





# **2022 Demographics**

## **HIGHLIGHTS**





705 homebound seniors received 43,031 home delivered meals



557 seniors took 19,947 rides to medical appointments, grocery shopping and to socialize



484 older adults exercised 9,176 times at 11 sites throughout Calhoun County



386 seniors received homecare 7,818 times in the Community Care Options program

286 seniors received dental care - cleanings, fillings, extractions and dentures

145 home repairs were made serving 172 older adults

(C 106 older adults received hearing aids, reducing their risk for developing dementia

## JOANNE KONKLE AWARD



The 2022 Joanne Konkle Lifetime Leadership Award was given to Chuck Asher, retiring chief operations officer for Community Action and Cathie Davids, a longtime Meals on Wheels volunteer for Milestone Senior Services. Chuck has been with Community Action for 12 years and is a retired firefighter. Cathie has been volunteering with Milestone for over a decade.

### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 2022 saw the return of the Calhoun County Senior Fair at a new location, the Kellogg Arena on September 8, hosting 98 vendors and nearly 400 participants.
- The first **Tekonsha Senior Health & Safety Fair** was held on October 6 at the Tekonsha Fire Station with 41 vendors and 147 people attending.



- **301 free Merry Mile** coupons redeemed by seniors to drive through the lights display at the Calhoun County Fairgrounds.
- Senior Day at the Calhoun County Fair was well attended with over 690 people enjoying the activities. Hosted by Senior Times; Calhoun County Senior Services is one of the proud sponsors of this event.
- The Centenarian Project had over 40 people, 99 years and over, participate in this celebration of aging project. We documented the life story of 18 new centenarians and 13 centenarians attended the July celebration along with their families. BluFish, the company who provided the photography for the portraits, put together an **art exhibit** of 10 seniors from the project at the **Eastend Studio & Gallery** in Marshall.
