Candidate shall be a resident and registered voter of the county in which election is sought and shall remain a resident and registered voter to hold his/her office, if elected. Nominations and elections for county offices shall be by partisan elections.

Primary Election: August 6, 2024
General Election: November 5, 2024
Election Cycle: November 20, 2024 through November 7, 2028, 4 Year Term

Filing Official: Calhoun County Clerk-Election's Office located at 315 W. Green Street, Marshall, Michigan; Room 2-100; office hours: Monday-Thursday, 8:00am to 5:00pm, Fri, 8:00am – 12pm

- **Candidates seeking the Republican Party or Democratic Party nomination**

The filing deadline for a partisan candidate is **APRIL 23, 2024, 4:00 pm**. A complete filing includes an [Affidavit of Identity](#) AND either **Partisan Nominating Petitions** or a **Non-Refundable \$100 filing fee**. *Candidates cannot alter the AOI after filing. If there is an error, the candidate must refile.*

Under Michigan's Campaign Finance Act, a candidate may not have any outstanding notices of Failure to File, or late filing fees with any filing official in the state as of the date the affidavit is executed.

*Withdrawal: the deadline for withdrawing a candidate filing for party nominations is **April 26, 2024, 4:00pm**. The withdrawal must be in writing and must be filed with your County Clerk.*

- **'No Party Affiliation' candidates**

The filing deadline for candidates without political party affiliation is **JULY 18, 2024, 4:00 pm**. A complete filing includes an [Affidavit of Identity](#) AND [Qualifying Petitions](#).

Under Michigan's Campaign Finance Act, a candidate may not have any outstanding notices of Failure to File, or late filing fees with any filing official in the state as of the date the affidavit is executed.

*Withdrawal: the deadline for withdrawing a no party affiliation candidate filing is **July 22, 2024, 4:00pm**. The withdrawal must be in writing and must be filed with your Township Clerk.*

- **For write-in candidates**

A candidate who wishes to seek the **Republican Party** or **Democratic Party** nomination to the office of county commissioner with write-in votes must file a [Declaration of Intent](#) with our County Clerk-Election's office in Marshall no later than **4:00 pm on JULY 26, 2024**.

A candidate who wishes to seek election for a County Office with 'No Party Affiliation' write-in votes must file a [Declaration of Intent](#) with our County Clerk-Election's office in Marshall no later than **OCTOBER 25, 2024, 4:00 pm** to be eligible for the November 5, 2024 general election.

CAMPAIGN FINANCE: All candidates for the office of County Commissioner are required to comply with the [Campaign Finance Act](#) filing requirements, and file with the County.

All filings for public office are public record. All candidates who file for office are listed at the Elections Office webpage: [Calhoun County, MI \(calhouncountymi.gov\)](#). *Candidates are responsible to visit the website to confirm all candidate listing information is correct & notify The Elections Office if any corrections are required.*

PETITION SIGNATURE REQUIREMENT CHART

The following "population based" signature requirements apply to certain federal and all state offices, judicial offices, county offices (including county commissioner), township offices (including offices elected in charter townships), city offices (unless otherwise set by charter) and village offices (unless otherwise set by charter). See notes following chart for information on petition signature requirements established for candidates who seek school board positions; intermediate school board positions; community college trustee positions; district library board positions; and city, township and village library board positions. MCL 168.544f.
