6. ORDINANCES

A. <u>Annex Property (Compass – 15W580 North Frontage Road)</u>

At the request of the property owner, this item was tabled from the September 10 Board meeting. The property owner requested time to submit petitions for annexation and zoning and proposed to enter into an Annexation Agreement with the Village. The property owner has submitted necessary paper work for annexation and zoning. The zoning hearing may be scheduled for the October 15 Plan Commission meeting.

The attorney for the property owner also has submitted a letter describing a broad outline of the terms of an annexation agreement. Those terms include:

- The truck driving school would be eliminated on or before May 1, 2013.
- The gravel parking lot would be re-surfaced with crushed asphalt to reduce the amount of dust and noise from trucks.
- The truck driving school uses the back lot on Mondays and Wednesdays from 5 pm to 8 pm. They would "endeavor to eliminate any outside lot use after 5 pm."
- They will pursue an alternate route for training and testing on area streets.
- They would seek a variation from the required 30 foot landscaping buffer on the north end of the property but would agree to effectively landscaping the area to meet the intent of the code.

If the Board agrees not to force annex the property, the property owner will proceed with the petitions for annexation and zoning and a draft annexation agreement will be prepared for consideration by the Board of Trustees. If the Board approves the attached Ordinance annexing the property, the property owner will be immediately notified that the school is in violation of the Zoning Ordinance and will either have to cease operation or pursue zoning approval for the truck driving school.

7. **RESOLUTIONS**

A. <u>Resolution of Appreciation for Tuthill Stormwater Award</u>

The Burr Ridge Stormwater Committee has long been an advocate of private investment in the stormwater systems in Burr Ridge. Our community has over 100 detention basins, as well as many miles of streams, rivers, and regulated floodplain. The vast majority of these systems are under the ownership and maintenance of private parties; primarily homeowners, businesses, and homeowners associations. In this regard, the Village wishes to acknowledge and commend those parties who improve a portion of the storm water system on their property, which serves not only the benefit of the immediate property owners, but the larger community as well.

The Tuthill Corporation and the Madison Club subdivision were built independently in 1998, surrounding existing wetland ponds. In 2010, representatives of the Tuthill Corporation contacted the Village regarding alternatives for sediment removal, in order to increase the depth of the pond and improve water quality. Tuthill has partnered with the Madison Club subdivision to provide funding for the removal of sediment using vacuum extraction methods. The project commenced in summer, 2011, and has continued through 2012. This project is an excellent example of coordination between neighboring property owners, and will result in improved water quality for this site, which is one of the most visible water bodies in Burr Ridge.

The Stormwater Committee wishes to congratulate the Tuthill Corporation for undertaking this project, and to present them with a "Pond and Stream Beautification Award". This project will be acknowledged by a notation on a plaque in the Village Hall foyer, and by a granite award marker at the site. Congratulations!

8. CONSIDERATIONS

A. <u>FY 2011-12 Audit</u>

Enclosed separately please find the FY 2011-12 Audit. Dan Berg, firm partner with our auditors, Sikich, will be in attendance on Monday evening to make a brief presentation on the audit and to answer any questions the Trustees might have.

It is our recommendation: that the FY 2011-12 Audit be received and filed.

B. <u>County Line Road Bridge Enhancement – Final Engrg Design Plans</u>

Our consultant, Tim King, of Hitchcock Design Group, will present final engineering and landscape design plans, as well as revised final cost

estimates associated with the County Line Road Bridge over I-55 Enhancement Project (see attached). The State has now approved all of the revised design concepts concerning the railing and interior form liner (brick design on the interior of the proposed wall). Unfortunately, at this time, the IDOT Design Bureau has not approved the BR logo on the center panel. However, they have indicated that they would approve the leaf attachments that were previously discussed for this location. It is our intention to continue to pursue the approval of the BR logo sign and to meet with the IDOT officials in Springfield to lobby for approval.

The original budget for this project was as follows:

As far as landscaping is concerned, Hitchcock Design Group solicited quotes from three landscape companies. So far, we have received two quotes as follows:

Landworks \$16,700

Clarence David \$18,500 - \$20,000

For budget purposes, we are still using \$20,000 per year. Assuming a 2% annual increase in landscape maintenance costs, the increase would be approximately \$400 per year.

In addition, over time, just like along County Line Road, there will be a need to replace plants and to perform a comprehensive cleanup of the existing woody material within the infield area. Based upon past experience, we anticipate an additional estimated \$5,000 every three years or so to replace plants and an additional \$5,000 every five years to perform a comprehensive cleanup of the larger infield area.

Once again, it should be made clear that 100% of the maintenance costs will be paid for through the use of Hotel/Motel taxes. In response to a concern raised by Trustee Manieri, the Hotel Marketing Committee has agreed to set aside an additional \$15,000 per year for the next five years to cover the cost of unforeseen maintenance. In summary, the cost estimates for the project are currently well below the grant amount. The project is currently scheduled to be awarded in the fall of 2013, with construction to begin in early 2014. Attached for your information are letters of support for the project from the Burr Ridge Hotel Marketing Committee, the Burr Ridge Restaurant Marketing Committee and the Willowbrook/Burr Ridge Chamber of Commerce.

It is our recommendation: that the final engineering/landscape design plans and cost estimates for the County Line Road Bridge over I-55 Enhancement project be approved.

C. <u>Contract for Supplemental Engineering Services</u>

The Village has been awarded grant funds for the construction of a traffic signal at Madison Street and North Frontage Road. The Village has secured additional funding from DuPage County and IDOT toward the project, (including construction engineering) and construction commenced in Spring, 2012. Construction is now substantially complete and the project is in the punch-list reconciliation phase.

During the course of construction, the engineering scope expanded to allow for extension of the improvement all the way to Brush Hill Road. This work was initially omitted because of cost concerns, but was added following the receipt of very favorable construction pricing. Even with the extension of the improvement, the work is well under budget, and all local match costs, including engineering costs, will still be provided from ancillary sources (IDOT contributions, DuDOT contributions, and developer donations).

No General Fund contributions will be required for the local match for construction, or for the Phase III Engineering services, as amended.

It is our recommendation: that the Phase III Engineering Services supplement to HDR Engineering in the amount of \$7,055.27 be approved.

D. <u>Contract for Tree Inventory (Emerald Ash Borer Grant)</u>

The Village of Burr Ridge has been awarded a \$20,000 EAB Technical Assistance Grant through the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus; the EAB Technical Assistance grant will allow for the development of a complete "stem-by-stem" tree inventory of all trees in the Village (not just Ash trees), and for the preparation of a formal EAB Management Program. The FY 2012-13 Budget includes \$23,500 for this work, \$20,000 of which will be reimbursed through the grant.

The inventory will identify exact GPS coordinates of each tree, as well as data specific to each tree including: species/subspecies, diameter, location, overhead conflicts, and a health/condition assessment. This data will allow Burr Ridge to manage our treatment program more efficiently, and to respond quickly and effectively to future diseases and infestations. Also, the inventory will allow us to ensure that annual planting programs continue to establish a

healthier, more sustainable and diverse urban forest. The data from the inventory will be used to prepare a detailed EAB management plan, which will serve as a guide for future management of the infestation in Burr Ridge and which will ensure that the Village's EAB management is operationally successful and cost effective.

The Village received proposals from four qualified vendors as follows:

Following review of the proposals, Public Works Director Paul May and Village Arborist Gary Gatlin scheduled interviews with the two lowest cost consultants, Natural Path Urban Forestry Consultants and Christopher B. Burke Engineering. Based upon the presentations, interviews and written proposal documents, the Department of Public Works has determined that Natural Path Urban Forestry Consultants is best qualified to perform the work.

The inventory work is scheduled to commence in October, followed by preparation of the EAB Management Plan in January. The inventory and plan will be completed by the end of January 2013, so that a presentation can be made to the Village Board and the FY 2013-14 Budget can be prepared accordingly.

It is our recommendation: that the contract for the Tree Inventory & Preparation of an EAB Management Plan be awarded to Natural Path Urban Forestry Consultants in an amount not to exceed \$23,050.

E. Raffle License/Hosting Facility License (Chicago Canine Club)

Enclosed is an application from The Chicago Canine Club to conduct a raffle on October 28, 2012, as part of their Open House event, as well as a letter requesting waiver of the fidelity bond requirement. Raffle tickets will be on sale the day of the event between the hours of 1:00 and 4:00 p.m. Also enclosed is a letter from The Chicago Canine Club requesting that they be issued a hosting facility license to allow them to hold this event at their location.

It is our recommendation: that a Raffle and Chance License and a Hosting Facility License be issued to The Chicago Canine Club, with the fidelity bond waived, for its October 28 raffle.

F. <u>Proclamation – Illinois Arts & Humanities Month</u>

Attached please find a letter from the Illinois Humanities Council and the Illinois Arts Council announcing the 5th Annual Illinois Arts & Humanities Month (AH!) taking place this October. Ah! Month is a statewide celebration encouraging citizens to establish, deepen and expand their relationships with

the arts and humanities. To this end, they are asking communities to issue a Proclamation designating October as "Illinois Arts and Humanities Month" (see attached) and to encourage resident involvement in the many activities planned for the month. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u> The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Trustees of September 10, 2012 was held in the Training Room of the Burr Ridge Police Department, 7700 County Line Road, Burr Ridge, Illinois and called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Grasso.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted by Molly Gricus of Gower West School.

ROLL CALL was taken by the Village Clerk and the results denoted the following present: Trustees Wott, Paveza, Sodikoff, Ruzak, Grela, and Mayor Grasso. Absent was Trustee Manieri. Also present were Village Administrator Steve Stricker, Assistant Village Administrator Lisa Scheiner, Public Works Director Paul May, Police Chief John Madden, Deputy Chief Tim Vaclav, Community Development Director Doug Pollock, Finance Director Jerry Sapp, and Village Clerk Karen Thomas.

There being a quorum, the meeting was open to official business.

AUDIENCE There were none at this time.

PRESENTATION BY DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE EMPLOYER SUPPORT OF THE NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVE <u>"PATRIOTS AWARD"</u> TO CHIEF JOHN MADDEN AND DEPUTY CHIEF TIM VACLAV

George Graves of the Employer Support of the National Guard and Reserve Committee presented Chief John Madden and Deputy Chief Tim Vaclav with the "Patriots Award" for their support of the Guard and Reserve members.

CONSIDERATION OF AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE VILLAGE OF BURR RIDGE (COMPASS) (15W580 NORTH FRONTAGE ROAD BURR

<u>RIDGE, IL</u>) Village Administrator Steve Stricker reported that the Ordinance Annexing the Compass property has been prepared and the appropriate notices have been given.

Community Development Director Doug Pollock explained that the Ordinance was prepared in response to a request from the property owner to DuPage County requesting zoning approval for a truck driving school on the property. At the August 13, 2012 meeting, the Board directed staff to prepare the Ordinance and to initiate the forced annexation of the property to ensure the County did not approve the zoning for the truck driving school.

Mr. Pollock explained that following notification of annexation, the attorney for the property owner requested that the Village enter into an Annexation Agreement with the property owner. He added

that staff requested that the County Zoning Request be withdrawn, which has been done, and staff has received a confirmation of this action from DuPage County.

Upon talking with the petitioner's attorney, Mr. Pollock informed him of the Village's concern regarding the truck driving school at the location due to the proximity of the business to residential homes and the noise level. Mr. Pollock added the Village has received resident complaints regarding the noise.

Mr. Pollock also noted that the property is not in compliance with the Village Sign Ordinance and Zoning, with regard to landscaping adjacent to the residential properties.

Mr. Pollock explained that if the Board chooses to proceed with a forced annexation, the property owner would be immediately informed of the following Village Zoning requirements:

- The truck driving school is not a legal use of the property and must either cease operation or petition the Village for zoning approval;
- A 30 foot landscaping buffer adjacent to the residential properties must be installed within nine months after annexation unless zoning relief is sought;
- The truck sales business is legally established in DuPage County and would be allowed to continue but no alterations to the buildings or structures would be permitted without rezoning of the property or bringing the property in conformance with the Zoning Ordinance.

Mr. Pollock concluded stating the property owner has requested a continuance and has filed a petition for Annexation and Zoning, which is currently incomplete, but has also paid the required fees. If the Annexation Agreement is acceptable to the Board and the continuation is granted, a Plan Commission Public Hearing could be scheduled for October 15, 2012. He added that the other alternative for the Board would be to force annex the property still allowing the property owner to proceed with the request for zoning approval.

Trustee Grela asked if truck driving schools are allowed in any of the Village Zoning Districts and Mr. Pollock confirmed they are not allowed.

Trustee Paveza requested clarification on the timing of the continuation request. In response, Mr. Pollock explained that the petition would be continued to the Board Meeting of September 24, 2012. If at that time, the Annexation and Zoning Petitions are not complete, the forced annexation could proceed to avoid the potential for continued delays.

In response to Trustee Sodikoff's inquiry as to when the property would be considered to be annexed to the Village if the Ordinance is passed at this Board Meeting, Mr. Pollock stated the property would be considered annexed to the Village this evening if the Ordinance is passed.

Trustee Ruzak inquired about the advantage of a forced annexation versus the annexation agreement with regard to the terms being requested by the property owner. Mr. Pollock replied that staff is

not certain of the terms at this point and intends to negotiate the termination of the truck driving school.

Trustee Wott asked if the truck driving school would have to cease operations if the property were force annexed. Mr. Pollock explained that it would not have to cease immediately but the property owner would have to petition the Plan Commission for the appropriate zoning and special use for the school. He explained that to force the truck driving school to cease operating, legal action would have to be taken and the court would not consider the case without the administrative process of a Plan Commission public hearing.

In response to Trustee Grela's inquiry regarding the process involved with a business operating in an inappropriate zoning district, Mr. Pollock explained that the Village would initially send a notification letter to the business requesting them to cease operations and if they did not, the Village would have to take legal action.

Trustee Wott stated she does not feel the Village benefits by extending the annexation.

Mayor Grasso added that Compass Truck Sales has been operating for some time without any issues and the only complaint is the initiation of the truck driving school.

Timothy Dwyer, Attorney for Compass Truck, stated Compass would like to work with the Village to secure the appropriate zoning for their truck sales business and requests additional time for the process.

Trustee Grela expressed his desire to force annex the property immediately with restrictive zoning of R-1 along with the filing of a zoning petition to allow the business to operate in that location.

Trustee Paveza stated he would be willing to allow a continuance of two to four weeks and asked Mr. Dwyer how much time would be required to file the appropriate annexation documents. Mr. Dwyer stated the documents would be filed within two weeks. Mr. Dwyer added that with cooperation, he feels the truck driving school can be relocated sooner.

Mayor Grasso added that there is no objection to the truck sales business but the complaint is the proximity of the truck driving school to the residences. Mayor Grasso asked if part of the cooperation with the Village includes the relocation of the truck driving school. In response, Mr. Dwyer indicated the classroom portion of the driving school may remain for a longer time period and the driving portion of the school would be relocated sooner.

Trustee Wott asked for details on the operation of the Compass Truck Driving School. In response, Mario Magliano of Compass Truck Driving School, explained that the program consists of a four to six week program with new students beginning weekly and in addition, the Secretary of State's office

comes to the facility each Friday to conduct testing. He noted there is a classroom portion of the school in addition to a driving portion.

Trustee Paveza indicated he would prefer that the property be annexed through agreement rather than force annexed.

<u>Motion</u> was made by Trustee Paveza and seconded by Trustee Ruzak to allow Compass Truck Company 30 days to submit the Annexation documents to the Village and if the documents are not submitted, force annex the property at the October 8, 2012 Board Meeting.

Mr. Pollock discussed timing in relation to submission of the Annexation documents and the Plan Commission schedule for the Public Hearing noting that the next available date is October 15, 2012 with a submission deadline for legal notice of September 24, 2012.

Mr. Stricker added that a meeting would be scheduled with Mr. Dwyer and Compass Truck Company to define specifics regarding the relocation of the truck driving school and the results of the meeting would be reported to the Board on September 24th at which time the forced annexation could proceed if deemed appropriate.

Motion was amended by Trustee Paveza and seconded by Trustee Ruzak to continue this item to the Board Meeting of September 24, 2012.

Trustee Sodikoff inquired about possible actions to ensure there are not significant delays in the process of moving the annexation forward, as has occurred in the past. Village Administrator Steve Stricker responded that the Village has the ability to force annex the property at any time.

Mayor Grasso requested confirmation that Compass Truck would not file the zoning petition again with DuPage County for the truck driving school within the next 90 days and in response, Mr. Dwyer indicated it would not be filed again.

ABSENT: 1 – Trustee Manieri

There being four affirmative votes, the motion carried.

Trustee Grela stated for the record that he was planning to make a motion to force annex the property at this meeting.

Mayor Grasso reiterated the requirements for Compass Truck as follows:

• The appropriate paperwork for Annexation and Zoning must be submitted to the Village by September 24, 2012;

- The zoning petition will be presented to the Plan Commission at the October 15, 2012 Meeting;
- If the paperwork is not submitted by the September 24, 2012 Board Meeting, the option to force annex is still available to the Board.

<u>UPDATE ON GENERAL FUND FINANCIAL OPERATIONS – FY 11 – 12 (UNAUDITED</u> <u>AND FY 12 – 13 1ST QUARTER)</u> Village Administrator Steve Stricker stated this presentation is in anticipation of the auditor's presentation at the September 24, 2012 Board meeting.

Mr. Stricker displayed a slide of the General Fund Summary of Operations highlighting the Revenues and Expenditures and noting that the reserves were increased by a surplus of \$541,334. Mr. Stricker attributed the increase in surplus over budget to decreased expenditures and increased revenues, especially in the area of sales tax revenue.

Mr. Stricker reported a surplus for both Water and Sewer Funds.

In the area of the Hotel / Motel Marketing Fund, he noted that the surplus of \$89,229 is higher than expected due to additional revenues with a total available of \$239,295.

PRESENTATION OF POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT Police Chief John Madden presented the FY 2011 – 2012 Report for the Police Department. Mr. Madden highlighted the following statistics in comparison to FY 2010 - 2011

- 11% decrease in service calls;
- 19% decrease in serious crimes, Part I Offenses (Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Theft, MV Theft, and Arson);
- 5% decrease in Part II Offenses (Forgery, Vandalism, Sex Offenses, Prostitution, Drug Abuse, Disorderly Conduct, and Gambling).

Mr. Madden noted a total of 4,687 traffic stops were recorded.

Mr. Madden attributed decreases to staffing due to an open position, officer retirement, an officer out for training, and officer absence due to disability. Mr. Madden added that two recruits have been hired and one has graduated from the Police Academy and the other will graduate in two weeks. Staffing will be short by one officer due to the deployment of Office Gutierrez.

Mr. Madden discussed the statistics for traffic stops in Burr Ridge and the analysis of the outcomes as related to racial profiling as required by the State of Illinois. He also highlighted efforts in the areas of traffic enforcement, DUI arrests, D.A.R.E. instruction, Community Policing, Police Facility Training, and CALEA reaccreditation scheduled for July of 2013.

Mayor Grasso inquired about the heroin issue in DuPage County and how it is being addressed in Burr Ridge. In response, Mr. Madden stated he is a member of the Executive Board of the DuPage Chiefs of Police and at the recent symposium, it was stated there were 35 heroin deaths in DuPage

County of which three or four adult deaths occurred in Burr Ridge. Mr. Madden stated the situation is being monitored and the reason heroin is popular is because it is inexpensive and available from the west side of Chicago.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS There were none at this time.

<u>AUDIENCE</u> There were none at this time.

<u>REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM VILLAGE OFFICIALS</u> Trustee Wott stated several residents have reported that the asphalt sidewalk bordering the Ambriance! Subdivision is buckled and would like notification sent to the Homeowner's Association to repair it.

Trustee Grela noted there is interference in broadcast on cable channel 6.

Mayor Grasso expressed his thoughts on the passing of Village of Lombard Mayor Bill Mueller due to West Nile Virus.

Mayor Grasso discussed the NBC 5 presentation coordinated by Assistant Village Administrator Lisa Scheiner with regard to the Village Donation Program.

Mayor Grasso read an announcement from St. Mark's Coptic Church regarding their Taste of Egypt festival on September 15th and 16th.

Mayor Grasso discussed the undertaking of resident Mickey Straub to visit 50 capitals prior to the November election to increase awareness of Lincoln and the Gettysburg address.

Mayor Grasso noted there are some areas of traffic concern in the Village that Public Works Director Paul May is in the process of addressing with Cook County; specifically, the northbound left turn lane at County Line and Plainfield Roads, 79th and County Line Road, and the Frontage Road heading toward Loyola.

Mayor Grasso announced that Trustee Paveza will become a member of the Men's Senior Baseball Hall of Fame.

ADJOURNMENT Motion was made by Trustee Wott and seconded by Trustee Ruzak that the Regular Meeting of September 10, 2012 be adjourned to Closed Session to discuss Approval of Closed Session Minutes of July 9, 2012 and Collective Bargaining.

Dear Steve:

On behalf of my clients, I want to thank you and Doug for the meeting Friday. We understand the position of the Village, and would like to cooperate. At the same time, we hope that the Village will understand the issues facing us and work with us to facilitate a phase-out of the driving school. This is a commercial operation with numerous layers. The school is regulated by the Illinois Secretary of State's Office and must act in accordance with directions from that office.

Compass understands that the Village would like to see the truck driving school use eliminated as soon as possible. My client will endeavor to accomplish that goal, and has been actively seeking an alternative site. Please understand that any different location must also be approved by the Illinois Secretary of State's Office. While both the Village and Compass would like that to happen sooner rather than later, we are requesting a drop dead date in an annexation agreement of May 1, 2013 to relocate the school. Again, I need to reiterate that it remains our goal to relocate much sooner than that; however, there are too many regulatory approvals and ongoing concerns to firmly promise elimination of the school in any shorter timeframe.

In the interim, Compass would seek to mitigate some of the effects by paving the stone base of the lot with crushed asphalt. This will virtually eradicate any dust and substantially reduce the noise levels of trucks banging on potholes, etc. Presently, the school operates in the yard from 5-8 on Mondays and Wednesdays. We would endeavor to eliminate any outside lot use after 5:00. This will entail some logistical juggling, and may not be entirely feasible given some of our student's limitations with respect to their schedules. However, we will make our best efforts to eliminate any lot traffic after 5:00 p.m. The Village has also complained about the existing route where our students are training in the vehicles. Please understand that this route was delineated by the Secretary of State's Office. Staff has requested that the route be changed and attached please find a letter from Compass to the Secretary of State requesting that change. We will, of course, keep the Village apprised of any response tendered by the Secretary of State. Should these mitigating factors coupled with the drop-dead date be acceptable, we would anticipate an annexation agreement with our property having a general industrial classification under the Village Zoning Code. We would petition for a special use for truck sales, leasing and repair, and we would request a variance on the buffer zone. Pursuant to a tentative agreement with staff, the right-of-way ("row"), for 75th Street would serve as a buffer, with the dead trees being removed and evergreens being planted. This landscape plan would be subject to Village approval. The existing signage would constitute a legal, non-confirming use, and could not be changed or otherwise altered without the Village approval.

In conclusion, then, the proposed annexation agreement would entail a zoning classification of general industrial with a special use for truck sales, leasing and repair. The agreement would also memorialize the variance regarding a buffer, again subject to endorsement by the Village and its arborist. The annexation agreement would also include the mitigating factor herein (i.e., placement of crushed asphalt, limitation of nighttime hours and a request to the Secretary of State for an alternative route to the west and from the Village). It may well be that we could have these mitigation controls in place well before the annexation agreement is complete. The agreement would also give Compass the School until May 1, 2012 to eliminate its truck school use, with the written understanding that Compass will endeavor to do everything in its power to expedite the closing date of the trucking school.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE VILLAGE OF BURR RIDGE (COMPASS) (15w580 North Frontage Road, Burr Ridge, Il.)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7-1-13 of the Illinois Municipal Code, the Village of Burr Ridge has the authority to annex property surrounded by the Village, which is less than 60 acres in size; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7-1-13 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/7-1-13), notice of the contemplated annexation was published in the Suburban Life Publications, a newspaper of general circulation in the territory hereinafter described, on August 24, 2012; said date being at least ten (10) days prior to passage of this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, notice of the contemplated annexation was also personally delivered, and sent by certified mail to each taxpayer of record in the territory hereinafter described on August 23, 2012; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Village of Burr Ridge that said territory be annexed to and become part of the Village.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois:

SECTION 1: That the findings set forth above are incorporated by reference into this Section 1 as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: That this President and Board of Trustees further find as follows:

(a) The territory described in Section 3 of this Ordinance contains less than sixty (60) acres and is wholly bounded by the Village of Burr Ridge.

(b) Such territory is not within the corporate limits of any municipality, but is contiguous to the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, a municipality existing under the laws of the State of Illinois.

(c) The Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, does not provide fire protection service, nor public library service.

(d) Notice that the corporate authorities of the Village of Burr Ridge are contemplating the annexation of such territory has been publis hed not less than ten (10) days prior to passage of this Ordinance as required by Section 7-1-13 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/7-1-13).

SECTION 3: That the territory legally described as follows:

LOT 2 IN FRONTAGE ROAD ASSESSMENT PLAT OF PART OF THE WEST ¹/₂ OF SECTION 25, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 11 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED ON FEBRUARY 1, 1979, AS DOCUMENT #R79-12368 IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

be and the same is hereby annexed to the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, all in conformance with and as shown on a plat and map of annexation of said territory prepared by a registered land surveyor of the State of Illinois, attached hereto and made a part hereof as **EXHIBIT A**.

The Burr Ridge Stormwater Committee has long been an advocate of private investment in the stormwater systems in Burr Ridge. Our community has over 100 detention basins, as well as many miles of streams, rivers, and regulated floodplain. The vast majority of these systems are under the ownership and maintenance of private parties; primarily homeowners, businesses, and homeowners associations. In this regard, the Village wishes to acknowledge and commend those parties who improve a portion of the storm water system on their property, which serves not only the benefit of the immediate property owners, but the larger community as well.

The Tuthill Corporation and the Madison Club subdivision were built independently in 1998, surrounding existing wetland ponds. In 2010, representatives of the Tuthill Corporation contacted the Village regarding alternatives for sediment removal, in order to increase the depth of the pond and improve water quality. Tuthill has partnered with the Madison Club subdivision to provide funding for the removal of sediment using vacuum extraction methods. The project commenced in summer, 2011, and has continued through 2012. This project is an excellent example of coordination between neighboring property owners, and will result in improved water quality for this site, which is one of the most visible water bodies in Burr Ridge.

The Stormwater Committee wishes to congratulate the Tuthill Corporation for undertaking this project, and to present them with a "Pond and Stream Beautification Award". This project will be acknowledged by a notation on a plaque in the Village Hall foyer, and by a granite award marker at the site. Congratulations!

It is our understanding that the Village Board will once again discuss the County Line Road Bridge Enhancement Project at its September 24 meeting. As you are aware, the Hotel Marketing Committee has been and continues to be in full support of this project, as it represents an unparalleled opportunity to highlight the entrance to Burr Ridge. From a marketing standpoint, it will be an invaluable way to create awareness of Burr Ridge and its many fine hotels, restaurants and shops.

The Committee acknowledges the fact that once the project is built as designed, there will be ongoing maintenance costs for both the landscaping and hard scape features. To this end, we believe that there will be sufficient dollars available in the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund to properly maintain the landscaping on an ongoing basis. The Committee will support setting aside \$15,000 per year in annual revenues for the next five years to ensure adequate funding for potential emergency and/or long-term maintenance needs.

Your approval of this important project will be greatly appreciated.
