yockey asked at what point in the meeting would the public be allowed to speak. Graham suggested that, in order not to interrupt the flow of the meeting, this would take place after the approval of the minutes. Yockey offered this as an amendment to the motion. Maddox and Hooker agreed.

Epperson asked what would happen if a person wished to speak on more than one issue. Graham said that they would fill out 2 forms and would speak on one item at a time at the appropriate times. Maddox and Hooker agreed to add this point to the motion.

# Bedford County Corridor Study Transportation Planning Grant

WHEREAS, the Bedford County Board of Commissioners submitted an application with approved Resolution 21-39 for consideration of grant request to the Tennessee Department of Transportation for the Transportation Planning Grant; and

WHEREAS, Bedford County Government was awarded the Tennessee Department of Transportation Planning Grant to develop a corridor study in Northern Bedford County on April

WHEREAS, a Steering Committee was created and conducted meetings specific to grant

WHEREAS, public engagement collected was an asset in gaining valuable community input to assist with the completed study; and

WHEREAS, Bedford County has completed the corridor study identifying existing and projected needs in regard to the safety, mobility, and connectivity of State Route 231 north and south as well as adjacent roadways connecting State Route 269 and State Route 16/41A;

WHEREAS, the Bedford County Regional Planning Commission voted at their regular session meeting of May 23, 2023 to favorably recommend the acknowledgement of the completed study to the Bedford County Board of Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Bedford County Board of Commissioners:

- 1. That the Mayor and Bedford County Board of Commissioners acknowledge the completion
- of the 231 North Corridor Study.

6. Consideration of Petition from Bedford Market, Sunchaser's Market, and Halls Mill Market to Reduce the 2,000 Foot Distance Rule to Zero Footage Distance from a Church, School, or Public Gathering Place to Sell Beer.

Vick made a motion to approve with the amendment that the item would be sent to the Planning Commission. Seconded by Pinson. The motion as amended:

"Whereas a petition was provided to the Bedford County Board of Commissioners requesting a zoning resolution modification regarding the sale of beer in Bedford County; and whereas such a change would require an applicable Zoning Resolution amendment to be approved by the Bedford County Board of Commissioners; and whereas it is the responsibility of the Bedford County Regional Planning Commission to originate and recommend said Zoning Resolution to the Bedford County Board of Commissioners; and whereas it is generally accepted that the fullest possible protection of liberty and property rights are both the strict limitations and the overarching duties of government. It is therefore in the best interests of public health, safety, morals, public convenience, general prosperity, and the general welfare of the residents of Bedford County that such requested amendments all be developed in such a way as to provide for the realistic protection to schools, places of worship, and places of public assembly, as well as the economic protection for the at-risk rural village marketplace. Therefore, be it resolved the Bedford County Board of Commissioners refer said request to the Bedford County Regional Planning Commission and request such Zoning Resolution language to be drafted by the Planning Commission and, upon completion, be favorably recommended to the Board of Commissioners in the same manner as all Zoning Resolutions. Further be it resolved the Bedford County Planning Commission specifically address language which would create separate and distinct applicable zoning requirements and classifications for: A) carry-out sales of alcohol, otherwise referred to as off-premise consumption, in the most appropriate rural commercial zoning classification (e.g. C-1 Zoning); and B) the more intensive table sales of alcohol or on-premise consumption in the most applicable urban commercial classification (e.g. C-2 Zoning), effectively disallowing any lawful on-premise consumption of alcohol in areas not abutting or very near any of Bedford County's corporate municipal boundaries or along roadways classified as arterial."

Vick said the item would be sent to the Planning Commission, and they would draw up the zoning regulations. This would give the Commission a specific document to vote on.

Hooker offered an amendment to add an item C that would consider schools as a separation. Vick declined the amendment, saying that is already addressed in his motion.

Yockey asked for confirmation that if the 2,000 foot rule was eliminated, it would allow consumption on the premises as well as sales. Attorney John T. Bobo confirmed that to be correct.

Neeley asked if the change would be county-wide. Bobo said that once it is changed, it cannot be changed again for the purpose of restricting any beer permit applicants. He also said it would apply to any areas in the county that are zoned with that particular classification. For example, you could not open a store and sell beer on property that is zoned for agriculture.

Smith called for the question. Upon a show of hands, commissioners voted to continue discussion.

Maddox asked whether sending the item to the Planning Commission will eliminate the 2,000 ft rule. County Attorney John T. Bobo stated that the Planning Commission can propose a modification of the overall zoning resolution, but since they cannot put items on the commission agenda, it will have to go back through the Rules Committee.
