### Paragraph Example:

The Calhoun County Broadband Task Force is urging the public to check their home address on national FCC internet maps to see if the information provided is accurate. In some cases, Internet Service Providers say that they cover certain areas of our county but residents find that that's not the case. This FCC Map Challenge process is an opportunity to ensure the data used to make decisions about federal broadband funds is accurate. There are numerous places in Calhoun County that lack access to any wired internet services. Improving access in those places relies on accurate national internet maps by the FCC.
