A Resolution to amend Article III, of the Zoning Resolution of Bedford County:

PURPOSE: To amend, for the purpose of updating the requirements for private airstrips, found in Section 3.340 (Private Airstrips).

WHEREAS; Title 13, Sections 13-7-101 through 13-7-401, of the Tennessee Code, empower a Tennessee Regional Planning Commission to recommend the enactment of a Zoning Resolution to a county legislative body and to provide for its administration, enforcement, and amendment. The Bedford County Regional Planning Commission thus certified and recommended the Zoning Resolution of Bedford County Tennessee to the Bedford County Commission on January 18, 1997, and

WHEREAS, the Bedford County Commission, as recommended by the Bedford County Regional Planning Commission, deemed it necessary in the promotion of public health, safety, morals, convenience, order, prosperity, and the general welfare of the County to enact the certified Zoning Resolution of Bedford County on January 13, 1998, and

WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commission has, in its administrative capacity, recommended an amendment to the said Zoning Resolution of Bedford County and the Bedford County Commission has, after hearing evidence in support of said amendment, deemed it necessary to make such an amendment as required, for the said promotion of public health, safety, convenience, order, prosperity, and general welfare of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Bedford County Commission meeting at Shelbyville, Tennessee on this the 13th day of June, 2023, that:

The Bedford County Commission hereby amends the specifically described Article, Sections and Subsections of the Zoning Resolution of Bedford County, Tennessee by adding the underlined (<u>underlined</u>) words below, deleting the words struck through (struck through), and by following italicized instructions (*do this or that*) in parenthesis as follows:

Article III, Section 3.340. Private Airstrips

a) (2.) Planning

c)

- A detailed site plan, in conformance to the specifications listed in Article II, Section 2.080, prepared by a registered Tennessee architect, or licensed Tennessee engineering firm, or licensed Tennessee Surveyor, is a prerequisite to application submission. Federal Aviation Regulation (FAR) part 157 states that anyone proposing to build a personal or private use airport (used solely for VFR (Visual Flight Rules) conditions, located more than twenty (20) nautical miles from an airport for which an instrument approach procedure (IFR) is authorized and located more than five (5) nautical miles from any airport open to the public. The applicant must submit FAA form 7480-1 at least thirty (30) days before work is to begin. All private strips shall be required to be noted on the FAA sectional chart with a notation as to the nature of the strip as well as the prevailing wind patterns important to safe operation of aircraft in the vicinity
- b) (5.) <u>Public/Private Use</u> All private airstrips shall be for private use only and shall not be considered primary airstrips nor public use airports as defined by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) or Tennessee Aviation Standards. Private airstrips shall be principally designed and intended to serve light aircraft of a maximum gross takeoff weight of twelve thousand five hundred (12,500) pounds or less. No rental of hanger space to customers nor fees of any kind may be charged persons using the private airstrip except for fuel.

 (6.) <u>Runways</u>

 Edit sub-section numbering to consistent format. From numbers (1-6) to letters (a - f).

- (2.) <u>Structures</u> Tie downs or hangar structures shall be located a minimum of two hundred fifty (250) feet away from any portion of the airstrip. Only one (1) <u>two</u> (2) hangar structures for the storage of no more than three (3) six (6) aircraft is permitted.
 - (6.)(b.) Length The formula for calculating the minimum runway length is as follows: Using the Aircraft Manual(s) (ACM) for the aircraft owned and

Using the Aircraft Manual(s) (ACM) for the aircraft owned and intended to utilize the proposed runway, determine which of the aircraft requires the longest maximum runway length at its maximum weight, load, and with the most resistant of runway and weather conditions. This aircraft will be identified as the owner's critical aircraft.

Using the maximum runway length for the critical aircraft (e.g., multiplicand) with a multiplier of 1.8; calculate the product. The minimum allowed airstrip length shall be the product of said multiplication or one-thousand five-hundred (1,500) feet, whichever is greater. In no instance shall any runway length be less than one-thousand five-hundred (1,500) feet in length. airstrip shall be a minimum of three thousand (3,000) feet in length and no longer than three thousand (3,000) feet in length and no longer than three thousand six hundred (3,600) feet in length. There shall be a designated RPZ at the approach end of the airstrip no less than one thousand five-hundred (1,500) (1,000) feet in length. The opposite end of the airstrip shall have a designated RPZ of a minimum length of one thousand (1000) feet.

d) (8) Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) Access

Access roads shall be provided <u>constructed</u> to provide unimpeded two-way access for rescue and fire-fighting equipment to <u>the</u> potential accident areas. <u>Obvious signage for</u> the purpose of directing first responders toward the runway and hangar area shall be required. Connecting these roads/drives, to the extent possible, with the operational surfaces of public roadways shall be required.

e) (9) Fuel Storage

In the event a fuel storage facility is planned to be installed, construction of an approved fuel storage pad with accidental spillage area shall be made part of the site plan. Fuel storage facilities shall be located a minimum of two hundred fifty

1) Article III, Section 3.360. Signs, Billboards, and Other Advertising Structures

a) (A.) In Any Zoning District, the Following General Regulations Shall Apply:

i. (8.) Temporary Signs

- (d.) No temporary event sign shall be placed before fifteen (15) days prior to the advertised event and all such signs advertising events shall be removed within ten (10) days after the event date. except the following:
- b. (e.) Political signs advertising candidates for a general or primary election may place signage up to thirty (30) days prior to such election primary and through to the general election, removing said signage within ten (10) days after the general election date.

An analysis of the above sections revealed that there is a clear 1st Amendment constitutional conflict by treating temporary and political signage differently than any other sign types – specifically with the amount of time the speech is permitted. Certain types of speech cannot be restricted differently in the law than other types of speech. Speech on signage is either free or it is restricted. If it is restricted, all signage speech must be similarly restricted. The law allows local government to place certain restrictions on signage and speech from signage, so long as all types of signage and speech are treated the same and that there is valid rationale in so doing.

- b) (B.) In the A-1, Agricultural District, the Following Regulations Shall Apply:
 - (2.) Not more than two (2) non-illuminated signs, not to exceed a total of thirtytwo (32) square feet in area, advertising the sale of agricultural products produced on the premises shall be permitted.

An analysis of the above determined that agricultural retail, on premises of a farm, is exempt activity. The entire subsection should be deleted.

(3.) Church, school, or public building bulletin boards or identification signs, not exceeding sixty (60) square feet in area permitted. Exception: No bulletin board or identification signs shall be located on a designated scenic highway or parkway.

An analysis of the above recognized that we have several TDOT approved scenic highways (41A South, Dixie Hwy- 130E, etc.). State designated scenic highways prohibit the placement of signage and billboards along the designated limitations. Local government, however, must enforce these state rules or otherwise the highways can lose their official designations. An exception prohibiting signs along this type of roadway designation is needed to protect the designations.

(250) feet from the Runway Surface Area and a minimum of two hundred fifty (250) feet from any hangar, accessory structure, or tie-down area for the storage of aircraft. <u>On site</u> fuel shall be for personal use only; no commercial sale of fuel to anyone except in a documented emergency.

2022-23 BUDGET AMENDMENTS – School Budget Amendment No. 4 and County Budget Amendment No. 5

Anderson called for the Commission to split the budget into 4 votes: school system, sheriff department, highway department, and general fund. He said that, according to Charles Curtiss, president of the County Commissioners Assocation, it is legal to do this. He said he would not vote for any budget that funds the Bedford County Partnership. Anderson said it is a nonprofit and the County has defunded most nonprofits. He said the City has also defunded the Partnership. He asked to make a motion to pass the school budget, the sheriff budget and discuss the rest. Graham said that would be premature because the item currently before the Commission was 2022-23 Budget Amendments.

Johnson made a motion to approve the amendments together. Seconded by Hooker.

Hooker said that in the finance committee meeting Robert Daniel said that some of the funds moved over from federal funding were used for capital projects and asked if there was a list of those. Graham asked for a show of hands in favor of asking Daniel to speak. 11 commissioners raised their hands, so Daniel came forward. Hooker asked what capital projects were funded by the \$678,000 on page 1. Daniel said that is school growth money that the county receives at the end of the year. It will go toward school projects and that Dr. Tammy Garrett, School Superintendent, would have more information. Upon approval by commissioners, Graham invited Garrett to speak. She said the projects included windows at Thomas, a fire alarm system at Eastside, and 4 units in the gym at Community Middle.

Anderson asked if all students would be out of portables once Liberty was taken care of. Graham said yes.

Motion passed by roll call vote. 18 Ayes 0 Noes

Resolution No. 24-1 - A Resolution Fixing the Tax Levy in Bedford County, Tennessee for the 1. Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2023

Yockey made a motion to approve the resolution with the tax rate bundled and waive reading of the resolution. Seconded by Smith.

Vick called the question. Seconded by Brothers. Objection was raised by Epperson and Maddox. County Attorney John T. Bobo stated that since there was an objection, there must be a two thirds majority to call the question. Graham stated that a yes vote is to call the question

and a no vote is to continue discussion. Motion to call the question failed on roll call vote. 9 Ayes 9 Noes

Maddox stated that there are things in this budget that we may not really need, such as a fire marshal, \$100k to the Partnership, and people making six figures on the payroll. He made a motion to amend the resolution to decrease the total tax rate from \$2.3252 to \$2.1752. Graham asked if Yockey would agree to amend the motion. Yockey did not agree.

Maddox made a motion to amend the resolution to lower the tax rate to \$2.1752. Seconded by Hooker. Boutwell presented data that in 2007 the Bedford County property tax revenue per capita was \$399. In 2022 it was \$536 for an increase of 34.2%. The Consumer Price Index for the same period increased 35.2%. So the property tax increase since 2007 has been slightly less than the rate of inflation.

Vick asked where the .15 would come from. Maddox said his motion to amend includes striking the .15 from General Debt Service for a total tax rate of \$2.1752. Vick said the county would not be able to pay its debt. Maddox said this would reduce the budgeted revenue from \$16M to \$14M. He said projected debt expenditures for debt service for the upcoming fiscal year are \$9.6M which would leave a surplus of over \$4M. Funding for approved projects is expected to come from interest. Cutting the .15 will have minimal impact on the income number since interest is being paid on the fund balance which is not being reduced. He recommended cutting new revenue flowing into the account.

The motion to amend the resolution failed on roll call vote. 4 Ayes 14 Noes

Yockey said this budget is not perfect, but it takes care of important things such as raises for employees and teachers, SROs, and getting all students out of portables.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there are also he appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the trustee, county clerk, circuit court clerk, clerk and master, register, and the sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may be entitled to receive under state laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of master, register and sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected shall be paid over to the trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

Item 2.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, Tennessee Code Annotated, operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, Tennessee Code Annotated, provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any amendment to the budget, except for amendments to the budget for funds under supervision of the director of schools, shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407. Tennessee Code Annotated. The director of schools must receive approval of the Board of Education for transfers within each major category of the budget, and approval of both the Board of Education and Board of County Commissioners for transfers between major categories as required by law.

One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the county clerk, one copy with the chairman of the Financial Management Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE 1T FURTHER RESOLVED that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the county shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the county in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the county. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the year ending June 30, 2024. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the state director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the county mayor and county clerk, are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the state director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2023-24 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9. Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the county mayor and countersigned by the county clerk, and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2024.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2022 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2024, shall be apportioned to the various county funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2022. The clerk and master and the trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2024.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any resolution or part of a resolution which heretofore has been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

Items not included on the agenda at the time of the meeting will require the commission/committee to suspend the rules to add an item to the agenda per local rules sections Q and R.

Citizens of Bedford County wishing to address an item on the agenda will be required to fill out a request form and present to the chairman of the appropriate commission/committee prior to calling the meeting to order. Forms will be available both on the county website as well as available hardcopy at the time of the meeting.

- 1. Public comment will follow approval of the prior month commission/committee meeting minutes.
- 2. Three speakers "in favor or not" of an item on the agenda will be allowed to address the commission/committee for three minutes during the meeting. If there are more than three wishing to speak on either side of the matter, the chairman will draw three names from the list of citizens who requested to speak.
- 3. Meetings regarding personal or non-action items are not subject to these rules, per Public Chapter 300.

SUBJECT: Public Chapters 300 and 213 on Open Meetings

In an effort to keep you informed about the latest legislation impacting transparency in government, please be advised that the 113th Tennessee General Assembly recently passed Public Chapter No. 300 ("PC 300"), which can be found <u>here</u>. This new law becomes effective on July 1, 2023 and introduces an important change to the Tennessee Open Meetings Act.

PC 300 requires that for each public meeting, governing bodies reserve a period for public comment to provide the public with the opportunity to comment on matters that are germane to the items on the agenda for the meeting. It also requires that the meeting notice specify how individuals may indicate their desire to provide public comment at the meeting.

While the new law allows governing bodies to put certain reasonable restrictions on the public comment period, it requires governing bodies to take all practicable steps to ensure that opposing viewpoints are represented fairly, if any. It also excludes certain meetings from these requirements.

The Tennessee General Assembly also passed <u>Public Chapter 213</u> ("PC 213") which became effective on April 25, 2023. Unlike PC 300, which has broad applicability, PC 213 only applies to local government legislative bodies and requires such bodies to make their agendas available in a place accessible to the public at least 48-hours prior to a meeting.

I encourage you to review PC 300, and PC 213 if applicable, in full to understand the details of these new requirements. If you have questions regarding implementation for your specific circumstances and community, please contact your local attorney, MTAS, or CTAS. Our Office of Open Records Counsel can also assist you in answering questions about these important changes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 8, Chapter 44, Part 1, is amended by adding the following as a new section:

(a) A governing body shall, for each public meeting, reserve a period for public comment to provide the public with the opportunity to comment on matters that are germane to the items on the agenda for the meeting.

(b) The governing body may put reasonable restrictions on the period for public comment, such as the length of the period, the number of speakers, and the length of time that each speaker will be allowed to provide comment. The governing body may require a person to give notice in advance of the desire to offer comments at a meeting. The governing body shall take all practicable steps to ensure that opposing viewpoints are represented fairly, if any.

(c) A notice for a public meeting shall indicate the manner in which a person may indicate the person's desire to provide public comment at the meeting.

(d) This section does not apply to:

(1) A meeting of a governing body, or a portion thereof, where the governing body is conducting a disciplinary hearing for a member of the governing body or a person whose profession or activities fall within the jurisdiction of the governing body; or

(2) A meeting for which there are no actionable items on the agenda.

SECTION 2. This act takes effect July 1, 2023, the public welfare requiring it.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 8, Chapter 44, Part 1, is amended by adding the following as a new section:

(a)(1) At least forty-eight (48) hours prior to a meeting, a local government legislative body shall make available to the public, at no charge, the agenda for the upcoming meeting in a place accessible to the public. The agenda must reasonably describe the matters to be deliberated or acted upon during the public meeting.

(2) A local government legislative body may deliberate or act upon matters not listed on the agenda if the local government legislative body follows its bylaws or properly adopted rules and procedures and complies with all other applicable state laws.

(b) A local government legislative body shall not circumvent the spirit or requirements of this section by withholding items from an agenda for the purpose of avoiding public disclosure of business to be considered by the legislative body.

(c) A local government legislative body that maintains a website may make an agenda available to the public through the website. The local government legislative body's website is considered a place that is accessible to the public for purposes of compliance with subsection (a).

(d) As used in this section, "local government" means an incorporated city or town, metropolitan government, or county.

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.

Highway Department:

- 1. _Worked on over 800 citizen projects this quarter
- 2. Done crack repairs on bridge at Clyde Gleaves Rd
- 3. Tdot is rebuilding bridge on Old Hwy 64 at no cost to the Highway Dept.
- 4. Chip Sealed on 21 roads this budget year

- 10.Highway Dept. has worked on any work in the Highway's right of way such as water, gas, internet, AT&T, etc, upgrades or new lines being installed that will be required to notify the Highway Dept. and post a bond and get a street cut permit for any work done in the right of way to make sure they are fixed back to standards and put back in original condition
- 11.Worked with the Planning Dept. to upgrade the subdivision requirements for new development across the County
- 12.Daily routine activities: equipment maintenance, culvert installations, road signage, road litter pickup, road side mowing

Solid Waste:

- 1. Centers are running at more capacity for residental trash
- 2. Our trash volume has increased by 20% more disposal at the landfills
- 3. We are getting more response from our adjacent counties on how our operations are better and wanting to move in the same direction as our Solid Waste operations and centers
- 4. We are in the process of getting bids on cameras for all centers for better operations and safety for our attendents and citizens
- 5. There has been a lot of discussion over the last few months on the cost for the Road Supt. to manage the Solid Waste Dept. for the Mayor and County. The Mayor and I have included in my reports a breakdown on what the County Highway Official saves the County for operating the Solid Waste for the Mayor and Commission. If any one has any questions on this process now would be the time to discuss these issues where the persons can answer any questions and explain.

Item 9.

Office of Bedford County Human Resources <u>Solid Waste Payroll and Capital Executive</u> <u>Summary</u>

In an effort to coordinate and plan for safe, efficient solid waste disposal in the state, the Tennessee General Assembly enacted several pieces of legislation, which are compiled in Title 68, Chapter 211 of the *Tennessee Code Annotated*. Therefore, to meet compliance, all local governments, including Bedford County, must engage in specified planning and organizational activities set forth in the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991, T.C.A. §§ 68-211-801 through 68-211-874.

Bedford County Solid Waste Department, since its required inception of convenience centers in 1991 by Tennessee state law are operated under the direction of the Solid Waste Director and the Solid Waste Coordinator. However, these positions since 1991 have been voluntarily held by the Bedford County Highway Superintendent and the Assistant Highway Superintendent in an effort to provide minimum costs to the organization and the taxpayers of Bedford County all while satisfying the compliance standards of Tennessee State Law. Further, this voluntary structure of dual roles is specific to Bedford County alone as no other Highway Superintendent in TN oversees Solid Waste operations for their county. This continued agreement of oversight to the Solid Waste Department by the Highway Superintendent as Solid Waste Director continues to serve as the most cost-effective approach to compliance for Bedford County.

To provide more insight and information on current and projected costs to the Solid Waste Department, the following is a 2023 Executive Summary that provides operating expenses under the current structure as well as projected costs to create a separate independent Solid Waste Department where staff, office, and equipment are separately located and owned by the Bedford County Solid Waste Department.

The projected payroll expense totals provided are indicative of data collected by Burris, Thompson & Associates Public Sector Wage and Salary Survey, 2021
