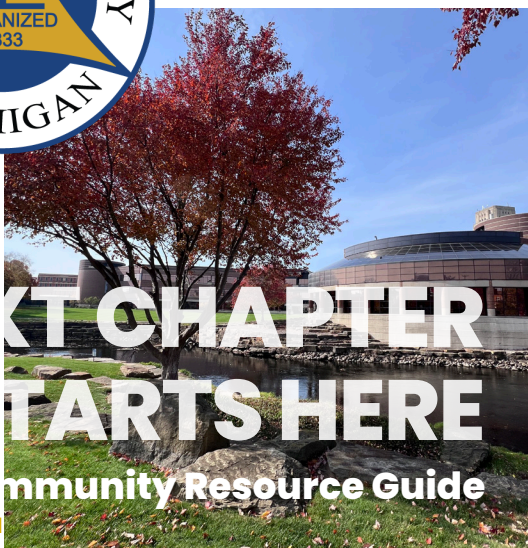

## Calhoun County Government Serving You and Building a Better Community

Welcome to Calhoun County, where government services are designed to support and enhance the quality of life for all residents. From public safety to public health, our local government is dedicated to meeting the diverse needs of our growing community.

Our largest focus is ensuring county-wide safety and justice through vital offices like the **Sheriff's Office, Prosecutor's Office, Courts, Youth Center, and Public Defender's Office**. The **Public Health Department** also works tirelessly to keep our residents healthy, offering services like restaurant inspections, well and septic permitting, immunizations, and school nursing programs.

What makes Calhoun County unique? Unlike most counties in Michigan, we own and manage our local and primary road systems through an internal **Road Department**, allowing us to prioritize road maintenance and improvements efficiently. Plus, our **Community Development Office** is available to assist residents, local governments, and businesses, while our special offices for seniors and veterans ensure tailored support for those who need it most.

Residents have a say in how their county is run. Every four years, voters elect one of seven members of the **Board of Commissioners** to represent their district. In addition, voters select five county-wide officials every four years, including the Prosecutor, Sheriff, Water Resources Commissioner, Treasurer, and Clerk and Register of Deeds. Judges for the District, Probate, and Circuit Courts are elected nonpartisan positions serving six-year terms.

Calhoun County is also passionate about **parks and outdoor spaces**. Thanks to community support for a parks millage, we continue to enhance our county-owned parks and trails, including a 5.5-mile hiking and biking trail in Emmett Township that connects to national trail systems. In collaboration with the Calhoun County Visitors Bureau, we're also investing in tourism and athletic events, ensuring that there's always something exciting happening.

We're committed to responsible resource management, offering a county-wide **Recycling and Solid Waste program** with year-round collections and a free recycling opportunity for residents at the C&C Landfill, Marshall, and various townships locations.



The **County Treasurer's Office** helps manage our financial health and offers programs to assist those experiencing difficulty paying property taxes. **Senior Services** supports older adults in Calhoun County via a wide range of programs and services, including meal programs, transportation, and recreational activities to keep seniors active and engaged. The county also provides guidance for healthcare, housing, and wellness programs to ensure a high quality of life for older residents.

Since 2021, Calhoun County has been leading the charge to bring affordable, reliable, **high-speed internet** to all residents, including those in rural areas—a game-changer for community access and quality of life.

We've expanded our **online services** to make life easier for residents, offering everything from online payments and records requests to job applications and live-streaming of Board of Commissioners meetings.

In Calhoun County, several waste management providers offer a **variety of services** for residential and commercial needs, such as weekly trash pickup, recycling, bulk waste disposal, and yard waste collection. Albion, Battle Creek, Marshall, Springfield, and Tekonsha operate **single-hauler contracts**. Marshall also runs a **compost center** where residents from Marshall, Marshall Township, Marengo Township, Eckford Township, and Fredonia Township, can purchase a pass or punch card at City Hall. Additionally, Convis Township residents have access to **trash and recycling services** at the C&C Landfill. 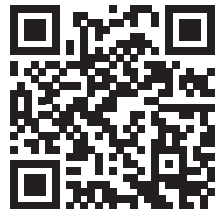

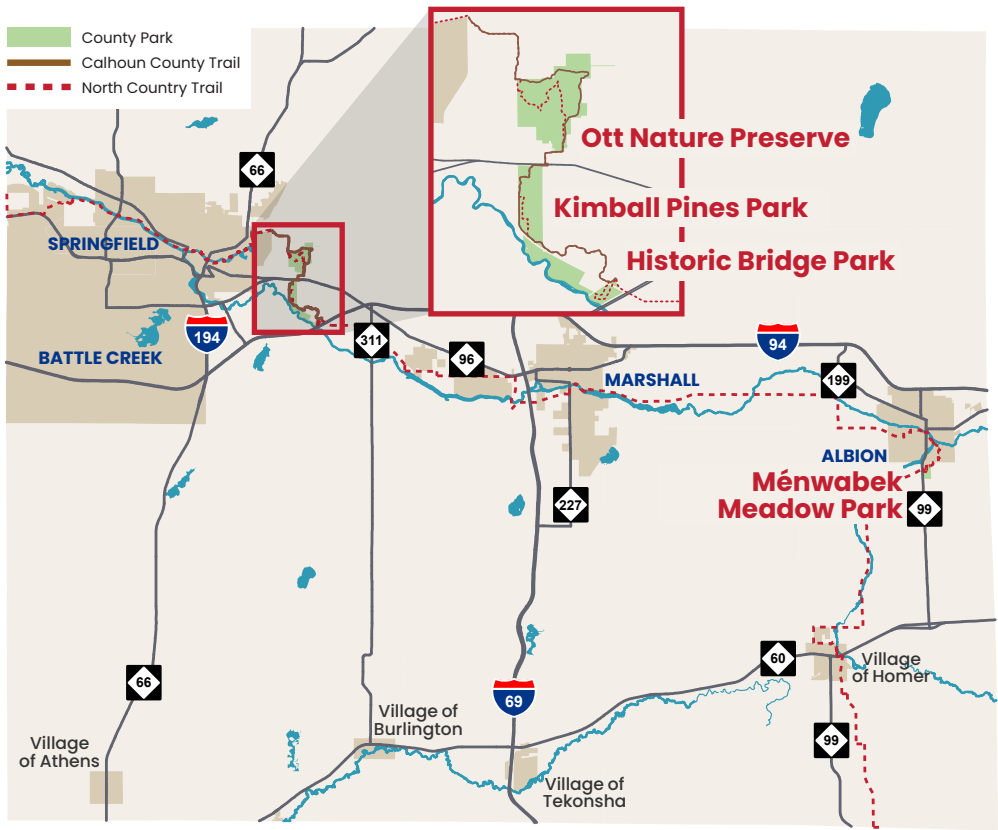

## County Parks

Calhoun County is home to a variety of beautiful parks that provide ample opportunities for outdoor recreation and relaxation. The county's park system includes unique spaces like **Historic Bridge Park**, known for its picturesque setting and preserved historic bridges, and the **Ott Biological Preserve**, offering scenic hiking trails and rich biodiversity. With spaces like **Kimball Pines Park** and the serene **Ménwabek Meadow Park**, residents and visitors can enjoy everything from picnics and family outings to hiking, biking, and wildlife observation. Additionally, the **Calhoun County Trail** spans 5.5 miles, offering bikers and hikers a scenic route that connects parklands, links to Kalamazoo and Jackson County's Linear trails, and serves as part of the **Iron Belle** and **Great Lake-to-Lake** trail networks.

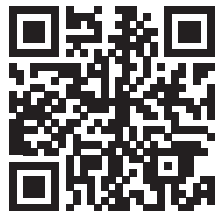

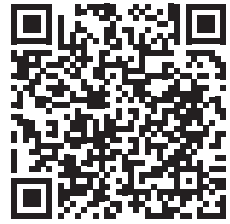

# Transportation

## Ride Calhoun/Transit Authority of Calhoun County

With the recent voter-approved millage, Calhoun County has established the **Transportation Authority of Calhoun County (TACC)** and introduced **Ride Calhoun** to enhance public transportation options. A new 2.66 mill tax will fund TACC from 2024 through 2028, generating an estimated \$5 million annually to cover operating and capital expenses. This initiative aims to provide comprehensive transit services for seniors, veterans, individuals with disabilities, and non-drivers across Calhoun County, including new and expanded services in the cities of Albion, Battle Creek, Marshall, and Springfield.

## Bus System

**Battle Creek Transit** provides regular bus routes and services to area residents within the City of Battle Creek, and limited stops to surrounding townships. **Tele-Transit** is a door-to-door service provided to area residents (primarily ADA Certified customers) within the City of Battle Creek, City of Springfield, and limited portions of townships.

## BCGo

**BCGo** is an innovative on-demand transportation pilot program designed to test flexible transit options in Calhoun County. Supported by a **Michigan Department of Transportation grant**, BCGo operates for a full year to give residents a convenient, adaptable travel solution. Operated by **Battle Creek Transit** in collaboration with other local agencies, BCGo utilizes a unified app and dispatch system to ensure seamless service.

## Dial-A-Ride Transit

Since 1974, **Dial-A-Ride Transit (DART)** has provided reliable curb-to-curb transportation in Marshall, serving residents with trips for work, healthcare, shopping, and more. Accessible for all, **DART** buses come equipped with wheelchair lifts or ramps.

## Culture & Diversity
