# “Why”

## Why Consider A Possible Franchise Agreement?

1. Safety
2. Reduction in waste hauling trucks, which will result in less wear and tear on Village streets, less fuel consumed, less emissions, and less noise.
3. Cost savings for residents
4. Enhanced recycling, other environmentally friendly program offerings.

# “What”

## Comparison of Garbage Trucks Street Impact to Resident Vehicles Street Impact

1 Garbage Truck = 1,279 Passenger Cars\*

1 Recycle Truck = 274 Passenger Cars\*

### Without Franchise Agreement

8 trucks per week – 1 garbage,  
1 recycle, 4 haulers

### With Franchise Agreement

2 trucks per week – 1 garbage,  
1 recycle, 1 hauler

*(3 Garbage trucks and 3 Recycle trucks  
eliminated per week)*

### Compare To Passenger Cars:

$(3 \text{ Garbage Trucks} \times 1,279) + (3 \text{ Recycle Trucks} \times 274) = 4,659 \text{ passenger car trips}$

Subdivision of 80 homes = 480 round trips/day = 3,360 trips per week  
(80 homes x 3 cars/home x 2 round trips/day)

$4,659 \text{ passenger car trips} / 3,360 \text{ resident trips} = 1.4$

***Eliminating 6 garbage trucks per week impacts streets 1.4 times as much as the residents impact their streets. Less wear and tear on the streets.***

# “Who” To Whom Would We Award A Franchise Agreement?

The Village Received 6 Proposals From Garbage Haulers. The Lowest Quote Was From Groot Industries.

| 6) Flood Brothers       | \$30.75/mo |

<b>NOTES:</b>			
Twice per week pickup will not be offered			
All households will be required to sign up for refuse collection			
Residents will be allowed to suspend refuse service if they are away for more than 30 days			
Contractor will handle billing on a quarterly basis (\$16.85 x 3 = \$50.55/quarter)			
If this program is ultimately approved by the Village Board and a Franchise awarded to Groot Industries, it is anticipated that the program would start on August 1, 2017.

April 5	Meeting with HOA Representatives
April 12	Meeting with Residents
April 20	Meeting With Residents
April 24 or May 1	Scavenger Franchise Agreement Subcommittee Meets to Make Recommendation to the Village Board whether or not to proceed.
May 8	Board Decision Concerning Award Of Agreement
August 1	New Refuse Collection Program Begins





# HOA Opt-Out

Homeowners' Associations with existing scavenger contracts may choose a one-time option to opt out of the Village's franchise contract. Qualifying HOAs will have 30 days from the date of a signed contract between the Village and a qualified scavenger company to notify the Village in writing of its decision to opt out. Thereafter, there will be no opportunity to opt out and all HOAs (with the exception of Homeowners' Associations where residents do not place their garbage on the curb for pick up and provide communal garbage collection) will be subject to the provisions of the franchise contract. HOAs that agree to opt out will be allowed a one-time option to permanently opt back in.
