12	At 6:00pm, Vice-Chair Ed Woods called the meeting to order.
13 14 15 16 17	Mr. Woods explained that this is a public meeting, is being televised to air at a different time, and we have a hard stop at 7:00pm. There is no formal agenda and any discussion may result in the topic being an agenda item at a future Select Board meeting. Listening Session meetings were initiated by Mr. Adams and Ms. White for the public to have a discussion with the Board and popularity of these meetings will determine the occurrence of future meetings.
19 20 21	Mike Bethel: Would like the ~\$50,000 that goes to the BBC to have a committee formed from the people downtown before the next budget to come up with ideas for a better promotion of the Downtown for next year.
22 23 24 25 26 27	<ul> <li>Mr. Hurd: Stated that the majority of the funds are contracted to 802 Vermont annually.</li> <li>Mr. Woods: Added that those dollars are a "Bennington fund" and not a "Downtown fund".</li> <li>Ms. White: People she has talked to feel that instead of giving that money to an outside contractor, the business owners downtown should work with the BBC to get more events downtown for all of the businesses, as well as, to draw people from 40 miles away and not just off the Bypass.</li> </ul>
28 29 30	Mr. Bethel: Perhaps that money should be divided into areas of Bennington. Billboards on the edge of Town advertising the Town is one idea, and the Board could discuss other ideas for the downtown merchants with the BBC.
31 32	Mr. Bethel: State Representatives should share their ideas with the Board. Mr. Woods: Has there been any interaction with the State in the past, and Ms. Conner answered no.
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Shirley Adams: Noted that advertising at the EV charging station at Dunkin Donuts where people are there for ~a half hour would be a good place for informational billboards of what is in the Downtown. Mr. Woods: Will bring this to the Energy Committee and others to work with the BBC as they are responsible for the charging stations. Mr. Adams: Added that he has seen people taking a photo of the QR code at the Bennington Museum so to have one at the charging stations is the "latest and greatest" form of advertising. Ms. Conner: Placing the QR codes at other locations besides the charging stations is an excellent idea. Merchants can also put them on their websites.

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Vickie Lampron: Thanked the Board for having this Listening Session, shared a personal issue that the Board was helpful with, and noted to everyone that the Board is, indeed, approachable.

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Robert Ebert: Read in the Banner that the Charter Review Committee has been formed and that there was discussion to make the Police Advisory Board (CPARB) autonomous and how would that change their function.

- Mr. Adams: When CPARB was formed it seemed that there were some constraints in the Charter as to their process. It had to be put in the grievance/complaint process of the Police Department. An organizational chart gives the perception that CPARB is under the Police Department when it is actually under the Select Board.
- Mr. Haley: Recalls there being some constraints in State Law, as well. Also, CPARB did have Listening Sessions scheduled in the beginning that were not well attended, however, they do hope for more public involvement from all walks of life as time goes on.
  - Mr. Hurd: CPARB was created by a Resolution of the Select Board. Do we want to make CPARB an investigative authority (Mr. Adams says no). "Placing it in the Charter doesn't change its authority unless you change its authority by placing it in the Charter. If it's in the Charter, it makes it harder to be eliminated or amended." CPARB may be coming to the Board to request having bi-monthly meetings instead of monthly meeting.
  - Jackie Matts, Chair of the Charter Review Committee: We will be meeting Fridays at 3:00pm in the Town Office Meeting Room, and if there's more interest from the public, we will move the meeting somewhere that's more accommodating.
    - Ms. Conner: Is now the Board Representative for CPARB and the listening sessions was discussed at the last and her first CPARB meeting. She has some thoughts on how to improve public participation, such as, going to their work places instead of asking them to come to a meeting the she will be sharing with the CPARB Chair.

Barbara Bluto: The description of what CPARB does should be made more public so that people would be less reluctant to approach them.

- Beth and Dwain Wilwol: 1. Commended the police for having more police presence in the Downtown. 2. Thanked Ms. Perrin and Betsy Greenwalt for the Food Truck Festival this past weekend and would like to see it moved closer to the Four Corners. 3. The Vermont Begins Here website needs to be updated as there are businesses listed that no longer exist, and if it's for the Downtown, why are the big box stores advertised on it. 4. Approves of people having the right to protest whatever they believe in, however, when they're on the four corners they are interfering with their business. 5. The Grow Bennington Initiative had raised money to put lights on the trees in the Downtown but that wasn't done this past year.
- Mr. Hurd: There are funds from the original fundraising project still in reserve that have been used in the past to repair the splash pad. Thinks the lighting on the trees was a project between the BBC and Grow Bennington but does not know what happened to it.
- 84 Mr. Woods: We will discuss this with Shannon Barsotti.
- Mr. Adams: Are the protesters blocking the entrance to your store or is there presence just intimidating? Ms. Wilwol: They could congregate on the other corners where they wouldn't be affecting those businesses. Mr. Wilwol: For the most part, the protesters are quiet, however, there was one group that had a bull horn that caused businesses to shut their doors up to Knapp's. "We have as much right to have a local business that they have to protest." The panhandling and drug deals that nobody tries to hide anymore are also an issue.
- 91 Ms. White: Did speak to the protesters with the bull horn noting that everyone understands 92 their right to protest but they should also understand that business owners also have the right 93 to do business without their customers feeling intimidated.
- Ms. Perrin: It is an issue of resources and asked Mr. Hurd about the noise and panhandling ordinances, and Mr. Hurd answered that the noise ordinance is decibels at the property line.

  The decibel of a bull horn probably wouldn't exceed the limit so that isn't a solution. There was a panhandling ordinance that we repealed under the advice of the Attorney General's Office because we were interfering with people's rights to free speech. In Vermont, panhandling may be an annoyance but it isn't a crime. We also do not have an ordinance against busking which business owners would probably support happening as it would be an activity on the streets.
  - Ms. White: If panhandling is on private property and the owners get a No Trespass can the police remove people from the property? Mr. Hurd: Property owners can No Trespass an individual but then the individual has to be identified so the No Trespass is served on the individual.

Mr. Hurd: Noted that Ms. White had mentioned that some people were afraid of speaking up 106 107 for fear of retribution if they bring a complaint to the Town. "That does not happen in Bennington." Town officials and Select Board members are approachable without retribution. 108 109 Ms. White: The retribution was not from Town Officials, it was the treatment of some by the 110 Select Board. Mr. Adams: Added that he had heard two things if people spoke up - there would be retribution and nothing would be accomplished. "We don't want to focus on negativity, we 111 112 just want to make it a better town." 113 Robert Ebert: Noted that the fear to go to the police for fear of retribution was in the IACP 114 report from interviews that they had done years ago and resulted in the formation of CPARB. 115 Thanked the Board for having this Listening Session as it is more relaxed without the pressure 116 117 of the rest of an agenda. "It's a great idea." Ms. White: Believes that most people are supportive of the Police Department. There are many State Police, Town Police, and Sheriff's 118 119 that go out of their way to help people. Mr. Haley: Complaints can be done online, those will go to the CPARB Chair, and then they have to go through the Police complaint process for CPARB to 120 121 review it. 122 Zak Hale: Feels that bringing a new 100 resident Senior Care Facility to Bennington would be 123 beneficial to the housing crisis. Seniors pay more than 30% of their income on housing, which 124 125 in a Senior Care Facility would actually be more like 60%, and they are 120% of the Area Median Income (AMI). This opens up a demographic where developers can afford to build new 126 127 housing. 70% of the new tenants will come from a 10-mile radius. The Select Board can make something like that happen. Since we don't have enough people walking in downtown, this 128 129 would be a boost to the economy. 130 Ms. White: 1.Is concerned about the lack of maintenance that was done at Cora B. for the last decade. Before we hop into another one, a study should be done to see if the other affordable 131 facilities have kept up on maintenance. 2. And you don't have the people to staff that facility. 132 133 Mr. Hale: No, but it would free up housing for people to come here to live and take those jobs. 134 Mr. Adams: Didn't hear the word 'affordable'. Mr. Hale: The definition of affordable housing is 30% of income, but affordable isn't necessarily subsidized because everyone that lives in our 135 facilities must make 3 times the rent. 136 137

Mike Bethel: Thanked the Board for doing this, thanked Ms. Perrin and Betsy Greenwalt for the

Food Truck Festival, and the Fire Department for what they did over Battle Day Weekend.

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141 142	Mr. Woods: Keep an eye out for future sessions, great turnout, great exchange of information. The Board and Staff appreciate it.

- 37 The motion carried unanimously.

### 4. PUBLIC COMMENT

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- The following Public Comment Practices to make the experience for all involved a productive and informative use of the Public Comment period at Select Board meetings was placed on the podium for those that wish to make Public Comments to reference:
- 42 1. Public Comment is to allow residents an opportunity to share information or make
- announcements that benefit the community at large.
- 2. The topic should not be related to an agenda item. If a member of the public wants to
- 45 comment on an agenda item they can do so during the discussion of that item.
- 46 3. Comments should be 3 minutes or less.
- 4. Speakers are required to state their legal name and town of residence.
- 48 5. Sharing comments, announcements and concerns are encouraged rather than asking
- 49 questions. Public Comment is not a time for discussion. If you have specific questions it is best
- 50 to call the Town Manager to get a full explanation and accurate information.
- 51 6. If the topic requires much discussion the item will be considered as an agenda item at a
- 52 future meeting.
- 53 7. Once an individual's comment is finished, unless a Board member has a clarifying questions,
- 54 the speaker is asked to take their seat.
- 55 8. When appropriate, Town staff and/or Select Board members will respond to questions or
- 56 issues raised during public comment at the end of public comment. If additional explanation is
- 57 desired, members of the public are encouraged to contact Town staff in person during regular
- 58 business hours, or via e-mail or phone.
- 59 9. When an agenda item is a presentation to the board, and after the board has asked any
- 60 questions, the public may comment. Any public comment on the presentation will be directed
- to the board chair. The board chair may answer or ask the presenter to answer at their
- 62 discretion.

64 There were no Public Comments.

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### 5. PUBLIC HEARING - VCDP PLANNING GRANT FOR SHIRES HOUSING MERGER

Cat Bryars, exiting Executive Director of Shires Housing and Mary Cohen, future Executive Director of Shires Housing, spoke on behalf of the Shires Housing Merger:

- Shires Housing wishes to apply for a Vermont Community Development Program (VCDP)
   Planning Grant for \$60,000 that flows through the Town to support merger activity for Shires Housing.
- Shires Housing provides housing to ~1,000 residents that stretches from Bennington to Manchester, as well as, the SASH program free of charge to seniors.
- Most of the housing developers in the State are operating on a 2-3 county scale so we have been discussing a merger with Rutland for about a year.
- The merger activities that this grant will fund are financial consulting, legal work, and integration of systems and staff.
- Rutland County has merged with Neighborworks of Western Vermont which covers 3 counties - Addison, Bennington, and Rutland.
- 79 Board comments/questions answered by Ms. Cohen and Ms. Bryars:
- 80 Ms. White: 1. Where is the \$60,000 you're asking for coming from? The Agency of Commerce
- and Community Development federal program called the Vermont Community Development
- 82 Program (VCDP). 2. For the past 10 years, Shires has not maintained the elevator or other
- 83 maintenance issues at Cora B. and are there other buildings that haven't been maintained that
- 84 we don't know about. 3. Would Shires be transferring properties that they own in Bennington
- 85 to anyone else? Yes, this is an opportunity to get buildings that are deficient into a rehab
- situation. The properties will be transferred to the Housing Trust Department's Entity. 4. This is
- an example of losing our say locally and in our county. Will other non-profits be taken over by
- 88 Rutland and are people in Rutland aware of this? Yes, they've received a Planning Grant
- 89 through their municipality.
- 90 Ms. Jenkins: Why is a merger necessary, why have other counties in the State merged, and how
- will the merger ensure that we don't lose what we have with Shires in Town? The Shires Board
- 92 has expressed the same concerns. Other counties have merged to make them stronger. We will
- 93 benefit from Neighborworks of Western Vermont because they are affiliated with
- 94 Neighborworks America who has tremendous resources. Even though they have been down
- 95 here, we have never had the benefit of their development resources. The first year is the
- 96 Strategic Plan and we will have a better idea in 6-12 months how everything will work. Ms.
- 97 Jenkins: An organization would be foolish not to utilize the federal dollars that are available.
- "Our discussion is not about the merger, it is about a municipal grant to help them do the
- 99 merger well."

100	Mr. Woods: Will the merger	address building maintenance issues	and are the merging boards

- addressing the communities that are losing their local entities? We will have a local office, will
- be looking for additional local staffing, the CFO and some directors will be located in
- 103 Bennington, and our Portfolio Analysis will be in a better place to deal with building
- maintenance concerns and our funders. Real estate development will also be in both counties.
- Mr. Adams: Is concerned that with regional and national influence that local input will be lost
- and has concerns about the concept that federal money is free money. Is \$60,000 a "leap of
- 107 faith" for the organization? Our merger budget is a little over \$400,000 and we are "tapping
- into" Neighborworks America, the Vermont Housing Conservation Board, the VCDP, and our
- 109 home organizations if we need to. The \$60,000 will not eliminate that but will help integrate
- 110 the systems.
- 111 Ms. Conner: Shires Housing doesn't need our permission to merge and our only purpose here is
- to approve or disapprove the grant application. Don't misinterpret our questions. They are
- because this is the first time that most of us have heard of this.
- Ms. Perrin: In general, no one likes change, so if and when this merger takes place, please be
- sure to notify the Select Board. The Chair of the Shires Board is Jim Sullivan who has always
- 116 worked for regional strength and development. The hospital right here in Bennington is a
- 117 merged organization.

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- 118 Mr. Haley: If the merger goes through, will there be representatives from both counties on that
- 119 Board? Yes, all three organizations are working on what that representation would look like.
- 120 We're hoping the merger will be done by 1/1/25 and all of those ducks will be in a row.
- 121 Public comments/questions answered by Ms. Cohen and Ms. Bryars:
- 122 Sarah Potts: This was confidential so why was Jeannie the only one to find out about it? Part of
- our due diligence was to reach out to town leaders for any concerns that they may have if the
- merger took place. Ms. Jenkins: Added that this is not a Town matter, and if it were, we would
- 125 have gone into Executive Session to discuss it. These are 3 non-profits merging. Ms. Conner: If
- 126 Jeannie were to share with the rest of the Board, it would have had to be in an Open Meeting
- 127 because we're not allowed to communicate like that.
- 128 Shirley Adams: Is it double dipping for Rutland to also have gotten a Planning Grant? We went
- to the VCDP and they agreed that it would be appropriate for the 3 businesses to each apply.

# Tom Haley moved and Ed Woods seconded to sign the Resolution read by Mr. Hurd to allow Shires Housing to apply for a VCDP Planning Grant for \$60,000.

Ms. Perrin questioned that we should have a second Public Hearing before voting, and Mr. Woods explained that we are only authorizing Shires Housing to apply for the grant which is not Town business. A decision that affected the Town directly would require two hearings.

### The motion carried with Nancy White and Clark Adams opposed.

136	6. BENNINGT	ON COUNTY REGIONAL COMMISSION, TRAFFIC CALMING
137		Anders, Bennington County Regional Commission (BCRC) Senior Transportation
138	Planner, did t	he following presentation:
139	0	Traffic calming is slowing down cars.
140	0	BCRC is looking for a budget to design traffic calming in Bennington and for the
141		Select Board to weigh in on where that could be - perhaps the Monument
142		Avenue Extension.
143	0	We would like to work with DPW and provide a budget for traffic calming in
144		Bennington
145	0	When traffic calming takes place we will provide before and after vehicle speeds.
146	0	We also will work with residents to be sure that they approve the budget first, as
147		well.
148	0	We also would like to work with the Board to develop an official Traffic Calming
149		Policy.
150	0	Traffic volume is as much of an issue as speeding.
151	0	Using 10 years of VTRANS data, there were over 4,000 vehicle crashes, 777 with
152		at least one injury, and 10 with at least 1 fatality.
<b>153</b>	0	There is a 7-page guide on the BCRC website on how to calm traffic.
154	0	Some traffic calming methods are:
155		✓ Trees near the edge of the road, parked cars, lack of a center line,
156		narrower street
157		✓ You design for the speed you want
158		✓ A road with a 30mph speed limit invites people to drive faster when it has
159		a similar look as a 50mph road
160		✓ Narrow lanes from 11' to 10' by painting side lines
161		✓ Remove center lines
162		✓ Radar feedback signs
163		✓ Vertical deflection techniques, i.e., speed bumps - used in parking lots
164		but not public roadways
165		✓ Speed humps - has a broader base and safer for vehicles - 12′-14′ wide, 3-
166		3.5" high at the highest point
167		✓ A series of speed humps with proper design and spacing slow vehicles by
168		20-25mph
169		✓ A speed table is a speed hump stretched out twice as long
170		✓ A speed table + a crosswalk = a raised crosswalk
171		✓ Studies have shown that speed tables and speed humps are effective -
172		74% reduction of vehicles 5mph over speed limit; 81% reduction of
173		vehicles 10mph over speed limit; and a 20% reduction in traffic volume
174		✓ Three locations to focus on traffic calming -

175 1. East Road between Route 279 and Houghton Lane - 12 crashes (7 176 property damage only and 5 injury) between 2010 and 2024 177 2. South Stream Road between Morgan Street and Beech Street - 12 178 crashes (6 property damage only and 6 injury) between 2010 and 179 2024 180 3. Monument Avenue Extension - 34 crashes (23 property damage 181 only and 11 injury) between 2010 and 2024. An illustration was 182 shared of traffic calming on Monument Avenue Extension 183 Board comments/questions answered by Mr. Anders: 184 Ms. White: 1. Wasn't a study done to increase the speed on East Road? Mr. Hurd: BCRC only 185 gathered the data and the average speed dictated that the speed limit should increase from 186 35mph to 40mph. 2. Would like to see where the pathways will be before doing another pilot 187 program. Mr. Monks: For years bike paths have been in the Town Plan and on the website for 188 over 2 decades. 3. Is concerned that traffic will be slowed down too much on Benmont Avenue 189 and cause a bottleneck. Mr. Monks: All the Benmont plans have been approved by VTRANS and 190 designed to make it safer. If there are things that need to be tweaked we will do that, as well. 191 Ms. Jenkins: 1. In general, what are you thinking for traffic calming with walking and biking as a 192 consideration? BCRC put a path from Orchard Village and Willow Brook to Molly Stark and 193 we're thinking of connecting a path to the Rail Trail along Orchard Road. 2. Is there a list of 194 your "one offs"? There isn't a list as we haven't done much calming in rural towns. We don't 195 have much experience with traffic calming methods which is why the pilot programs are 196 important. 3. Should we be more concerned about curvy roads where there are more crashes than straight road? When doing a speed study for traffic calming we look at the 85th percentile 197 198 that are 7mph over the speed limit. Ms. Jenkins: It would be helpful to have that information. 199 Mr. Haley: 1. How long do you expect these pilot projects to take? My hope is that we could do 200 a pilot by next construction season and we would know right away if it slowed down traffic. We 201 would then do a traffic study. 2. You mentioned Molly Stark as in town when it would seem that 202 other locations would be more in town. You're right but we were thinking of the pathway 203 connections, too. 204 Mr. Adams: Of the 3 roads, are they similar or different in amount of traffic? All 3 are similar in 205 residence and are all used for cut through traffic which generally speeds more than regular 206 traffic. Ms. Jenkins added that we have also heard about streets in town. In town streets are 207 often easier to deal with - the Molly Stark one being considered in town and one of the other 208 ones as rural. 209 Ms. Conner: 1. Was told - apparently in error - that the double lines were required. 3,000 210 people/day is the rule of thumb for requiring a double line. 2. Perhaps getting in touch with the police department for where they issue the most tickets would be helpful. That's a good idea. 211 3. If you reduce speed, you reduce noise. That's correct. 4. Is there a reason to choose a 212

- 213 straight road over a curvy road? Straight roads would be more conducive to speed. 5. Can
- speed tables and speed humps be removed? Yes.
- 215 Mr. Woods: A speed cart on Monument Avenue greatly reduced the speed. There are very few
- of them. Should we get more? That would be good, however, since there's no enforcement tied
- 217 to them, the effects of them fade over time.
- 218 Mr. Hurd: 1. The State of Vermont puts the yellow lines on all Class 2 roadways assuming for a
- reason. A lot of things are done because that's just the way they've always been done. 2. Does
- 220 eliminating the center lines have an effect on drivers during foggy/inclement weather? The side
- 221 lines keep drivers on the road and the lack of the center lines creates an uncertainty that would
- 222 slow people down.
- 223 Public comments/questions answered by Mr. Anders:
- 224 Martha Mackey: Feels that speed tables or speed humps would be effective at the crosswalks in
- the downtown without waiting to do a pilot study. Also, could we put in a bike lane as we
- 226 narrow the streets? Bike lanes are good in some places and not in others, however, they would
- be good on Monument Avenue. In general, it's a good idea.
- 228 Charles Dewey: Has noticed that the 30mph radar feedback sign really works as people slow
- down for the rest of the way into Old Bennington. Also, cars from Massachusetts accelerate
- 230 from the intersection of Dewey Street and Monument Avenue and suggests more of the radar
- 231 feedback signs.
- 232 John Goodrich: Is against speed bumps on Monument Avenue, supports permanent radar
- 233 control signs, and police presence. 27 states allow automatic ticket issuing from a machine but
- Vermont does not so automatic recording of speed is a moot point.
- 235 Mark Wilson: 1. Was the speed calming work on Benmont Avenue recommended by BCRC? Mr.
- 236 Hurd: The speed calming on Benmont Avenue is the first step in the Pathway Project to create a
- 237 "snow shelf" between the bike/pedestrian pathway. 2. Is the bike/pedestrian pathway the
- 238 sidewalk or will there be an extra lane cut out for that? Mr. Monks: It's a wider sidewalk that
- 239 meets the federal standards. 3. It has cut down Apollo Fuels business by 20% and is detrimental
- 240 to the traffic that moves up and down Benmont Avenue. Do we know the number of cars that
- 241 go up and down Benmont Avenue? Mr. Hurd: The Benmont Avenue Project is a town project.
- The lane width will be reduced to 10' and slow people down. The purpose of establishing curb
- cuts was to make that area safer. 4. It would have been nice if somebody had let the business
- owners know that this project was going to start. Mr. Hurd: The property owners that were
- 245 effected were provided notice. When the Pathway Project goes forward, all of the effected
- 246 property owners will be notified. 5. Will the Pathway Project make its way to my business? Mr.
- 247 Monks: It will be at least 2 years.

248 249 250	Susan Beal: We have become frustrated every time we pulled out of our driveway and have a petition with 31 of our neighbors who are supportive of some version of traffic calming. The list was given to Mr. Hurd.								
251 252 253	Ezra Miller: Lives on Monument Avenue and feels that the traffic calming should begin on Monument Avenue where they have the data and then gather data elsewhere for a future project.								
254 255 256	Mike Bethel: Disagrees with slowing traffic on Benmont Avenue and spoke to being able to cross the road in his wheelchair as it is. And, when the roundabouts are done traffic on Benmont will be slowed too much.								
257 258	Debbie Matte: Is there a risk of becoming airborne if someone is speeding over the speed humps at 100mph? <i>Probably.</i>								
259 260	David Pearson: Feels that narrowing the lanes on Monument Avenue will make it much safer for the pedestrians.								
261 262	Drew Keaffaber: Thanked Mark and Susan for pulling this together for Monument Avenue as there are many speeding vehicles there.								
263 264	Ms. Jenkins summarized - it looks like there are some low cost measures suggested like speed limit signs. What we need:								
265 266 267 268	<ul> <li>Get data from the Police Department on high crash areas.</li> <li>Mr. Anders's information from BCRC.</li> <li>Low cost items and what may need to wait until next budget season.</li> <li>How do we proceed - Do we want to do a pilot?</li> </ul>								
269	7. MANAGER'S REPORT								
270	Mr. Hurd did the following report:								
271 272 273 274	<u>Boards and Commissions Adjustments</u> - The DRB has recently lost two members reducing the membership to five which makes it more difficult to field a quorum at three. To make this change, it must be an agenda item or we can advertise for 2 more members to keep the number at seven. It's been ~3 months since the 2 members resigned.								
275 276 277	Ed Woods moved and Jeanne Conner seconded to advertise for two (2) more members on the Development Review Board (DRB) to have a slate for the 9/23/24 Select Board Meeting.								
278 279 280	Discussion ensued noting that the DRB Meetings are the first and third Tuesdays at 6:30pm at the Fire Facility. Expertise in engineering, surveying, development, planning background, business, and construction would be helpful. If no expertise, a willingness to learn								

how to read plans.

### The motion carried unanimously.

Ed Woods moved and Jeanne Conner seconded to remove voting rights from the Select Board liaison to the Energy Committee to align with other Select Board liaison positions effective in the 2025/2026 fiscal year.

Mr. Haley asked why that liaison position became a voting member, and Ms. Jenkins explained that the Chair of the Board at that time felt that it should be, and the rest of the Board agreed.

### The motion carried unanimously.

<u>CAT-TV Facebook Postings</u> - We understand that postings on the CAT TV Facebook page during Select Board meetings contain personal attacks and comments that are mean-spirited and unhelpful to the purpose of the meeting. We don't see these in real time and have approached CAT TV on how they might better screen comments coming into the site during our Board meetings. However, they don't have sufficient staff to do that. So, we believe the Board should ask CAT TV to block all postings.

Tom Haley moved and Clark Adams seconded to table a decision to block all postings to the CAT TV's Select Board meeting Facebook page until staff has devised an in-house alternative way to comment directly to the Board.

Mr. Adams thinks this is an "overreach" for the Board to approach CAT TV to make a change to their operations and cannot support any form of government censoring.

Ms. White agrees with Mr. Adams. Elected officials must have "thick skin" and feels that other citizens will call out the ones making the offensive comments.

Mr. Haley doesn't disagree with Mr. Adams or Ms. White but doesn't want to make a decision until the alternative way is heard.

# Tom Haley withdrew the motion to table because comments should not be made on a motion to table.

### Discussion continued -

Ms. Perrin stated that our Town Facebook Page is able to censor comments and we are opening ourselves up to law suits if we are able to censor comments on CAT TV, and cannot agree with that at all. The internet is out there and people are saying things on every platform. "Citizens have the right to say whatever they want and it's ugly. We know it's ugly."

Ms. Conner stated that in a world before Facebook we wouldn't be having this conversation. The Select Board meetings have always been aired live. Ms. Jenkins added if only the people with CAT TV access can see the meetings we're limiting ourselves to the catchment area, whereas opening it up to Facebook allows people from anywhere to view the

meetings. Mr. Adams noted that comments can also be made on You Tube, and are parallel to Facebook but not connected.

Ms. Jenkins noted that staff did ask CAT TV if they could follow the Town's Communication Policy which does not allow attacks, and an individual that was at the meeting was told that they couldn't make an attacking comment, went back and sat down, and put that attacking comment on CAT TV Facebook while sitting at the meeting. "It shouldn't be different if you're in a meeting speaking or you're sitting in the back of the room."

Mr. Woods stated that Board members took an oath when elected but not our family members, town staff, or members of the public that come before this Board. The public come to a meeting and can speak during Public Comment or in discussion on an Agenda Item. We are having difficulty recruiting people to serve this Town in any public way. We repeatedly hear from people that refuse to serve because of the negativity of the comments on social media. "I have a real problem calling that freedom of speech" and awaits what the staff develop as an alternative that follows our Communication Policy.

Mr. Hurd said that the only reason we went to CAT TV is because we contract with them and pay them an hourly rate to be here so we have a right to negotiate with them if, in fact, we don't want some of those services. "It's a contract issue." Mr. Adams added that he doesn't believe that it is appropriate for us to alter the internal workings of CAT TV unless that is part of the contract.

Ms. Jenkins - All Board members should be sent the comments from the 4 Board meetings that we have been referring to and any decision that we make will be given to Counsel for their legal opinion.

Tom Haley moved and Ed Woods seconded to table a decision to block all postings to the CAT TV's Select Board meeting Facebook Page at this time. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Notice of Intent to Remove a Tree at Former Shaffe's Men Shop</u> - The tree is very large and has lifted the sidewalk to a dangerous level and is interfering with the water shut off to the building. The tree will be replaced in a slightly different location to avoid the shut off.

Two pickleball courts have been constructed at Willow Park where the old tennis courts used to be and are ready for use.

Our contractor should be ready to start on the Skatepark by the end of this week or the beginning of next week.

<u>New Downtown Group Forming</u> - The crime perpetrated at Main Street Antiques on Main Street has led to an effort to form a group consisting of downtown merchants, Town staff and with assistance from BPD to begin a discussion of how to better protect our businesses in the downtown. Mr. Hurd will let the Board know when a meeting has been scheduled and Ms.

- 352 White feels the public should be involved, as well. Ms. Jenkins added that we should have Chief
- 353 Doucette come in for discussion, too.
- 354 Mr. Adams noted that Silver Street is rough, heaved and in need of repair.

- 359 Mr. Haley: Commended the Fire Department for a fabulous Battle Day celebration.
- 360 Ms. Conner: Reminded everyone that school will be opening this week and to drive accordingly.
- 361 Ms. White: 1. Will the Listening Sessions be monthly? Ms. Jenkins answered that we voted on
- having them every other month and Mr. Hurd will have the dates at the next meeting. We have
- 363 a full schedule. 2. Per the Purchasing Policy, can the Town Manager enter into a contract and
- let the Select Board know about it in 30 days? Mr. Hurd: In April, we notify the Board on
- 365 contracts that we enter into on an annual basis and send out a list of those that are standard
- bids, those that are continuous, those that are exempt from policy, and those that are more
- 367 than 3 years in length. 3. Where do I see the policy for the YMCA and Meals on Wheels? Mr.
- 368 Hurd: That is part of it. Meals on Wheels is a renewable contract that renews every 3-5 years.
- 4. How does the Select Board hear about these publicly? Mr. Hurd: In the Managers Report if
- it's a new contract and in the budget process. Ms. Jenkins: This has already been voted on and
- 371 you were here. Do you want this policy brought up sooner than later? Yes. 5. For over a year,
- 372 Mr. Monks and the BCRC have been working on the Town Plan and they haven't been here to
- 373 give us an update since early last fall. Ms. Jenkins: This has been asked and answered. You may
- 374 not have liked the answer but the answer was they were not at a place where they could come
- in and talk to us at this point. If your question is 'when will the Planning Commission be at a
- 376 point when they can give us an update on the Town Plan?' then ask that. The BPI expert should
- have been here to tell us what she'd like us to do. Mr. Monks: We made that presentation
- 378 before when BCRC was in doing their presentation on Phase 1. We're in-between Phase 1 and
- 379 Phase 2. BCRC is doing a lot of data collection and we're going through the draft outline that
- 380 they prepared. We don't have a written document for the Board or public to look at. Did I see
- where the public would be paid for their input? Ms. Jenkins: That was from BCRC not the Town.
- What about the DBI report? Mr. Monks: All of that information is on the website and I would be
- happy to sit down with you on that. There is nothing that is ahead of you or that we're way
- 384 beyond. Anyone is welcome to come to a Planning Commission meeting. It is in the very
- beginning stages of drafting a document and there will be multiple opportunities for the public
- 386 to comment once there is a draft in place.

387 388 389	Ms. Perrin: Had family in town and showed them the Town which was great. Also, she wanted to make it clear that it would have been a conflict of interest had she voted for the closure of School Street to Main for the Food Festival. It wasn't indicated that she had abstained.
390 391	Ms. Jenkins: Reminded everyone that the vote for the Turf Field is on September 10, 2024 from 10:00am-7:00pm.
392 393 394	Mr. Woods: Get the information you need to make an informed vote from the MAU Board or the Turf Adhoc Committee. The numbers are not as startling as you imagine. You can also vote now. I have and voted yes.



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### INTRODUCTION

### What is traffic calming?

Some roads and streets invite motorists to drive faster than the posted speed limit. Wide roads, wide travel lanes and highway style pavement markings can make a local road look and feel like a high-speed highway. While exceeding the speed limit on these roads may feel comfortable to motorists, it increases the risk and severity of crashes and can hurt the quality of life for people who live along the road. The goal of traffic calming is to make driving at unsafe speeds uncomfortable. By adding physical and perceptual measures to a road, traffic calming makes it most comfortable for motorists to drive at or below the speed limit so that the road becomes "self-enforcing."

### Note on sources:

The primary source for this report is A Guide to Vertical Deflection Speed Reduction Techniques, by the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE), 2022. This report is a summary of the 160-page ITE book with information from other sources added. Unless otherwise noted, the source for the information that follows is from the ITE.

### WHY TRAFFIC CALMING?






Which street would you drive slower on? Most people would probably say they would drive slower on the street pictured on the right. The parked cars, the trees close to the edge of the road, and the lack of a double yellow centerline will compel most motorists to proceed more cautiously. Its characteristics make it more "self-enforcing" than the street pictured on the left.





In this local example, both roads pictured above have similar designs. They both have 11-foot travel lanes, and a double-yellow centerline. Yet, despite similar appearances, the road pictured on the right (Route VT7A in Arlington) has a 50-mph speed limit, while the road on the left (Monument Ave. in Bennington) has a 30-mph speed limit. We want motorists to drive slower on Monument Ave. than on Route 7A because Monument Ave. has much shorter visual sight distances, narrower clear zones on the edge of the road, and more pedestrians and cyclists, yet the visual cues from the road's design encourage driving at unsafe speeds.



### TYPES OF TRAFFIC CALMING

The main types of traffic calming are:

A horizontal deflection hinders the ability of a motorist to drive in a straight line by creating a horizonal shift in the roadway. Measures include chicanes, realigned intersections, traffic circles, and roundabouts.

A routing restriction prevents some turning movements at intersections to reduce cut-through traffic. Measures include diagonal diverters, full and half closures, median barriers, and forced turn islands.

A street width reduction narrows the width of the vehicle travel lane. Measures include curb extensions, median islands, on-street parking, and road diets.

A vertical deflection creates a change in the height of the roadway that forces a motorist to slow down to maintain an acceptable level of comfort. Measures include speed humps, speed tables, raised crosswalks, raised intersections, and traffic calming roundabouts.

This report draft focuses on vertical deflection measures because they are the most effective at reducing speeds on rural roads. We hope to expand future drafts to include other types of traffic calming.

### **VERTICAL DEFLECTION**

### SPEED HUMPS

A speed hump is an elongated mound in the road extending across the travel way at a right angle to the flow of traffic. It is typically 3 inches in height and 12 feet in length along the vehicle travel path axis. Speed humps 2.75 to 3.5 inches tall are acceptable on streets with posted speed limits of 25-30 mph.

Speed humps should be a little higher on slower streets. On streets with speed limits of 25 mph or less a height of 4 inches is recommended.

Vehicles slow to about 20-25 mph on streets with properly designed and spaced speed humps.




One of a series of speed humps on Central Avenue in Somerville, MA.


### **Approach Cross-sections**

The three typical approach profiles for speed humps and tables each produce different effects.


- Straight approaches are only recommended with raised crosswalks.
- Parabolic approaches are better at slowing cars, but not as good for bicycles and snowplows.
- Sinusoidal (wave-like) approaches are gentler and work better with bikes and snowplows.



Note: Not to scale, straight approach.




Note: Not to scale, parabolic approach.

### **SPEED TABLES**

A speed table is longer than a speed hump and supports the entire wheelbase of a motor vehicle. The longer length makes them gentler than speed humps. Speed tables work better with emergency vehicles and should be used instead of speed humps on primary emergency response routes.

A speed tables should be 22-23 feet long with a 10-foot plateau and 6-foot approaches. It should have a vertical height 3-3.5 inches for 30 mph and 4 inches for 20-25 mph.

Vehicles slow to about 25-30 mph on streets with properly designed and spaced speed humps.

### RAISED CROSSWALKS

A raised crosswalk is a variation of a flat-topped speed table with a crosswalk on top. It should be the same height as the curb. The approach should be straight, not parabolic or sinusoidal.

### TRAFFIC CALMING ROUNDABOUTS

Traffic calming roundabouts are a raised, traversable circle in the center of an intersection three inches tall. They can be used on local, residential streets with widths less than 35 feet and speed limits 30 mph or less.

A single speed hump or speed table will only act as a point of speed control. Vehicles will slow down at the speed hump or table and then accelerate. A single isolated speed hump or table may have little effect and may have negative impacts. To be effective they need to be installed in a series.

tables varies, but they are typically spaced 250 feet to 500 feet apart. Wider spacing produces higher vehicle speeds. The area which vertical deflection reduces speeds is 165-180 feet.

The Dutch space speed humps and tables with targeted speeds:

- 165 feet apart at 20 mph
- 260 330 feet apart for 30 mph
- · Longer humps create higher speeds (11.5 - 15.7 feet)

**Noise Impacts of Vertical Deflection** 

The two primary sources of noise from motor vehicles are engine noise and rolling tire noise. Engine noise dominates up to about 25 mph. Above this speed rolling tire noise is more noticeable. Traffic calming reduces rolling tire noise by lowering vehicle speeds.

The ITE report concludes that the vertical deflection's net effect on road noise is minimal, but that some studies show a reduction of noise from cars by about 10%, but an increase in commercial truck noise by about 6% due to cargo shifting as the truck goes over a speed table. Speed humps reduced commercial truck noise by 2%. It is unclear why speed humps reduced commercial truck noise while speed tables increased it.

### **Spacing of Vertical Deflection Measures**

### OTHER TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES

### **Radar Speed Feedback Signs**

Radar speed feedback signs display the speed of a passing vehicle in comparison to the posted speed limit. Studies show they reduce speeds by 2-11 mph, but this effect may fade with time unless it is paired with regular police enforcement.

### **Lane Narrowing**

Historically, wider travel lanes (11–13 feet) have been favored to create a more forgiving buffer for drivers. However, <u>studies</u> show that wider travel lanes result in higher vehicle speeds. Methodologies in the *Highway Capacity Manual* (HCM) predict an approximately 0.4 to 1.1 mph increase in speeds on two-lane highways for every 1 ft increase in lane width. The <u>Vermont State Design Standards</u> allow for lane widths of 10-12 feet on principle and minor arterial streets and roads and 9-11 feet on collector streets and roads depending on traffic volume and shoulder width. <u>Lane widths of 10 feet</u> are appropriate in urban areas and have a positive impact on safety without impacting traffic operations (<u>NACTO</u>).

### **Removing the Centerline**

A study by Transport for London found that removing road centerlines resulted in a reduction in vehicle speeds by 5.4 to to 8.8 mph. The <u>study</u> concluded that "center line removal introduces an element of uncertainty which is reflected in lower speeds".

The Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices, which governs road sign and lines in the US, does not require centerlines for all roads. The MUTCD states that:

"Center line markings **shall** be placed on all paved urban arterials and collectors that have a traveled way of 20 feet or more in width and an ADT of 6,000 vehicles per day or greater."



It is very important to reduce speed in residential areas where there is potential for MV/pedestrian crash.

"Center line markings **should** also be placed on all rural arterials and collectors that have a traveled way of 18 feet or more in width and an ADT of 3,000 vehicles per day or greater."

### **IMPLEMENTATION**

### What is a speeding problem?

There are no warrants for installing traffic calming measures, but the ITE found the following conditions exist where vertical deflection projects were installed:

- More than 25% of vehicles exceeding posted speed limit by 5+ mph.
- More than 10% of vehicles exceeding posted speed limit by 10+ mph.
- 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed 7+ mph above posted speed limit.

It is important to note that the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed, which is often used in traffic studies to set speed limits, is more a measurement of vehicle performance than neighborhood livability and safety.

### **Public Input Process**

Many jurisdictions have established a traffic calming program with a process for public input and approval. Many towns and cities with traffic calming programs require that most fronting residents approve a vertical deflection project on their street or road before it can be installed. The ITE found many municipalities require 67% approval, with a range of 51% to 75%.

It is important to survey residents after project definition, so they know what they are supporting.

### **Before and After Studies**

A study should be done before and after a project. Studies may include:

- · Vehicle speed
- Cut-through traffic
- Resident perception surveys
- Crash data
- Could also add pedestrian and cyclist level of comfort and traffic stress where applicable.

After studies should be done 6 months to a year after implementation. Crash data should be reviewed 2-3 years after implementation.

### Construction

Most vertical deflection is constructed on existing roads to address residents' concerns, but they can be added during paving projects.

Most agencies use a template to achieve the sinusoidal and parabolic cross-sections.

Some have found installing asphalt concrete humps in two lifts or by hand is most accurate.

Getting the height correct is the most difficult part of construction.

Please see ITE book for detailed design and construction information.

### **Snowplowing**

Vertical deflection projects have been successfully implemented in snowy places like Rochester, New York; Minneapolis, Minnesota; Toronto, Ontario; and Edmonton, Alberta; and Burlington, Vermont.

Sinusoidal (wave-like) approach cross-sections work better with snowplowing than parabolic approaches.

Many agencies use appropriate or specialized equipment (rubber-tipped plows), slightly raise the plow at vertical measures, and using salt at the measure.

It is important to mark speed tables/humps with warning signs so they can be seen if they are covered with snow.

"Vertical deflection/humps should be implemented to serve a purpose of improving neighborhood livability through reduced speeds and volume, supported by a community-driven transportation engineering review." -ITE

### **Common Mistakes**

- Not following height recommendations (too high or low). Sweet spot is between 2.75 in. to 3.5 in.
- Lack of proper traffic control devices (signs and lines).
- "One speed hump/table is all we need." A single isolated speed hump/table may have little effect and may have negative impacts.

- Not following process, data collection, coordination with fire officials, etc.
- Humps/tables too close to driveways. They should be at least one car length from a driveway.




Figure 19. Contrasting Local Street Designs.












Figure 21. Uncurbed, Rural Speed Hump.








Figure 56. Speed Hump Construction Template.















Figure 41. Example Traffic Calming Roundabout.



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# PROJECT BACKGROUND & EXISTING CONDITIONS

#### PROJECT AREA

The project area is Monument Avenue between Carpenter Hill Road and Dewey Street. The BCRC is also conducting speed studies of upper Monument Avenue to evaluate potential future traffic calming projects to the north of Dewey Street.

#### **HIGHWAY FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION**

- · Urban Major Collector,
- Federal Aid Urban Route

Collectors are major and minor roads that connect local roads and streets with arterials. Collectors provide less mobility than arterials at lower speeds and for shorter distances. They balance mobility with land access.

#### SPEED LIMIT

The speed limit on Monument Avenue in Bennington is 30 mph. The speed limit goes down to 25 mph in the Village of Old Bennington.

## **PUBLIC OUTREACH**

All households on Monument Avenue between Carpenter Hill Road and Dewey Street were contacted by a citizens' group concerned about speeding on Monument Avenue. Most households expressed concern about speeding. There has not yet been a formal poll about the proposed traffic calming measures. Southwestern Vermont Medical Center and Alfred Weiss Real Estate, the developers of the resort on the former SVC campus, were also contacted and expressed support for addressing the speeding problem on Monument Avenue.

## **PROBLEM STATEMENT**

Monument Avenue, between Carpenter Hill Road and Dewey Street, has a significant volume of cut-through traffic, with a concerning number of vehicles exceeding the speed limit. Cut-through traffic tends to be faster than local traffic. Many residents living along the corridor have expressed concern about unsafe conditions and negative impacts to quality of life from the traffic conditions. The situation is exacerbated by the presence of many driveways with limited sight distance, leaving residents pulling out of their driveways with dangerously short reaction times to avoid collisions with speeding vehicles. Moreover, the road serves as a route for pedestrians and cyclists, further escalating the risks posed by higher traffic speeds. It's crucial to note that pedestrian survival rates

in crashes decrease substantially as speeds rise: a pedestrian struck by a motor vehicle moving at 45mph is 6 times as likely to die from the incident, compared with a pedestrian struck by a motor vehicle moving at 25mph. Adding to the gravity of the situation, data reveals that there have been 33 motor vehicle crashes along this segment of Monument Avenue since 2010. These statistics underscore the urgent need for interventions to address the unsafe conditions and mitigate the negative impacts on the quality of life for residents in the area.

#### WHAT IS A SPEEDING PROBLEM?

There are no warrants for installing traffic calming measures, but the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) finds that the following conditions typically exist where vertical deflection projects are installed in the United States:

- More than 25% of vehicles exceeding posted speed limit by 5+ mph.
- More than 10% of vehicles exceeding posted speed limit by 10+ mph.
- 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed 7+ mph above posted speed limit.

# PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES

## **NARROW TRAVEL LANES**

Existing conditions: travel lanes are mostly 11 feet wide on Monument Avenue in the project area but are as wide as 14.5 feet in places.

Proposal: narrow the travel lanes from 11 feet to 10 feet.

Historically, wider travel lanes (11–13 feet) have been favored to create a more forgiving buffer for drivers. However, <u>studies</u> show that wider travel lanes result in higher vehicle speeds. Methodologies in the *Highway Capacity Manual* (HCM) predict an approximately 0.4 to 1.1 mph increase in speeds on two-lane highways for every 1 ft increase in lane width. The <u>Vermont State Design Standards</u> allow for lane widths of 10–12 feet on principal and minor arterial streets and roads and 9–11 feet on 9–11 feet on collector streets and roads depending on traffic volume and shoulder width. <u>Lane widths of 10 feet</u> are appropriate in urban areas and have a positive impact on safety without impacting traffic operations (<u>NACTO</u>).

#### **REMOVE CENTER LINE**

Existing conditions: Monument Avenue in the project area has a double-yellow center line.

Proposal: remove the double-yellow center line.

A study by Transport for London found that removing road centerline resulted in a reduction in vehicle speeds by 5.4 to 8.8 mph. The <u>study</u> concluded that "center line removal introduces an element of uncertainty which is reflected in lower speeds".

The <u>Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices</u>, which governs road sign and lines in the US, does not require centerlines for all roads. The MUTCD states that:

"Center line markings **shall** be placed on all paved urban arterials and collectors that have a traveled way of 20 feet or more in width and an ADT of 6,000 vehicles per day or greater."

"Center line markings **should** also be placed on all rural arterials and collectors that have a traveled way of 18 feet or more in width and an ADT of 3,000 vehicles per day or greater."

## INSTALL RADAR FEEDBACK SIGNS

Proposal: install two radar feedback signs, one in each direction.

Radar speed feedback signs display the speed of a passing vehicle in comparison to the posted speed limit. Studies show they reduce speeds by 2–11 mph, but this effect may fade with time unless it is paired with regular police enforcement.

# **INSTALL SPEED HUMPS OR SPEED TABLES**

*Proposal:* Install speed humps or speed tables throughout the project area where the road's slope does not exceed 7%. Speed humps are more effective at controlling speed than speed tables and are the preferred alternative for this project, but speed tables should be considered as an alternative.

A speed hump is an elongated mound in the road extending across the travel way at a right angle to the flow of traffic. It is typically 3–4 inches in height and 12 feet in length along the vehicle travel path axis. Vehicles slow to about 20–25 mph on streets with properly designed and spaced speed humps.

A speed table is longer than a speed hump (22-23 feet long) and supports the

entire wheel base of a motor vehicle. The longer length makes them gentler than speed humps. Speed tables work better with emergency vehicles and should be used instead of speed humps on primary emergency response routes. Vehicles slow to about 25–30 mph on streets with properly designed and spaced speed tables.

Preferred cross-section: *Sinusoidal* (wave-like) approaches are gentler and work better with bikes and snowplows.

#### Spacing of speed humps/tables on Monument Avenue

A single speed hump (or speed table) will only act as one point of speed control. Vehicles will slow down at the speed hump and then accelerate. A single isolated speed hump may have little effect and may have negative impacts. To be effective, speed humps need to be installed in a series.

Speed humps/tables slow traffic for about 260 feet (the "area of influence"). Vehicles decelerate about 80 feet before a speed hump/table and accelerate for about 180 feet after crossing a speed hump/table. Spacing speed humps/tables 250–300 feet apart provides a continuous traffic calming area of influence.

Three alternatives for spacing speed humps/tables on Monument Avenue in the project area:

- 1. Most effective traffic calming alternative: Install speed humps throughout the project area spaced 250–300 feet apart.
- 2. Medium effective traffic calming alternative: Install speed tables/ humps 250–300 feet apart along road segments where residences are denser and where there were more motor vehicle crashes. Install speed humps/tables 500 feet apart where residences are less densely spaced and where there were fewer motor vehicle crashes.
- 3. Least effective traffic calming alternative: Install speed humps/ tables every 500 feet throughout the corridor. 500 feet is the maximum spacing recommended for traffic-calming a corridor.



Many driveways have limited sight distance, leaving residents pulling out of their driveways with dangerously short reaction times to avoid collisions with speeding vehicles.



A recent crash on Monument Ave.



Horseback riding on Monument Avenue circa 1977. The road was frequently used for equestrian and agricultural activities in the years before cut-through traffic volume increased. Average daily traffic has more than doubled since the 1970's as GPS applications like Google Maps has steered motorists away from Bennington's downtown business district.



Traffic volume has increased significantly on Monument Avenue over the years. The road averaged 850 vehicles per day in 1976 and the BCRC measured an average of nearly 2,000 vehicles per day in 2024.









Many Bennington residents walk and bike on Monument Ave. Reducing vehicle speeds in areas with potential motor vehicle and pedestrian interactions is crucial. A pedestrian struck by a car traveling at 45 mph is twice as likely to die as one hit by a car traveling at 35 mph, and more than six times as likely to die as one hit by a car traveling at 25 mph.





6	CURRENT SITUATION:
7	Select Board meetings are recorded by CAT TV. A recorded version of the meeting is saved to CAT
8	TV's account on YouTube.com and that is what is linked from the town's website. There are
9	currently no comments on the CAT TV Youtube.com recorded videos that I reviewed, but comments
10	are allowed. They are also streamed live on the CAT TV Facebook page. People can comment on
11	the CAT TV Facebook live feed during the meeting, and those comments are not filtered or
12	moderated during the meeting. People are using the comment feature on the Facebook live feed,
13	from a low of one person to a high of 36 over the three months reviewed. At some point after a
14	meeting is held, CAT TV staff may review the CAT TV Facebook video comments and remove
15	some. Saved versions of that Facebook video and remaining comments are available on the CAT
16	TV Facebook page but nowhere else.
17	
18	CONCERNS
19	
20	Public Comments Are Lost:
21	Comments made on the livestream do not become part of the public record and are not reviewed
22	by staff or town officials so those comments are in a real sense "lost". People commenting on the
23	livestream may have an expectation that their comments are being heard by decision makers when
24	they are not. Comments made on the Facebook live stream are not able to be moderated in real
25	time so personal attacks and other inappropriate or offensive comments are not preventable.
26	
27	Public Records Retention:
28	The Town is required to maintain all public records — pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317a (Management of
29	Public Records) all public records are considered permanent unless destruction has been authorized
30	under a record schedule approved by the State Archivist or by law. This can include comments on a
31	social media page if the content is unique to a social media site and not also existing on the Town
32	website. For example, a member of Town government or elected official, or member of a
33	government body, commission, or board, participating in comments or answering questions could be

considered to have created a public record. We currently avoid this legal issue by not allowing any comments on our Facebook page.

Our Communications policy states (reviewed and approved by counsel, and approved by the Select Board):

Item #1, Section A: The following social media platforms are hereby designated as government speech forums for the Town of Bennington: **Facebook**, Instagram.

Item #1, Section C: The purpose of using Town of Bennington social media accounts is to serve as a government speech forum to provide residents with community information and important notices and to communicate directly with community members in real time regarding critical incidents, traffic closures, natural disasters, evacuations, and other matters of public safety. The Town does not use social media accounts to solicit input or to answer requests for information.

## **Town Communication Policy on TOWN Accounts VS Other Accounts:**

While unfiltered comments are specifically not allowed on Town controlled social media accounts as per Town policy, CAT TV is a separate entity and as such is unable to filter comments the way we do on Town controlled social media accounts. They can disallow comments, but that would require a request from the Select Board for that to happen.

#### **Confusion About Comments:**

Users of Facebook may have a expectation that comments they make about a Select Board meeting on CAT TV's account as it is happening are being heard. As noted above, because we have no control over CAT TV's Facebook account and we are not involved in any review of comments, people may feel that the Town is unresponsive to an issue when that is not the case.

#### What Are Other Organizations Doing?

For those government agencies that allow comments on social media posts, strict moderation of those comments are in place to ensure that they follow established guidelines in place for comments. I have not seen examples where government is actively monitoring live streams as they happen (meaning that all comments are reviewed prior to being approved in real time).

This will facilitate those who wish to be heard and allow their concerns to be directed to the 85 Select Board where action can be taken and ensure that we are in compliance with all Open Meeting 86 Laws and Public Records keeping requirements. The Select Board will be provided with all 87 comments prior to each subsequent meeting. Anyone can request the comments by asking for them. 88 89 NOTE: 90 CAT TV has the ability to provide a link to a comment form from their live Facebook feed. Specific 91 details of how things are linked on social media accounts change relatively frequently. Details on 92 where and how people are directed to provide comment may change over time due to changes 93 outside our control. The protocol would be fixed in that people are provided direction on how to make 94 comments, while the implementation will vary as those change over time. Having the Select Board 95 chair note how viewers can comment at the start of each meeting might be an additional way to keep 96 people updated.

# MANAGER'S REPORT September 9, 2024

## **ACTION**

<u>UCS Superhero 5 K Road Closures</u> This annual event is scheduled for Saturday November 2. UCS seeks to close Main Street from Benmont Avenue to Branch Street and Gage Street from Bradford to Safford Street. Kick- off is scheduled for 9 am. It should be over by noon. They have been working closely with BPD.

<u>Action Requested</u> Motion to approve the closures as presented.

#### **INFORMATIONAL**

Walloomsac Valley Pathway Grant Award I am pleased to announce that the Town was successful is pursuing additional grant funds for the former Ninja Trail. The VTRANS Bicycle & Pedestrian Program has approved \$1,058,400.00 in federal funds under the Large Scale/Additional Funding category. This is a reimbursement grant and requires a 20% match which may include in-kind work. This may allow the Town to complete the entire pathway.

Major Projects The paving of the streets scheduled for this year including Benmont Ave and Hunt Street should be completed soon. Other streets to be paved include Bradley Drive, a portion of Elm Street, Lafeyette Street, Pageant Street, Weeks Street, Settlers Road and Spring Hill Road. The last two were where new water lines were installed due to PFOA contamination. We expect that upper Gage Street and Frank Street will also be paved this year as this water main replacement project moves to completion.

## **FOLLOW UP**

<u>Legal Opinions</u> Two legal opinions were sought from Town Counsel. The first questioned the appropriate purchasing procedures related to the skatepark and the general designer/contractor selection process. Counsel found that the Town followed the appropriate protocols under the ARPA rules and its Purchasing Policy. The second questioned the proper notice and conduct of the public hearing regarding the request for a planning grant to assist in the Shires potential merger. Counsel determined that the notice and hearing were lawful and appropriate. The written opinions are retained as confidential to protect the Town's lawyer/client privileges.

<u>Select Board Listening Sessions</u> Looking at every other month, the following sessions are planned for the third Wednesday in October (Oct. 16), December (Dec. 18), and February (Feb 19) from 6 pm until 7 pm at the Fire Facility.



Congratulations on your successful application for funding to the 2024 VTrans Bicycle & Pedestrian Program. Your project was approved for \$1,958,400 in federal funds under our Large Scale / Additional Funding category. Approximately half of your additional project funding is from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Carbon Reduction Program (CRP), which funds projects designed to reduce transportation emissions by focusing investments on bicycle, pedestrian, transit, micromobility and fleet electrification projects, in alignment with the VT Carbon Reduction Strategy.

In accordance with the requirements of the program your award amount is capped, so it will be imp, tant for the municipality to monitor the project budget closely. Funding will be available once a grant agreement with the Agency of Transportation (VTrans) is executed. With our current increased workload due to the recent statewide flooding, the grant agreements may be delayed. I ask for your patience as we work through these agreements as quickly as possible.

As you know, this is a reimbursement program and not a direct grant. The City will be responsible for 20% of the total project costs. The offering of this award should not be construed as approval of all work, methods, terms or other specifics proposed in your application. Your award will be governed by the terms of the Grant Agreement with VTrans, including all applicable VTrans, State, and Federal program requirements.

#### Recreation:

## YMCA program planning:

The Bennington Community Center (Rec Center) pool schedule and programs for adults and youth are updated regularly on the Rec Center Facebook page and town's website. Sign-ups for youth sports, swim classes, and adult fitness classes are on the BFYMCA website: <a href="https://bfymca.org/locations-0/bennington-rec-branch-berkshire-family-ymca">https://bfymca.org/locations-0/bennington-rec-branch-berkshire-family-ymca</a>

# **Walloomsac Riverwalk Improvement Project:**

The Town received a \$200,000 Downtown Transportation Fund grant for improvements along the Riverwalk, which include widening the pathway to make it shared use for both pedestrians and cyclists and adding lighting. The improvements to the Riverwalk also include a connection to the new Rail Trail. The final piece of the project will be some additional signage to connect the Riverwalk to the Rail Trail and Skatepark.

#### **Bennington Skatepark Project:**

The Select Board approved the construction contract with GRINDLINE, the firm who will be the designer/builders of the Bennington skatepark. GRINDLINE also built the Manchester and Burlington skateparks. The skatepark committee reached our fundraising goal a month early thanks to the many individuals, organizations, and businesses who donated to our crowdfunding campaign. Town staff, GRINDLINE, and MSK Engineers are working on the final plans and construction on the skatepark has begun.

## **Downtown Transportation Fund skatepark grant:**

I submitted a grant application for the Agency of Commerce and Community Development's Downtown Transportation Fund, and we received the full amount of \$200,000 for the Bennington Skatepark. DTF funding has been used to revitalize downtown areas such as the Park at 336 (Pocket Park), Franklin Lane, and the Downtown Riverwalk. These latest funds will support additional lighting, benches, security cameras, landscaping, and the pathway connections to the Riverwalk and Rail Trail from the skatepark.

## **Vermont Begins Here marketing update:**

The annual Town budget includes \$40,000 for marketing expenses for the Vermont Begins Here campaign to promote both downtown Bennington as well as area attractions such as cultural institutions and outdoor recreation. Eight Oh Two Marketing manages the VBH digital marketing campaign and website to promote Bennington to tourists, and the Bennington Banner manages the VBH social media content. The VBH blog post for September promoted home based food businesses, food trucks, and farm stands in Bennington.

Town marketing expenses for FY24:

- \$18,000 (\$1500 per month) for Vermont Begins Here paid digital ads on Google (such as "Things to Do in Bennington") and Facebook (photo collages with links to area attractions).
- \$5200 (\$430 per month) for digital marketing (Search Engine Optimization) and website management to Eight Oh Two Marketing.

- \$16,000 (\$1300 per month) for VBH social media management (Facebook and Instagram), Mailchimp monthly e-newsletter content creation, and ads in Banner and Vermont Country Magazine to Bennington Banner.
- \$1500 for Shires Guide ad to Southwestern Vermont Chamber of Commerce.
- \$800 for Mailchimp (email newsletter) and SiteGround (web hosting) fees.

Note that the annual town marketing budget is \$40,000 and we went over by \$1500, which came from the Shires Guide ad. We had some reserve from the year prior, so this covered the overage.

Eight Oh Two Marketing noted that VBH organic rankings and traffic have increased steadily since the campaign was launched. Organic traffic is those visitors that land on a website from unpaid sources rather than paid ads. Here is a comparison in total currently ranking keywords among the VBH and BBC and the SW Chamber websites:

• Vermontbeginshere.com: 2.6k keywords

Bennington.com: 1.7k keywords

• Betterbennington.com: 894 keywords

For comparison, I also researched the marketing budgets of other neighboring towns in Vermont:

- Brattleboro spends \$45,000 for marketing and \$20,000 for arts events (\$45,000 comes from local option tax revenue).
- Rutland spends \$120,000 on marketing (70% corporate sponsorship and 30% municipality).
   Municipal funds come from Mayor's budget.
- Manchester allocates \$50,000 to Manchester Business Association from their annual town budget.
- Wilmington spends \$110,000 on digital marketing and \$40,000 on events from their local option tax revenue. Dover also spends \$110,000 for a combined marketing budget of \$220,000.

#### **Bennington Fair Food Initiative:**

The Bennington Fair Food Initiative, including the Bennington Community Market, Southwest Tech, Bennington College, and the Vermont Veteran's Home, was funded with a 2.2 million earmark in the government spending bill that passed at the end of 2022 (nominated by Senator Peter Welch). The funds are administered through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and flow through the Town of Bennington to each partner in the project. The goal of the initiative is to connect partners in the local food system and create jobs in the food sector.

#### **Community Development Block Grants:**

The Vermont Community Development program recently awarded an enhancement grant of \$613,810 to the Town of Bennington to support the Benn High redevelopment. Shires Housing has also received a VCDP award of \$700,000 for the Squire House recovery housing project on North Street and \$1,000,000 for a recovery housing project on Gage Street. I submit paperwork required for each grant agreement and subgrant agreement along with progress reports on the projects. At the end of the year, I also submit financial reports to the state of Vermont on past HUD loans that have been granted to the Town or sub-grantees.

#### **Benn Hi Redevelopment:**

I am working closely with Hale Resources, the developer of the overall project, and am researching grants to help support the Benn High redevelopment. My application for Congressionally Directed Spending for the Benn High redevelopment was awarded \$1 million from Representative Becca Balint's office. The Town also received a \$150,000 grant from the Community Partnership for Neighborhood Development program of the Agency of Commerce and Community Development to help cover some of the predevelopment costs for the Benn High project. The Benn High Redevelopment was recognized as a 2023 Vital Project by Southern Vermont Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). The Town's application to the Northern Border Regional Commission was also awarded \$1 million for the Benn High project, with a focus on the childcare center.

I am currently working with Mariya Shcheglovitova, Extension Assistant Professor in Community and Economic Development for UVM Extension, on an EPA Community Change grant application to support Benn High as a Community Resilience Hub and Neighborworks with a Community Resilience Fund to provide housing repairs and energy efficiency upgrades to homes in the neighborhood surrounding Benn High.

# **Housing Committee:**

Zak Hale has organized a regular meeting of various professionals working to improve the housing crisis in Bennington, including representatives from BCRC, the Town, the Health Department, Bennington County Coalition for the Homeless, Neighborworks, Southwestern VT Chamber of Commerce, Shires Housing, and Maple Leaf Realty.

#### **Historic Preservation Commission:**

Thomas Scheetz, a recent MAUHS graduate and member of the Historic Preservation Commission, worked on a project for the HPC through the SPARK program at Harvard University, where he is now attending college. Thomas researched historic properties on Pleasant Street to prepare for a National Register of Historic Places application. HPC members are using this research for a historical walking tour of Pleasant Street that will be organized later this fall.

# **Equitable & Inclusive Communities Grant:**

The Town received a \$10,000 grant from the Vermont Community Foundation for a mural project at 120 Union Street, the Bennington Multicultural Community Center (and offices of the Ethiopian Community Development Council). Murals have been designed by the Afghan Art Lords, a group of internationally recognized artists and members of Bennington's refugee community.

## **Community Outreach:**

In the past month, I have met with the Benn Hi Redevelopment team, BFYMCA management team, Better Bennington Corporation, Bennington Banner, Eight Oh Two Marketing, Skatepark Committee, Historic Preservation Commission, Shires Housing, UVM Cooperative Extension, Southwest Tech, the Ethiopian Community Development Council, and the Vermont Council on Rural Development.
