A. Special Use (15W455 79th Street - St. Mark Church)

B. <u>Variations – (15W455 79th Street – St. Mark Church)</u>

Attached are the Ordinances approving the addition to the St. Mark Coptic Orthodox Church at 79th Street and Garfield Avenue. The first Ordinance grants special use approval and the second Ordinance approves the variations for the parking lot and building height. The conditions in both Ordinances are the same and reflect the conditions directed by the Village Board at the November 11 meeting. Those conditions include elimination of the driveway to Garfield Avenue and staff review and approval of the final landscaping plan.

It is our recommendation: that the Ordinance be approved.

C. Amend Zoning Ordinance - Medical Cannabis Dispensing Facilities

Attached is an Ordinance amending the Zoning Ordinance to add medical cannabis dispensing facilities to the list of special uses in the GI District. This amendment is mandated by recently approved state legislation which requires municipalities to accommodate medical cannabis facilities consistent with the state law. The Plan Commission recommended approval of this amendment and the Board, at its November 11 meeting, directed staff to prepare this Ordinance.

B. Salary of Elected Officials

At the November 11 Board meeting, Trustee Guy Franzese asked that this item be placed on the agenda. Compensation for elected officials was last changed by Ordinance on May 12, 2008, which went into effect in May 2009 for the Mayor and three Trustees and in May 2011 for the remaining three Trustees:

POSITION	PRIOR TO MAY 2009	CHANGE IN COMPENSATION
Mayor/Liquor Commissioner	\$1,200	\$6,000
Village Clerk	\$4,800	No change
Trustee	\$ 0	\$3,000

Compensation for elected officials can be changed by Ordinance if done 180 days prior to the beginning of the term of office of those officials whose compensation is to be changed. With this in mind, changes to the compensation for elected officials who begin their term on May 1, 2015, must be made by the end of October 2014. The compensation for three Trustees whose terms end in 2017 would not be affected until that time.

According to Village Attorney Scott Uhler, compensation for an elected official cannot be legally increased or decreased during the term of office for that official. Whatever the elected official chooses to do with the funds is up to the discretion of that elected official, but the compensation cannot be changed. In addition, the elected official cannot refuse to accept the compensation. They can donate the compensation back to the Village or to any other organization, but they will still receive a 1099 form as if they received the compensation (see attached memo).

Also attached please find an updated Compensation Survey of elected officials conducted by the DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference in 2012.

Board direction is requested.

D. <u>Table Consideration of Space Needs Committee Recommendation re Village Hall Renovation Project</u>

Since we have not received revised pricing from the contractor that was requested by the Village Board at its November 18 Special Workshop, it is my recommendation that the issue of the renovation of the Village Hall Offices and Public Spaces be tabled to December 9.

D. Raffle License (St. Alphonsus/St. Patrick School)/Hosting Facility License (Chicago Marriott Southwest at Burr Ridge)

Enclosed is an application from the St. Alphonsus/St. Patrick School to conduct a raffle on February 22, 2014, as part of their Gala fundraising event, as well as a letter requesting waiver of the fidelity bond requirement. Ticket

sales will be conducted between December 5, 2013 and February 21, 2014; no ticket sales will take place at the event on February 22, only the drawing for prizes. Also enclosed is a letter from the Chicago Marriott Southwest at Burr Ridge requesting that they be issued a hosting facility license to allow them to hold this event at their location.

It is our recommendation: that a Raffle and Chance License be issued to the St. Alphonsus/St. Patrick School for its February 22 raffle, with the fidelity bond waived, and that the Chicago Marriott Southwest at Burr Ridge be licensed to host the event.

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u> The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Trustees of November 11, 2013 was held in the Meeting Room of the Village Hall, 7660 County Line Road, Burr Ridge, Illinois and called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Straub.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted by Alyssa Lim of Elm School.

ROLL CALL was taken by the Village Clerk and the results denoted the following present: Trustees Paveza, Ruzak, Franzese, Bolos, Grasso, Manieri, and Mayor Straub. Also present were Village Administrator Steve Stricker, Public Works Director Paul May, Community Development Director Doug Pollock, Police Chief John Madden, Deputy Police Chief Marc Loftus, Finance Director Jerry Sapp, and Village Clerk Karen Thomas. There being a quorum, the meeting was open to official business.

<u>AUDIENCE</u> Connie Markiewicz, 61 Pine Tree, discussed concerns that were raised at the Plan Commission Public Hearing with regard to the St. Mark Coptic Church expansion and emphasized their importance to the residents of Pine Tree Subdivision.

CONSIDERATION OF PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE SPECIAL USE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BUILDING ADDITION TO A CHURCH AND THE EXPANSION OF THE PARKING LOT AND WITH AN OUTDOOR PLAYGROUND, OUTDOOR CLASSROOM AND OUTDOOR KITCHEN AND GAZEBO; A VARIATION FROM SECTION VI.F.5.b OF SAID ZONING ORDINANCE TO ALLOW SECTIONS OF THE BUILDING ADDITION TO EXCEED THE 45-FOOT MAXIMUM PERMITTED HEIGHT FOR NON-RESIDENTIAL USES; A VARIATION FROM SECTION XI.C.8.a OF SAID ZONING ORDINANCE TO ALLOW PARKING TO BE LOCATED IN A FRONT BUILDABLE AREA RATHER THAN IN THE SIDE OR REAR BUILDABLE AREA OF THE LOT; AND A VARIATION FROM SECTION XI.C.11a(2)(a) OF SAID ZONING ORDINANCE TO ALLOW A LIMITED

NUMBER OF PARKING SPACES TO ENCROACH INTO THE REQUIRED 30-FOOT SETBACK FROM THE WEST PROPERTY LINE (Z-22-2013: 15W455 79TH STREET – ST. MARK COPTIC CHURCH) Community Development Director Doug Pollock stated that the Plan Commission recommends approval of the special use and variations requested for this petition. Mr. Pollock explained that at the Plan Commission Public Hearing, neighbors expressed concern for the following:

- increased traffic due to the proposed additional driveway access on Garfield Avenue;
- existing Stormwater drainage problems on the property;
- the proposed additional building height;
- landscaping on the perimeter of the property.

Mr. Pollock added that the Plan Commission suggested the driveway access to Garfield Avenue be restricted to an emergency access driveway only that would be constructed with a gate and grass pavers. Upon later discussion with the Tri-State Fire District, Mr. Pollock reported that staff was informed that grass pavers are not adequate for the Fire District's use for emergency access.

Mr. Pollock noted that the Church submitted a response to the Plan Commission recommendation stating they would like to eliminate the driveway on Garfield along with the suggested sidewalk; they will maintain the existing hedge and provide additional landscaping on the south property line; they would like to maintain the height of the bell tower; and they will work with the Village and Pine Tree Subdivision regarding the Stormwater problem.

Trustee Ruzak inquired about the buffer zone and Mr. Pollock responded that there would be berms and landscaping along Garfield. Mr. Pollock also discussed a plan that was submitted after the Plan Commission meeting which includes a turnaround for the emergency vehicles. Mr. Pollock explained that the turnaround would not be needed as there is sufficient space in the parking area to accommodate a fire truck. He added that the driveway width could be increased to 33 feet wide to allow a fire truck to turn around, which may require the elimination of two parking spaces.

Trustee Franzese inquired about equipment screening and Mr. Pollock responded the screening would be addressed in the final landscaping plan.

Naveen Michael, St. Mark Church member, explained that the expansion of the church is to accommodate the growing needs of the church.

Awad Eskander, Project Architect with Paradigm Consulting, provided a slide display of the project and described the proposed development. Mr. Eskander emphasized that the proposed driveway and sidewalk on Garfield would be eliminated and the bell tower height as proposed would remain since it is the same height as the existing tower and in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance.

Jamil Bou-Saab, of Terra Engineering, discussed the proposed parking lot and Stormwater modifications.

Bill Schmidt, Terra Engineering Landscape Engineer, discussed the existing landscaping at the facility and the proposed modifications to the landscaping to provide screening for the neighboring residents.

There were questions regarding screening and berm height and in response, Mr. Schmidt added that the final topography is not yet available but the berm height along 79th Street would be approximately four feet and additional screening is planned for the parking lot area as required.

Trustee Manieri expressed his thanks to the Plan Commission for their thoroughness at the Public Hearing and also to St. Mark Coptic Church and the development group for their responsiveness to the Plan Commission and residents.

Trustee Franzese inquired about Stormwater detention and the property elevation which was explained by Mr. Bou-Saab.

Trustee Franzese asked if the petitioner would be willing to bring the signs into compliance with the Village Sign Ordinance and it was confirmed that they would be willing to do so.

Motion was made by Trustee Manieri and seconded by Trustee Bolos to direct staff to prepare an Ordinance approving special use for the construction of a building addition to a church and the expansion of the parking lot and with an outdoor playground, outdoor classroom and outdoor kitchen and gazebo; a variation from section VI.F.5.b of said Zoning Ordinance to allow sections of the building addition to exceed the 45-foot maximum permitted height for non-residential uses; a variation from section XI.C.8.a of said Zoning Ordinance to allow parking to be located in a front buildable area rather than in the side or rear buildable area of the lot; a variation from section XI.C.11a(2)(a) of said Zoning Ordinance to allow a limited number of parking spaces to encroach into the required 30-foot setback from the west property line; to eliminate the proposed Garfield Avenue driveway and sidewalk; to designate the building heights as shown on the original plat of survey as presented to the Plan Commission; to eliminate the proposed turnaround loop; and to defer the landscaping specifications to be included in the final landscape review to be conducted by the Community Development Director (Z-22-2013: 15W455 79th Street – St. Mark Coptic Church).

Leo Ditewig, 26 Pine Tree Lane, expressed concern with regard to the view from his backyard looking at the building and grounds.

Connie Markiewicz, 61 Pine Tree Lane, requested additional screening at the northeast corner of the property. Mayor Straub responded that the screening was incorporated as part of the motion.

Bud Arquila, 61 Pine Tree, recommended saving the existing tree line and also requested additional screening.

Refaat Abdek-Malek, 8512 Johnston and member of the church and added the church members respect the neighbors. Mr. Abdek-Malek also added that the church steeple is an expression of faith and would not be accessed by anyone.

Atef Moawad, 4 Norman Court and member of the church, stated the expansion of the church will be a benefit to the church and the community.

Marvin Dyson, 129 Kraml Drive, encouraged the approval of the church expansion.

Martin Cavaney, 51 Pine Tree, stated he is in favor of the emergency access entrance off Garfield Avenue.

Village Administrator Steve Stricker stated staff received a letter from Dr. Basilly 9286 Fallingwater Drive, indicating his support of the project.

CONSIDERATION OF PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE TO ADD MEDICAL CANNABIS DISPENSING FACILITIES AS A SPECIAL USE IN THE GI GENERAL INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (Z-19-2013) Community Development Director Doug Pollock stated that the Plan Commission is recommending approval of an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to add "Medical Cannabis Dispensing Facility licensed by the State of Illinois as per the State of Illinois of the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act" to the list of special uses in the GI General Industrial District.

Mr. Pollock explained the recent legislation enacted by the State of Illinois and how it affects municipalities. He added that the Plan Commission felt that dispensing facilities would be best classified as a special use in the GI General Industrial District.

Mr. Pollock responded to Trustee Franzese's inquiry stating that the Village cannot prohibit dispensing facilities but can regulate them as long as it is consistent with State law.

Trustee Grasso inquired if a dispensing facility could be located in a medical facility such as the Loyola Center for Health. In response, Mr. Pollock stated the Village Attorney indicated that the intent of the law is that the facility should be independent.

In response to Trustee Manieri, Mr. Pollock confirmed that a maximum of 60 facilities could be located in the State of Illinois.

Motion was made by Trustee Grasso and seconded by Trustee Ruzak to amend the Zoning Ordinance to add Medical Cannabis Dispensing Facilities as a Special Use in the GI General Industrial District (Z-19-2013).

DISCUSSION REGARDING 2013 TAX LEVY

and

PRESENTATION OF POLICE PENSION BOARD TAX LEVY RECOMMENDATION

Village Administrator Steve Stricker explained the Tax Levy process noting that the levy must be approved by the Village Board by the end of the 2013 calendar year.

Mr. Stricker stated that the Tax Levy represents approximately 3% of a Burr Ridge resident's tax bill and contains three separate levies; Corporate, Police Protection, and Police Pension. He noted there is a fourth levy, the Debt Service Levy, for the Bedford Park Water Main Project that was set when the bond issue was established and is not part of the tax levy approved by the Board.

Mr. Stricker explained the factors involved in the Tax Levy calculation. He stated that for 2013, the tax cap is set at 1.7%, the limiting rate is estimated at .1009 and the EAV is estimated to increase by 6% which encompasses a 2% increase in existing value and a 4% increase in new construction. The proposed 2013 Tax Levy amount is \$343,174 for Corporate, \$228,782 for Police Protection, and \$543,678 for Police Pension for a total of \$1,115,634.

Mr. Stricker explained that the goal is to capture the maximum allowed under the tax cap to ensure that all growth is captured. He discussed the tax implications to the resident tax bills. He indicated that for an average \$618,000 home in Burr Ridge, DuPage County residents taxes would increase by \$5.49 and for Cook County residents, the increase would be \$7.39.

Mr. Stricker noted that prior to moving forward, Agenda Item 8D, Police Pension Board Tax Levy Recommendation, will be discussed.

Joe Patyk, resident and Police Pension Board member, discussed the Village tax levy for the Police Pension Fund. Mr. Patyk emphasized that the fund contribution should be more than that which is mandated by state statutes.

Tom White, Police Pension Board member, discussed the actuarial status of the Police Pension Fund as of the past year noting that the Village is currently 70% funded. He expressed concern with regard to the unfunded liability.

Mr. White noted that the tax levy recommendation amount for the pension fund is \$766,328, which is significantly more that the State mandated amount of \$543,678 and he recommends contributing additional funding. He discussed the historical funding noting a statutory deficiency that will continue to grow. Mr. White also noted that the annual expenses may soon exceed contributions resulting in the need to liquidate Trust Fund assets to cover expenses. Mr. White encouraged the Board to address the growth of the pension fund.

Trustee Bolos stated that as economic times improve, she hopes to work toward reducing the unfunded liability.

Trustee Franzese inquired about the deficit in the fund since 2001. In response, Mr. White explained the factors that affected the deficit.

Mr. Stricker explained that the sources of revenue for the Police Pension Fund are employee contributions, employer contributions and investment returns. He noted that a factor to consider with the deficit is the reduction in investment returns. Mr. Stricker also mentioned the referendum in 2010 for pension system reform in which 88.5% of the voters were in favor of. He also discussed the cost of hiring police officers noting the priority of having the additional officers on staff versus contributing those funds toward the Pension Fund. Mr. Stricker concluded that if there is a budget surplus at the end of the fiscal year, additional funding could be added to the Pension Fund.

Mr. White responded to Mr. Stricker's comments noting that the deficit is the Village's responsibility and that the majority of the Police Pension Funds are in the same situation. Mr. White offered suggestions for increasing revenue to allow the fund to be increased.

In response to Trustee Paveza, Mr. Stricker explained that the Pension Fund will be 90% funded by 2040 based upon the Actuarial estimate for funding.

Motion was made by Trustee Ruzak and seconded by Trustee Paveza to accept the proposed Tax Levy for 2013 and authorize Staff to prepare the necessary notice for a public hearing to be held on December 9, 2013.

There was discussion regarding the ability to achieve the projected investment returns and the shortfall amounts.

CONSIDERATION OF PATHWAY COMMISSION REQUEST TO RECONSIDER THE USE OF PATHWAY FUND INTEREST FOR GENERAL FUND PURPOSES Pathway Chairperson Pat Liss stated that Pathway Commissioner Marilou McGirr would discuss a letter prepared on behalf of the Pathway Commission.

Commissioner Marilou McGirr discussed a letter provided to the Board and signed by the Pathway Commissioners which states that \$50,705 in non-interest income Pathway Funds were used to balance the Village budget. The Pathway Commission questions the use of these funds for beautification and requests the funds not be taken in the future. In addition, the Pathway Commission would like clarification on the Beautification Committee and would also like a Trustee appointed to their Committee.

Pathway Commissioner Luisa Hoch noted that Trustee Manieri has been attending their meetings and his presence is appreciated. She also requested that the Pathway Commission remain as an active committee even when their funds are depleted.

Village Administrator Stricker pointed out that the funds for the beautification came from the Pathway Fund and the Hotel / Motel Tax Fund. Mr. Stricker reminded the Commissioners that although the Pathway Commission did not support the use of their funds for the beautification of the plaza areas, the Board unanimously voted to approve the use of the funds. Mr. Stricker also noted that the beautification was assigned to the Pathway Commission several years ago and that responsibility could be removed by the Board, if desired. Mr. Stricker pointed out that a Trustee was assigned to the Commission as a liaison when it was initially formed.

Trustee Paveza stated that he was a Board member when the decision to use the Pathway Funds for beautification was voted on. He stated the Board was unanimous in their approval for the use of the funds since at that time, the Pathway Commission had no viable projects underway.

Trustee Bolos questioned if the remaining \$365,912.00 in the Pathway Fund is interest income and Mr. Stricker confirmed that it is. Mr. Stricker also added that a majority of the balance in the Pathway Fund is allocated to upcoming projects leaving approximately \$125,000 in the fund.

Trustee Manieri commended the Pathway Commission on their accomplishments and commented he would like to be appointed to the Pathway Commission but will attend the meetings regardless.

Trustee Franzese thanked the Pathway Commission for their efforts and supports the continuation of the Commission. He added he disagrees with the transfer of the interest from the Pathway Fund

Trustee Bolos inquired if the Village portion of the bridge enhancement funding is budgeted from the Hotel / Motel Tax Fund and Mr. Stricker responded that the funding is coming from that source.

Commissioner McGirr questioned the Beautification Committee responsibilities. In response, Mr. Stricker stated it should be discussed at the next Pathway Commission meeting to determine if the Commission would like to undertake that responsibility.

Mayor Straub added his thanks to the Pathway Commission for their accomplishments. He also noted that he would not be appointing a Trustee to the Commission.

<u>OTHER CONSIDERATIONS</u> Trustee Grasso announced that the Jingle Mingle will be held on November 23rd at the Village Center.

Mayor Straub thanked all who participated in the Veteran's Day event.

Trustee Manieri extended his thanks to all of the Veterans.

AUDIENCE John Bittner, 2 Hidden Lake Drive, pointed out there is now insufficient parking in the County Line Square parking lot due to the loss of parking spaces with the construction of the Chase Bank. He noted that people are parking illegally.

Marilou McGirr asked that a trustee request that the salaries for the Trustees and Village President be discussed. Trustee Franzese added he would like this item on the next agenda.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM VILLAGE OFFICIALS

There were none at this time.

<u>ADJOURNMENT</u> Motion was made by Trustee Ruzak and seconded by Trustee Grasso that the Regular Meeting of November 11, 2013 be adjourned.

1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL:

3. APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER 12, 2013 MINUTES

Commissioner Davis clarified that he was not at the last meeting. He said the roll call was correct but that elsewhere in the minutes it is indicated that he was at the meeting.

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Maggio and SECONDED by Commissioner Davis to approve the September 12, 2013 minutes as amended. The motion was unanimously approved by a voice vote of the Commission.

Mr. Conrad Fialkowski, 110 Waterside Place, said he came to the meeting to express his appreciation to the Pathway Commission for the replacement of the asphalt pathway in Chasemoor with a concrete pathway. He said others in Chasemoor appreciate the new sidewalk as well.

4. DISCUSSION OF FUTURE SIDEWALK PROJECTS - Carriageway Drive and Garfield Avenue

In regards to the Garfield sidewalk project, Mr. Pollock said that this project is a High Priority project on the Pathway and Sidewalk Plan and the Commission asked staff to put this on the agenda for an update. Mr. Pollock said that he discussed this with Willowbrook and they are willing to consider participating in the cost based on the cost of the sidewalk that would be in Willowbrook. Mr. Pollock added that the Public Works Director is planning on submitting a grant application for street improvements and that staff recommends that the sidewalk be included in the grant application when it is submitted next year.

Chairperson Liss suggested that staff contact Willowbrook and let them know that the Pathway Commission supports this project and appreciates their participation.

After discussion, the Pathway Commission agreed with Mr. Pollock's recommendation to reconsider this project in 2014 at the time that the grant application is submitted.

In regards to the Carriageway sidewalk project, Mr. Pollock said that this project is dependent upon Cook County making improvements to the intersection of County Line Road and Carriageway Drive to accommodate a pedestrian crossing. Mr. Pollock said that the County has recently indicated they will be doing an engineering study of this intersection. Mr. Pollock recommended that the Commission consider this project in 2014 after it is determined whether the County is going to proceed with an intersection improvement.

After discussion, the Pathway Commission concurred and asked that this project be placed on an agenda sometime in 2014 for an update and further consideration.

5. REVIEW OF SUBDIVISION SIDEWALK – McNaughton's 87th and Madison Subdivision

Mr. Pollock described the proposed four lot subdivision at the southeast corner of 87th and Madison. He said a sidewalk exists on Madison Street and that the developer of Polo Ridge paid for the sidewalk on Polo Ridge Court; thus, the only required sidewalk is on 87th Street. He said that the developer is planning on constructing the 87th Street sidewalk so there is no action required of the Pathway Commission.

After discussion, it was suggested that the Commission make a motion indicating its preference for the 87th Street sidewalk instead of a donation.

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Davis and SECONDED by Commissioner Liss to require the construction of the sidewalk on 87th Street rather than accept a donation. The motion was unanimously approved by a voice vote of the Commission.

6. APPROVAL OF 2014 MEETING SCHEDULE

Mr. Pollock said that the normal meeting times for the Commission are the second Thursday of each odd numbered month. Chairperson Liss said she would not be able to attend the meeting in January.

A MOTION was made by Chairperson Liss and SECONDED by Commissioner Maggio to approve the 2014 Pathway Commission meeting schedule to include the second Thursday of each odd numbered month. The motion was unanimously approved by a voice vote of the Commission.

7. BOARD REPORT

Chairperson Liss reported that the Village Board, at their meeting on Monday, November 11, discussed the letter sent to them by the Pathway Commission. She said that she and Commissioners McGirr and Hoch attended the meeting. She noted that Village Administrator

Steve Stricker stated that all of the remaining money in the Pathway Fund is interest money and therefore, is not restricted to use for pathways.

Commissioner Hoch noted the response letter from Mr. Stricker to the Village Board and questioned the statement regarding the role of the Street Policy Committee relative to the Village Board. Chairperson Liss suggested that this paragraph needs clarification.

Trustee Manieri suggested that the Pathway Commission ask the Board to make pathways a separate line item in the annual budget. Chairperson Liss responded that the Commission should discuss that at the next meeting.

Chairperson Liss asked the Commission about its role in regards to beautification. She said the Commission was given that role by the Board several years ago but has never done anything in regard to beautification. She suggested that the Commission maintain that role. There were no objections.

Commissioner Hoch reported that one of the questions asked of the Board at the November 11 meeting was in regard to appointing a Trustee as the liaison to the Pathway Commission. She said that Mayor Straub responded that he was not going to appoint a Trustee to that position.

8. OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Davis suggested that the Pathway Commission consider sidewalk connections in the vicinity of Chasemoor Drive and 79th Street. He said a connection on the north side of 79th Street between Burr Oaks Glen North and the pathway behind Chasemoor and a crosswalk at Chasemoor on 79th Street would provide a benefit to a lot of residents who walk to the Village Center for concerts and other activities. Mr. Pollock said he would have the Village Engineer look at this and provide a report at the next Pathway Commission meeting.

Trustee Manieri asked that the full Pathway Commission agenda packet be distributed to the entire Board of Trustees. Mr. Pollock said he would do that in the future.

8. ADJOURNMENT

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Davis and SECONDED by Commissioner Hoch to ADJOURN this meeting. ALL MEMBERS VOTING AYE, the meeting was adjourned at 8:17 p.m.

Due to the fact that Mayor Mickey Straub was absent, Space Needs Committee Chairperson Greg Trzupek was asked to call the meeting to order and Chair the meeting.

ALTERNATIVE PRICES FOR RENOVATION OF VILLAGE HALL OFFICES AND PUBLIC SPACES

Village Administrator Steve Stricker indicated that the Consultant had received alternative prices from the contractor, per the request of the Board, but that he and the Consultant were having a hard time determining the actual cost savings associated with the alternatives. He stated that Consultant Josephine Goetz and he met earlier in the morning to review the numbers and decided the best approach was to take the current base bid and then eliminate the costs for the cabinets and countertops in the amount of \$56,574, to arrive at a new minimum base bid of \$87,240, and then to add back in the revised costs for cabinets and countertops. Under this scenario, Administrator Stricker suggested the following:

- Laminate countertops and cabinets for the Customer Service Area in the amount of \$2,725
- Building Plans Files remained the same at \$9,000
- 2 cm quartz countertop and ½" Trespa cabinets for a total of \$8,585 for the Lunchroom
- Corian countertops in the amount of \$7,576 and laminate cabinets in the amount of \$15,884, for a total of \$23,460 for the Workroom
- Laminate for the Administrative Area cabinets in the amount of \$5,597

He stated that the revised cost came out to \$136,607 and, with the deduction for the varnishing of the ceiling in the foyer in the amount of \$4,725, the new base bid came in at \$131,882. With a 5% contingency, the new revised base cost was at \$138,476, which was lower than the amount that is currently available for this project in the amount of \$147,600. Administrator Stricker indicated that, if the Board decided to use laminate instead of the $\frac{1}{2}$ " Trespa, there could be an additional \$3,079 cost savings.

Trustee Len Ruzak stated that he would like to hear what the professionals think about which materials to use. Chairperson Trzupek stated that the Consultant specified the best materials and could understand why the Village Board would like to spend less money using laminate. However, he indicated that he did not approve of using laminate for countertops and suggested that the Customer Service Area countertop by made of the Corian material, which would increase the price by \$1,095. He stated that, for the Lunchroom area, Trespa would probably be better, due to the potential of water damage, but it would certainly be more expensive.

Trustee John Manieri stated that the laminate throughout the building has lasted over 25 years and that he felt that the Trespa product was too expensive. Trustee Manieri also stated his concern regarding the use of quartz in the Lunchroom, as some residents may think that it was too excessive. In response, Consultant Goetz stated that this is not natural quartz, but a quartz composite material, which costs the exact same amount as the Corian.

Trustee Bolos expressed her concerns regarding the contractor, based on the fact of his ever-changing numbers and the fact that the original countertop and cabinetry costs did not add up.

Trustee Manieri stated that he felt that \$9,000 for the Building Department special cabinet was too costly. Space Needs Committee member Craig Buckridge agreed, stating that he felt that it could be done for less. Trustee Guy Franzese also agreed that the price of the cabinet was too high and suggested that it may be possible to find an existing prefabricated cabinet. After some discussion, it was agreed to remove this from the contract and seek either alternate bids or look at the possibility of an already prefabricated unit.

After considerable discussion, Administrator Stricker summarized the discussion concerning the use of alternative materials. The consensus of the Board was to utilize the Corian solid surfacing for the countertop in the Customer Service Area and the use of laminate for facing of the cabinets. It was agreed that the Building Department storage unit would be removed from the contract and alternative prices would be sought. For the Lunchroom, it was agreed to use the 2 cm quartz composite solid surface material, along with plastic laminate. In the Workroom, it was agreed to use the Corian solid surface countertop, with plastic laminate for the cabinets. For the Administrative Area cabinets abutting the Mayor's office, it was agreed again to use the laminate material.

Administrator Stricker asked if there were any other changes the Board would like to make before presenting these items back to the contractor for final pricing. Trustee Paveza stated

that, with all the cost savings, the Board should consider adding back in the renovation of the ceiling in the foyer.

Trustee Guy Franzese suggested eliminating the wallpaper in the Mayor's office and the Administrator's office. There was no consensus in regard to this suggestion.

After some discussion, a **motion** was made by Trustee John Manieri to direct Staff to seek a final price from the contractor, using the Corian solid surface countertop and laminate cabinetry for the Customer Service Area, removing the Building Department Plans File from the contract, utilizing 2 cm quartz composite solid surface material for the Lunchroom countertop along with laminate, using the Corian solid surface material and laminate in the Workroom, using laminate for the cabinets in the Administrative Area that abut the Mayor's office and to add back in the cost of refinishing the ceiling in the foyer. The motion was **seconded** by Trustee Guy Franzese and **approved** unanimously.

ADIOUURNMENT

There being no further business, a **motion** was made by Trustee John Manieri to adjourn the meeting. The motion was **seconded** by Trustee Diane Bolos and **approved** unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE FOR
THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BUILDING ADDITION TO A CHURCH AND THE
EXPANSION OF THE PARKING LOT AND WITH AN OUTDOOR PLAYGROUND, OUTDOOR
CLASSROOM AND OUTDOOR KITCHEN AND GAZEBO
PURSUANT TO THE VILLAGE OF BURR RIDGE ZONING ORDINANCE

(Z-22-2013: 15W455 79th Street - St. Mark Coptic Orthodox Church)

whereas, an application for a special use for certain real estate has been filed with the Village Clerk of the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, and said application has been referred to the Plan Commission of said Village and has been processed in accordance with the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, said Plan Commission of this Village held a public hearing on the question of granting said special use on November 4, 2013 at the Burr Ridge Village Hall, at which time all persons desiring to be heard were given the opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, public notice in the form required by law was provided for said public hearing not more than 30 nor less than 15 days prior to said public hearing by publication in the <u>Suburban Life</u>, a newspaper of general circulation in this Village, there being no newspaper published in this Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Burr Ridge Plan Commission has made its report on the request for a special use, including its findings and recommendations, to this President and Board of Trustees, and this President and Board of Trustees has duly considered said report, findings, and recommendations.

NOW THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the President and Board of

Trustees of the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: All Exhibits submitted at the aforesaid public hearing are hereby incorporated by reference. This President and Board of Trustees find that the granting of special use indicated herein is in the public good and in the best interests of the Village of Burr Ridge and its residents, is consistent with and fosters the purposes and spirit of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance as set forth in Section II thereof.

<u>Section 2</u>: That this President and Board of Trustees, after considering the report, findings, and recommendations of the Plan Commission and other matters properly before it, in addition to the findings set forth in Section 1, finds as follows:

- A. That the Petitioner for the special use for the property located at 15W455 79th Street, Burr Ridge, Illinois, is St. Mark Coptic Orthodox Church (hereinafter "Petitioner"). The Petitioner requests special use approval as per Section VI.F.2.k of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance for the construction of a building addition to a church and the expansion of the parking lot and with an outdoor playground, outdoor classroom and outdoor kitchen and gazebo.
- B. That the existing church was established prior to annexation into the Village, expanded with an addition to the building and granted a special use by the Village after annexation into the Village.
- C. That the existing use of the property as a church is consistent with the existing use and with surrounding zoning and development.
- D. That the special use is compatible with the Burr Ridge Comprehensive Plan which recommends community facilities for the subject property.

Section 3: That special use approval as per Section VI.F.2.k of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance for the construction of a

building addition to a church and the expansion of the parking lot and with an outdoor playground, outdoor classroom and outdoor kitchen and gazebo *is hereby granted* for the property commonly known as 15W455 79th Street and with the Permanent Real Estate Index Numbers of 09-36-104-009, 09-36-104-066, 09-36-104-017, 09-36-104-018.

<u>Section 4</u>: That the approval of this special use is subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- A. The special use shall be limited to the existing and proposed improvements on the property as per submitted plans attached hereto as **Exhibit A** except as may be specifically modified herein.
- B. The final site plan shall not include a driveway connection from the parking lot to Garfield Avenue and shall not include the emergency turnaround loop as per the attached **Exhibit A**;
- C. The final landscaping plan shall be subject to staff review and approval prior to issuance of any building permit and shall include:
 - Landscaping as per the submitted landscaping plan attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> including but not limited to a 4 foot, landscaped berm between the parking lot and 79th Street.
 - Maintenance of the existing arbor vitae along the south lot line and the addition of arbor vitae wherever there are gaps between south lot line and the proposed parking lot;
 - 3. Maintenance of the existing plant materials along the west lot line and the addition of evergreen plants between the parking lot and west lot line to fill in gaps and to ensure that vehicle headlights do not shine into the adjacent residential area;
 - 4. Maintenance and enhancement of the landscaping along the east end of the proposed parking lot to the north and south side of the building to provide an

effective visual buffer of the parking lot from any adjacent street or property;

- 5. Landscape screening of the existing mechanical equipment located at the northeast corner of the existing building.
- D. The final stormwater management plan shall be subject to staff review and approval with the intent of eliminating the existing ponding adjacent to the existing detention area at the southwest corner of the property and consideration of maintaining some of the detention at the southwest corner of the property if it contributes to the resolution of the existing ponding.

<u>Section 5</u>: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law. The Village Clerk is hereby directed and ordered to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

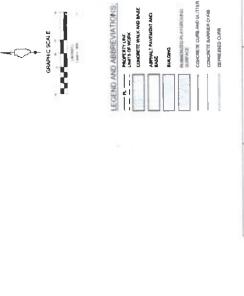

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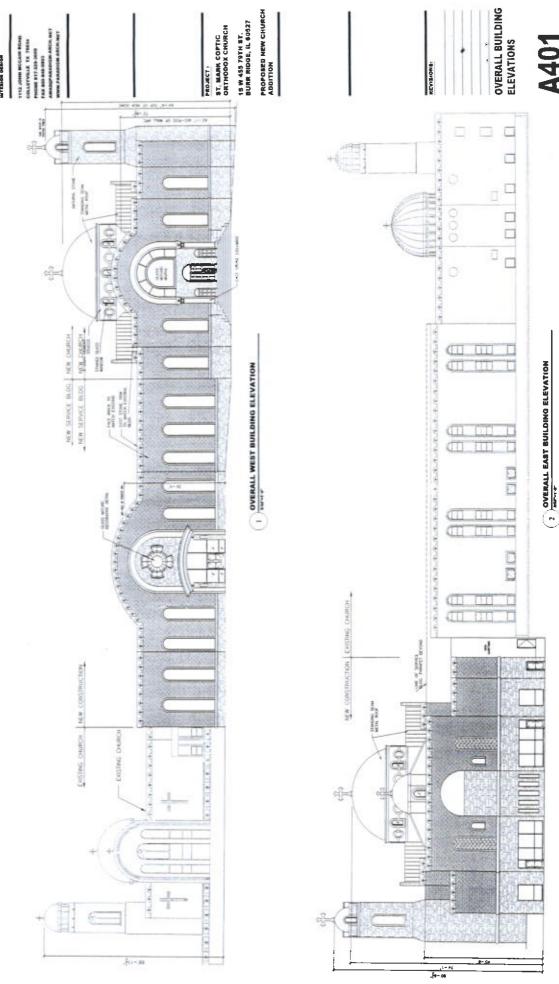

PROPOSED SITEPLAN EXHIBIT

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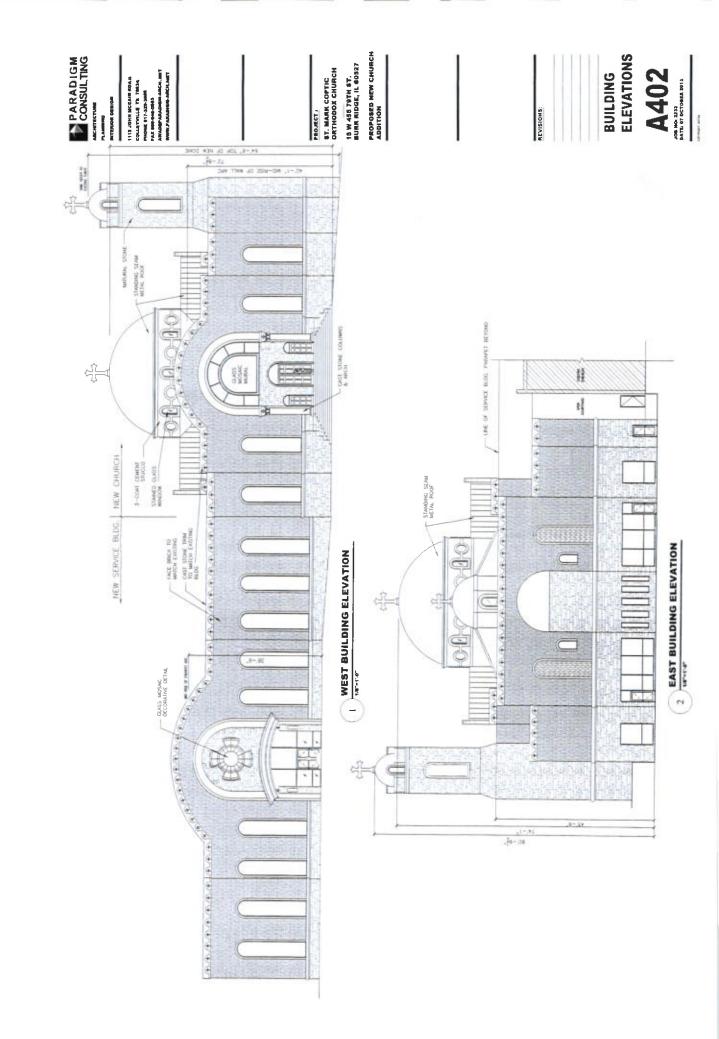

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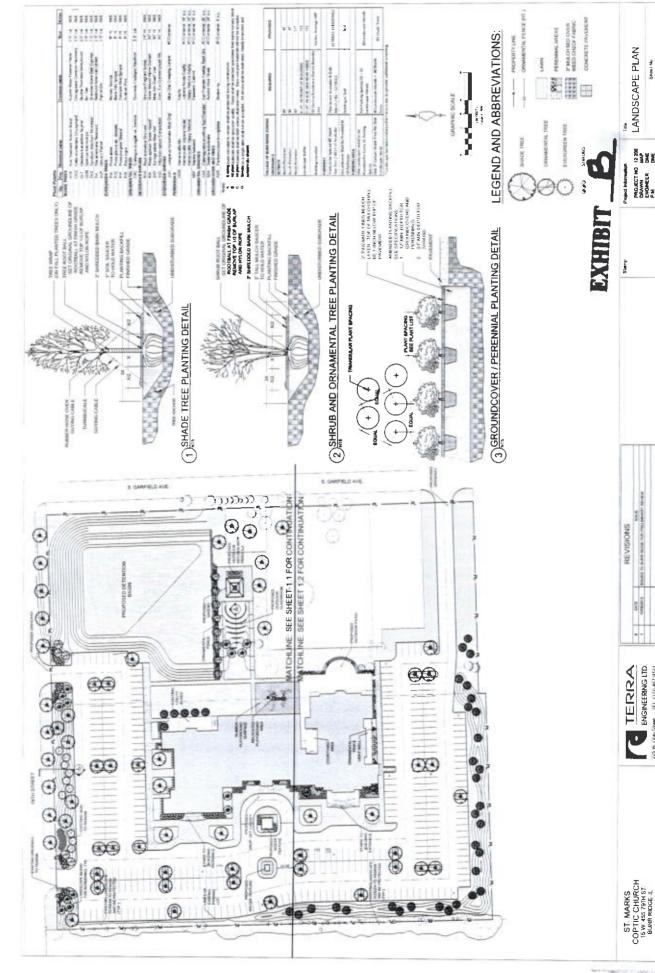
PROPOSED NEW CHURCH ADDITION

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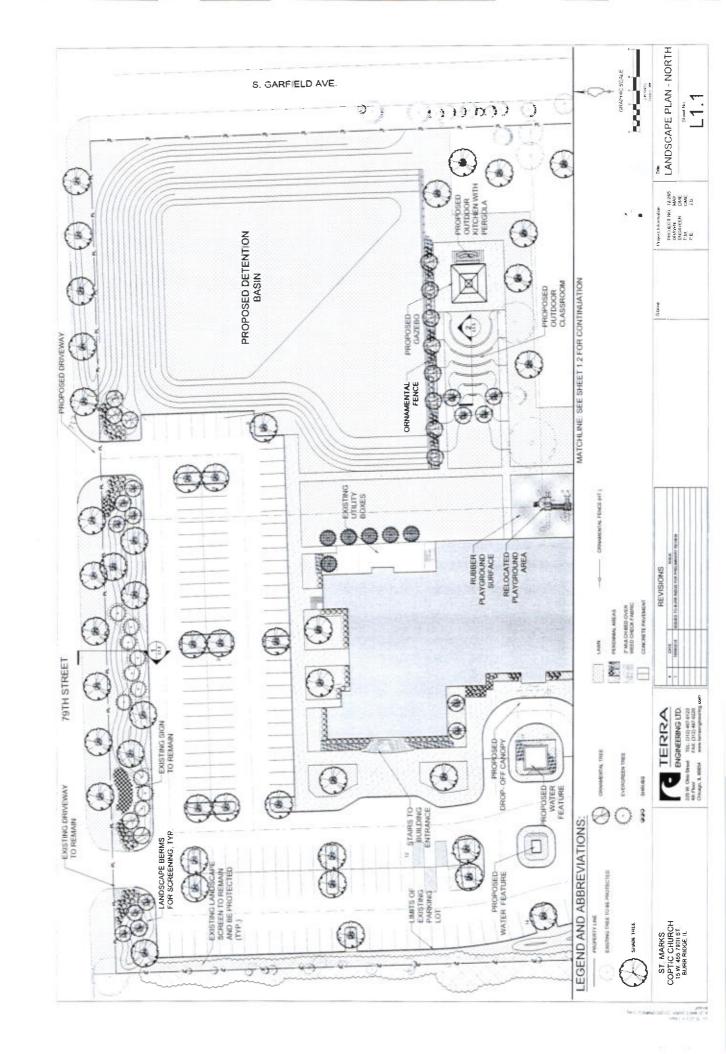
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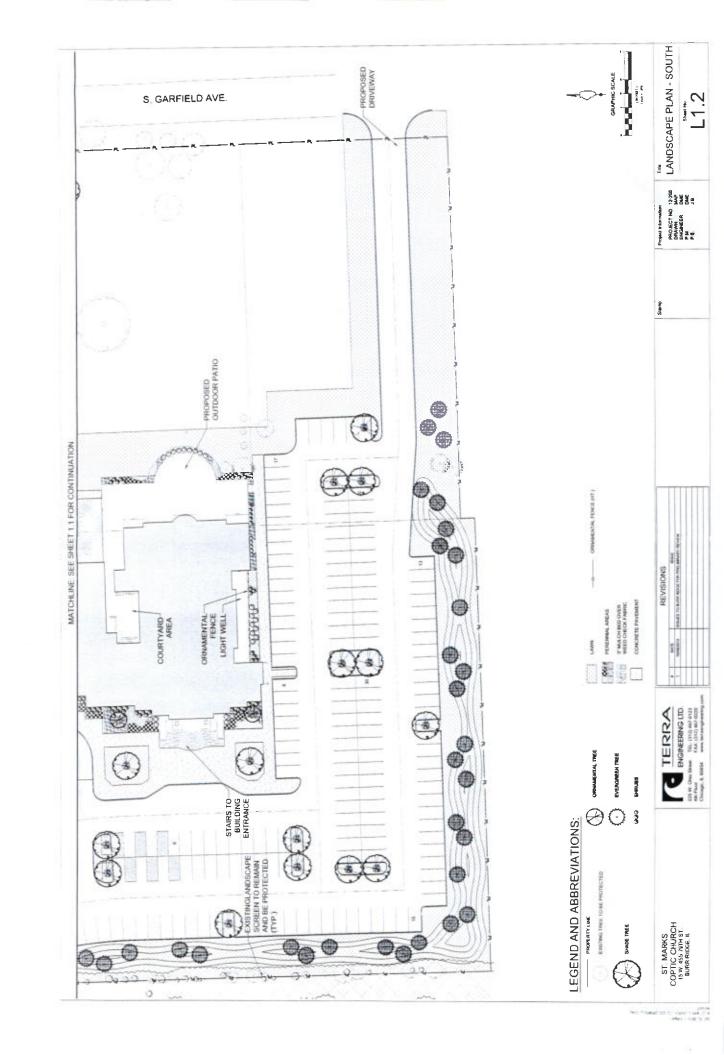

(Z-22-2013: 15W455 79th Street - St. Mark Coptic Church)

WHEREAS, an application for a variation from the Village of Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance for certain real estate has been filed with the Village Clerk of the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, and said application has been referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals of said Village and has been processed in accordance with the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, said Zoning Board of Appeals of this Village held a public hearing on the question of granting said zoning variation on November 4, 2013, at the Burr Ridge Village Hall, at which time all persons desiring to be heard were given the opportunity to be heard; and

whereas, public notice in the form required by law was provided for said public hearing not more than 30 nor less than 15 days prior to said public hearing by publication in the Suburban Life, a newspaper of general circulation in this Village, there being no newspaper published in this Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Burr Ridge Zoning Board of Appeals has made its report on the request for zoning variations, including its findings and recommendations, to this President and Board of Trustees; and this President and Board of Trustees has duly considered said report, findings, and recommendations.

NOW THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Burr Ridge, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: All Exhibits submitted at the aforesaid public hearing are hereby incorporated by reference. This President and Board of Trustees find that the granting of the zoning variations indicated herein are in the public good and in the best interests of the Village of Burr Ridge and its residents, is consistent with and fosters the purposes and spirit of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance as set forth in Section II thereof.

Section 2: That this President and Board of Trustees, after considering the report, findings, and recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals and other matters properly before it, in addition to the findings set forth in Section 1, finds as follows:

A. That the Petitioner for the variation for the property located at 15W455 79th Street, Burr Ridge, Illinois, is St. Mark Coptic Orthodox Church (hereinafter "Petitioner"). The Petitioner requests variations from

Section VI.F.5.b of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to allow sections of the building addition to exceed the 45 foot maximum permitted height for non-residential uses; a variation from Section XI.C.8.a of said Zoning Ordinance to allow parking to be located in a front buildable area rather than in the side or rear buildable area of the lot; and a variation from Section XI.C.11.a(2)(a) of said Zoning Ordinance to allow a limited number of parking spaces to encroach into the required 30 foot setback from the west property line.

- B. That the variations are due to unique circumstances because; the petitioner is constructing an addition to a church and expanding the parking lot of the church. In order to complement the existing building and expand the existing parking lot, the variations are necessary.
- C. That if the variation is not approved the petitioner would suffer a hardship because the petitioner would not be able to make reasonable use of the property for a church which is its existing use.

Section 3: That variations from Section VI.F.5.b of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to allow sections of the building addition to exceed the 45 foot maximum permitted height for non-residential uses; a variation from Section XI.C.8.a of said Zoning Ordinance to allow parking to be located in a front buildable area rather than in the side or rear buildable area of the lot; and a variation from Section XI.C.11.a(2)(a) of said Zoning Ordinance to allow a limited number of parking spaces to encroach into the required 30 foot setback from the west property line are hereby granted for the property commonly

known as 15W455 79th Street and with the Permanent Real Estate

Index Numbers of 09-36-104-009, 09-36-104-066, 09-36-104-017,

09-36-104-018.

<u>Section 4</u>: That the variations are subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- A. The special use shall be limited to the existing and proposed improvements on the property as per submitted plans attached hereto as **Exhibit A** except as may be specifically modified herein.
- B. The final site plan shall not include a driveway connection from the parking lot to Garfield Avenue and shall not include the emergency turnaround loop as per the attached **Exhibit A**;
- C. The final landscaping plan shall be subject to staff review and approval prior to issuance of any building permit and shall include:
 - 1. Landscaping as per the submitted landscaping plan attached hereto as **Exhibit B** including but not limited to a 4 foot, landscaped berm between the parking lot and 79th Street.
 - 2. Maintenance of the existing arbor vitae along the south lot line and the addition of arbor vitae wherever there are gaps between south lot line and the proposed parking lot;
 - 3. Maintenance of the existing plant materials along the west lot line and the addition of evergreen plants between the parking lot and west lot line to fill in gaps and to ensure that vehicle headlights do not shine into the adjacent residential area;
 - 4. Maintenance and enhancement of the landscaping along the east end of the proposed parking lot to the north and south side of the building to

provide an effective visual buffer of the parking lot from any adjacent street or property;

- 5. Landscape screening of the existing mechanical equipment located at the northeast corner of the existing building.
- D. The final stormwater management plan shall be subject to staff review and approval with the intent of eliminating the existing ponding adjacent to the existing detention area at the southwest corner of the property and consideration of maintaining some of the detention at the southwest corner of the property if it contributes to the resolution of the existing ponding.

<u>Section 5</u>: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law. The Village Clerk is hereby directed and ordered to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

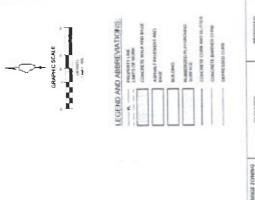

- A. That the recommendation is to amend Section X.F.2 of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance to add "Medical Cannabis Dispensing Facility, licensed by the State of Illinois as per the State of Illinois Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act" to the list of special uses in the GI District.
- B. That the amendment is consistent with the purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance.

Section 3: That Section X.F.2 of the Burr Ridge Zoning Ordinance be and hereby is amended to add the following as a special use in the GI General Industrial District (and that the list of special uses shall be reordered to maintain alphabetical order):

a. Medical Cannabis Dispensing Facility, licensed by the State of Illinois as per the State of Illinois Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act

You have asked about the applicable rules related to the increase or decrease of compensation to elected officials on a municipal board of trustees.

Increase or Decrease of Compensation of Elected Officials During Term

Both the Illinois Local Government Officer Compensation Act and the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code governing the compensation of elected officials, control the rules regarding the compensation of elected officials. The rules prohibit the increase or decrease of the compensation of an elected official during the term of office of any such official. The law provides that establishing the compensation, whether an increase or a decrease, of any elected officials has to be done by a municipality at least 180 days before the beginning of the terms of the officers whose compensation is to be fixed.

The municipal election is the first Tuesday in April. An elected member of the board of trustees takes office in Burr Ridge in May after the municipal election. Section 2.10 of Chapter 2 of the Village Code provides that "[t]he term of office of each member of the Trustees shall commence on the date of the first regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees in May following the regular April Village elections at which such Village Trustees are elected." Therefore, any action to change compensation for the elected officials would have to be completed at least 180 days prior to the first regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees in May 2015. The law goes on to specifically provide that such compensation "shall neither be increased nor diminished during that term". 65 ILCS 5/3.1-50-10

The issue of whether an elected official can decide that they will no longer be paid has been considered multiple times by States' Attorney Generals and has been litigated. The above principle applies, i.e. the compensation of an elected official cannot <u>legally</u> be increased or decreased during the term of office of that official. Nor can an elected official affect the payment of the compensation from the Village, i.e. the decision to

compensate a trustee is made by the Board of Trustees and cannot be legally changed or altered by an individual member of the Board. A trustee cannot direct the Village not to pay out compensation as the trustee did not make the determination that compensation would be paid. Whatever that elected official chooses to do with the funds, is up to the discretion of that elected official, but an ordinance providing for a particular compensation of an elected official or officials during their term cannot be changed during that term of office.

Therefore, any change in compensation cannot affect any of the current trustees or the president, during their current term of office. Any change made at least 180 days before the April 2015 election would affect only those trustees which would be up for election at that time, and the seats of those trustees and the president who were elected in April 2013 could not be affected by any change in compensation until the April 2017 election.

The applicable sections of the Illinois Local Government Officer Compensation Act (50 ILCS 145/2), and of the compensation provisions for officers under the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/3.1-50-10) are set forth below:

The Local Government Officer Compensation Act

<u>"Sec. 2.</u> Time of fixing compensation. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the compensation of elected officers of school districts and units of local government, including home rule units, which compensation is to be fixed by that school district or unit of local government, shall be fixed at least 180 days before the beginning of the terms of the officers whose compensation is to be fixed." 50 ILCS 145/2

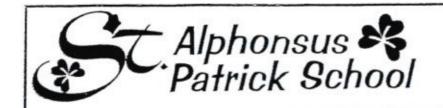

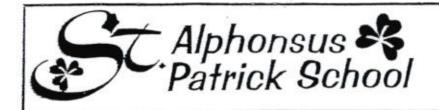
