



# In the matter of probationary officer Marty Effert's status:

- It came to the attention of City Attorney Captain and Chief Styka earlier this week that, due to a discrepancy between state and federal policy on the matter, Probationary Officer Effert was declared ineligible to carry a weapon by the federal authorities. Ability to carry a weapon is a condition of employment for a City of Menasha police officer.
- > The issue relates to what was determined to be disqualifying criminal history from more than a decade ago.
- Upon learning this, City Attorney Captain (acting in her role as City of Menasha Human Resources Director) and Chief Styka immediately placed probationary officer on paid administrative leave. Once the state authorities confirmed the federal authorities' findings, officer Effert's status was changed to unpaid administrative leave.
- Probationary Officer Effert is working to resolve the matter with state officials as well as the prosecutor's office and judge that initially dealt with the incident in question.
- The issue before the Commission was whether to terminate Probationary Officer Effert or allow him to remain on unpaid administrative leave for a specified period of time pending resolution.
- Given the likelihood this would conclude in a tie vote, Ron Duuck motioned that the matter be tabled until the full commission could reconvene. Jason Dionne seconded the motion which was unanimously supported.

Adjourn: Motion by Jason Dionne, seconded by Tony Gutierrez, at 5:25 pm. The motion was unanimously carried.

Subject: 1) Habitat destruction in HWR's Wildlife Preserve located at the southwest corner of the Reserve, and 2) problems with vandals/trespassing along HWR's west side adjacent to the bike trail.

Dear Mayor Merkes and Brian Tungate:

About two years ago, we met and discussed the unfortunate problem of vandals/trespassers along HWR's west side. At that time, HWR was proposing to install a 4' high fence generally about 4' to 10' east of the east edge of the bike trail, with HWR responsible for maintaining the areas east of the HWR fence and the City responsible for the area west of the HWR fence.

HWR agreed to postpone the fence construction until we tried a) HWR installing a reasonable number of "No Trespassing" signs and b) the City increasing police patrols in the area. Also, the City had intentions to build an 8' high chain link fence with barbed wire on top to protect the City garage site, which has been completed.

It was HWR's understanding that we had mutually agreed with the City to keep the area status quo for the trial period. Then, without contacting HWR first, the City cleared brush away from the trail in the Wildlife Preserve Area. Again we thought there was an understanding for no more cutting by the city.

We were shocked that the City recently cut/trimmed 16 (or more) trees in the Wildlife Preserve Area, again without first discussing it with us. This is an inexcusable act that significantly increases potential problems for the Reserve. We are upset (to say the least).

Conclusion: HWR now considers that the trial situation has failed because problems now are worse than they were two years ago. The Reserve will proceed with a fence.

HWR's fence construction schedule will generally be:

- 1. HWR's Site Committee will meet ASAP to finalize a resolution about building the fence that will be presented at our June 27, 2012 board meeting. Note: Most of HWR's directors are aware of this situation. Several Directors want a 6' high minimum fence, so that issue will be addressed and included in the resolution.
- 2. HWR will seek fence and fence financing approval from the HWR Board on June 27, 2012. Construction will proceed as directed.

There are two fence location alternatives that are under consideration:

#### Fence Location Alternate 1

The location would generally be as shown on sketches and as discussed about two years ago. It would extend from the east end of the existing City fence at the railroad crossing area it would "parallel" the bike trail and be  $\pm 4$  (at the existing fence end) and be up to  $\pm 10$  east of



the east edge of the bike trail. It would extend north to beyond HWR's west gate, and possibly as far as the split rail fence at the NW corner of the Reserve.

This is HWR's preferred location for the fence. In our opinion, this is the best location from a practical and esthetic standpoint. As such, some of the fence would be constructed on City property.

<u>City Action Requested</u>. HWR would appreciate a written response from the City before HWR's next board meeting on June 27, 2012 with the City's approval for HWR to proceed with the fence as per this alternative.

# Fence Location - Alternate 2

HWR would proceed to construct the fence entirely on HWR control property along designated property lines. It would start at the edge of Lopas Pond (in the vicinity of the railroad bridge) and go due north, then it would go westerly crossing the bike trail and ending at the corner of the existing City Fence near the 90 degree bike trail corner. HWR's compromises with this alternative are the loss of Wildlife Preserve area and more expensive fence construction. In fairness, HWR requests that the City remove the north-south segment of the bike trail immediately south of Plank Road (which was constructed on HWR controlled property by the City without HWR permission). HWR could then convert the reclaimed area to Wildlife Preserve.

The HWR Board recognizes that this is a poor second to Alternate 1, but it would be in HWR's best interest if the City rejects Alternate 1.

The Reserve will be awaiting your response as requested above.

First, the letter you sent out did NOT give adequate notice for those of us working to attend the most important of two meetings. You and I both know that most people can not attend a meeting last minute due to work obligations with only a few days notice and therefore, the first meeting should have been scheduled during pm hours. The following are very serious concerns I have regarding this plan after reviewing the following:

My husband and I purchased this property mainly because of the view we have and the fact that our back yard faces an undeveloped area. By developing this area I feel you are significantly decreasing my property value by placing bungolows basically in my back yard with a road very near by. The properties across the street already have difficulty selling as their back yards face the water treatment plants, now ours will be facing multiples dwellings. Who is responsible for the value loss we will definatley see when we go to sell?? I can assure you this will NOT be a selling point!! My husband and I have always felt that our current back yard and view would be of great interest to potential buyers.

I am also concerned about the safety of our children. Their are MANY children living in the homes along our street. If you place another road this close to our back yard we now have the issue of living in between two roads, increased vehicles, as well as the potential risks to our children living so close to deep waters with in these ponds. Along with these ponds brings more mosquitoes and birds to defecate on our properties.

I would also like to know what the cost of living in one of these dwellings would be?? Will this bring in low budget rentals and or housing and less than desirable individuals to our neighbor hood. With this many dwellings we are sure to have a drastic increase in vehicles which means a lot more noise. Again, we moved here for the quietness and serenity our back yard currently brings. Attached are the June 5, 2012 election results for the City of Menasha. When figuring the percentage of voters I use the number of pre-registered voters plus the number of election day registrations and divide by the total number that voted on June 5. City wide the percentage of people that voted was 68%.

On June 7, 2012 the Appleton Post Crescent listed the percentage of people that voted on June 5 for the City of Menasha as 43%. The numbers they used were the number of residence of voting age divided by the total number of people that voted on June 5. I contacted the reporter that wrote the article to confirm the numbers. He informed me they used population numbers compiled by the Wisconsin State Legislature that give the voting age population from the 2010 census. They used the number for the Town of Menasha and not the City of Menasha. The correct number for City of Menasha voting age population according to the 2010 census is 13,055 which would give the City of Menasha a 52.7% turnout of voting age residence.

Financing from Board of Commissioners of Public Lands

Included on your Common Council agenda are a number of resolutions authorizing borrowing from the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands (BCPL). Although the total amount of the resolutions is \$28,897,003, the actual amount of "new" General Obligation debt for the City is \$350,000. The \$350,000 is the amount needed to perform the work approved at the last Council meeting for Contract 2012-02.

The remainder of the borrowings are to put into place long term financing for some TIF districts and more importantly, to reduce interest rates on existing General Obligation Debt.

The City has five outstanding bond issues and promissory notes totaling \$7,470,000 which have balloon payments coming due in August and September of this year and September of 2013. The current debt has interest rates ranging from 2.90% to 6.40% with the refinancing rates ranging from 2.75% to 4.00%. These bond issues are for the refurbishing of the library, the loan for Advanced Tooling Specialists and TIFs # 6, 7, 8 and 9.

The balance of the borrowing is to refinance General Obligation debt already placed with the BCPL. The Board has a program which allows for a municipality to refinance current debt with the BCPL if "new" debt exceeds 25% of the "old" debt to be refinanced. In this case it does so the City is in a position to refinance \$17,000,000 of G.O. debt issued for the Steam Utility from rates of 5.00% to 5.50% down to 4.00%, reduce Water Utility debt

rates from 5.00% to 4.00% and reduce interest on other City public works and TIF debt from 3.75% to 3.00%.

Timing is very important on this entire refinancing in that the bond issues would need to be called by August 1st for payment on September 1<sup>st</sup>. That resolution would come before the Council during the month of July. I would recommend that the Council approve the resolutions for the refinancing with the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands at this meeting.

# DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MENASHA AND CR STRUCTURES GROUP INCORPORATED

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of May June, 2012, by and between the City of Menasha (the "City") and CR Structures Group Incorporated (CR Structures).

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the development of a residential subdivision on Property commonly known as Bowe Property (the "Property), City of Menasha Parcel #0-00734-00 and Calumet County Parcel #010-0000-0000000-0-201807-00-420C, located at W7011 Manitowoc Road, is desirable for the City; and

WHEREAS, CR Structures has agreed to development of the Property within the City;

WHEREAS, A concept plan for the development is attached as Exhibit A


NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. CR Structures will be allowed to develop the Property in phases and will develop the Property in as timely a manner as possible.
- 2. It is acknowledged that development of the Property requires a zoning classification of R2A. The City will initiate R2A zoning for Parcel B.
- 3. The City will cooperate with CR Structures in the platting and development of residential lots on the Property.
- 4. CR Structures may install all infrastructure, so long as the City has the authority to inspect such infrastructure during construction.
- 5. The City will pay to CR Structures the actual cost of infrastructure within 30 days of the receipt of any billing for such infrastructure. The cost of the infrastructure will not exceed that price which the City would have paid had it installed the infrastructure. CR Structures shall advise the City as to the firm cost within 90 days after installation of the infrastructure.
- 6. The City will levy a special assessment for infrastructure which shall be due and payable at the time of the sale of that lot, or pursuant to the City's deferred special assessment policy.
- 7. At the City's request, CR Structures will cause the owner of Parcel A to sign a Notice of Intent to Circulate an Annexation Petition and Petition for Annexation for Parcel A which will provide a zoning classification of R2A for the property designated Parcel A. Such notices and petitions may include additional non-consenting property as allowed by State law and inter-municipal agreement between the City and the Town of Harrison.
- 8. The City acknowledges that certain variance (including street width and cul du sac radii) from the subdivision ordinance are required to enable the development of the Property. The City will not unreasonably withhold approval of such variances.

- 9. CR Structures obligations under this Agreement are contingent on the following:
  - a. R2A zoning classification designation for Parcel A in the Annexation Ordinance.
  - b. R2A zoning classification for Parcel B.
  - c. Levy of a special assessment over the benefited properties for the cost of the infrastructure using the city's deferred assessment policy estimated to be approximately \$118,000.
  - d. Approval of certain variances (including street width and cul du sac radii Subject to Inter-national Fire Code 2009 Edition)
- The City will facilitate all approval processes necessary to effectuate the intent of this Agreement.
- 11. The parties agree that this Agreement constitutes the complete agreement of the parties. Any amendments to this Agreement shall not become effective until agreed to in writing by all parties to this Agreement.








### I. PURPOSE

The City may accept donations, gifts or grants for any public governmental purpose. This policy sets guidelines for the acceptance of gifts to the City.

### II. Real Property

Regardless of any dollar threshold, the acceptance of any gift of "Real Property" shall require the approval of the Common Council.

### III. Budgeted Gifts

Departments that regularly accept gifts as a function of their regular business (e.g. meal sites, park benches, fireworks, etc.) should include an estimate of said gifts in the annual budget.

### IV. Unbudgeted Cash & Non-Cash (e.g. In-Kind) Gifts.

- a. Department Heads have the authority to accept unbudgeted gifts to the City with a value of \$5,000.00 or less.
- b. Unbudgeted gifts to the City with a value of greater than \$5,000.00 and up to \$10,000.00 shall require the approval of the Department's Committee of jurisdiction.
- c. Unbudgeted gifts to the City with a value over \$10,000.00 shall require the approval of the Common Council.

### A. Change title to read

Community Festivals, Special Events (non-profit or profit) or Other Large Park Events (200+ people)

In addition to the City policy regarding donations, gifts or grants, the Parks and Recreation Board may opt to seek donations, gifts or other in-kind services for a department project or program that it deems beneficial. Staff shall inform the Board of the intent to seek any form of donation (besides regularly accepted, budgeted gifts/donations).

### C. Add 13.

All events are subject to other fees and rules as established by the city's Special Event Policy.



By the provisions of Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands of Wisconsin is authorized to make loans from the State Trust Funds to municipalities for such purposes. (Municipality as defined by Sec. 24.60(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes means a town, village, city, county, public inland lake protection and rehabilitation district, town sanitary district created under Sec. 60.71 or 60.72, metropolitan sewerage district created under Sec. 200.05 or 200.23, joint sewerage system created under Sec. 281.43(4), school district or technical college district.)

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Menasha, in the County(ies) of Calumet And Winnebago, Wisconsin, borrow from the Trust Funds of the State of Wisconsin the sum of One Million Four Hundred Eighty Thousand And 00/100 Dollars (\$1,480,000.00) for the purpose of refinancing 2003 Promissory Notes and for no other purpose.

The loan is to be payable within 10 years from the 15th day of March preceding the date the loan is made. The loan will be repaid in annual installments with interest at the rate of 3.00 percent per annum from the date of making the loan to the 15th day of March next and thereafter annually as provided by law.

That means that Mr. Gueths is unable to file another lawsuit against the City for the same claim.

A copy of this notice of claim was provided to our insurance carrier. After my discussions with our CVMIC representative, we are recommending that the City take no formal action on this claim.

NOTICE OF CLAIM AGAINST THE CITY OF MENASHA AND IT'S EMPLOYEES

Pursant to sec. 893.80, Wis. Stats., I Daniel L. Gueths, W7255 Manitowoc Rd. Menasha, WI 54952 Calumet County, hereby submit the following claim against the City Of Menasha Wisconsin for the amount of \$20,000,000. (Twenty Million Dollars) for (Intentional Tort) by violating my 4th, 5th, and 14th ammendment rights. The 14th ammendment requires the Government to protect it's citizens from tyranny, harrassment, and harm by City Employees, including, but not limited to members of the City of Menasha Police Department (MPD), including former Chief of Police Robert Stanke, Officer Nick Oleszak, Officer Lt. Styka, who is now the sitting Police Chief. Members of the MPD entered my property at the address above in the City Of Menasha, Calumet Co. Wisconsin without a warrant, proable cause, consent or any other legal justification between 10:49 PM. and 11:27 PM. on May 30th, 2010 Incident No. 10-001843 / 10-005614 and committed property damage, personal injury, and violation of my civil rights. I Believe Mayor Donald Merks and City Attorney Palmela Captain were involved in perpetrating a cover a up of criminal activity by the City of Menasha Police Department violating my 14th ammendment rights. Such criminal activity being, tampering with City of Menasha Police Department records, falsifing dispatch audio, and incident recall data log from incident MP10-001843 / Mp10-005614 that occured on May 30th 2010 at w7255 Manitowoc Rd. Menasha, Wi. 54952 Between the hours of 10:30 PM. and 11:30 PM. The incident log is missing 5 minutes of data. Of wich this time coinsides with approximately 5 minutes of video believed to be missing from Officer Oleszaks squad during this incident due to editing, as well as the 1st minute and 7 seconds of audio on the video that was released from Oleszaks squad of the incident. Filing a false police report for intentional malicious proscution. The City Of Menasha, Wi concealed and refused to turn over video evidence from squad 21/29 and squad 25 responding to the incident mentioned above, while the City of Menasha, WI, was the defendant in a Federal Law suit case No. 11-CV-336 with Mr. Gueths being the plaintiff in such Law suit. The City OF Menasha, Wi. deliberately committed fraud by refusing to turn over all evidence requested during the discovery process of said lawsuit. That evidence being squad car dash cam video from squads 21/29 Officers Shepps' squad, and dash cam video from squad 25, Lt. Stykas' squad. The video was requested to be sent by certified mail directly from the MPD to Mr. Gueths' Forensic Audio Video expert. Mr. Gueths previously had a copy of squad 21/29 video to prove such video existed, and also have evidence that squad 25 had a dash camera in the vehicle that was recording at the time of the incident. We were told by email to Attorney Len Kachinsky that squad 25 did not have a dash camera at the time of the incident by former Chief of Police Robert Stanke. Futher deciet and fraud by the City of Menasha, Wi. and the MPD. To further perpetrate the cover up and fraud by the City Of Menasha, they intentionally failed to turn over the same two videos from squad 21/29 and 25, and dispatch audio of the above mentioned incident to their own expert witness Robert C. Wilis, 1315 North 119th street Wauwatosa, WI. 53226, 3237 during the Federal law suit 11-cv-336 in Judge Griesbachs' court in Green Bay WI. resulting in an unfair and bias report. The City Of Menasha was represented

by Attorney Greg J. Gunta, Suite 9898 West Bluemond Road, Wauwatosa, Wi. 53226-4319. Also in a recent open records request for the aboved mentioned video from squad 21/29 and video from squad 25, and dispatch audio of said incident mentioned above, Gueths was told by Lt. Ron Bouchard of the MPD that Gueths' open records request would be denied by orders of City Attorney Pamela Captain in a further attempt to conceal evidence of the criminal activity of members of the MPD in violation of Wisconsin Open Records Law, Wis.Stats. ss 19:31-19:39

As a result of the above, I claim to be entitle to the following

relief:

- 1. Cost of repair to fence
- 2. Violation of my civil rights under the United States and Wisconsin Constitutions and statues to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures and that the government protect me if such acts occour.
  - 3. Intentional infliction of emotional distress, pain and suffering

and

malice by putting my life in imminent danger with reckless behavior, making false statements on a police report, conspiracy to conceal evidence to conceal criminal activity and to defraud in a federal law suit, and other non economic damages in the amount of \$20,000,000. Million Dollars.

In addition to the above, I am filing a seperate complaint to the Police Commission for the City Of Menasha, Wi to bring administrative action against the officers involved. As well as Charges against Attorney Captain for conspiracy to conceal evidence.

# NOTICE OF CLAIM AGAINST CITY OF MENASHA AND ITS EMPLOYEES

To: Deborah A. Galeazzi, City Clerk, 140 Main Street, 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, Menasha, WI 54952

Pursuant to Sec. 893.80, Wis. Stats., I, Daniel L. Gueths, 7255 Manitowoc Road, Menasha, WI 54952, hereby submit the following claim against the City of Menasha and its employees for property damage, personal injury and violation of civil rights that occurred as a result of the actions of the City of Menasha Police Department (MPD) in entering my property at the address above in the City of Menasha, Calumet County, Wisconsin without a warrant, probable cause, consent or any other legal justification between 10:49 p.m. and 11:27 p.m. on May 30, 2010. Incident No. 10-001843. (10 - 005614)

In particular, the MPD entered my property without adequate evidence that a crime had been committed or that there was any reasonable suspicion that a crime had been committed at the Winnegamie Dog Club at 7245 Manitowoc Road. Further, members of the MPD refused to leave when I asked them to do so on multiple occasions and after they had reliable information verifying my identification as the owner of the property. MPD officers were armed and drew their weapons. They threatened me with a Taser which based upon my medical history would have likely triggered a heart attack if used. Officers further attempted to break through a locked wooden fence which separated me from them. As a result of the officers' actions, the fence was damaged.

As a result of the above, I claim to be entitled to the following relief:

- 1. Cost of repair to the fence: \$100.00 (estimate).
- 2. Violation of my civil rights under the United States and Wisconsin Constitutions and statutes to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures in the amount of \$5,000,000. Five Million Dollars
- Intentional infliction of emotional distress, pain and suffering and intentional malice by putting my life in imminent danger with reckless behavior and making false statements on a police report and other non-economic damages in the amount of \$5,000,000.

In addition to the above, I am filing a separate complaint to the Police Commission for the City of Menasha to consider administrative action against the officers involved.
