Police Canine – On your next agenda I will be proposing that the Town apply for a grant for a canine for the police department. I have spoken with both Public Safety Director Geagan and Deputy Chief Winchester and they will be presenting this at the 3/11 meeting.

UMaine Mitchell Center – Materials Management – I have been asked to participate in an interview with the UMaine Mitchell Center in regard to a Materials Management project that they are working on. It centers around solid waste, recycling - and the overall handling of waste materials in Maine. The interview will only take a maximum of an hour.

Budgets – I have received most all of the department budgets, met with some department heads and will be meeting with others next week to review requests and then compiling the total document for the Council.
