PUBLIC HEARING – Annexation Agreement Amendment (Meadowbrook Place Subdivision)

Enclosed is the notice for the public hearing regarding the Amendment to the Annexation Agreement for Meadowbrook Place Subdivision. The Ordinance authorizing this amendment is Item #6A on this agenda.

6. ORDINANCES

A. <u>Amend Annexation Agreement (Meadowbrook Place Subdivision)</u>

The Meadowbrook Place subdivision is located on Meadowbrook Drive near Route 83. A final plat of subdivision was approved in 2007. Construction was begun in 2008, but consisted only of limited grading work before the original developer defaulted on the project. Oxford Bank was the lending institution and they took over the property soon thereafter. Oxford Bank has previously requested extensions of the 2 year deadline for completion of the improvements with the most recent extension expiring on March 1, 2015. Oxford is requesting one more extension with the option of a second extension. As per the Subdivision Ordinance, Oxford Bank has paid a \$10,000 fee for each one year extension and agrees to do so again. At this time, the property is in good condition with an established ground cover. There are no construction fences, equipment or materials on the property.

It is our recommendation: that the Ordinance be approved.

B. <u>Rezone Properties (Z-05-2015: Oak Knoll and Buege Lane)</u>

Attached is an Ordinance rezoning 16 parcels in the Oak Knoll and Buege Lane area from the R-1 District to the R-2A District. The Plan Commission previously recommended approval of this rezoning. At the February 23, 2015 meeting, the Board directed staff to prepare this Ordinance.

It is our recommendation: that the Ordinance be approved.

7. **RESOLUTIONS**

A. German Church Road Local Agency Agreement with IDOT

The design phase for the German Church Road sidewalk project is concluding and the project is currently slated for a Spring 2015 letting. This project is partially funded through an STP grant from IDOT/FHWA. In order to process the grant funds associated with this project, it is necessary to execute a Local Agency Agreement with IDOT. The project is slated for construction in Summer 2015.

It is our recommendation: that the Resolution be adopted and that the Village Board authorize the Mayor to execute the Local Agency Agreement for utilization of Federal and State funding for the German Church Road sidewalk project (STP Grant).

8. CONSIDERATIONS

A. <u>Contract for the 2015 Road Program</u>

The Engineering Division of the Public Works Department has prepared the contract documents and solicited bids for the 2015 Roadway Resurfacing Contract in accordance with IDOT guidelines for projects financed in part with Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds.

Scope of Improvements for the 2015 Roadway Resurfacing Program

Streets to be resurfaced as part of this year's Road Program include:

- High Grove subdivision
- Wildwood subdivision
- Tower Drive
- Dougshire Court
- Miscellaneous patching

Once again, the DPW Engineering Division have accelerated the preparation of bid documents to create the most favorable bidding environment. This year, five bids were received, which were opened and read publicly on March 5, 2015. The bids are summarized as follows:

Contractor Reputability and Completeness of Bid Documents:

No errors or omissions were identified in the review of the lowest responsive and responsible bid. Engineering staff has previously worked with Central Blacktop and performance has been acceptable. All IDOT certifications are in order and properly documented for this contractor.

Therefore, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder is Central Blacktop, of LaGrange, IL, with a bid of \$628,337. The engineer's estimate for the resurfacing program is \$630,612.50, so the low bid is 0.3% under the estimate, and work is expected to be completed within budget.

The Engineering Division finds that the lowest responsive and responsible bidder has submitted a complete proposal, that the contractor is reputable and in good standing, and that the Village has received competitive pricing for the 2015 Roadway Resurfacing Program.

It is our recommendation: that a unit-price contract for the 2015 Roadway Resurfacing program be awarded to Central Blacktop, of LaGrange, Illinois in the amount of \$628,337.

B. Employment Training Agreement (Patrol Officer Timothy Lesniak)

The Village has had a standard Employment Training Agreement for the past several years that each Police Officer signs prior to entering the Police Academy. In the past, the Village Administrator signed this agreement on behalf of the Village. The Village Attorney has recently recommended that this agreement be approved directly by the Village Board and signed by the Village President. Attached is the Training Agreement signed by new Patrol Officer Timothy Lesniak.

It is our recommendation: that the Employment Training Agreement for Patrol Officer Timothy Lesniak be approved and that the Mayor be directed to sign the Agreement.

C. <u>Proclamation (Minnard "Dusty" Harold Hanson's 100th Birthday)</u>

Attached is a Proclamation recognizing Burr Ridge resident, Minnard Harold Hanson, in honor of his 100th Birthday on April 6, 2015. Mr. Hanson has been a resident of King Bruwaert Retirement Community for over 34 years.

It is our recommendation: that the Proclamation be approved.

MINUTES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN SUB-COMMITTEE Tuesday, March 3, 2015

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Mickey Straub at 7:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Present were Chairperson Mickey Straub, Len Ruzak, Guy Franzese, and Zach Mottl

Absent - None

Also present were Village Administrator Steve Stricker, Community Development Director Doug Pollock

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN OUTLINE

Village Administrator Steve Stricker stated that the purpose of the meeting was to establish an outline for how the Committee would like to see the Economic Development Plan be prepared, to review the proposed Business Area Map and how the Sub-Area information should be compiled, to review the S.W.O.T. Questionnaire that is proposed to be sent out to the Board and Economic Development Committee members, and to review the current EDC Mission Statement.

Guy Franzese stated that he was happy with the proposed outline, but suggested that a list of vacant properties and the possible plan for how to develop these properties be part of the overall Economic Development Plan. Len Ruzak agreed and stated that it may be appropriate to meet with some of the owners of the parcels to get a better understanding of why they've not been able to develop their property. In response, Administrator Stricker stated that he and the Community Development Director meet constantly with potential developers of many of these vacant parcels and that, in many instances, what the developer may be proposing does not meet the zoning for these properties. In response, Len Ruzak stated that maybe it was time to look at whether or not different uses should be allowed, on a case by case basis.

Zach Mottl suggested that the No. 1 priority should be to generate additional tax revenue. In response to a question from Mayor Straub regarding what Mr. Mottl thought the business community would feel was important, Mr. Mottl stated that location, consistent utilities, especially electric power, and a reasonable tax rate were all important to the manufacturing business, along with the concept of not being bothered by local government, but also having local government willing to help with State and Federal permits when necessary.

CURRENT EDC MISSION STATEMENT

Mayor Straub asked about the Mission Statement and if anyone had any concerns. Mayor Straub stated that he felt that the Mission Statement was fine and did not see any need to change it. Guy Franzese agreed, stating that he was sure a lot of time and effort went into wordsmithing the Mission Statement several years ago.

Administrator Stricker thanked the Committee for its input and stated that, as we move further into this process, we can always revisit the Mission Statement to determine if anything needs to change.

DISCUSSION OF HOW SUB-AREA INFORMATION SHOULD BE COMPILED

In reviewing the Sub-Area Plan Information, Community Development Director Doug Pollock explained the methodology used to update each district. He stated that, in a lot of cases, occupancies are relatively high in each area. Administrator Stricker stated that each of the 11 areas would include information regarding existing conditions, what the Comprehensive Plan says, what the existing zoning may be and would include a zoning map. For each area, there would be a listing of properties, individual businesses and a list of vacant parcels. Guy Franzese stated that this information would be helpful and would allow us to concentrate on setting parameters for what we would like to see in certain areas and what we may need to work with property owners to make what we would like to see happen.

REVIEW OF S.W.O.T. QUESTIONNAIRE

Next, the Committee reviewed the S.W.O.T. questionnaire and discussed who should be asked to fill out the questionnaire. Administrator Stricker stated that, at a minimum, it was his opinion that the Village Board and Economic Development Committee should fill out the information. Guy Franzese suggested that the Plan Commission also be asked to fill out the information. Len Ruzak suggested that the Hotel and Restaurant Marketing Committees should be asked to fill out this information. Community Development Director Pollock suggested that a few businesses in each of the 11 areas could also be asked to fill it out. In response, Guy Franzese stated that he would like to gain the input of the Economic Development Committee and Board members first, then do a second round with area businesses.

Zach Mottl asked where our sales tax money is coming from and which sectors are generating how much revenue. In response, Administrator Stricker stated that this is something that we can now determine and that Village Staff can prepare this analysis.

After considerable discussion, a **motion** was made by Guy Franzese to approve the outline as presented by the Village Administrator, with one amendment to include a list of vacant parcels and suggestions on how they may be developed. The motion was **seconded** by Zach Mottl and **approved** by a vote of 4-0.

In discussing the S.W.O.T. analysis questionnaire, it was agreed to change the wording from listing three suggestions to listing up to five. With this in mind, a **motion** was made by Zach Mottl to approve the S.W.O.T. analysis questionnaire. The motion was **seconded** by Guy Franzese and **approved** by a vote of 4-0.

Based on the prior discussion, , a **motion** was made by Guy Franzese to accept the current Mission Statement of the Economic Development Committee The motion was **seconded** by Len Ruzak and **approved** by a vote of 4-0.

Administrator Stricker stated that he would send out the S.W.O.T. analysis questionnaire to the members of the Board and Economic Development Committee by the end of the week. Guy Franzese suggested that the Committee meet one more time to review the data prior to holding any joint meetings. Administrator Stricker stated that Staff would continue to work on data required for the completion of the Plan and, after some discussion, it was agreed that the next meeting of the Committee would be held on Monday, April 6, at 7:00 p.m.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, a **motion** was made by Zach Mottl to adjourn the meeting. The motion was **seconded** by Guy Franzese and **approved** by a vote of 4-0. The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m.

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT (the "Second Amendment") to the Meadowbrook Place Annexation Agreement is hereby made and entered into this 9th day of March, 2015, by and between the VILLAGE OF BURR RIDGE, a municipal corporation (hereinafter the "Village") and MEADOWBROOK BURR RIDGE, LLC, an Illinois limited liability company, (hereinafter the "Owner").

WHEREAS, the Owner is the current record title holder of the property legally described

WHEREAS, the development of the Subject Property as provided herein will promote the

sound planning and development of the Village as a balanced community and will be beneficial to

the Village; and

WHEREAS, Owner's predecessor in title to the Subject Property and Village have

previously entered into that certain "Annexation Agreement (Meadowbrook Place)" dated July 25,

2006 (the "Agreement") and Owner and Village wish to amend the Agreement as provided herein;

and

WHEREAS, although the Subject Property was to have been developed pursuant to the

terms of the Agreement, it has not yet been developed and remains vacant; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this Amendment (the "Amendment") has been held by the Corporate Authorities of the Village pursuant to notice as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a binding agreement upon the terms and conditions contained in this Amendment; and

WHEREAS, all public hearings and other actions required to be held or taken prior to the adoption and execution of this Amendment, in order to make the same effective, have been held or taken, including all hearings and actions required in connection with the subdivision of the Subject Property, such public hearings and other actions having been held pursuant to public notice as required by law and in accordance with all requirements of law; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village and Owner deem it to be to the mutual advantage of the parties and in the public interest that the Agreement be amended as hereinafter provided.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual promises herein set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. <u>Extension of Subdivision Plat Approval</u>: It is understood and agreed that the deadline for completion of the Meadowbrook Place Subdivision (the "Subdivision") and all required subdivision improvements in accordance with the Subdivision Regulations Ordinance of the Village, the previously approved Plat of Subdivision and accompanying engineering plans for all required public improvements has expired on March 1, 2015 (the "Extension") but that the Owner has and does hereby request an extension to March 1, 2016 (the "First Extension") with an option for a further one-year extension (the "Second Extension"). The Owner agrees to pay to the Village, within 30 days of the Village Board's approval of this Amendment and prior to signing of the Amendment by the President or Village Clerk, the fee of \$10,000 for the First Extension to March 1, 2016, and the Village hereby approves the First Extension. The Village hereby agrees to give Owner the Second Extension for completion of the Subdivision and all required public improvements for an additional year to March 1, 2017 for an additional fee of \$10,000 to be paid

by Owner prior to March 1, 2016. The Second Extension shall be approved administratively without Board review provided the extension fee is paid prior to March 1, 2016.

- 2. <u>General Provisions</u>:
 - A. <u>Notices</u>: Notice or other writings which any party is required to, or may wish to, serve upon any other party in connection with this Amendment shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

B. <u>Continuity of Obligations</u>:

(1) The provisions of this Amendment shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the Owner and its respective successors in any manner in title and shall be binding upon the Village and the successor Corporate Authorities of the Village and any successor municipality. The Owner and its successors shall at all times during the term of this Amendment remain liable to the Village for the faithful performance of all obligations imposed upon the Owner by this Amendment until such obligations have been fully performed or until the Village, at its sole option, has otherwise released the Owner from any or all of such obligations.

(2) All terms and conditions of this Amendment shall constitute covenants running with the land, and shall bind each subsequent record owner of any portion or all of the Subject Property.

C. <u>Remedies</u>: The Village, the Owner and its successors and assigns, covenant and agree that in the event of default of any of the terms, provisions or conditions of this Amendment by any of the parties, or their successors or assigns, which default exists uncorrected for a period of ten (10) days after written notice to any party to such default, the party seeking to enforce said provision shall have the right of specific performance and if said party prevails in a court of law, it shall be entitled to specific performance. It is further expressly agreed by and between the parties hereto that the remedy of specific performance herein given shall not be exclusive of any other remedy afforded by law to the parties, or their successor or successors in title.

D. <u>Survival of Representations</u>: The parties agree that the representations, warranties and recitals set forth in the preambles to this Amendment are material to this Amendment and the parties hereby confirm and admit their truth and validity and hereby incorporate such representations, warranties and recitals into this Amendment and the same shall continue during the period of this Amendment.

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E. <u>Captions and Paragraph Headings</u>: The captions and paragraph headings used herein are for convenience only and are not a part of this Amendment and shall not be used in construing it.

F. <u>Reimbursement of Village for Legal and Other Fees and Expenses:</u>

(1) <u>To Effective Date of Amendment</u>: The Owner, concurrently with the approval of this Agreement, shall reimburse the Village for the following expenses incurred in the preparation and review of this Amendment, and any ordinances, letters of credit, plats, easements or other documents relating to the Subject Property:

- (a) the costs incurred by the Village for engineering services;
- (b) all attorneys' fees incurred by the Village in connection with this Amendment; and
- (c) miscellaneous Village expenses, such as legal publication costs, recording fees and copying expenses.

(2) From and After Effective Date of Amendment: Except as otherwise expressly provided in the paragraph immediately following this paragraph, upon written demand by Village made by and through its President, the Owner from time to time but not more frequently than once a month shall promptly reimburse Village for all expenses and costs incurred by Village in the administration of this Amendment, including engineering fees, attorneys' fees and out-of-pocket expenses involving various and sundry matters such as, but not limited to, preparation and publication, if any, of all notices, resolutions, ordinances and other documents required hereunder.

Notwithstanding the immediately preceding paragraph, the Owner shall in no event be required to reimburse Village or pay for any expenses or costs of Village as aforesaid more than once, whether such are reimbursed or paid through special assessment proceedings, through fees established by Village ordinances or otherwise.

Such costs and expenses incurred by Village in the administration of the Amendment shall be evidenced to the Owner upon his request, by a sworn statement of the Village; and such costs and expenses may be further confirmed by the Owner at his option from additional documents designated from time to time by the Owner relevant to determining such costs and expenses.

In any event that any third party or parties institute any legal proceedings against the Owner and/or the Village, which relate to the terms of this Amendment, then, in that event, the Owner, on notice from Village shall assume, fully and vigorously, the entire defense of such lawsuit and all expenses of whatever nature relating thereto; provided, however:

- (a) The Owner shall not make any settlement or compromise of the lawsuit, or fail to pursue any available avenue of appeal of any adverse judgment, without the approval of the Village.
- (b) If the Village, in its sole discretion, determines there is, or may probably be, a conflict of interest between Village and the Owner, on an issue of importance to the Village having a potentially substantial adverse effect on the Village, then the Village shall have the option of being represented by its own legal counsel. In the event the Village exercises such option, then the Owner shall reimburse the Village, from time to time on written demand from the President of Village and notice of the amount due, for any expenses, including but not limited to court costs, attorneys' fees and witnesses' fees, and other expenses of litigation, incurred by the Village in connection therewith.

In the event the Village institutes legal proceedings against the Owner for violation of this Amendment and secures a judgment in its favor, the court having jurisdiction thereof shall determine and include in its judgment against the Owner all expenses of such legal proceedings incurred by Village, including but not limited to the court costs and attorneys' fees, witnesses' fees, etc., incurred by the Village in connection therewith (and any appeal thereof). The Owner may, in its sole discretion, appeal any such judgment rendered in favor of the Village against the Owner.

G. <u>No Waiver or Relinquishment of Right to Enforce Amendment</u>: Failure of either party to this Amendment to insist upon the strict and prompt performance of the terms, covenants, agreements and conditions herein contained, or any of them, upon the other party imposed, shall not constitute or be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of either party's right thereafter to enforce any such term, covenant, agreement or condition, but the same shall continue in full force and effect.

H. <u>Village Approval or Direction</u>: Where Village approval or direction is required by this Amendment, such approval or direction means the approval or direction of the Corporate Authorities of the Village unless otherwise expressly provided herein or required by law, and any such approval may be required to be given only after and if all requirements for granting such approval have been met unless such requirements are inconsistent with the express provisions of this Amendment.

I. <u>Recording</u>: This Amendment, and any subsequent amendments thereto shall be recorded by the Village in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in DuPage County, Illinois, at the expense of the Owner.

J. <u>Further Amendments</u>: This Amendment, together with the Agreement, sets forth all the promises, inducements, agreements, conditions and understandings between the parties relative to the subject matter thereof, and there are no promises, agreements, conditions or understandings, either oral or written, express or implied, between them, other than are set forth in this Amendment and the Agreement. Except as herein otherwise provided, no subsequent alteration, amendment, change or addition to this

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Amendment and/or the Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto unless authorized in accordance with law and reduced in writing and signed by them.

K. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Amendment may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

L. <u>Unamended Terms of the Agreement</u>: All provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect except as specifically amended herein.

M. <u>Definition of Village</u>: When the term Village is used herein it shall be construed as referring to the Corporate Authorities of the Village unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

- (6) To comply with all applicable Executive Orders and Federal Highway Acts pursuant to the Equal Employment Opportunity and Nondiscrimination Regulations required by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
- (7) To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General and the department; and the LA agrees to cooperate fully with any audit conducted by the Auditor General and the department; and the department; and the stabilish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- (8) To provide if required, for the improvement of any railroad-highway grade crossing and rail crossing protection within the limits of the proposed improvement.

- (10) (State Contracts Only) That the method of payment designated on page one will be as follows:
 - Method A Lump Sum Payment. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE within thirty (30) calendar days of billing, in lump sum, an amount equal to 80% of the LA's estimated obligation incurred under this Agreement. The LA will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) within thirty (30) calendar days of billing in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
 - Method B Monthly Payments. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE, a specified amount each month for an estimated period of months, or until 80% of the LA's estimated obligation under the provisions of the Agreement has been paid, and will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
 - Method C Progress Payments. Upon receipt of the contractor's first and subsequent progressive bills for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE within thirty (30) calendar days of reciept, an amount equal to the LA's share of the construction cost divided by the estimated total cost, multiplied by the actual payment (appropriately adjusted for nonparticipating costs) made to the contractor until the entire obligation incurred under this Agreement has been paid.

Failure to remit the payment(s) in a timely manner as required under Methods A, B, or C, shall allow the **STATE** to internally offset, reduce, or deduct the arrearage from any payment or reimbursement due or about to become due and payable from the **STATE** to **LA** on this or any other contract. The **STATE**, at its sole option, upon notice to the **LA**, may place the debt into the the Illinois Comptroller's Offset System (30 ILCS 105/10.05) or take such other and further action as my be required to recover the debt.

- (11) (Day Labor or Local Contracts) To provide or cause to be provided all of the initial funding, equipment, labor, material and services necessary to construct the complete project.
- (12) (Preliminary Engineering) In the event that right-of-way acquisition for, or actual construction of the project for which this preliminary engineering is undertaken with Federal participation is not started by the close of the tenth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this agreement is executed, the **LA** will repay the **STATE** any Federal funds received under the terms of this Agreement.
- (13) (Right-of-Way Acquisition) In the event that the actual construction of the project on this right-of-way is not undertaken by the close of the twentieth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this Agreement is executed, the LA will repay the STATE any Federal Funds received under the terms of this Agreement.

(14) (Railroad Related Work Only) The estimates and general layout plans for at-grade crossing improvements should be forwarded to the Rail Safety and Project Engineer, Room 204, Illinois Department of Transportation, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764. Approval of the estimates and general layout plans should be obtained prior to the commencement of railroad related work. All railroad related work is also subject to approval be the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC). Final inspection for railroad related work should be coordinated through appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Plans and preemption times for signal related work that will be interconnected with traffic signals shall be submitted to the ICC for review and approval prior to the commencement of work. Signal related work involving interconnects with state maintained traffic signals should also be coordinated with the IDOT's District Bureau of Operations.

The LA is responsible for the payment of the railroad related expenses in accordance with the LA/railroad agreement prior to requesting reimbursement from IDOT. Requests for reimbursement should be sent to the appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.

- (15) And certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief its officials:
 - (a) are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;
 - (b) have not within a three-year period preceding this Agreement been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements receiving stolen property;
 - (c) are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (Federal, State, local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in item (b) of this certification; and
 - (d) have not within a three-year period preceding the Agreement had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.
- (16) To include the certifications, listed in item 15 above and all other certifications required by State statutes, in every contract, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment.
- (17) (State Contracts) That execution of this agreement constitutes the LA's concurrence in the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the STATE.
- (18) That for agreements exceeding \$100,000 in federal funds, execution of this Agreement constitutes the LA's certification that:
 - (a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or any employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement;
 - (b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress, in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying", in accordance with its instructions;
 - (c) The LA shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all ties (including subcontracts, subgrants and contracts under grants, loans and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.
- (19) To regulate parking and traffic in accordance with the approved project report.
- (20) To regulate encroachments on public right-of-way in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (21) To regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage into any storm water drainage system constructed with this improvement in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (22) That the LA may invoice the STATE monthly for the FHWA and/or STATE share of the costs incurred for this phase of the improvement. The LA will submit supporting documentation with each request for reimbursement from the STATE. Supporting documentation is defined as verification of payment, certified time sheets, vendor invoices, vendor receipts, and other documentation supporting the requested reimbursement amount.
- (23) To complete this phase of the project within three years from the date this agreement is approved by the **STATE** if this portion of the project described in the Project Description does not exceed \$1,000,000 (five years if the project costs exceed \$1,000,000).
- (24) Upon completion of this phase of the improvement, the LA will submit to the STATE a complete and detailed final invoice with all applicable supporting supporting documentation of all incurred costs, less previous payments, no later than one year from the date of completion of this phase of the improvement. If a final invoice is not received within one year of completion of this phase of the improvement, the most recent invoice may be considered the final invoice and the obligation of the funds closed.

- (25) (Single Audit Requirements) That if the LA expends \$500,000 or more a year in federal financial assistance they shall have an audit made in accordance with the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular No. A-133. LA's that expend less than \$500,000 a year shall be exempt from compliance. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to the STATE (Office of Finance and Administration, Audit Coordination Section, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764), within 30 days after the completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the LA's fiscal year. The CFDA number for all highway planning and construction activities is 20.205.
- (26) That the LA is required to register with the System for Award Management or SAM (formerly Central Contractor Registration (CCR)), which is a web-enabled government-wide application that collects, validates, stores, and disseminates business information about the federal government's trading partners in support of the contract award and the electronic payment processes. To register or renew, please use the following website: <u>https://www.sam.gov/portal/public/SAM/#1</u>.

THE STATE AGREES:

- (1) To provide such guidance, assistance and supervision and to monitor and perform audits to the extent necessary to assure validity of the LA's certification of compliance with Titles II and III requirements.
- (2) (State Contracts) To receive bids for the construction of the proposed improvement when the plans have been approved by the STATE (and FHWA, if required) and to award a contract for construction of the proposed improvement, after receipt of a satisfactory bid.
- (3) (Day Labor) To authorize the LA to proceed with the construction of the improvement when Agreed Unit Prices are approved and to reimburse the LA for that portion of the cost payable from Federal and/or State funds based on the Agreed Unit Prices and Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.
- (4) (Local Contracts) That for agreements with Federal and/or State funds in engineering, right-of-way, utility work and/or construction work:
 - (a) To reimburse the LA for the Federal and/or State share on the basis of periodic billings, provided said billings contain sufficient cost information and show evidence of payment by the LA;
 - (b) To provide independent assurance sampling, to furnish off-site material inspection and testing at sources normally visited by **STATE** inspectors of steel, cement, aggregate, structural steel and other materials customarily tested by the **STATE**.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- (1) Construction of the project will utilize domestic steel as required by Section 106.01 of the current edition of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.
- (2) That this Agreement and the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event that the **FHWA** does not approve the proposed improvement for Federal-aid participation or the contract covering the construction work contemplated herein is not awarded within three years of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- (3) This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties, their successors and assigns.
- (4) For contracts awarded by the LA, the LA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The LA shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT assisted contracts. The LA's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by USDOT, is incorporated by reference in this Agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the department may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31U.S.C. 3801 et seq.). In the absence of a USDOT approved LA DBE Program or on State awarded contracts, this Agreement shall be administered under the provisions of the STATE's USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.
- (5) In cases where the **STATE** is reimbursing the **LA**, obligations of the **STATE** shall cease immediately without penalty or further payment being required if, in any fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly or applicable Federal Funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for the work contemplated herein.
- (6) All projects for the construction of fixed works which are financed in whole or in part with funds provided by this Agreement and/or amendment shall be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) unless the provisions of that Act exempt its application

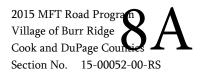

AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is entered into this <u>23rd</u> day of <u>March</u>, <u>2015</u>, by and between the VILLAGE OF BURR RIDGE and <u>Timothy M. Lesniak</u> (hereinafter referred to as the Employee) for the assignment of the financial responsibilities of the parties hereto for expenses incurred in training, equipping and uniforming Employee as a police officer for the Village of Burr Ridge (sometimes the "Village").

WHEREAS, the Village of Burr Ridge desires to have Employee occupy the position of police officer with the Village of Burr Ridge; and

WHEREAS, Employee shall begin employment with the Village on March 23, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Employee shall be a probationary police officer for a period of 18 months after successful completion of the minimum standards basic law enforcement training program approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board (hereinafter referred to as "Basic Training Academy") or certification as a law enforcement officer by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board, which ever comes last, said probationary period being subject to the Village of Burr Ridge Board of Fire and Police Commissioners' Rules and Regulations; and

WHEREAS, as a police officer, Employee will be required to undergo various training, including but not limited to successful completion of the Basic Training Academy; and

WHEREAS, Employee is required to be certified as a law enforcement officer by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board (hereinafter referred to as "Police Training Board") within 6 months of initial full-time employment pursuant to the Illinois Police Training Act, 50 ILCS 705/8.1; and

WHEREAS, a number of the training courses are located outside of the immediate area of the Village of Burr Ridge, in such locations as Champaign, Chicago, and Springfield, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Burr Ridge Police Department personnel will expend significant time and effort training Employee throughout his/her probationary period in the Police Department's Field Training Officer's Program and other training; and

WHEREAS, as a probationary police officer, Employee shall be required to wear and/or maintain a Burr Ridge Police Department uniform and equipment, including but not necessarily limited to the following identified items: shirts, slacks, jackets, raincoats, other outerwear, head gear, badges, department-issued firearm, department identification, bullet-proof vest, and leather goods; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to equitably assess between them the costs of the above training, uniform and equipment expenses subject to Employee's continued employment with the Burr Ridge Police Department, as defined in this Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

The Provisions stated in the preamble above are incorporated herein and made Section 1. operative provisions hereof, as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. The Village hereby employs Employee as a police officer and Employee hereby accepts such employment in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Employee shall commence work hereunder on the 23rd day of March, 2015. Section 3.

The initial services to be performed by Employee shall be those of a police officer Section 4. trainee until successful completion of the Basic Training Academy and certification as a law enforcement officer by the Police Training Board, and thereafter as those of a probationary Village of Burr Ridge police officer.

Section 5. The Village may terminate this Agreement at any time based upon Employee's violation of instructions, policies, ordinances or rules of the Village, violation of rules of the Basic Training Academy, failure to attend classes as may be required during training without an adequate excuse, failure to successfully complete any training which the Burr Ridge Police Department deems necessary, or for any cause whatsoever during the probationary period (during which period such Employee shall be an employee at will only).

Section 6. Employee agrees to successfully complete any training which the Burr Ridge Police Department deems necessary.

Section 7. Upon employment and until successful completion of the Basic Training Academy and certification as a law enforcement officer by the Police Training Board, the Village shall pay Employee a salary at the rate of \$59,054.00 per year in accordance with this Agreement. The payments will be bi-weekly.

Upon the successful completion of the Basic Training Academy and certification Section 8. as a law enforcement officer by the Police Training Board, the Village shall pay Employee a salary at a rate of \$59,054.00 per year, in accordance with this Agreement. The payments will be made bi-weekly. Subsequent increases in salary shall be based upon Village and Police Department policy.

The Village shall advance, on behalf of Employee, all expenses attendant with the Section 9. costs of said uniforms, equipment, and training, including the costs associated with the Basic Training Academy and training conducted by Burr Ridge Police Department personnel at or Recruit Agreement - Lesniak 2

about the Village of Burr Ridge, and any other direct or indirect charges to which the Village agrees in writing.

<u>Section 10.</u> Employee agrees to work in the capacity of police officer for the Village for a period of not less than two years from and after the date of successful completion of the Basic Training Academy or certification as a law enforcement officer by the Police Training Board, whichever occurs last, and in no event shall Employee's wage be reduced below the statutory minimum hourly wage in order to collect the amount owed in Section 11 below.

<u>Section 11.</u> If Employee terminates by any means employment as a police officer with the Village in breach of the terms set forth in section 10 above, Employee agrees to reimburse the Village, as agreed liquidated damages, for all expenses incurred by the Village in Employee's training, uniforming and equipping. Such expenses shall include but are not limited to the cost of Employee's training, including the cost of the Basic Training Academy, the salaries of Burr Ridge Police Department personnel conducting Employee's field or other training, as well as equipment provided to Employee and the cost of Employee's uniforms. Further, Employee shall return to the Village, in as good a condition as when initially received, any department-issued firearm(s), and any and all badges, identification and/or other materials, containing the insignia and/or name of the Village of Burr Ridge or Burr Ridge Police Department, which shall be used as a credit, after appropriate depreciation, against the reimbursement costs provided in this section.

<u>Section 12.</u> Upon completion of the first full year that Employee works in the capacity of police officer for the Village after the date determined in Section 10, Employee will receive a credit of 50% against the reimbursement costs that have accrued and are subject to assessment in Section 11.

<u>Section 13.</u> If Employee fails, after due notice, to reimburse the Village in accordance with the provisions of Section 11, Employee shall be liable for the Village's costs to file suit and any and all attorneys fees necessary to bring suit based upon Employee's breach of this Agreement. Such costs shall be in addition to the reimbursement costs provided in Section 11 above

<u>Section 14</u> No repayment will be required in the event that Employee is required to terminate employment due to a disabling illness or injury.

<u>Section 15.</u> The waiver by the Village of a breach of any provision of this Agreement by Employee shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach by Employee.

<u>Section 16.</u> Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to prohibit the Village from pursuing any other remedies for such breach.

<u>Section 17.</u> If any clause or provision herein shall be and judged invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction or by operation of any applicable laws, it shall not affect the validity of any other clause or provision, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Recruit Agreement - Lesniak

Section 18. This Agreement shall be governed by the law of the State of Illinois.
