A. CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order by Vice Chr. T. Konetzke at 6:05 PM.

C. MINTUES TO APPROVE

1. Introduction of New Park Superintendent, Vince Maas

Vince Maas was introduced as the new Superintendent of Parks, Forestry and Cemeteries.

2. Minutes to Approve:

The following revisions to the June 8, 2009 meeting were made: Meeting called to order at 6:00 PM, G. Korth moved and N. Barker seconded the motion to approve the May 11, 2009 minutes, this motion carried unanimously, meeting time ended at 6:45 PM. A motion was made by G. Korth, seconded by N. Barker to approve the revised minutes for June 8, 2009. Motion carried 6-0.

D. PUBLIC COMMENT ON ANY MATTER LISTED ON THE AGENDA

E. REPORT OF DEPARTMENT HEADS/STAFF/CONSULTANTS

1. Park Project and Vandalism Report – PS Maas

PS Maas gave a report on the park projects and vandalism. Pool is functioning well mechanically, tuck pointing and some minor block repair work will be occurring at the Smith Park pavilion, second 441/Calder sign was installed. It is hoped that the Jefferson Park shoreline repair work can be done before the Otto Grunski festival, cap stone repair work being done along the Riverwalk. Some large oak tree limbs and dying trees should be removed from Smith Park. PS Maas will bring back a recommendation. One vandalism incident at Hart Park was reported. Estimated value was \$355.40. G. Korth suggested some trimming of shrubbery north of the Smith Park pavilion before repair work is undertaken.

2. Hart Park Report from Police Department

The Board reviewed written comments by CPO Jeff Jorgenson about recent calls for service at Hart Park. General comments included: taking down one hoop may be a good incremental step towards helping the situation, hiring older attendants is a good idea, the people watching the basketball games (not usually the players) may be a problem, talking with Stan Sevenich prior to taking any action is a good idea, current group of attendants have been less effective than in past years, having the PD hire or become more involved with the attendant program was suggested, PD has used some directed patrol at Hart Park, use of K-9 unit was effective at the park, but there appear to be a scheduling shift issue with using the K-9 unit when its busy at Hart Park. After a lengthy discussion it was suggested that an ad-hoc committee be appointed by the Mayor to explore multiple ideas towards solving the problems at Hart Park. Mayor Merkes was agreeable to this.

F. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Jefferson Park East Parking Lot

The condition of the Jefferson Park east parking lot was discussed. Some work was done in 2008, however, the Board is concerned with the condition of the lot. PRD Tungate will look into the possibility of city crews patching the worst sections along with some other areas they are already planning to do.

2. 2010 Parks and Recreation Budget – 2009 Budget Attached

Copies of the 2009 budget were distributed. Some potential revenue ideas were discussed. The Board will discuss the 2010 budget at their August meeting.

3. Maintenance of Smith Park Burial Mounds – N. Barker

Smith Park burial mounds were discussed. The Park Caretaker will go back to keeping the grass on the mounds a little longer so they are easier to identify.

4. Tree Health - Chr. D. Sturm

D. Sturm committed on the condition of 10-12 ash trees in Jefferson Park. PS Maas stated that ash trees are susceptible to sporadic die back and the Park Crew will look into trimming the dead limbs.

- (c) **BUOYS TO BE INSTALLED.** The Parks and Recreation Department is charged with the installation and obtaining of said buoys according to Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources specifications.

SEC. 12-1-9 ANIMALS IN PARKS.

- (a) Under no condition shall the owner of any animal be allowed to have such animal in the parks with or without a leash with the following exceptions:
 - (1) Animals in an enclosed motor vehicle.
 - (2) Animals specifically trained to assist the disabled.
- (b) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit the sponsorship of pet or hobby shows, dog obedience schools and animal shows with permission from the Parks and Recreation Board.

SEC. 12-1-10 AMPLIFYING SYSTEMS AND DEVICES REGULATED.

No voice or music amplifying system shall be permitted in any of the parks without a permit from the Parks and Recreation Director. Where the Parks and Recreation Director has issued a permit for any group or sports activity this shall include the use of any music or voice amplifying equipment. Amplifier volume must be controlled so that the sound is not objectionable beyond the confines of the park. Sound systems must be tuned not to be heard beyond a distance of 20 feet from the source, including those contained in motor vehicles.

SEC. 12-1-11 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN CITY PARKS.

- (a) **PROHIBITED HOURS.** No alcoholic beverages shall be brought into the parks of the City of Menasha or consumed between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. Use and consumption of alcoholic beverages at other times shall be governed by the provisions of Section 11-5-1(b) of this Code of Ordinances.
- (b) USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES PROHIBITED AT SMITH PARK. The use, vending, and consumption of any beverage containing alcohol is hereby prohibited in Smith Park and the buildings thereon.

Cross-Reference: Section 11-5-1(b).

SEC. 12-1-12 SELLING OF MERCHANDISE IN PARKS AND PUBLIC GROUNDS.

(a) **SALES PROHIBITED.** No merchandise, food or other concessions may be sold by individuals or non-profit organizations for profit in City parks.

- (b) SALES PERMITTED. All organizations which desire to sell food, merchandise or concessions to carry on their non-profit programs in City parks must first display to the satisfaction of the Director of Parks and Recreation evidence that such organization has received a tax-exempt status from the Wisconsin Department of Revenue.
- (c) **RULES AND REGULATIONS.** Times and areas to be served, as well as the types of merchandise to be sold, shall be as determined by the Parks and Recreation Board and then by a permit only. The Parks and Recreation Board is directed to enact any and all reasonable rules and regulations to carry out the intent of this Section.
- (d) **EXCEPTIONS.** This Section shall not apply to the selling of fermented malt beverages in the parks in the City of Menasha where a license has been granted by the Common Council. Such license shall imply the selling of food and merchandise usually associated with the selling of non-alcoholic beverages, food by a non-profit organization having a tax-exempt status. This Section shall not apply when the Mayor permits the same by issuing a proclamation in regard to events of a community-wide interest that do not involve the sale or serving of alcoholic beverages.
- (e) **FEES.** Fees for the permits described above shall be recommended by the Parks and Recreation Board from time to time to the Common Council.

SEC. 12-1-13 MENASHA SKATE PARK AT HART PARK.

- (a) Only non-motorized wheeled equipment permissible for use at Menasha Skate Park at Hart Park shall include:
 - (1) skateboards
 - (2) bicycle
 - (3) in-line skates/roller blades
 - (4) roller skates
 - (5) roller shoes
- (b) Smoking shall be prohibited within five yards of the concrete of the skate deck

SEC. 12-1-14 TRAILS.

- (a) All rules and regulations contained in Sec. 12-1-1 through Sec. 12-1-13 shall apply to all trails.
- (b) Sec. 12-1-14 (a) shall not apply to:
 - (1) Domestic animals on leashes are allowed on trails except where Friendship Trail proceeds through Jefferson Park.
 - (2) Skateboards, non-motorized scooters, roller blades, bicycles are permitted on any trail.
 - (3) All trail systems shall be open as posted.
