ORDINANCES 6.

A. Special Use (16W535 South Frontage Road – Burr Ridge Car Care)

Attached is an Ordinance granting special use approval for the display and sale of automobiles at Burr Ridge Car Care, on South Frontage Road. Automobile sales are limited to one car on display at a time. The Plan Commission has recommended approval of this request and, at its July 23 meeting, the Village Board directed staff to prepare the attached Ordinance.

It is our recommendation:

that the Ordinance be approved.

Sign Variation (16W535 South Frontage Road – Burr Ridge Care Care) B.

Attached is an Ordinance granting a sign variation to allow a "For Sale" sign in an automobile for sale at the Burr Ridge Car Care on South Frontage Road. The sign would be limited to a four square foot sign located inside the window of the car for sale. The Plan Commission has recommended approval of this request and, at its July 23 meeting, the Village Board directed staff to prepare the attached Ordinance.

It is our recommendation:

that the Ordinance be approved.

C. Amend Liquor Code (for Starbuck's)

The Board will recall that a new Class Q liquor license was recently approved for Starbuck's. At that time, Starbuck's contemplated only selling beer and wine by the glass. Although patrons could purchase a bottle of wine, Starbuck's required that the bottle be kept behind the counter and poured one glass at a time. Starbuck's policy prohibited patrons from taking any unused portion of the bottle home with them. Since opening, they have had requests from residents in the Village Center who would like to purchase a bottle of wine and be able to take the unfinished portion of the bottle home with them. Therefore, they would now like to change their policy. Enclosed please find an Ordinance that amends the Class Q Liquor License to allow for this to occur. This language is similar to the languages that is found in all the other liquor licenses throughout the Village.

It is our recommendation: that the Ordinance be approved.

8. CONSIDERATIONS

A. <u>Plan Commission Recommendation - Special Use (161 Tower Drive - Ludicrous 6, LLC)</u>

Please find attached a letter from the Plan Commission recommending approval of a request by Ludicrous 6 LLC for special use approval to permit wholesale and retail sales of automobiles in an existing tenant space. In July of 2011, special use approvals were granted for retail sales of luxury automobiles at this location, subject to two, six-month trial periods. In February, 2012, the first trial period was completed and the second six-month trial period was approved. The petitioner has completed the second trial period and is seeking to renew the special use without a time limit.

There were no neighbors or anyone else from the public at the public hearing. There was one complaint received during the first six-month trial period and one complaint received during the second trial period. The first complaint (a neighbor reported hearing a loud car) was determined not to be a violation of the special use as it occurred during permitted hours. Staff was not able to verify the second complaint (a neighbor heard a loud car), but the petitioner reported they were not at the property at the time of the incident and alleged that it must have been a car not associated with this business.

One of the conditions of the special use was that all vehicles that are stored at the property be sold from this location with the sales tax going to the Village of Burr Ridge. The Village has sales tax data from the first six months of the business (September 2011 through February 2012) and a total of \$23,674.09 was received by the Village in sales tax from this business. The petitioner's attorney has reported that, in the subsequent months, March through May, the business experienced a substantial increase in sales, although that cannot be verified until the Village receives the sales tax from the State of Illinois.

The Plan Commission recommends that the special use be approved without a time limit. The other conditions of the special use would be continued and are listed in the attached letter from the Plan Commission.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that the Board direct staff to prepare an Ordinance granting a special use as recommended by the Plan Commission.

B. <u>Plan Commission Recommendation – Sidewalk Signs in Retail Business</u> <u>Districts</u>

Please find attached a letter from the Plan Commission recommending approval of an amendment to the Sign Ordinance to add "Portable Sidewalk Signs" as a conditional sign in the Business Districts. This recommendation was previously considered by the Board at the June 11, 2012 meeting. While generally in agreement with allowing portable sidewalk signs, the Board was concerned about two aspects of the Plan Commission's recommendation. The Board did not want to require conditional sign approval and the Board wants to allow changeable copy on the signs. As a result, the Board remanded this matter to the Plan Commission for further consideration. In response to the Board's direction, the consensus of the Plan Commission was as follows:

- The Commission agreed that changeable copy signs should be allowed, but with limitations. Changeable copy signs that are designed for that purpose, such as chalkboard signs, are acceptable. However, changeable copy signs that are handwritten on poster board not intended for such purposes should not be allowed and signs with changeable plastic letters may not always be appropriate, depending on their design and quality.
- The Commission does not want to allow plastic signs of any type, such as those now commonly used in County Line Square, and has added a condition that all portable sidewalk signs are made from wood or metal.
- The Commission remains concerned that allowing such signs without public review of the final design of the sign type may result in undesirable signs of low quality. Thus, the Commission continues to recommend that these signs be classified as conditional signs which will allow the Village to review the design of sign structure. The intent is that each property owner, not each business, presents an array of sign structure types that would be approved by the Village for general use throughout a shopping center. It is not intended that each individual tenant would have to present their sign(s) to the Plan Commission and Board for approval.

Staff shares the concerns that a conditional sign approval process may become cumbersome if individual businesses are subject to this requirement. The intent of the regulations as drafted is for the shopping center owner to seek conditional sign approval up front. Individual business then can choose the sign they want to use from the group of approved signs for each shopping center. It is possible, however, that a business may find a new type of sign that is acceptable to the shopping center and acceptable to the Village, but not on the approved list. In this situation, staff suggests that the Village allow the conditional sign approval to be amended without a formal sign petition or sign approval fee.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that the Board direct staff to prepare an Ordinance amending the Sign Ordinance as recommended by the Plan Commission and as modified above.

C. <u>Truck Driving Training School – 15W580 North Frontage Road</u>

Compass Truck, 15W580 North Frontage Road in unincorporated DuPage County, located directly west of the SAIA Truck Depot, has petitioned the DuPage County Zoning Board of Appeals to request a conditional use to allow for a CDL training school on their property (see attached). Although the hearing was originally scheduled for August 16, it is our understanding that this issue will be tabled at the request of the petitioner until September 20.

The Village has received calls in the recent past from residents complaining about this use, which apparently has been going on without proper County zoning approval since the spring. If this property were located in the Village, a truck training school would not be an allowed use at this location. With this in mind, <u>it is my recommendation</u> that Staff be directed to send a letter to the DuPage County Zoning Board of Appeals in opposition to this zoning request.

In addition, the Village Board may want to consider the possibility of force-annexing this property. The property is totally surrounded by the Village and can be force-annexed as early as the September 10 Board meeting. Our Village Attorney has indicated that the Village has the authority to force-annex this property, which would circumvent any zoning request, if the annexation occurs before the final action by the County. It is my understanding that residents along 75th Street, which are located just directly north of this property, will be in attendance on Monday evening to voice their concerns.

Board direction is requested.

D. <u>Plan Commission Recommendation – Text Amendment and Special Use</u> (16W300 83rd Street – Moreno)

Please find attached a letter from the Plan Commission recommending approval of a request for special use approval as per Section X.F.2 of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to permit a medical office in an existing building. The proposed medical office would occupy 1,020 square feet of the 15,577 square feet and would include only one doctor.

The Commission determined that the medical office use is consistent with other uses on 83rd Street. The property currently provides sufficient parking for the medical office and other uses in the building.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that the Board directs staff to prepare an Ordinance approving the special use as recommended by the Plan Commission.

E. <u>Plan Commission Recommendation - Text Amendment (Outdoor Kitchens)</u>

Please find attached a letter from the Plan Commission recommending approval of an amendment to Section IV.I of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to add outdoor kitchens as a permitted accessory structure in residential districts and to create appropriate regulations for outdoor kitchens.

Construction of outdoor kitchens in residential back yards has become a common feature of many homes in Burr Ridge. In response, the Plan Commission believes that the Village should create a separate category of regulations for outdoor kitchens in the Accessory Structures section of the Zoning Ordinance. The regulations recommended herein were developed with input from residents and from a contractor who has built outdoor kitchens in Burr Ridge. The regulations restrict outdoor kitchens to the rear yard and establish limitations on height and area.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that the Board direct staff to prepare an Ordinance as recommended by the Plan Commission.

F. Contract for 2012 Brush Chipping Program

Winkler's Tree Service has performed the fall and spring curbside brush chipping program for the Village since 1996. Once again, Winkler's has agreed to hold their rate of \$96.56 per hour per crew, which includes the necessary brush chipping equipment and 2 employees. \$30,900 has been budgeted for this program during FY12-13. To date, staff has been satisfied with the competency, responsiveness and quality of work performed by Winkler's Tree Service.

It is our recommendation: that a contract be awarded to Winkler's Tree Service, of LaGrange Park, for the fall 2012 and spring 2013 curbside brush chipping program at the rate of \$96.56 per hour, for a total not to exceed \$30,900.

G. Contract for Pump Center Generator Maintenance

The FY 12-13 Budget includes \$1,800.00 for the cost of an annual maintenance contract for the Pump Center emergency stand-by generator. This vital piece of equipment should be maintained to the highest standards to assure complete reliability and functionality.

Cummins NPower, of Hodgkins, has submitted a quote in the amount of \$1,490 for a one year maintenance agreement to service the Pump Center generator; this represents no increase from the previous year. This agreement consists of two (2) visits per year and includes the cost of all oil, lubricants and filters that are routinely needed. Cummins, which has a world-wide reputation in the field of power generation, is the company that manufactured the generator and installed the electronic control components for this equipment. They currently have a service contract to maintain the

generators at both the Public Works Department facility and the Village Hall. The Hodgkins branch of Cummins NPower has been performing this work for the Village for the past several years and all maintenance is performed by factory trained and certified technicians. They are the only local company that has the ability to perform these maintenance functions and also provide 24-hour emergency service. In addition, the proximity of the Hodgkins branch office has proven to be an invaluable asset in the past.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that a contract be awarded to Cummins NPower for the annual maintenance of the Pump Center emergency stand-by generator in the amount of \$1,490.

H. Reappoint Sandra Allen to Board of Fire and Police Commissioners

Mayor Grasso is recommending the reappointment of Sandra Allen to the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners for three-year term that will expire April 30, 2015. Ms. Allen has been a member of the BFPC since June 10, 2002.

<u>It is our recommendation:</u> that the recommendation to reappoint Sandra Allen to the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners be approved.

I. Reappoint Barbara Miklos to E-9-1-1 Board

The Mayor is recommending the reappointment of Barbara Miklos to the Emergency Telephone System (E-9-1-1) Board for a one-year term that will expire February 1, 2013. Ms. Miklos has been on the E-9-1-1 Board since December 13, 1989.

<u>It is our recommendation:</u> that the recommendation to reappoint Barbara Miklos to the E-9-1-1 Board be approved.

J. Reappoint Bob Jewell to E-9-1-1 Board

The Mayor is recommending the reappointment of Bob Jewell to the Emergency Telephone System (E-9-1-1) Board for a one-year term that will expire February 1, 2013. Mr. Jewell has been on the E-9-1-1 Board since February 25, 2002.

<u>It is our recommendation:</u> that the recommendation to reappoint Bob Jewell to the E-9-1-1 Board be approved.

K. Reappoint Jerome Connolly to E-9-1-1 Board

Mayor Grasso is recommending the reappointment of Jerome Connolly to the Emergency Telephone System (E-9-1-1) Board for a one-year term that will expire February 1, 2013. Mr. Connolly has been on the E-9-1-1 Board since May 12, 2008.

It is our recommendation: that the recommendation to reappoint

Jerome Connolly to the E-9-1-1 Board be approved.

L. Reappoint Brooks Fuller to E-9-1-1 Board

The Mayor is recommending the reappointment of Brooks Fuller to the Emergency Telephone System (E-9-1-1) Board for a one-year term that will expire February 1, 2013. Mr. Fuller has on the E-9-1-1 Board since March 14, 2011.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that the recommendation to reappoint Brooks Fuller to the E-9-1-1 Board be approved.

M. Reappoint John Madden to E-9-1-1 Board

The Mayor is recommending the reappointment of Police Chief John Madden to the Emergency Telephone System (E-9-1-1) Board for a one-year term that will expire February 1, 2013. Chief Madden has been on the E-9-1-1 Board since June 22, 2009.

<u>It is our recommendation:</u> that the recommendation to reappoint Police Chief John Madden to the E-9-1-1 Board be approved.

N. Reappoint Alice Krampits to I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor

The Mayor is recommending the reappointment of Alice Krampits as the Village's representative to the I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor Civic Center Authority Board for a four-year term that will expire June 25, 2015 (Ms. Krampits' term expired 6/25/11). Ms. Krampits has been the Village's representative to the I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor since June 25, 2007.

<u>It is our recommendation:</u> that the recommendation to reappoint Alice Krampits as Representative to the I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor be approved.

O. Raffle License/Hosting Facility License - St. Helena Church

Enclosed is an application from St. Helena's Church to conduct a raffle as part of its charitable event on Sunday, December 16, as well as a letter requesting waiver of the fidelity bond requirement. The church is planning to sell raffle tickets between September 16 and December 16, with the winner determined on December 16. Also enclosed is a request for a Hosting Facility License for the Church.

<u>It is our recommendation</u>: that a Raffle and Chance License and a Hosting Facility License be issued to St. Helena's Church for its December 16 raffle, for which tickets will be sold between September 16 and December 16, and that the fidelity bond be waived.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION TO ACCEPT AMENDMENT TO THE FY12 – 13 HOTEL MARKETING PLAN The Board, under the Consent Agenda by Omnibus Vote, approved the amendment to the FY12 – 13 Hotel Marketing Plan for the reallocation of \$75,000 originally budgeted for billboard advertising to additional online advertising and a focus on the Chicago Convention and Visitors Bureau. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gary Grasso called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF MINUTES - JANUARY 9, 2012

A **motion** was made by Trustee Bob Grela to approve the minutes of January 9, 2012. The motion was **seconded** by Trustee Len Ruzak and **approved** by a vote of 3-0.

PROGRESS SUMMARY OF 2012 CAPTIAL PROGRAM

Public Works Director Paul May provided the Committee with a summary of the ongoing 2012 Capital Program, including the 2012 Resurfacing Program, which was budgeted in the amount of \$527,000, and awarded the contract to the low bidder, Brothers Asphalt, in the amount of \$496,000, which was 6% under budget. He stated that the project was recently completed, pending the resolution of a few punch list items at a cost of approximately \$450,000, which is 15% under budget and 9% under bid. He stated that the Program was completed on time and included resurfacing on 60th Street, Grant/Heathrow/Rockwell, Meadowbrook Drive, Windsor Court and Garfield Street south of 91st Street.

Mr. May stated that the Madison Street Traffic Signal Project was wrapping up and that the traffic light should be installed sometime within the next week. He stated that the project is currently under budget.

Mr. May indicated that both the 2012 Crack Filling and Pavement Markings programs were placed on the July 23 Board Meeting Agenda for approval. He stated, together, these two programs would be at or under budget.

STP GRANT CYCLE

Public Works Director Paul May indicated that the 2013-2018 DuPage Surface Transportation Program (STP Grants) is now open. He indicated that, although the Village already received a grant to resurface Garfield Street in 2013 in the amount of \$168,000, Village Staff had long desired to upgrade this section of roadway to a curbed section to provide continuity throughout the corridor and upgrade the stormwater system and

driving surface. He stated that the updated 2040 traffic volume projections for Garfield Street were increased and this new information may allow us to be successful in applying for a grant to reconstruct the street. Mr. May suggested that we retain the existing resurfacing grant and submit a grant for reconstruction during the 2012 STP Cycle. He stated a full reconstruction for the Burr Ridge section of Garfield is estimated at \$1,000,000. If the Village is awarded funds for reconstruction, the resurfacing grant will be dropped and the project will proceed as a full reconstruction. He stated that, if the reconstruction application is not successful, the village will proceed with the existing resurfacing grant. If this occurs, he recommended that sections along the west side of the street be upgraded with curb and gutter at an additional cost of approximately \$100,000.

Mayor Grasso agreed that, since Garfield is a major arterial street, the Village should attempt to obtain grant funding for its total reconstruction. In response to a question from Administrator Stricker, Mayor Grasso also stated that, because Garfield Street is a major arterial, he did not feel that the residents should be responsible to pay for the cost of the reconstruction of the road to upgrade it to include curb and gutter.

After some discussion, a **motion** was made by Trustee Len Ruzak to direct Staff to apply for a grant to reconstruct Garfield Street with curb and gutter. The motion was **seconded** by Trustee Bob Grela and **approved** by a vote of 3-0.

It was also agreed that the question of whether or not to spend an additional \$100,000 to add curb and gutter on the west side of Garfield, if the Village does not receive the grant, should be decided at a later date.

2012/2013 CMAQ GRANT CYCLE

Public Works Director Paul May reminded the Committee that, based upon the current STP Grant, the Village has until September 30, 2015, to construct the round-about at 79th Street and Madison. He reminded the Committee that the Village has been concerned about the cost associated with the grant match and the Phase 2 and 3 engineering services, which must be funded locally. He stated that the anticipated Village-related cost for this project would be over \$750,000.

Mr. May indicated that an additional funding source may now be available, which would significantly reduce the cost of this project to the Village. He stated that the funding source is the CMAQ Program (Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program). This Program includes a large pool of Federal money, which is distributed in our region through CMAP (Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning). He stated that, due to changes that CMAP has made to the grant program, CMAQ Grants will now provide for 100% funding for Phase 2 and 3 engineering and 100% for construction. He stated that, since the Phase 1 engineering has already been completed and paid for by the Village, it is possible that the round-about could be completed at virtually no additional cost to the Village, with the exception of the cost of minor right-of-way acquisition.

B. Z-17-2012: 16W300 83rd Street (Moreno); Special Use

Chairman Trzupek asked Mr. Pollock to provide a summary of this public hearing.

Mr. Pollock described the public hearing as follows: The petitioner is the Architect for the property owner. The property owner seeks special use approval for a medical office in an industrial district. The medical office would occupy 1,020 square feet. The rest of the building would be occupied with permitted offices and industrial uses. Sufficient parking is provided on-site.

Chairman Trzupek asked for comments from the petitioner.

Mr. Hernando Moreno, the Architect for the property owner, stated that the medical office would be a pediatric neurological doctor which would be a benefit to the schools and residents of the Village. He said there would be one doctor and that the doctor is the wife of the property owner. Mr. Moreno said she sees a small patient load which would not generate significant traffic. He added that the office portion of the building would be occupied by the property owner who operates a medical billing and administration service.

There being no comments from the general public, Chairman Trzupek asked for questions and comments from the Plan Commission.

Commissioner Cronin asked about the other parts of the building and about the hours for the medical office. Mr. Moreno said that the property owner would occupy a portion of the building with his business and administrative office and the rest would be leased to industrial users most likely warehouse type uses. He added that the hours would be normal daytime hours but most likely less than the normal work hours.

Commissioner Franzese asked if more doctors would be added. Mr. Moreno said that they do not intend to add more doctors but if they did more parking could be added on the adjacent lot to the west.

Commissioner Bolos had no questions.

Commissioner Perri asked the petitioner why they want to put a medical office in this location. Mr. Moreno said that the property owner's wife is a doctor and would like to work in the same building as her husband.

Commissioners Stratis and Grunsten both said they had no questions.

Chairman Trzupek asked how the special use would be applied to the property relative to the amount of floor area used for medical offices. Mr. Pollock said that the Plan Commission should determine if the special use is limited to the 1,020 square feet proposed or if it should be for medical offices in the entire building. He said that the petitioner is only asking to occupy 1,020 square feet with medical offices and that staff recommends limiting this special use to the 1,020 square feet.

There being no further questions or comments, Chairman Trzupek asked for a motion to close the public hearing.

C. Z-18-2012: Zoning Ordinance Text Amendment – Outdoor Kitchens

Chairman Trzupek asked Mr. Pollock to provide a summary of this public hearing.

Mr. Pollock described the public hearing as follows: At its July 16, 2012 meeting, the Plan Commission requested authorization from the Board of Trustees to conduct a public hearing for the above referenced text amendment and at its July 23, 2012 meeting, the Board approved this request. The amendment proposes to add "Outdoor Kitchens" as a permitted accessory structure in residential districts and to establish appropriate regulations for outdoor kitchens.

Mr. Pollock added that he received there were two residents pursuing outdoor kitchens that would be impacted by the Ordinance. He said both supported the amendment but both asked for some minor changes. He said those changes included; increasing the

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permitted height from 4 feet to 5 feet and increasing the maximum area from 60 to 70 square feet.

Chairman Trzupek asked if the area included any seating area around the kitchen. Mr. Pollock said that it does not include the seating area as that would be part of the patio. He said the 60 square feet only includes the vertical structure used for an oven, cooktop, fridge, sink, etc.

Chairman Trzupek asked for question and comments from the public.

Mr. Dave Sheehan, 131 Kraml Drive, suggested that the height be increased to five feet. He said he was planning the construction of an outdoor kitchen and it would be 4 feet tall plus a back splash that would exceed the 4 feet. He said some outdoor kitchens are made from standard uni-lock blocks and that they would typically exceed 48 inches when there is a backsplash.

There being no other public comment, Chairman Trzupek asked for questions and comments from the Plan Commission.

Commissioner Grunsten said that she sees outdoor kitchens as a popular trend in the Village and supports the proposed amendment.

Commissioner Stratis said that he supports the additional height for back splashes. He added that he has no further questions.

Commissioner Perri asked how the structures would be vented. Mr. Sheehan said that the one he was planning has a built-in fan. Chairman Trzupek said that typically venting is not necessary as they are similar to any other outdoor portable grill.

Commissioner Bolos asked for clarification of what was being recommended. Mr. Pollock said that the regulations for outdoor fireplaces and grills would remain in place but that a separate classification for outdoor kitchens is being added.

Commissioner Franzese asked if a permit is required for these structures. Mr. Pollock said that a permit is required.

Commissioner Franzese suggested that the stove be referred to as a cooktop. He also asked if masonry would include uni-lock blocks. Chairman Trzupek said that he believes the term masonry would include uni-lock blocks.

Commissioner Perri asked about safety and shut-offs for the gas line. Mr. Pollock said that the building code would regulate the gas and water lines to be constructed for an outdoor kitchen.

There being no further questions or comments, Chairman Trzupek asked for a motion to close the hearing.

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A **MOTION** was made by Commissioner Stratis and **SECONDED** by Commissioner Grunsten to close the public hearing for Z-18-2012.

A **MOTION** was made by Commissioner Franzese and **SECONDED** by Commissioner Bolos to adopt the staff's findings of fact for Z-18-2012 and to recommend that the Board of Trustees approve an amendment to Section IV.I of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to add Outdoor Kitchens as a permitted accessory structure in residential districts and to create appropriate regulations for Outdoor Kitchens as follows:

38. Kitchens, Outdoor

Outdoor kitchens (typically being a masonry structure with a cook top and oven, plumbing, cabinet storage areas, and counter top) may be located in the rear buildable area and are also permitted in the required rear yard of a residential property subject to the following:

- a. Outdoor kitchens must be a minimum of 10 feet from the rear lot line and not closer than the required side yard setback to the interior side yard.
- b. Any cooking unit or fireplace included in an outdoor kitchen must be a minimum of 10 feet from the principal building and all accessory buildings.
- c. Outdoor kitchens may not exceed 5 feet in height and 60 square feet in area except that a chimney provided for a stove or fireplace may extend to 15 feet in height.

D. Z-15-2012: 161 Tower Drive (Ludicrous 6, LLC); Special Use

Chairman Trzupek asked Mr. Pollock to provide a summary of this public hearing.

Mr. Pollock described the public hearing as follows: In July of 2011, the petitioner was granted special use approval for the sales of automobiles in conjunction with an existing automobile storage facility. The special use approval was granted subject to several conditions including two, 6 month trial periods. The first trial period expired on February 15, 2012 (six months from the August 15, 2011 issuance of a retail sales license by the State of Illinois). A second trial period was approved earlier this year. At this time, the petitioner is seeking to renew the special use approval on a permanent basis.

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Chairman Trzupek asked about the public notices for this hearing. Mr. Pollock said that notices were sent to all of the property owners within 500 feet of the property. He said that the petitioner did a new search of the public records for this hearing.

Chairman Trzupek asked the petitioner for comments.

Christina Brotto said she was the attorney for the petitioner. She said that during the first six month period, there was on complaint and it was determined that it was not a violation of the special use. She said that during the second six month trial period there was one complaint and it was determined it was a loud car not associated with this business.

Ms. Brotto also said that the petitioner no longer owns the property at 145 Tower Drive and no longer operates from that location.

Chairman Trzupek asked if there was anyone in attendance to speak on this matter. There were none.

Chairman Trzupek asked the Plan Commission for questions and comments.

Commissioner Cronin confirmed that this business conducts sales of luxury and exotic cars and there were no changes to the business since the original approval. Ms. Brotto said there were no changes.

Commissioner Franzese asked about the subject of the latest noise complaint. Ms. Brotto said she did not know.

Commissioner Franzese said that he is concerned that it is difficult to determine if there is a noise violation. He said it was possible to have cars with after-market mufflers which could be louder. He said that one complaint was one too many.

Commissioner Bolos asked if there was sufficient space for cars to be moved internally without going outside the building. Ms. Brotto said there was sufficient space.

Commissioner Stratis said that he disagrees and that only one complaint is admirable. He said that some noise is to be expected and is typical of any neighborhood during daytime hours.

Commissioner Stratis asked about the condition requiring a minimum value of cars sold. Mr. Pollock said that condition was added by the Board to ensure that the business would remain a luxury car sales business. Ms. Brotto added that the condition required an average sales price and not a minimum.

Commissioner Grunsten said that with the limited hours she has no objection to granting the special use.

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Chairman Trzupek asked the petitioner if they had any concerns with any of the conditions being continued. Ms. Brotto said they did not.

The hours of operation for customer visitation, moving of vehicles (except as provided herein), and sales shall be limited to 10 AM to 3 PM, Mondays through Fridays, with no business conducted on Saturdays, Sundays or state and federal holidays. Nothing herein shall prohibit any principals of Petitioner from moving the vehicles in and out of the building at any given time when the vehicles are for personal use.
- The Petitioner shall sign a Sales Tax Disclosure Agreement with the Village of Burr Ridge.
- J. The business shall comply with the noise regulations as outlined in the Zoning Ordinance.
- K. There shall be no test driving of automobiles in the residential areas to the north of the subject property including on streets within the Carriageway Subdivision, Carriageway Club, and Carriageway Condos.
- L. 90% of all sales shall average \$100,000 or more.
- M. The point of sale for all vehicles stored in this location will be registered as this location in the Village of Burr Ridge;
- N. All sales of vehicles stored in this location shall be consummated and completed at this location in the Village of Burr Ridge;
- O. The Petitioner shall promptly pay to the State of Illinois, as required by law, all applicable vehicle sales taxes in such amounts as required by the State of Illinois.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25 OF THE BURR RIDGE MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDING CLASS "Q" LIQUOR LICENSE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: That Section 25.09 of Chapter 25 of the Burr Ridge Municipal Code be and is hereby amended to add the following italicized language to the existing provisions of subsection "R", for said sub-section "R" to read in its entirety as follows:

R. Class Q License; Restaurant/Beer and Wine Only

A Class "Q" - License shall be issued for a period of one year. A Class "Q" License shall permit the sale of beer and wine only on the premises designated therein for consumption by the drink on such premises only, and further provided that such sale of beer and wine shall be restricted to sales made in conjunction with the licensee's operation of a restaurant on said premises, and further provided that such sale of beer and wine shall not be permitted until all food services equipment is installed and fully operating and such licensed premises meet the qualifications set forth in 235 ILCS 5/1-3.23. No person shall sell, dispense or pour or give away any such beer and wine between the hours of 12:00 Midnight and 11:00 A.M. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursday and between 1:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. on Friday and between 2:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. on Saturday and Sunday; provided further, however, that on January 1st each year while this Chapter is in effect alcoholic liquor may be sold at retail pursuant to the terms of this Chapter until 2:00 A.M.; provided further, however, that it shall be the duty of the license holders of such establishments to require that all persons, other than employees of said establishments, leave the premises within fifteen (15) minutes after the foregoing stated closing times. Provided, however, notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, a restaurant may permit a patron to remove one unsealed and partially consumed bottle of wine for off-premises consumption. A partially consumed bottle of wine that is to be removed from the premises pursuant to this Section shall be securely sealed by the licensee or an agent of the licensee prior to removal from the premises and placed in a transparent one-time use tamper-proof bag. The licensee or agent of the licensee shall provide a dated receipt for the bottle of wine to the patron. Wine that is



resealed in accordance with the provisions of this Section and not tampered with shall not be deemed to be in an unsealed container.

Section 2:	This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its

The Plan Commission transmits for your consideration its recommendation to approve a request by Ludicrous 6 LLC for special use approval as per the Section X.E.2 of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to permit wholesale and retail sales of automobiles in an existing tenant space. In July of 2011, special use approvals were granted for retail sales of luxury automobiles at this location subject to two, sixmonth trial periods. In February, 2012, the first trial period was completed and the second 6 month trial period was approved. The petitioner has completed the second trial period and is seeking to renew the special use without a time limit.

Re: S-02-2012: Sign Ordinance Amendment – Portable Sidewalk Signs in Business Districts

Dear Mayor and Board of Trustees:

At the meeting of June 11, 2012, the Board of Trustees considered a recommendation from the Plan Commission to amend the Sign Ordinance to add "Portable Sidewalk Signs" as a conditional sign in the Business Districts. While generally in agreement with allowing portable sidewalk signs, the Board was concerned about two aspects of the Plan Commission recommendation. The Board did not want to require conditional sign approval and the Board wants to allow changeable copy on the signs. As a result, the Board remanded this matter to the Plan Commission for further consideration.

The Plan Commission re-considered this matter on July 16, 2012. In response to the Board's direction, the consensus of the Plan Commission was as follows:

- The Commission agreed that changeable copy signs should be allowed but with limitations. Changeable copy signs that are designed for that purpose, such as chalkboard signs, are acceptable. However, changeable copy signs that are handwritten on poster board not intended for such purposes should not be allowed and signs with changeable plastic letters may not always be appropriate depending on their design and quality.
- The Commission does not want to allow plastic signs of any type such as those now commonly used in County Line Square and has added a condition that all portable sidewalk signs are made from wood or metal.

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• The Commission remains concerned that allowing such signs without public review of the final design of the sign type may result in undesirable signs of low quality. Thus, the Commission continues to recommend that these signs be classified as conditional signs which will allow the Village to review the design of sign structure. The intent is that each property owner, not each business, presents an array of sign structure types that would be approved by the Village for general use throughout a shopping center. It is not intended that each individual tenant would have to present their sign(s) to the Plan Commission and Board for approval.

Based on the above considerations, the Plan Commission, by a vote of 7 to 0, recommends approval of an amendment to Sections 55.02 and 55.06 of the Sign Ordinance as follows:

55.02 Definitions

T. Portable Sidewalk Sign: A sign made of a rigid material (i.e. not a banner, placard or pennant), not attached to the ground or a building, and easily carried and moved by one person.

55.06 Business District Signs

- B. Conditional Signs
 - 8. Portable Sidewalk Signs:
 - a. The sign structure shall not exceed 4 feet in height and 9 square feet in area.
 - b. The sign copy shall not exceed 4.5 square feet in area.
 - c. One sign per storefront is permitted. Additional signs may be used for shopping center event signs provided the total number of signs in a shopping center does not exceed one per storefront.
 - d. Storefront signs shall only be displayed during business hours and shall be removed at any time the business is not open.
 - e. The sign shall not interfere with any pedestrian area or block necessary sight lines for pedestrians or vehicles.

Under no circumstances shall a sign cause the sidewalk to be less than 4 feet in usable width.

- f. Sign shall be of sufficient weight or design to prevent its movement in the wind.
- g. Changeable copy on the sign shall be permitted provided the sign is designed to accommodate changeable copy (for example, chalk board signs). Changeable copy signs using individual plastic letters are generally discouraged.
- h. The sign structure shall be metal or wood. Plastic A-frame signs are not permitted.







Dear Mayor and Board of Trustees:

The Plan Commission transmits for your consideration its recommendation to approve an amendment to Section IV.I of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to add Outdoor Kitchens as a permitted accessory structure in residential districts and to create appropriate regulations for Outdoor Kitchens.

After due notice, as required by law, the Plan Commission held a public hearing on this matter on August 6, 2012. Construction of outdoor kitchens in residential back yards has become a common feature of many homes in Burr Ridge. In response, the Plan Commission believes that the Village should create a separate category of regulations for outdoor kitchens in the Accessory Structures section of the Zoning Ordinance. The regulations recommended herein were developed with input from residents and from a contractor who has built outdoor kitchens in Burr Ridge.

Accordingly, the Plan Commission, by a vote of 7 to 0, recommends that the following be added to Section IV.I of the Zoning Ordinance:

38. Kitchens, Outdoor

Outdoor kitchens (typically being a masonry structure with a cook top and oven, plumbing, cabinet storage areas, and counter top) may be located in the rear buildable area and are also permitted in the required rear yard of a residential property subject to the following:

a. Outdoor kitchens must be a minimum of 10 feet from the rear lot line and not closer than the required side yard setback to the interior side yard.

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- b. Any cooking unit or fireplace included in an outdoor kitchen must be a minimum of 10 feet from the principal building and all accessory buildings.
- c. Outdoor kitchens may not exceed 5 feet in height and 60 square feet in area except that a chimney provided for a stove or fireplace may extend to 15 feet in height.


