The question was asked, is there good strong evidence-based support for school nursing, and what do school nurse programs in Kalamazoo County look like? Kalamazoo County does not have a lot of services in regards to school nurses. There is not a lot of evidence-based information. The National Association of School Nurses (NASN) recognizes the need and that development of evidence-based criteria should occur at this level to support school nurse services.

Health Officer's Report

Pessell presented the Health Officer report. The report included:

- Albion resident diagnosed and treated for Campylobacter, a foodborne illness, and Giardia, a protozoan typically found in areas with contaminated water
- Nurse-Family Partnership is showing a decrease in caseload, Pessell not concerned
- Introduction of Kevin Green, Environmental Health Manager
- The question was asked why the CCPHD is not using EPIC, an Electronic Medical Records (EMR) system used by most hospitals. Crawford mentioned EPIC may not have a module that supports the work of the Health Department. All EMR systems should be able to interact with each other
- Pessell presented on Vapor Intrusion at the Premier Public Health Conference
- There have been zero unsafe sleep related deaths in 2017
- STD rates continue to rise in Calhoun County. No real answer as to why. Age 18-29 is the highest rating group
- No longer differentiating between non-profit and for-profit organizations within the Environmental Health fee schedule
