Village Highlights and Updates

New Village Hall Front Doors: The Village Hall received a small but long overdue facelift with the installation of new front doors. Public Works Crew Leader John Wernimont coordinated the purchase and installation of the doors. The old doors were original to the building but had a poor locking mechanism, were very drafty, and were unwieldy for some visitors to operate due to their weight. The new doors are a big improvement, adding more natural light to the front entrance and foyer and are much lighter and simpler to open.

FY2023 Budget Update: Data collection and analysis of department-level budgets has been completed, with Finance staff and I planning to meet several times during the week of February 7 to perform a final true-up of the overall budget architecture. The budget will be publicly released on February 25 with a budget workshop scheduled for 5:30pm on Monday, March 14 prior to the regularly scheduled Board meeting. Further updates will follow in the coming weeks.

DMMC Annual Luncheon: The DuPage Mayors and Managers Annual Legislative Reception and Luncheon is scheduled for Monday, February 28 starting at 11:30 am at the Double Tree in Lisle. 

This edition of the *Statehouse Briefing* provides weekly bills of concern, an announcement of funding opportunities for infrastructure improvements, region-specific technical assistance from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) and an approaching deadline for municipal employers from Illinois OSHA.

Governor's SFY 2023 Budget Address

As is the case in advance of each state budget address, Illinois Municipal League (IML) Executive Director Brad Cole will receive a briefing from senior administration officials to provide details about what to expect when Governor JB Pritzker releases his budget proposal on Wednesday, February 2. IML will share a comprehensive summary of the budget address and information important to cities, villages and towns through an email update to be sent immediately after the Governor's speech.

U.S. Senators Announce New Upcoming Funding Opportunities for Infrastructure Improvements

On January 21, U.S. Senators Dick Durbin (D-IL) and Tammy Duckworth (D-IL) announced 25 upcoming infrastructure grant opportunities for local governments as a result of the *Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act* (IIJA). Local governments throughout Illinois will be able to apply for funding to improve roads, bridges, public transit, water infrastructure, broadband access and more. In addition to these grant opportunities, Illinois will receive more than \$17 billion in dedicated funding as a result of the IIJA. DCEO Offering Regional Assistance with ARPA Funds

DCEO's Office of Regional Economic Development is offering region-specific technical assistance sessions to Non-Entitlement Units (NEUs) who received Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021.

The sessions will provide an overview of the program and examples of eligible uses such as revenue replacement, addressing negative economic impacts on households and upgrading public infrastructure and broadband expansion. This sessions will also include information about the <u>Final Rule (available via this link)</u> issued by the U.S. Department of the Treasury to use a standard allowance for revenue loss up to \$10 million.

OSHA Deadline for Local Government Employers to Post 2021 Injury and Illness Data

The deadline for local government employers to post 2021 data about work-related injuries and illnesses is February 1, 2022. Specifically, the <u>OSHA Form 300A</u>, <u>Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses (available via this link)</u>, must be posted in every state and local government establishment by this date. Establishments meeting certain criteria must also electronically report their 2021 Form 300A data by March 2. <u>A press release from the Illinois Department of Labor, with additional information, is available via this link</u>.
