ADVISORY BOARDS & COMMITTEES

BOARD OF FIRE & POLICE COMMISSIONERS

MEETS: 2nd Wednesday - 7:00 p.m.

Duties of the Commission include the screening of all police officer candidates as well as screening for department promotions, as set forth by state law. The Mayor and Board of Trustees determine the need for additional or replacement personnel on the Police Department; however, they have no input on the selection of police officer candidates (except in the case of the Chief of Police and Deputy Chiefs of Police). The Board of Fire & Police Commissioners maintains an eligibility list from which officers are hired. The two fire protection districts serving Burr Ridge manage their own hiring since they are separate governmental entities.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

MEETS: 1st Wednesday in January, April, July, & October - 6:00 p.m.

The mission of the Economic Development Committee (EDC) is to strengthen the Village's business climate by being an active partner with local businesses, investors, and residents. The EDC strengthens economic development in the Village by enhancing business retention, expansion, and attraction programs; the creation and implementation of economic development plans and policies; being business ambassadors to the community; and coordinating with other government entities on business opportunities.

PLAN COMMISSION & ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS

MEETS: 1st & 3rd Monday - 7:00 p.m.

Members of the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals attend meetings twice a month. This Board hears all requests for zoning text amendments, rezoning, special uses and variations and forwards recommendations to the Board of Trustees. The Commission also reviews all proposals to subdivide property and is charged with Village planning, including the updating of the Comprehensive Plan.

POLICE PENSION BOARD

MEETS: 2nd Tuesday in January, April, July & October - 7:00 p.m.

The Police Pension Board administers the pension fund of the police officers. Two members of this Board are residents appointed by the Village with the remaining comprised of police officers.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

MEETS: 2nd Tuesday in February, May, August, November - 7:00 p.m.

The Stormwater Management Committee is charged with evaluating any activity, project, or development's impact on the Village's storm water system and reporting their findings to the Board of Trustees.

STREET AND PATHWAY COMMITTEE

MEETS: As Needed

Members of the Street and Pathway Commission help plan and maintain the Village's pathways and roadways by making recommendations to the Board of Trustees. Members consist of residents and elected officials.
